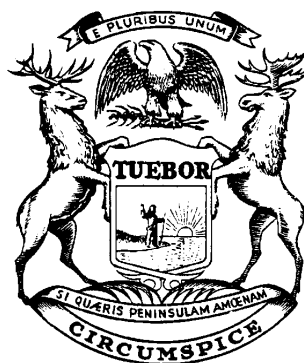

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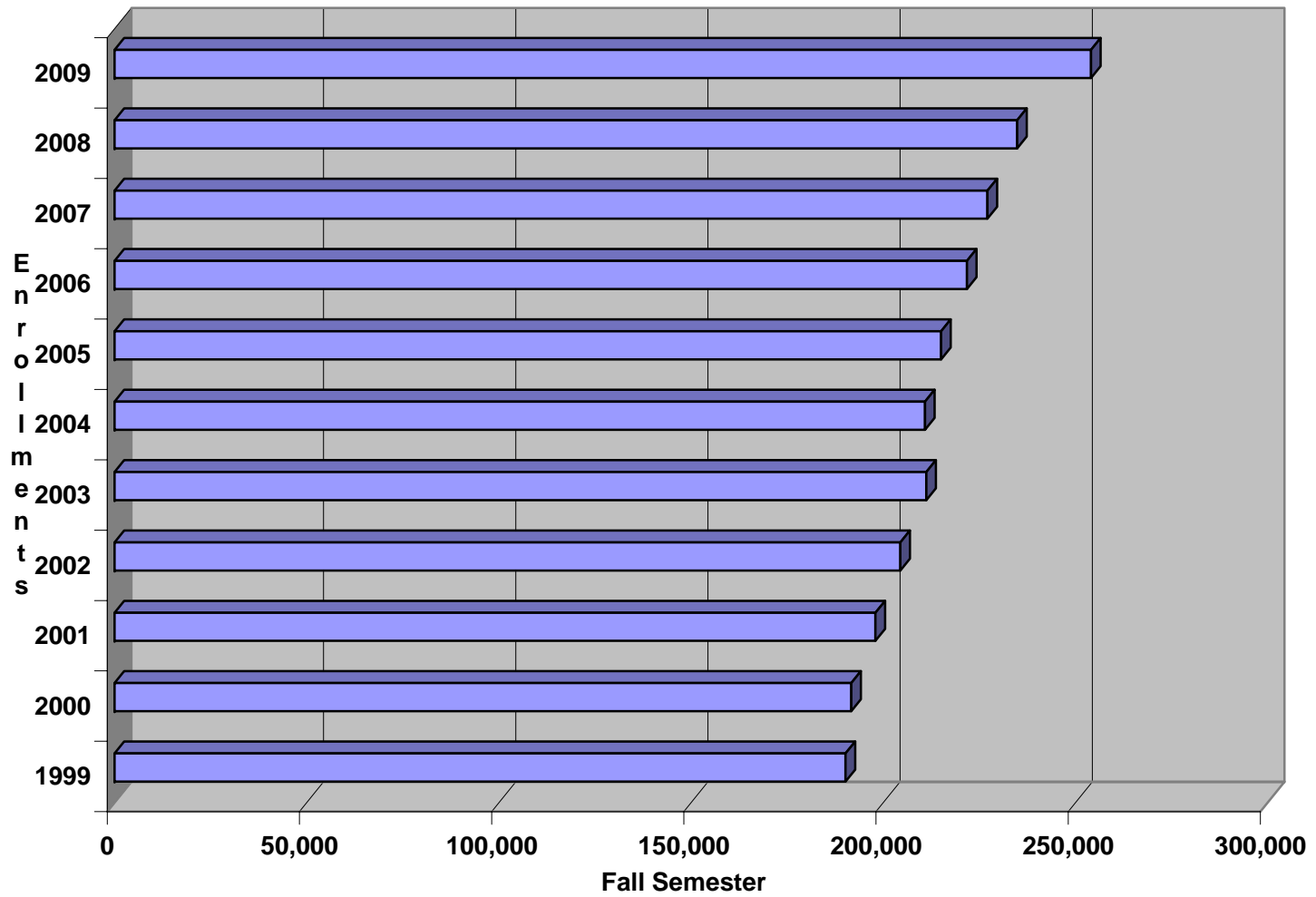

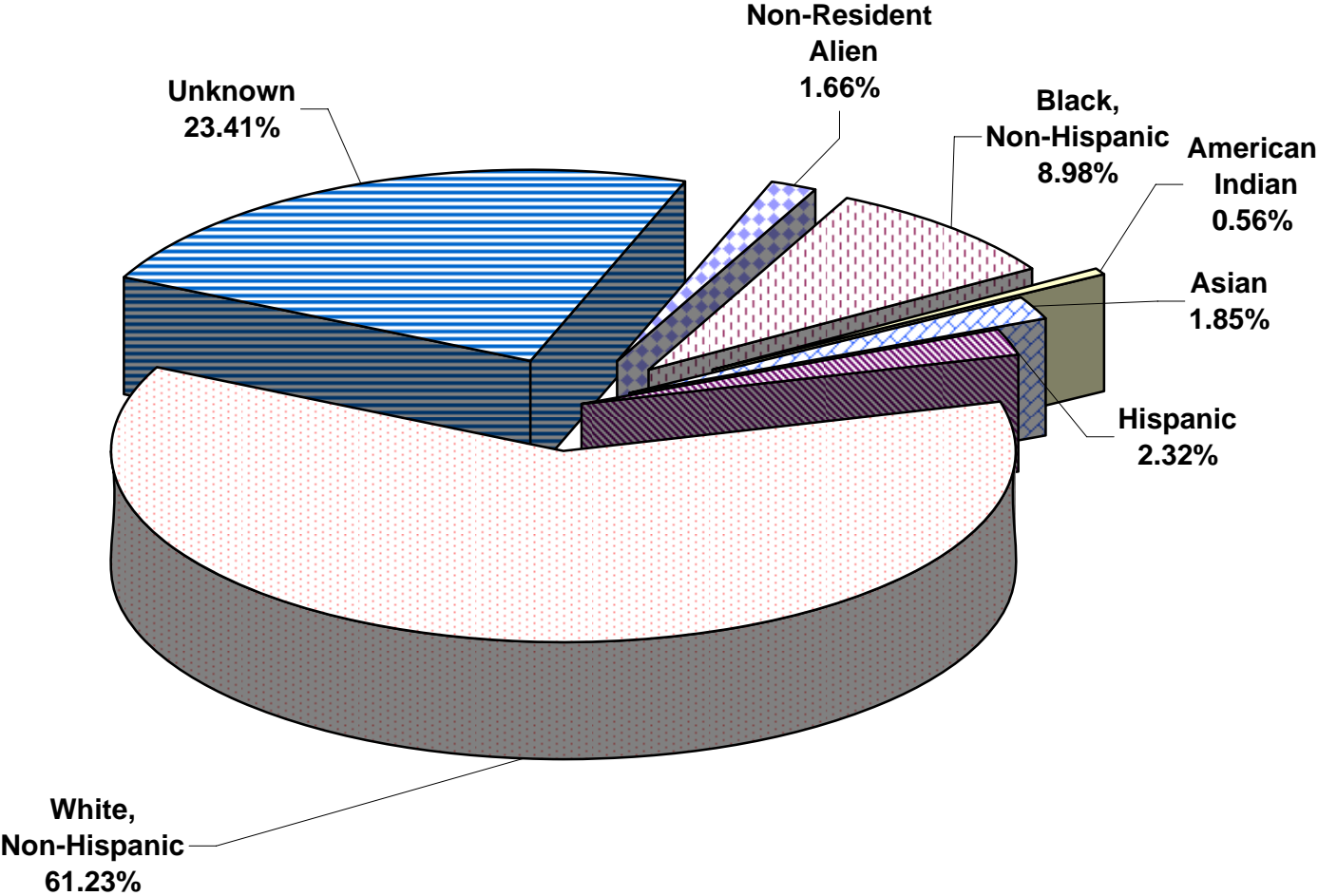

# FALL 2009 ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY

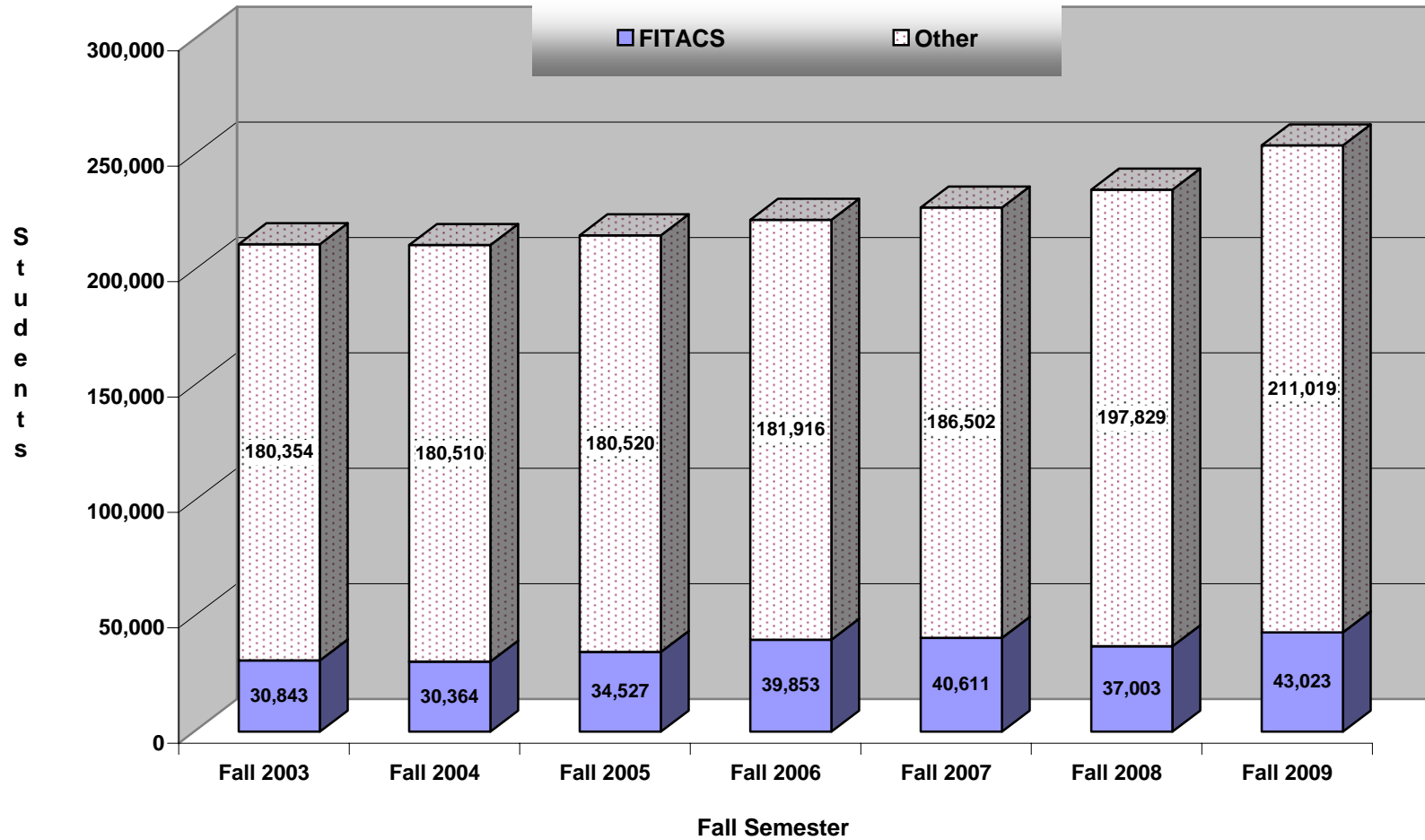

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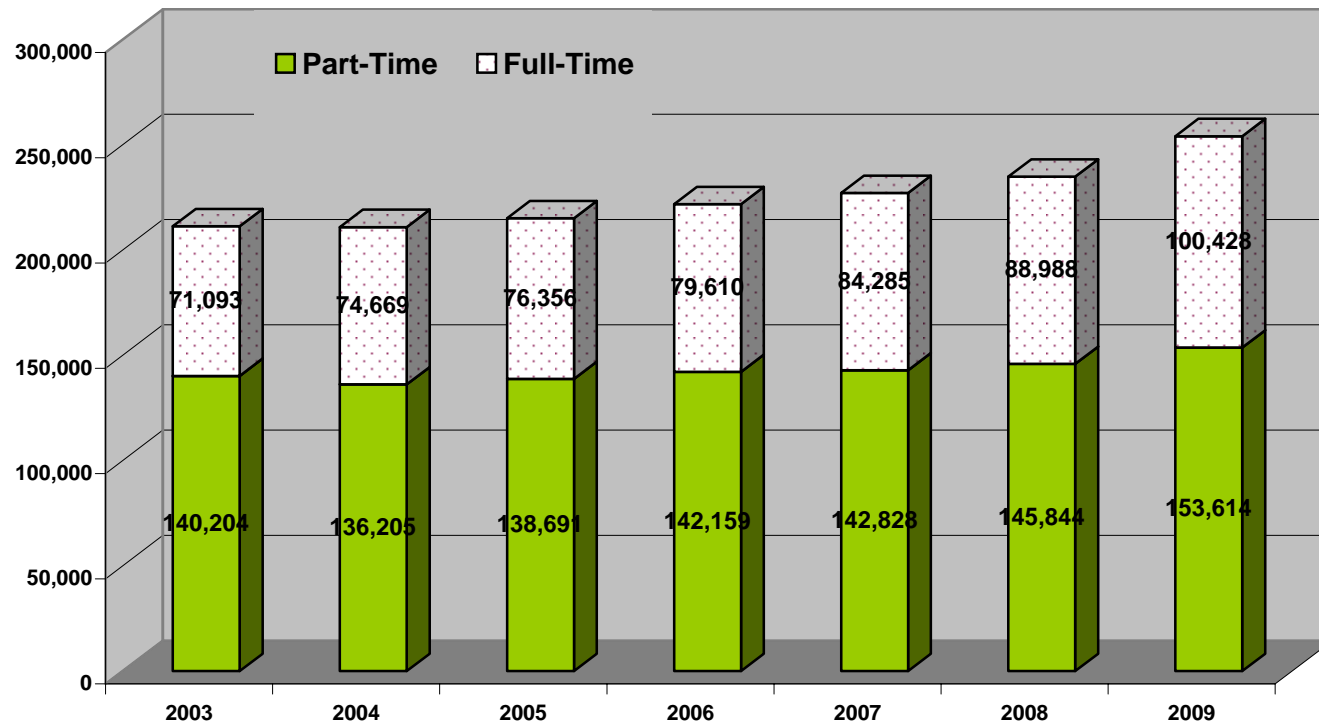

*Full-Time enrollment has continuously increased since Fall 2003 having increased by over 41% from 2003 to 2009.*

*From Fall 2008 to Fall 2009, Full time enrollments increased by 12.75%.*

*Part-Time enrollment has steadily increased from Fall 2004 to Fall 2009, however, not as dramatically as full-time enrollment.*

*Part-time enrollment increased 12.7% from Fall 2004 to Fall 2009. There was a 5.3% increase from Fall 2008 to Fall 2009.*

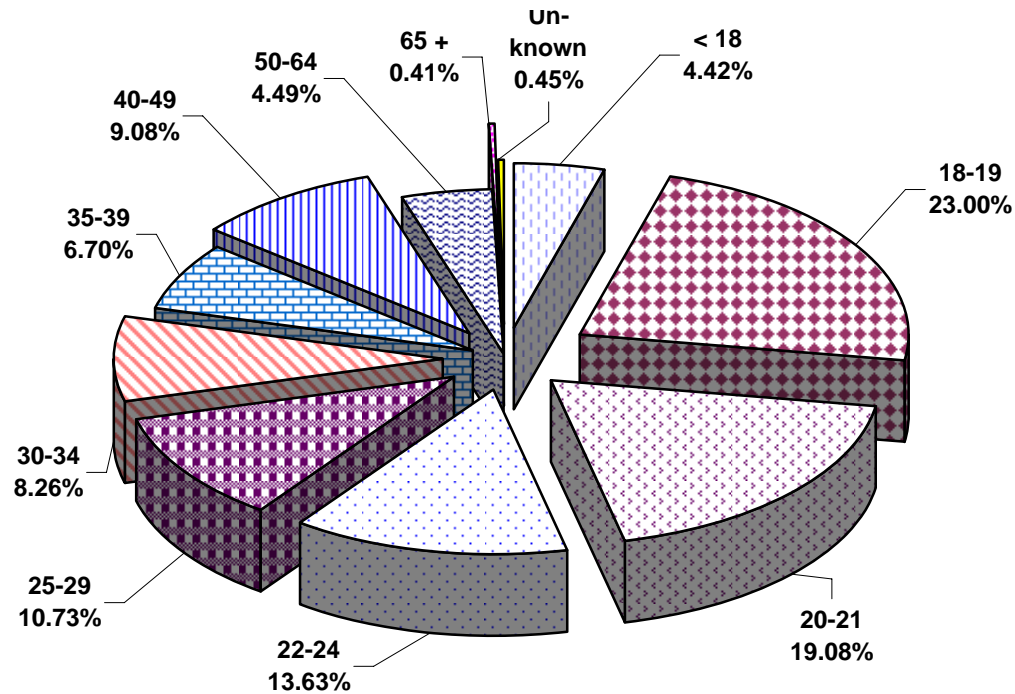

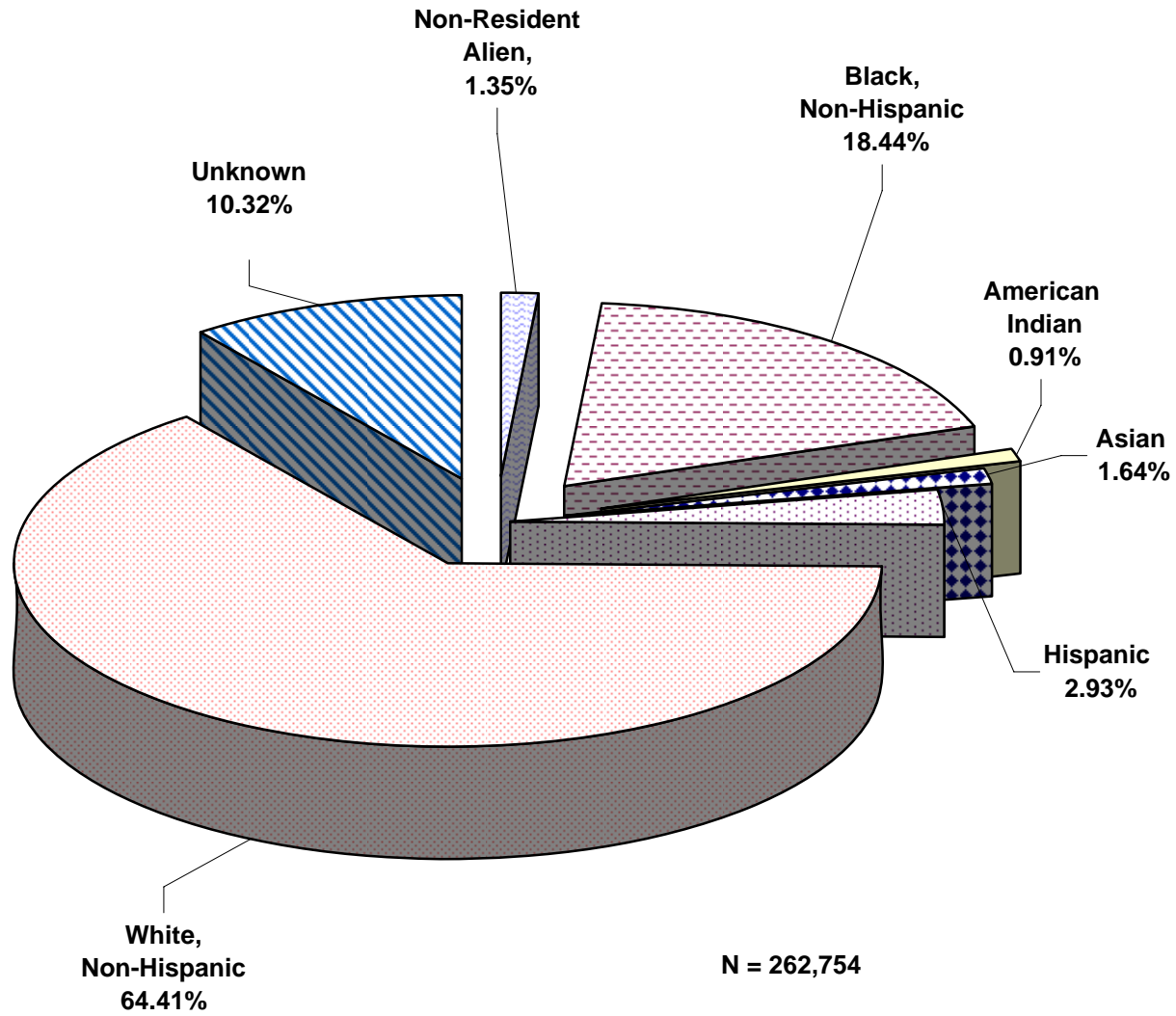

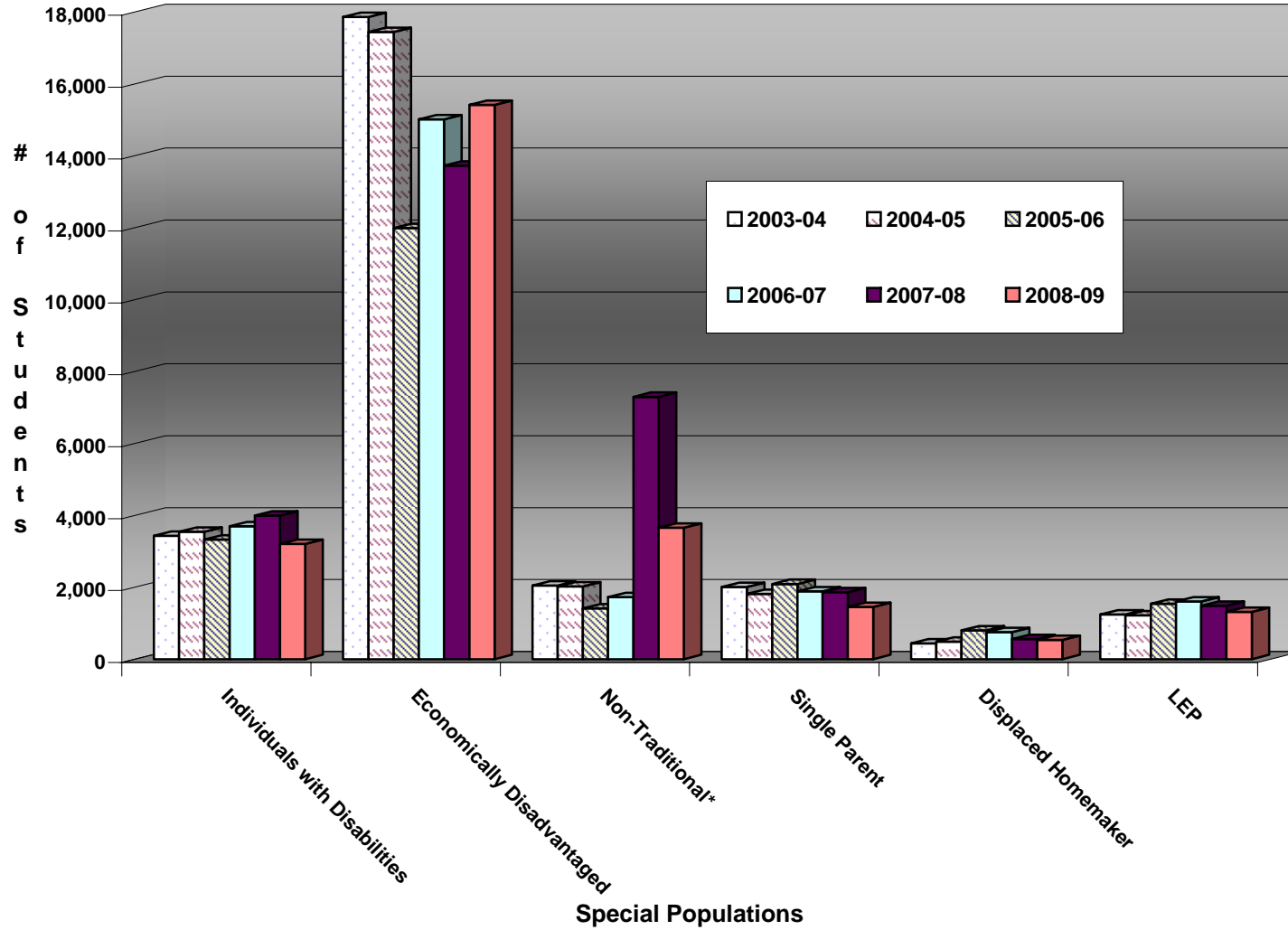

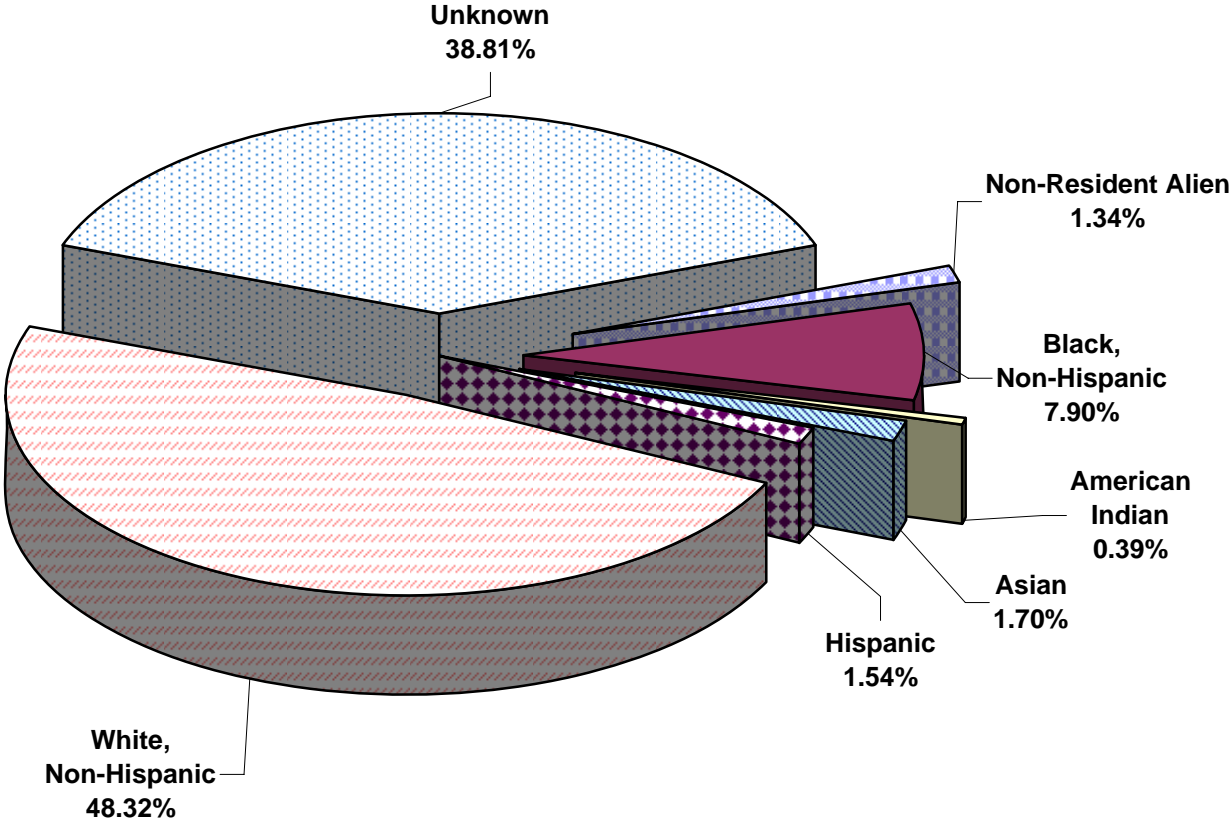

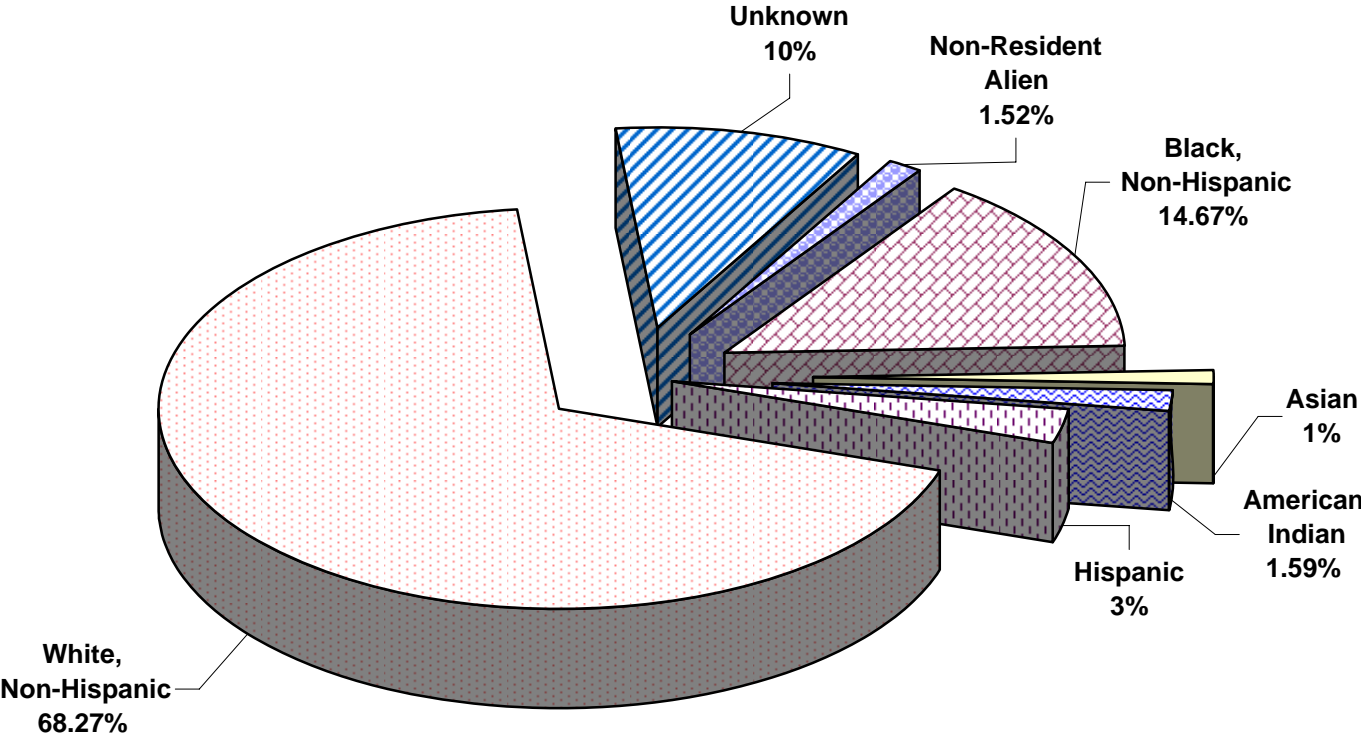

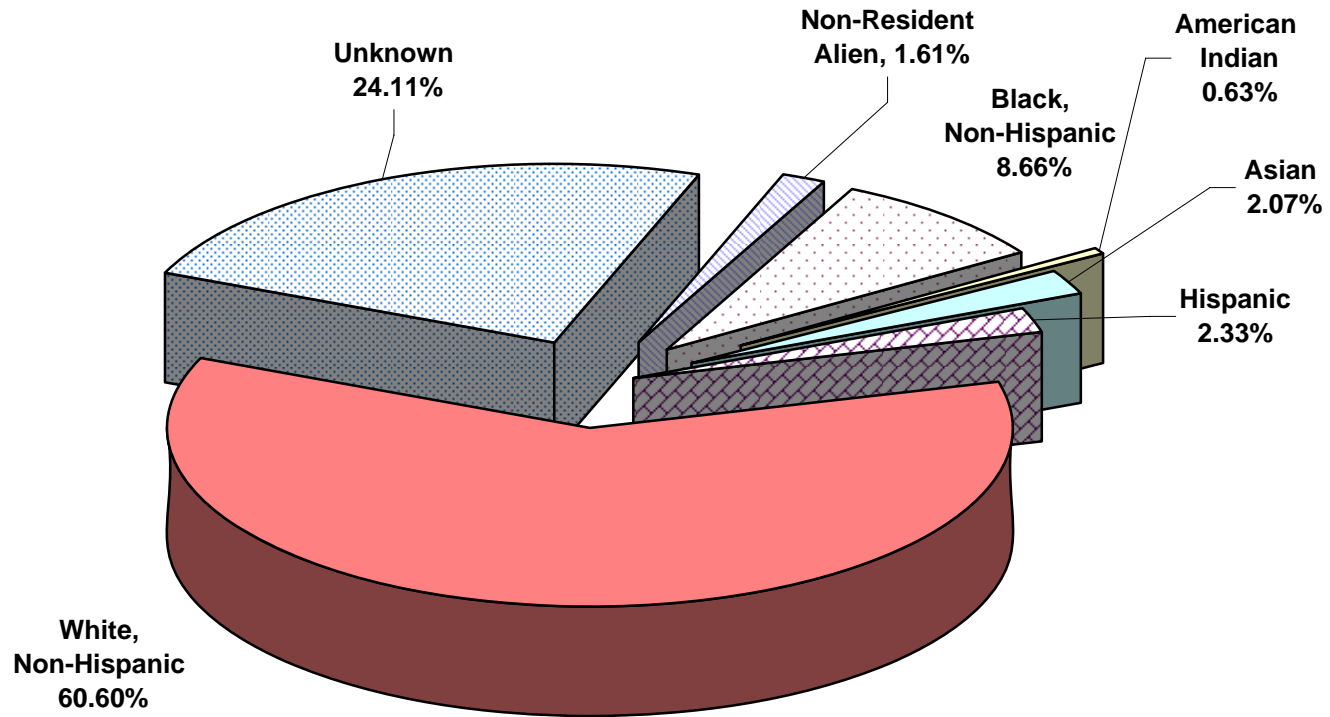

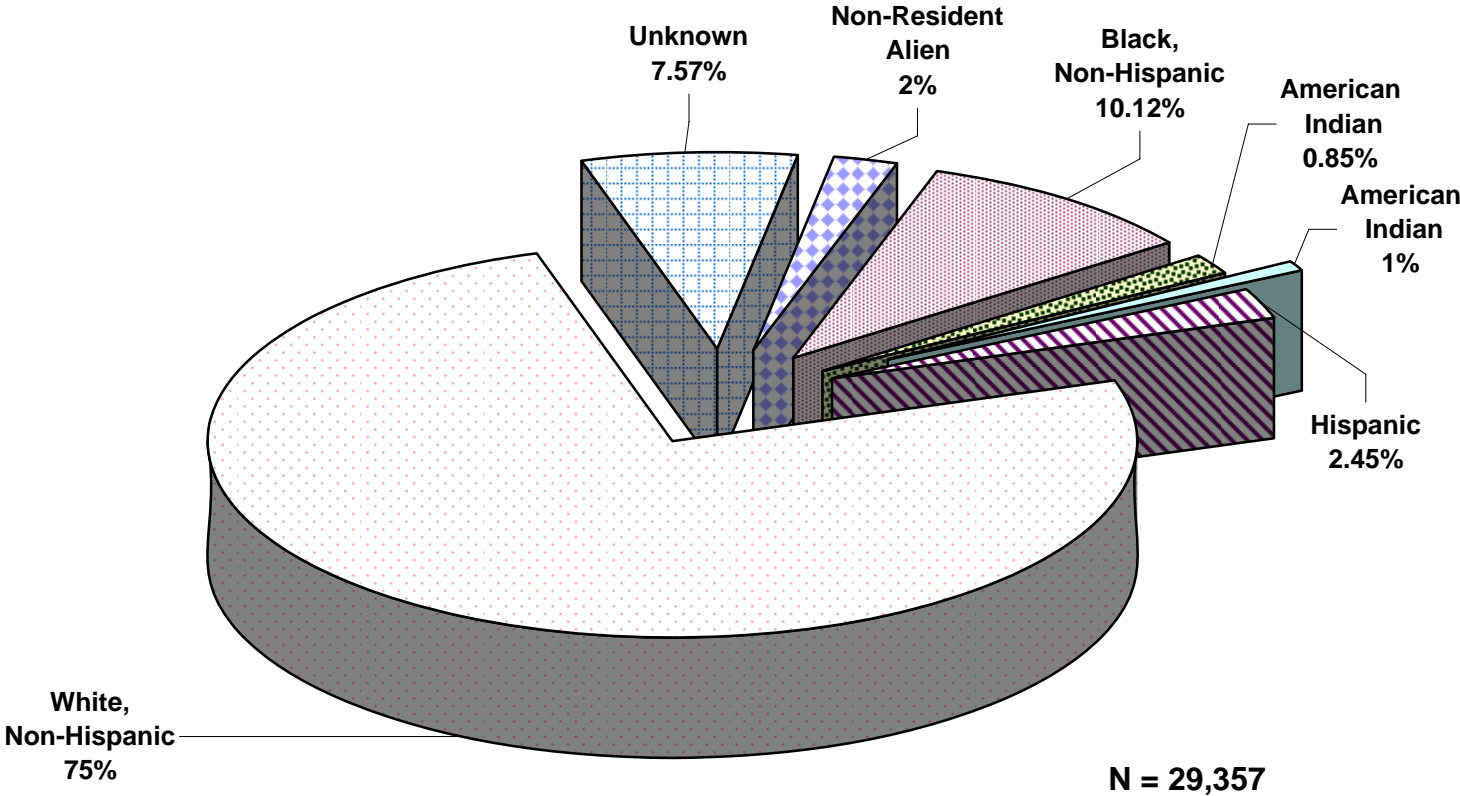

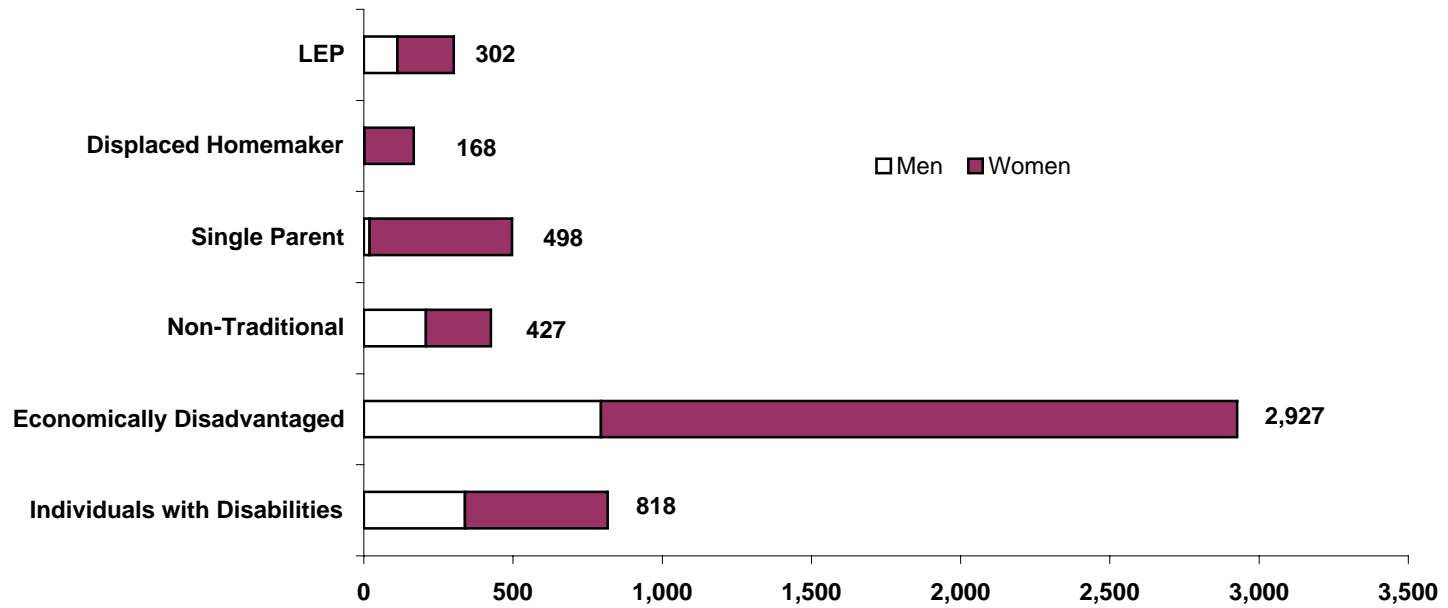

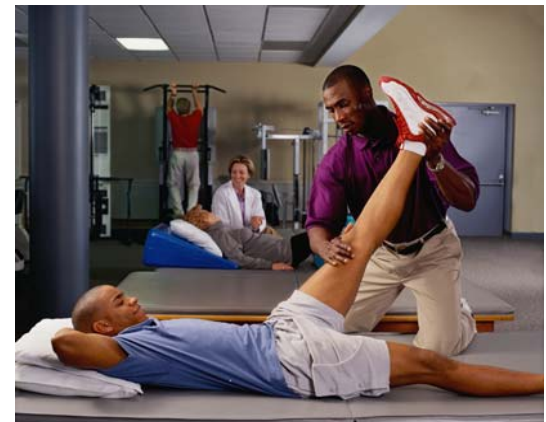
