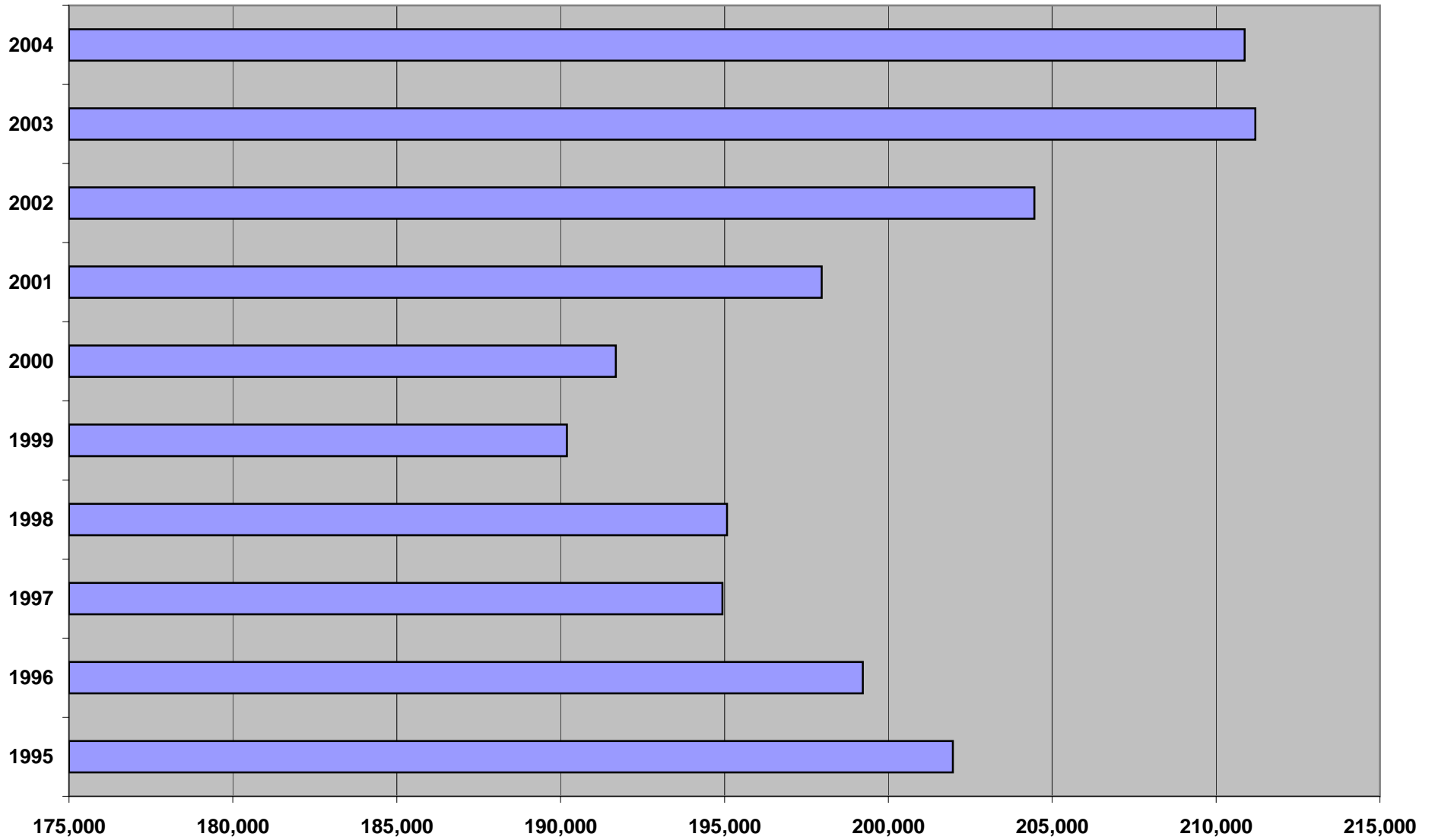
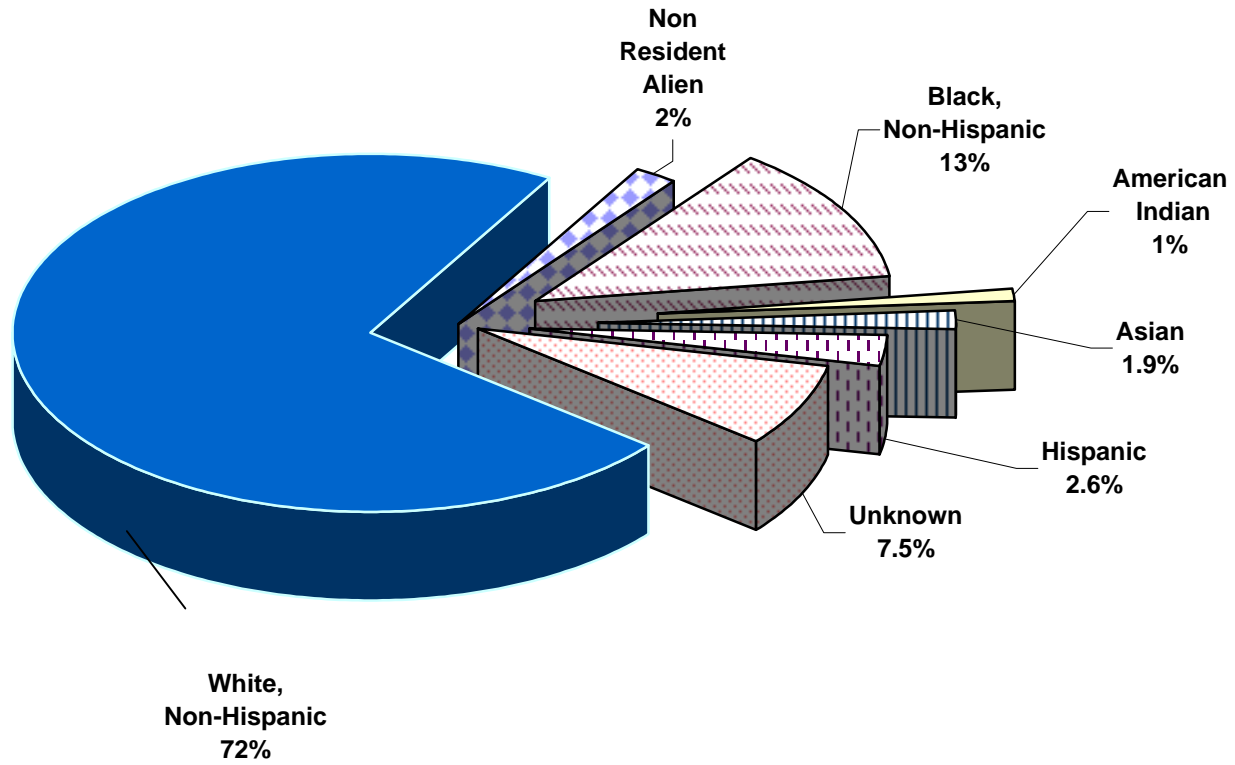

FALL 2004 ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY

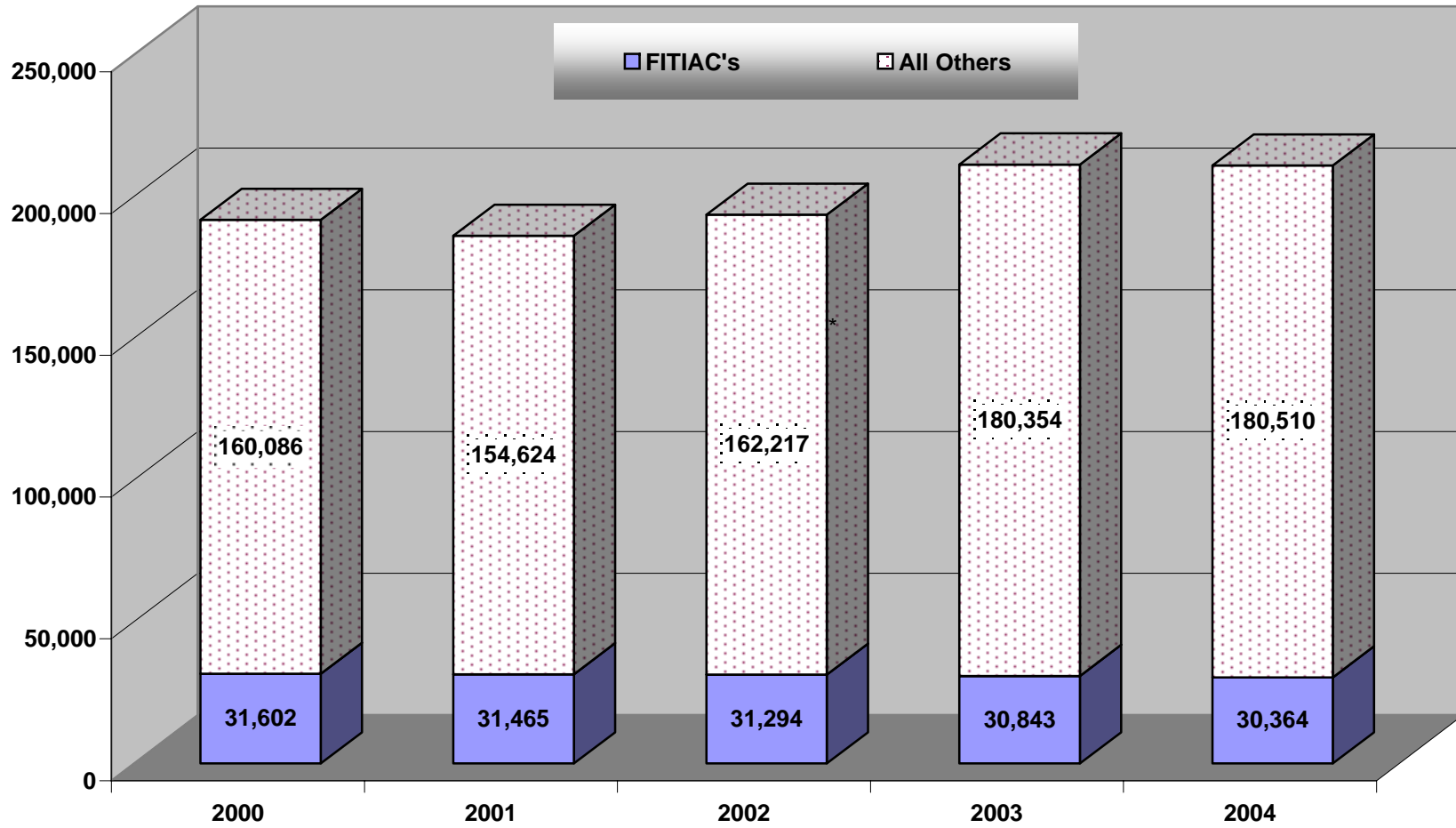

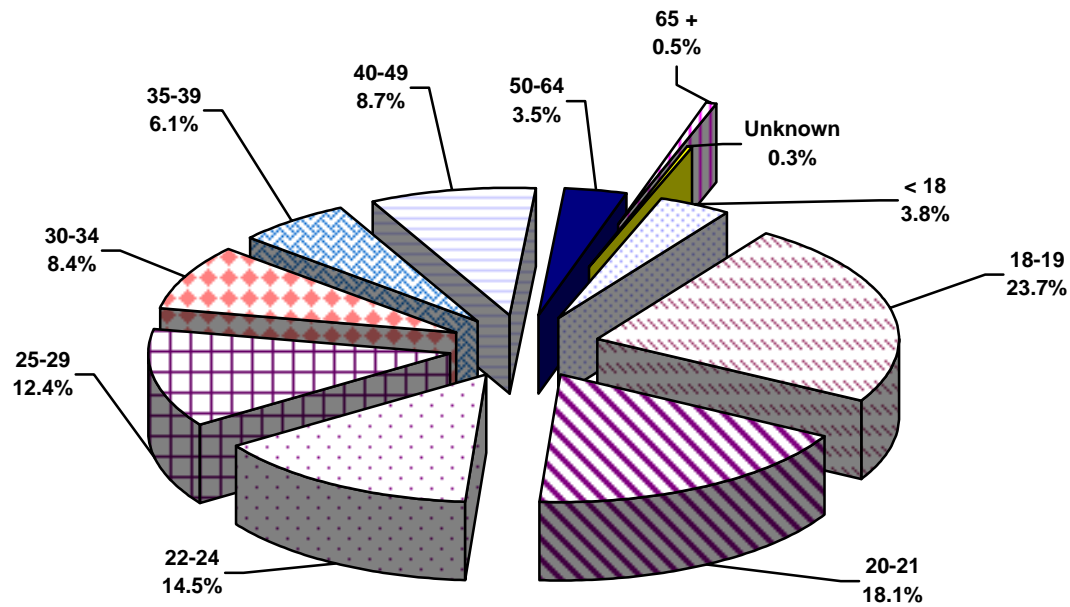

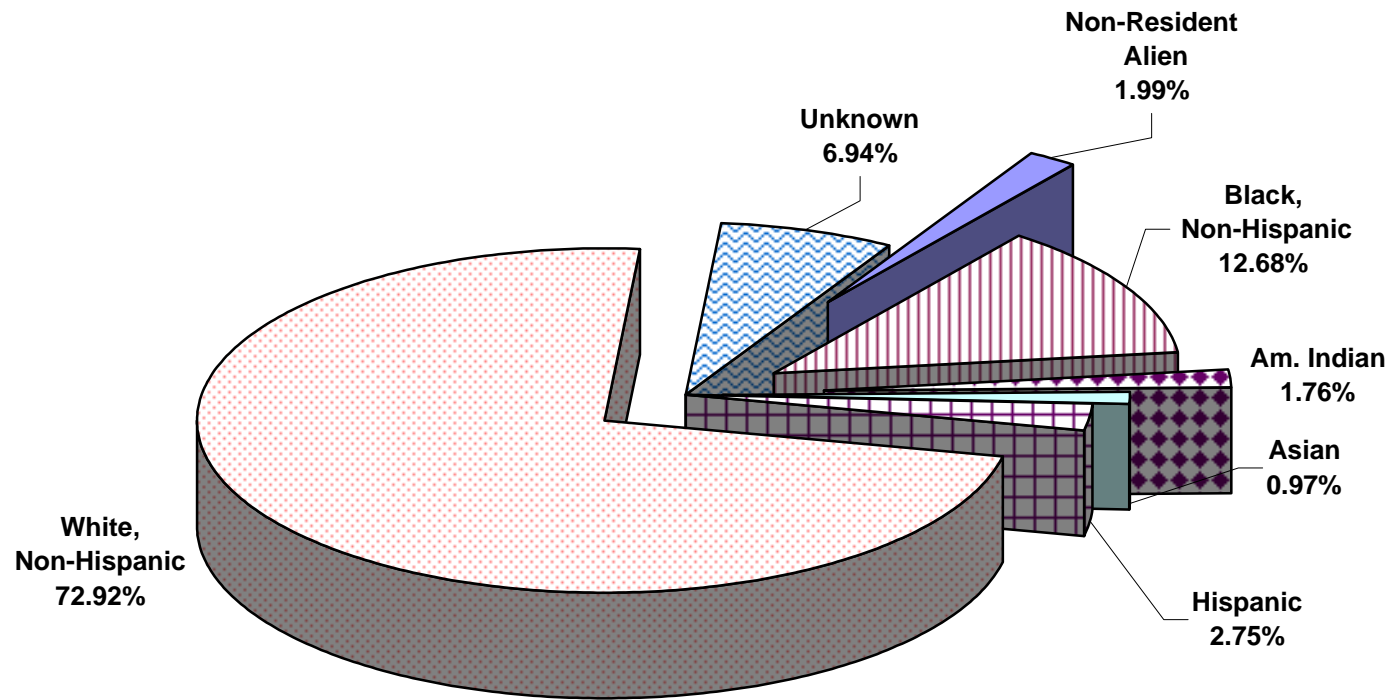

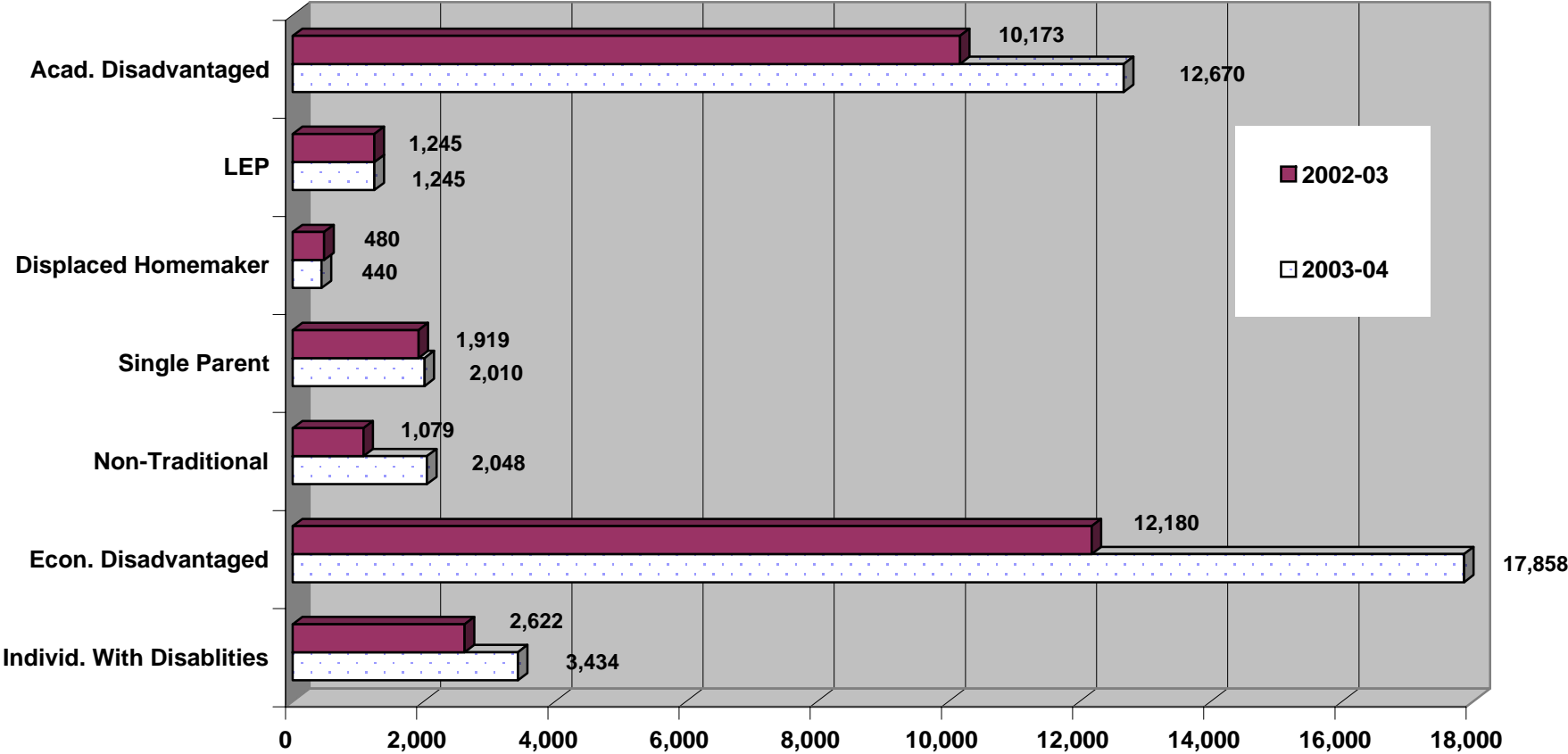

TOTAL NON-PROGRAM ENROLLMENTS BY ETHNICITY, 2003-04

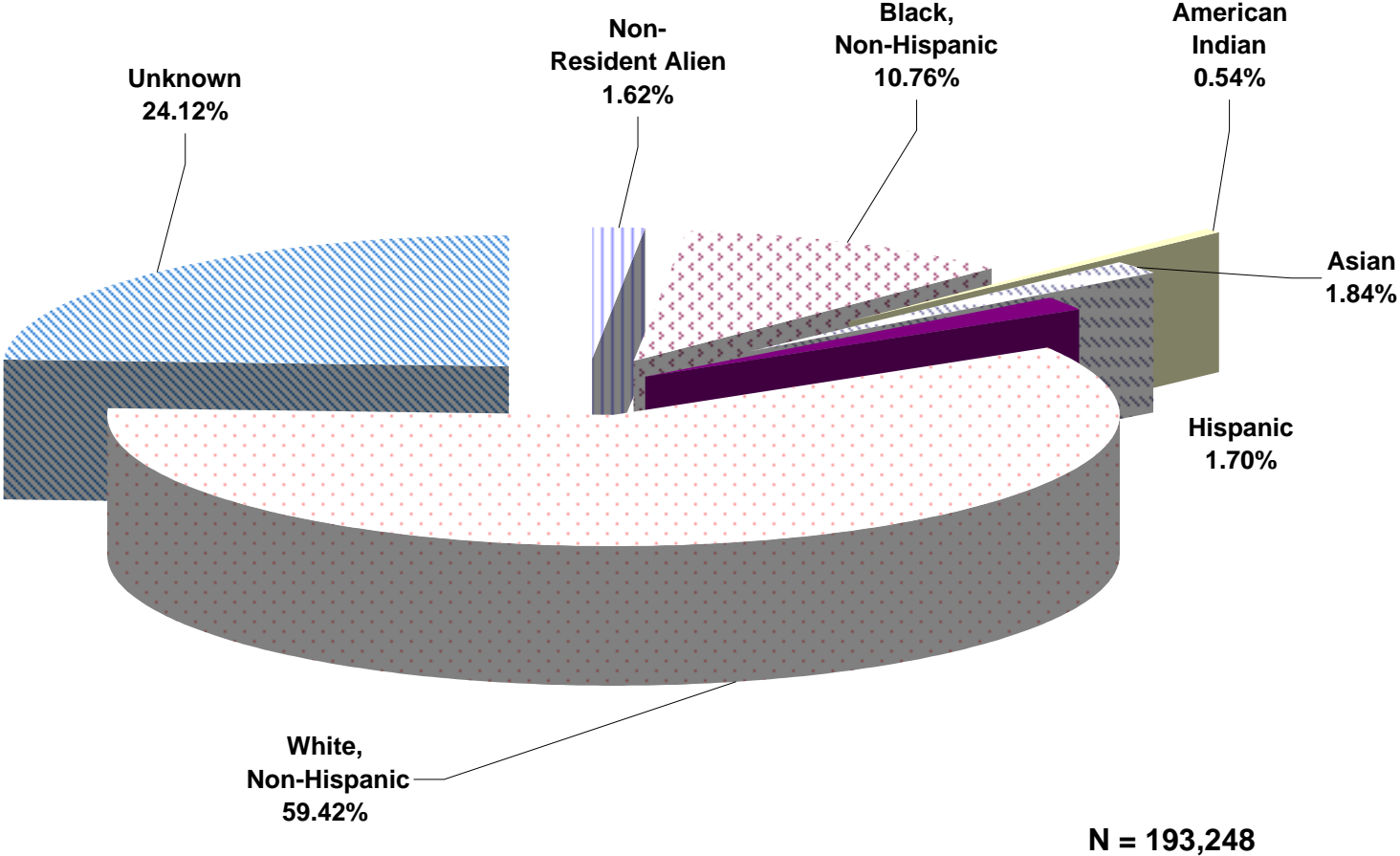

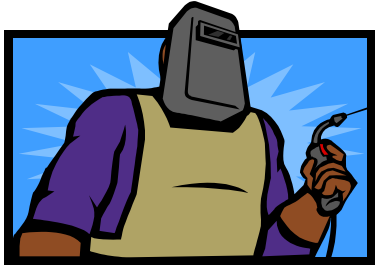

YEAR-END OCCUPATIONAL PROGRAM ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY, 2003-04

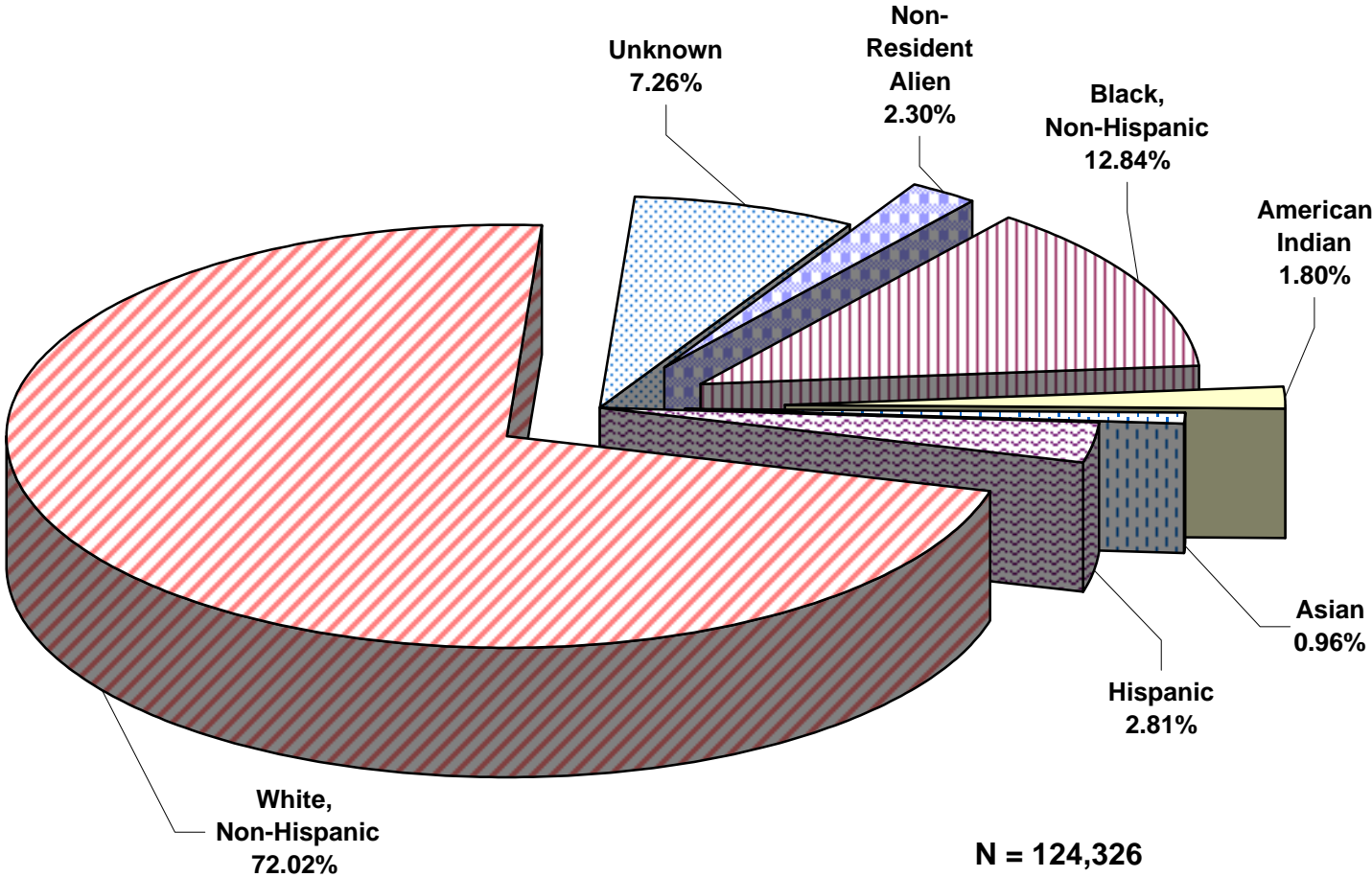

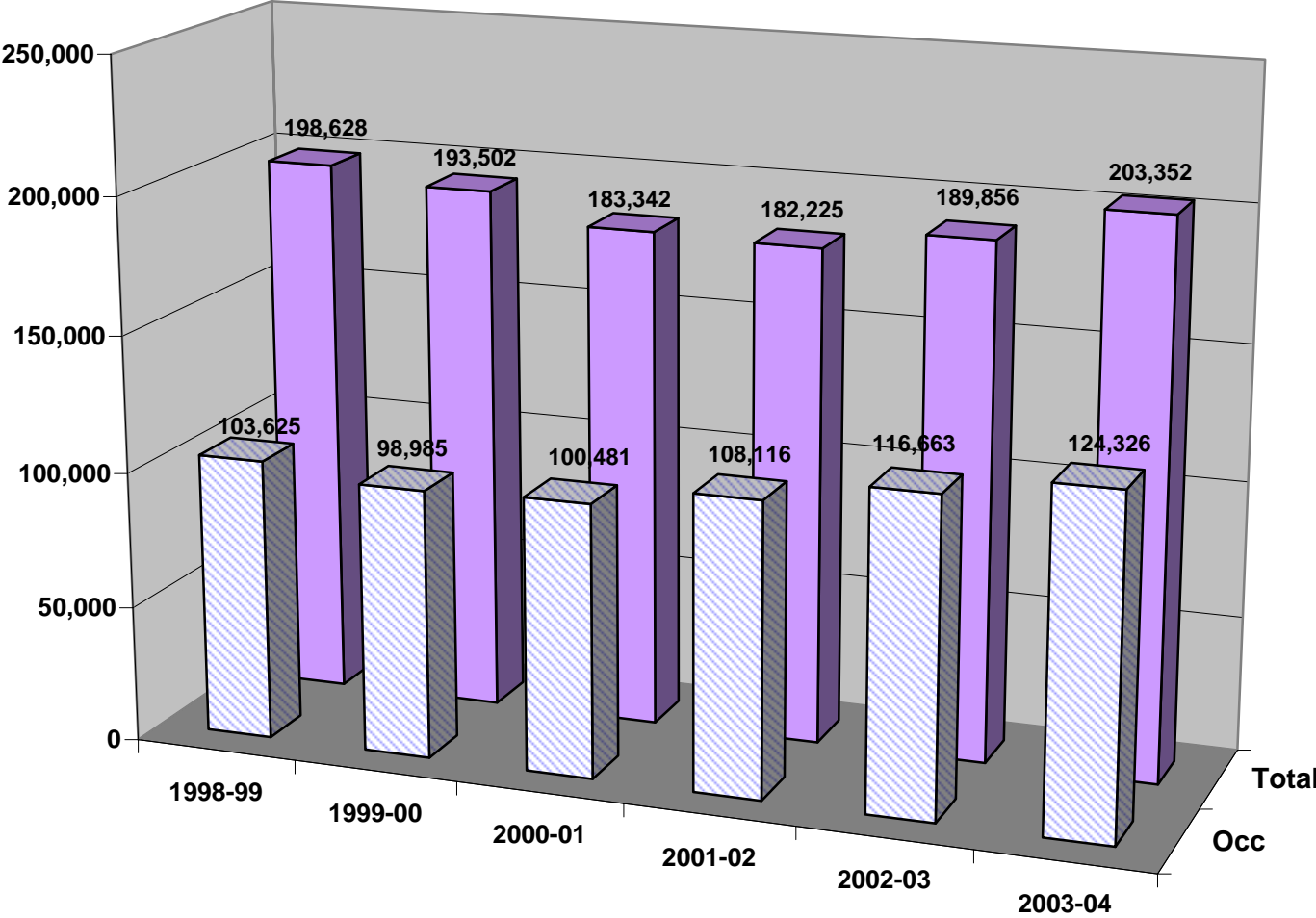

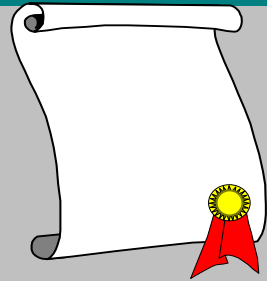

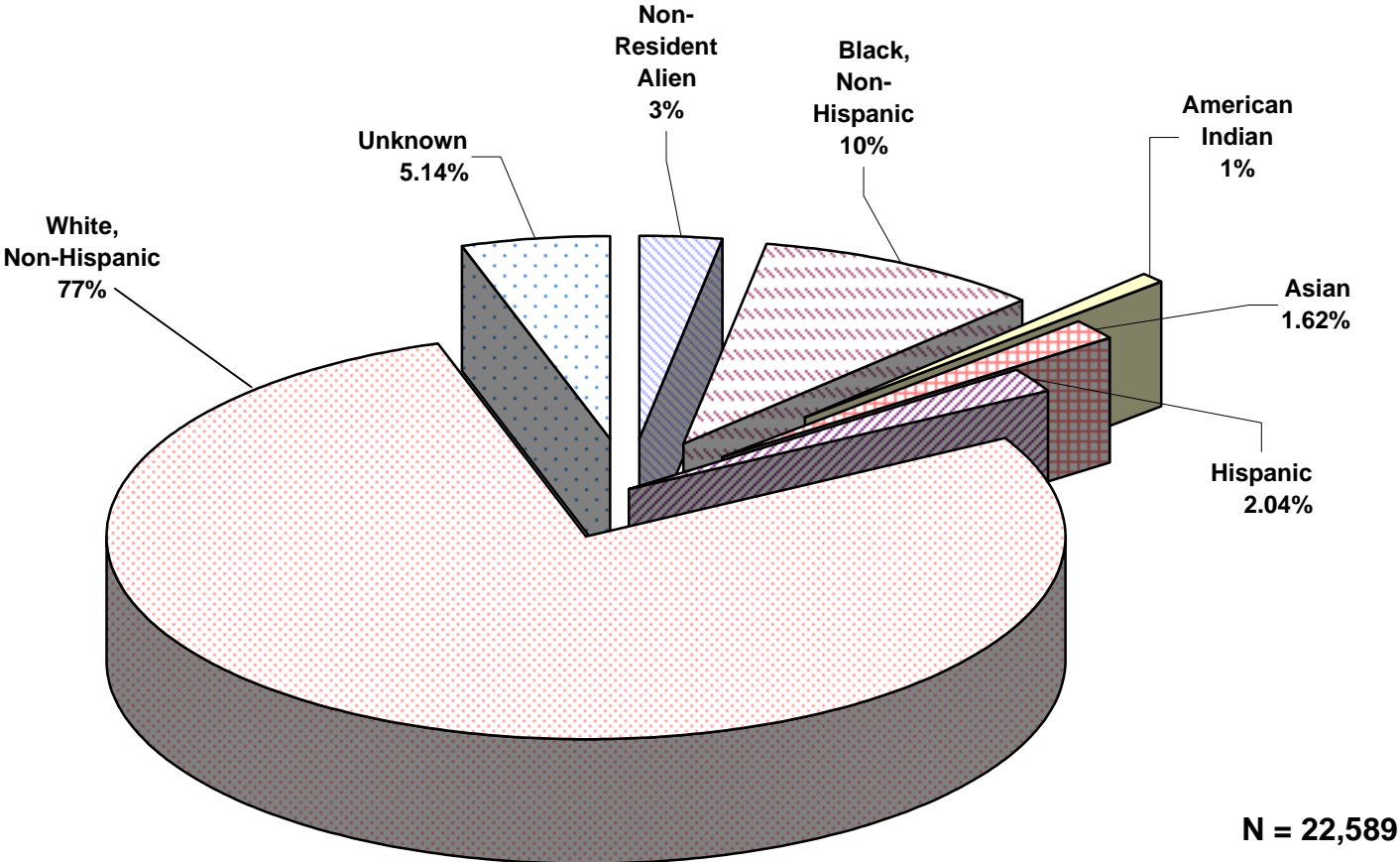

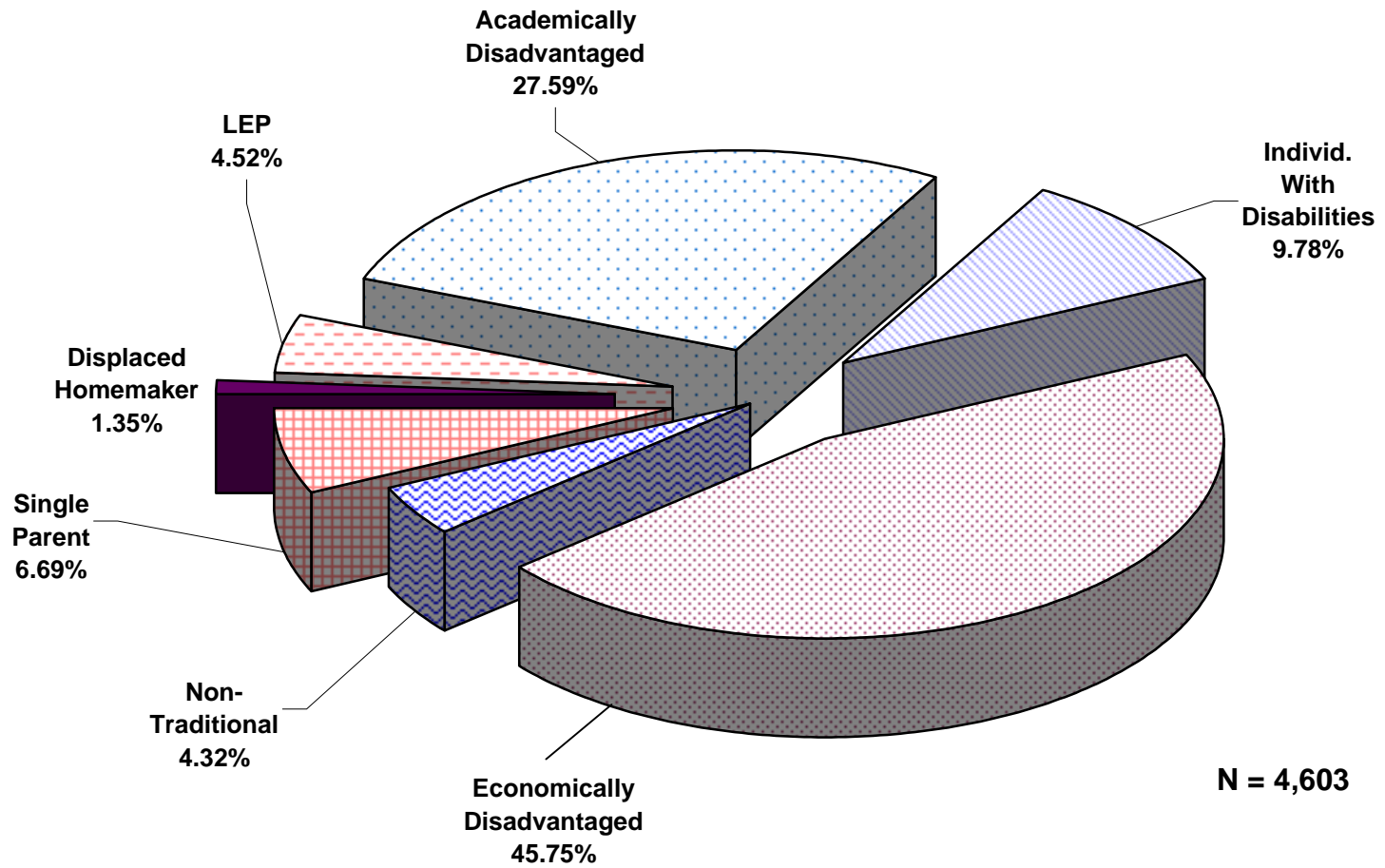

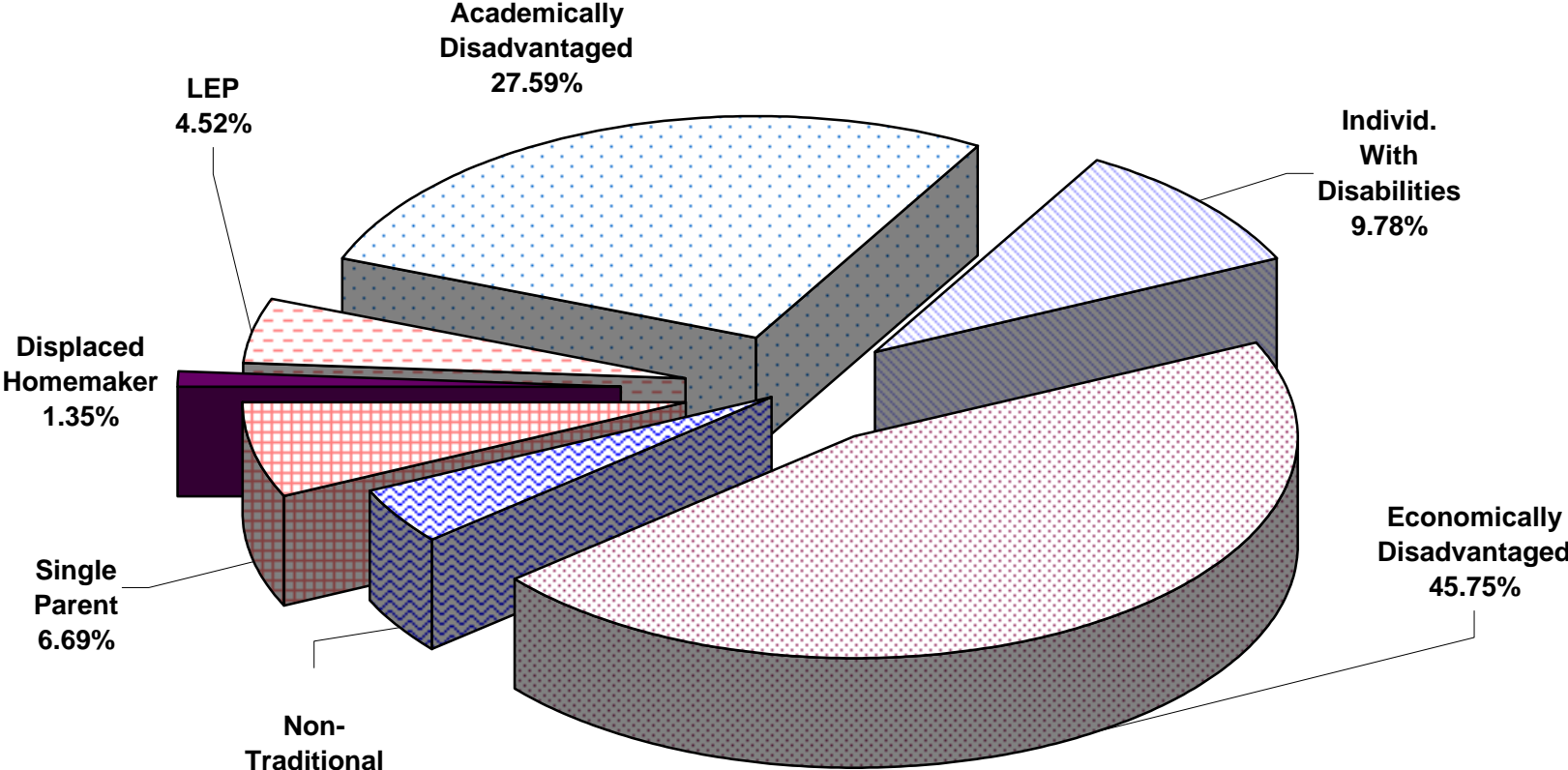

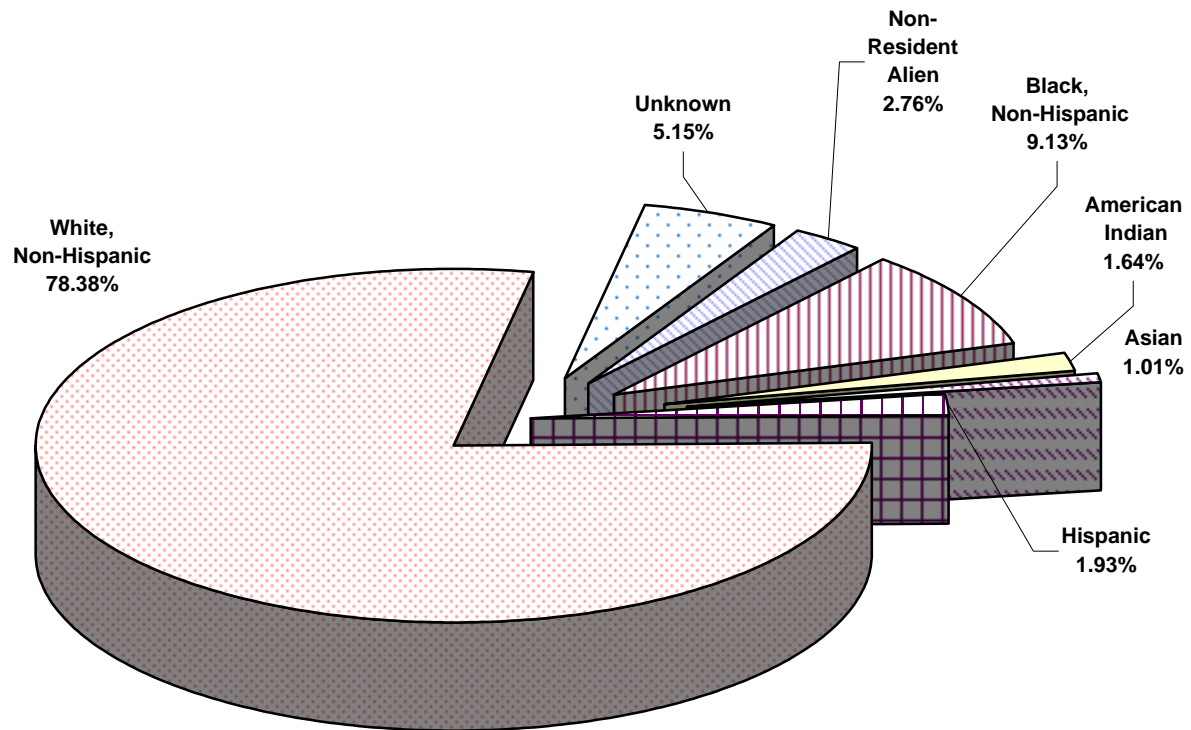
