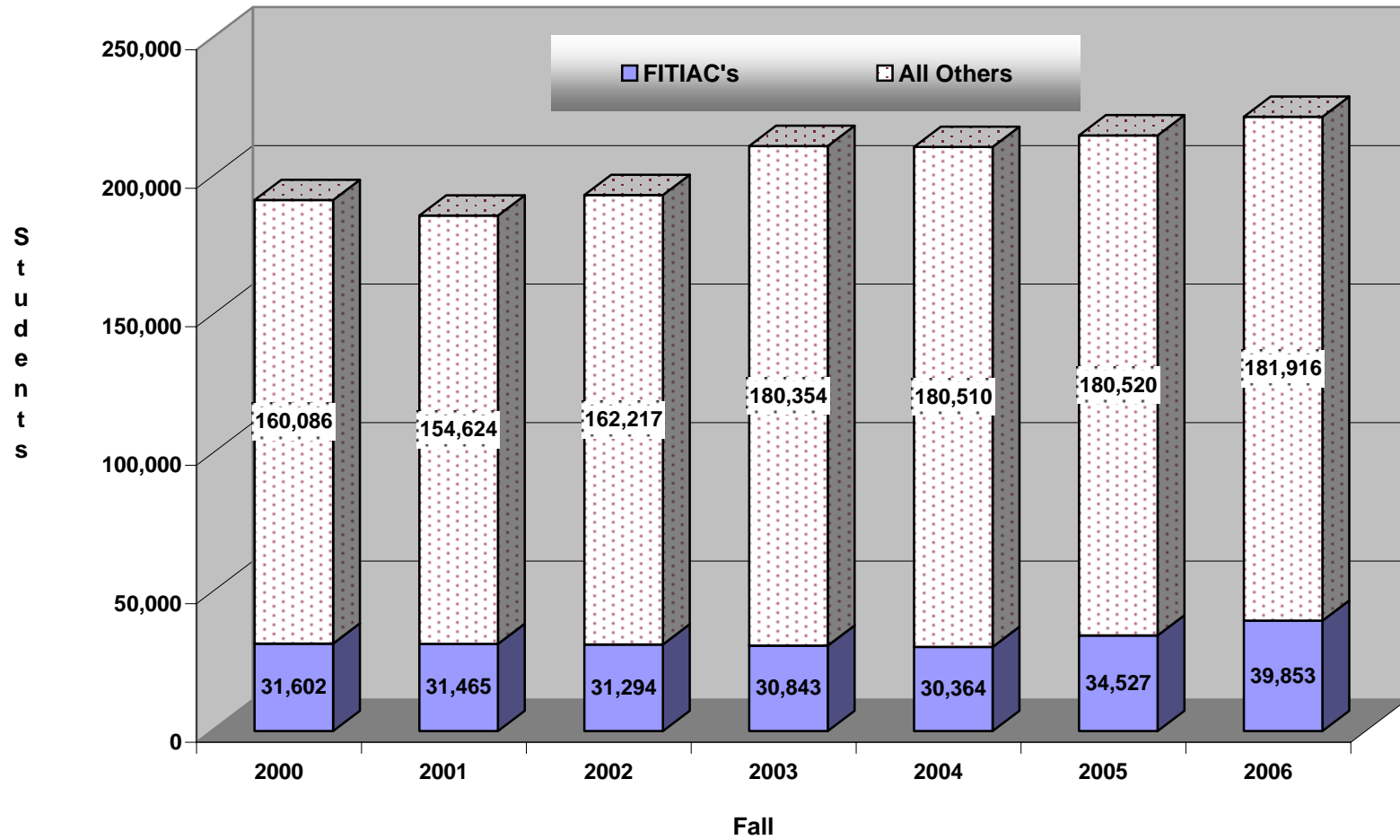

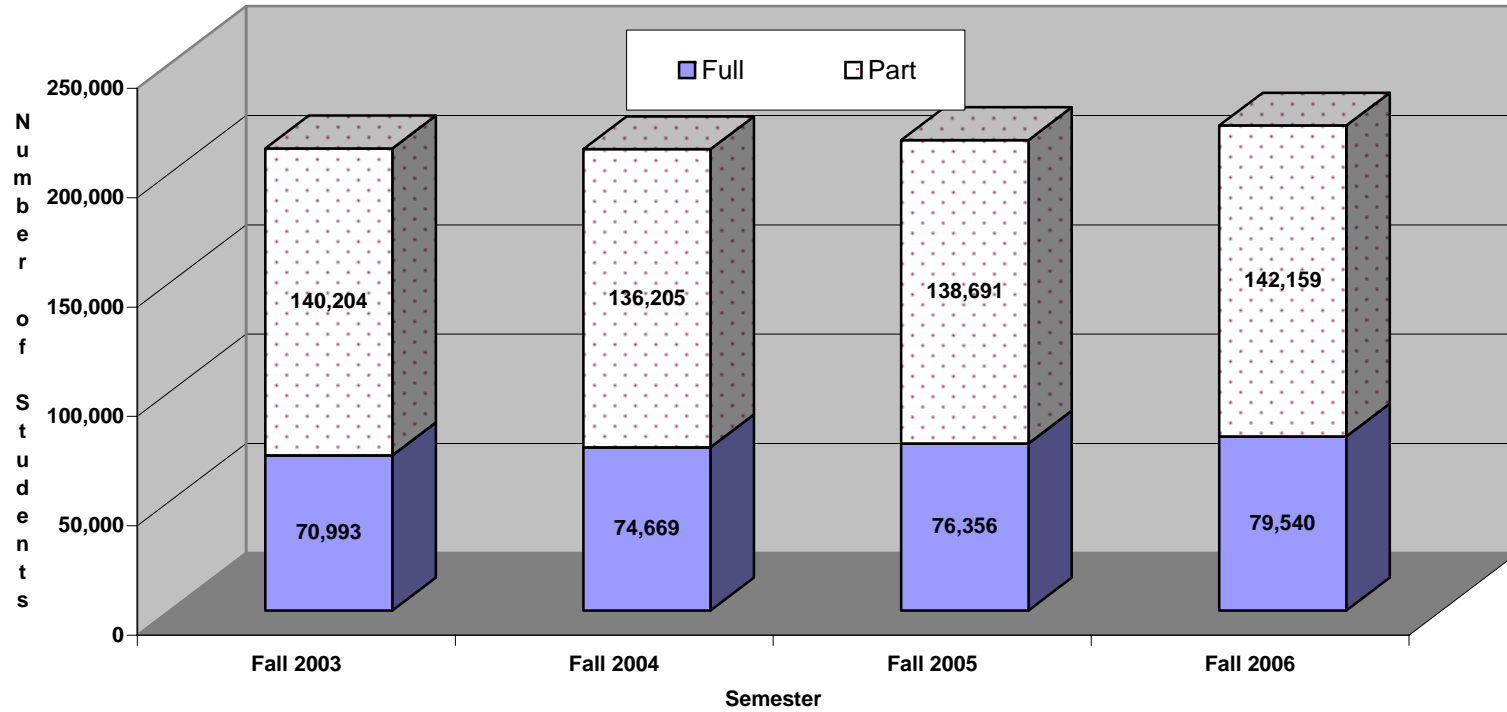

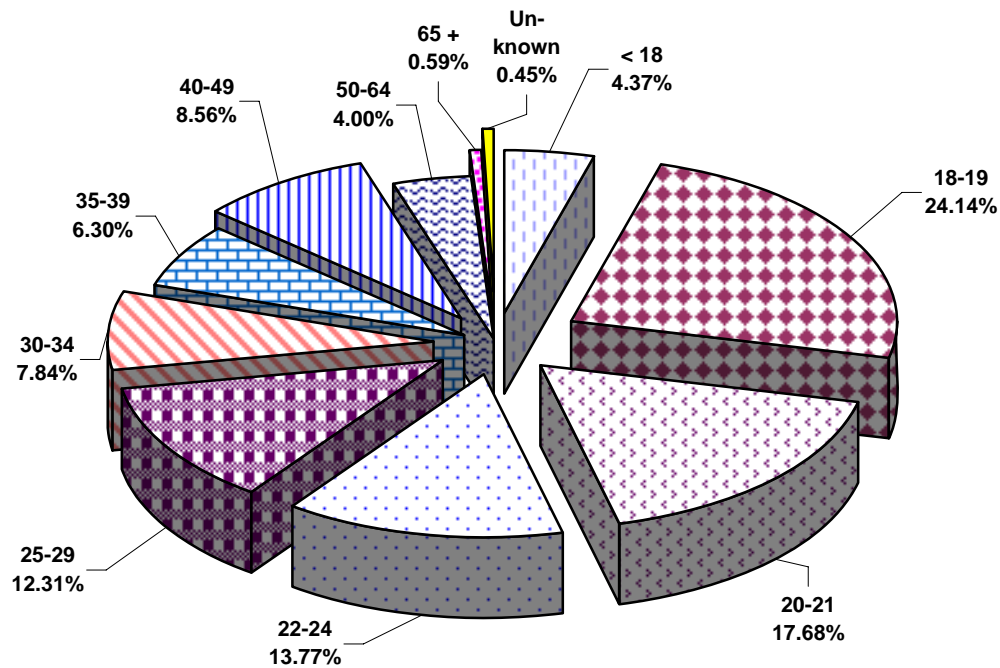

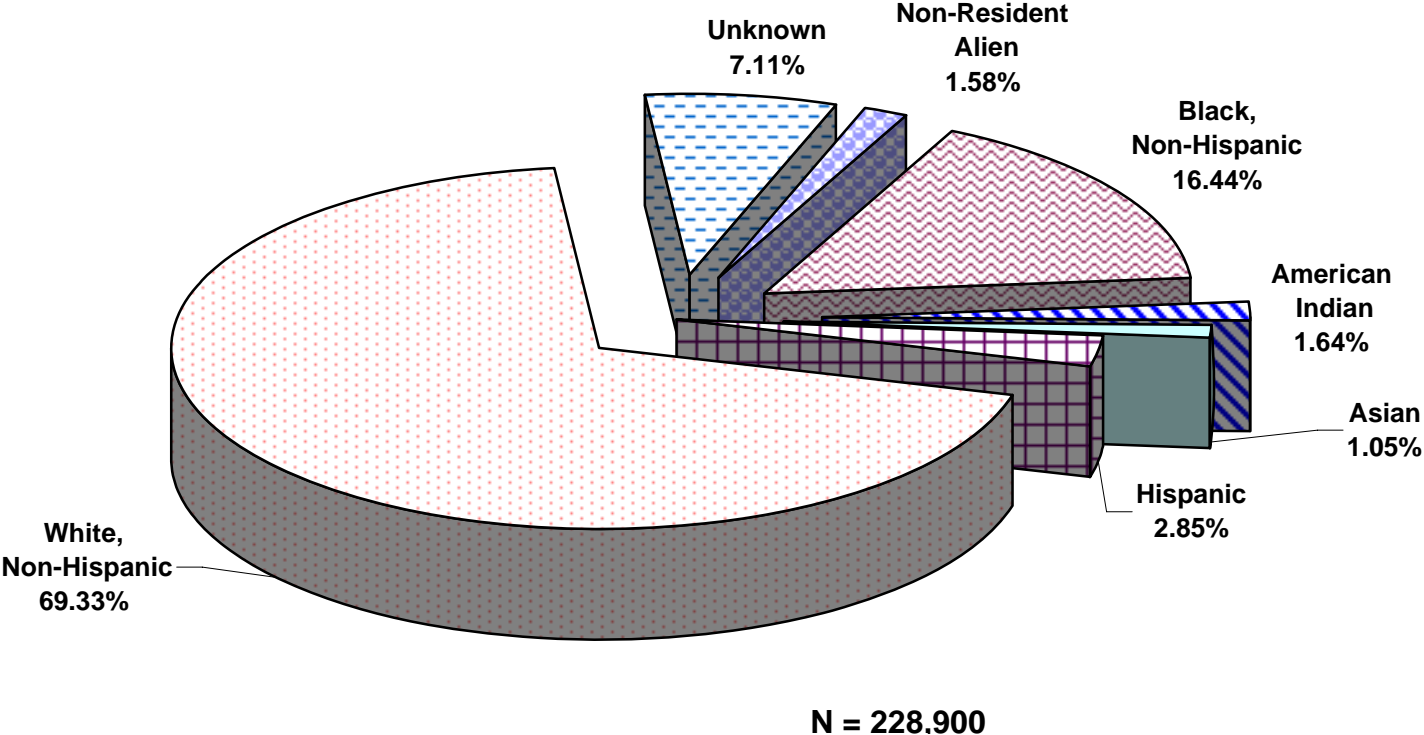

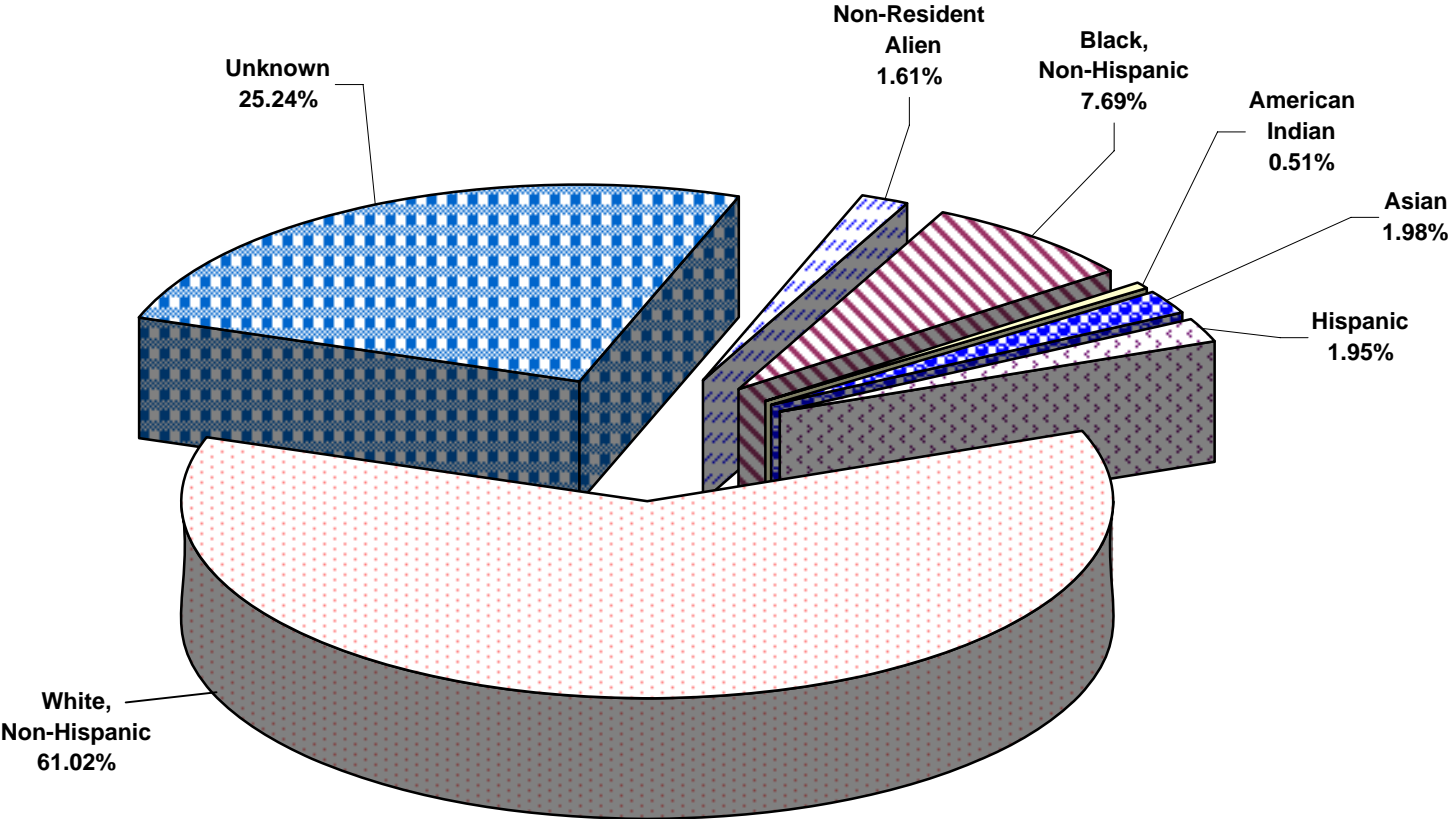

## TOTAL YEAR-END ENROLLMENTS BY COMMUNITY COLLEGE, 2002-03 Through 2005-06

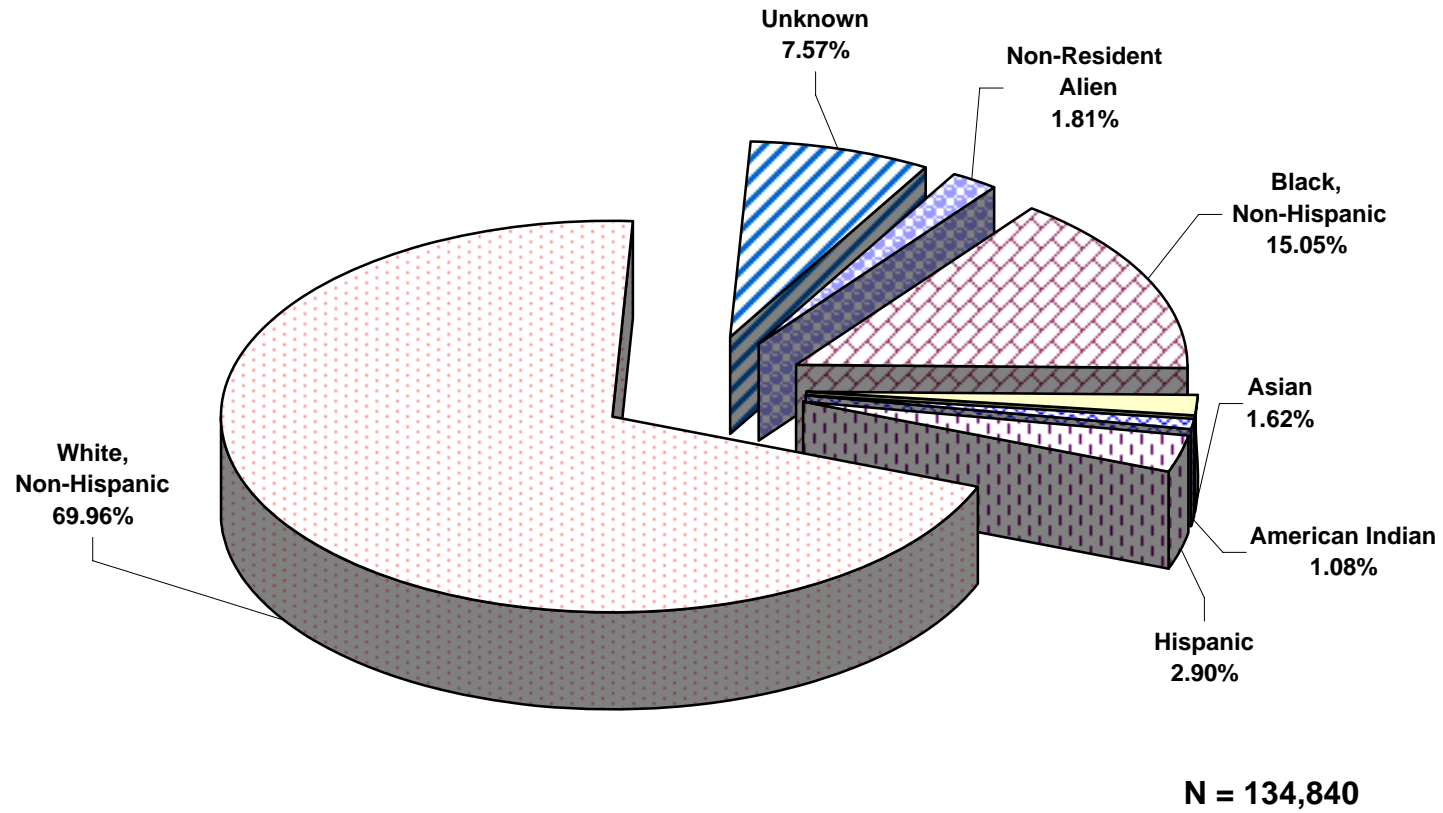

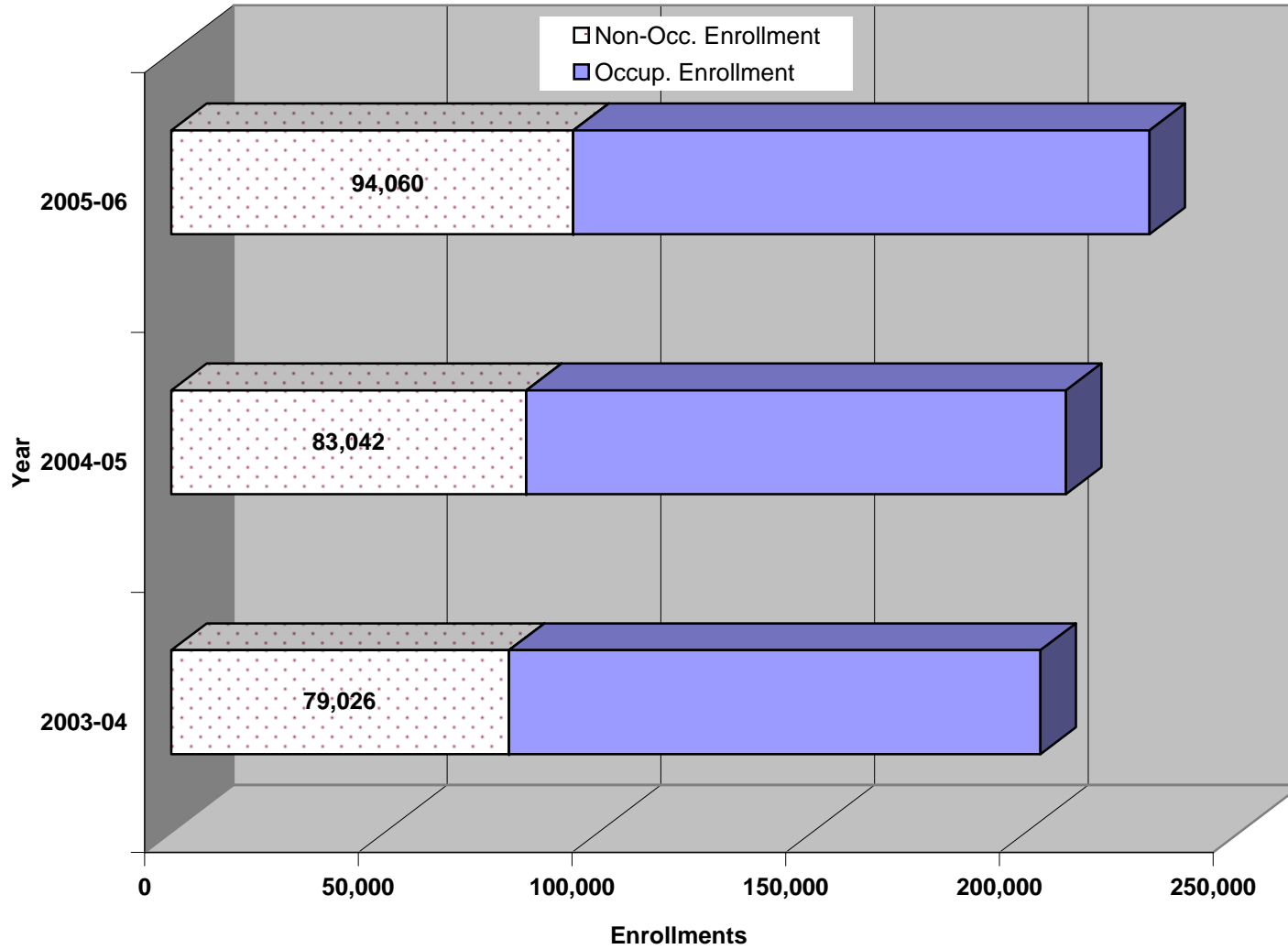

2003-04 THROUGH 2005-06**

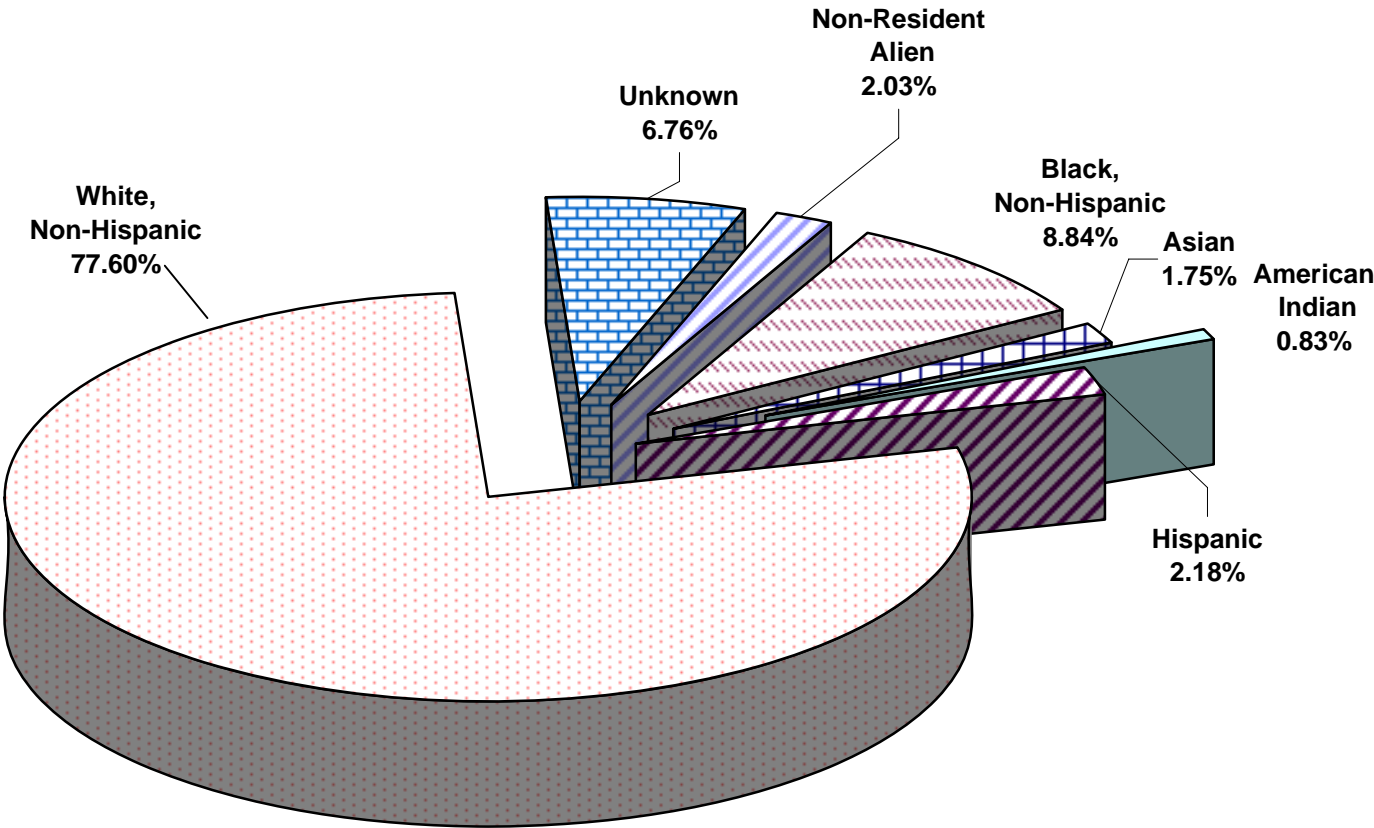

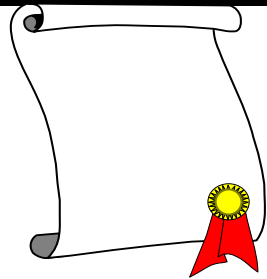

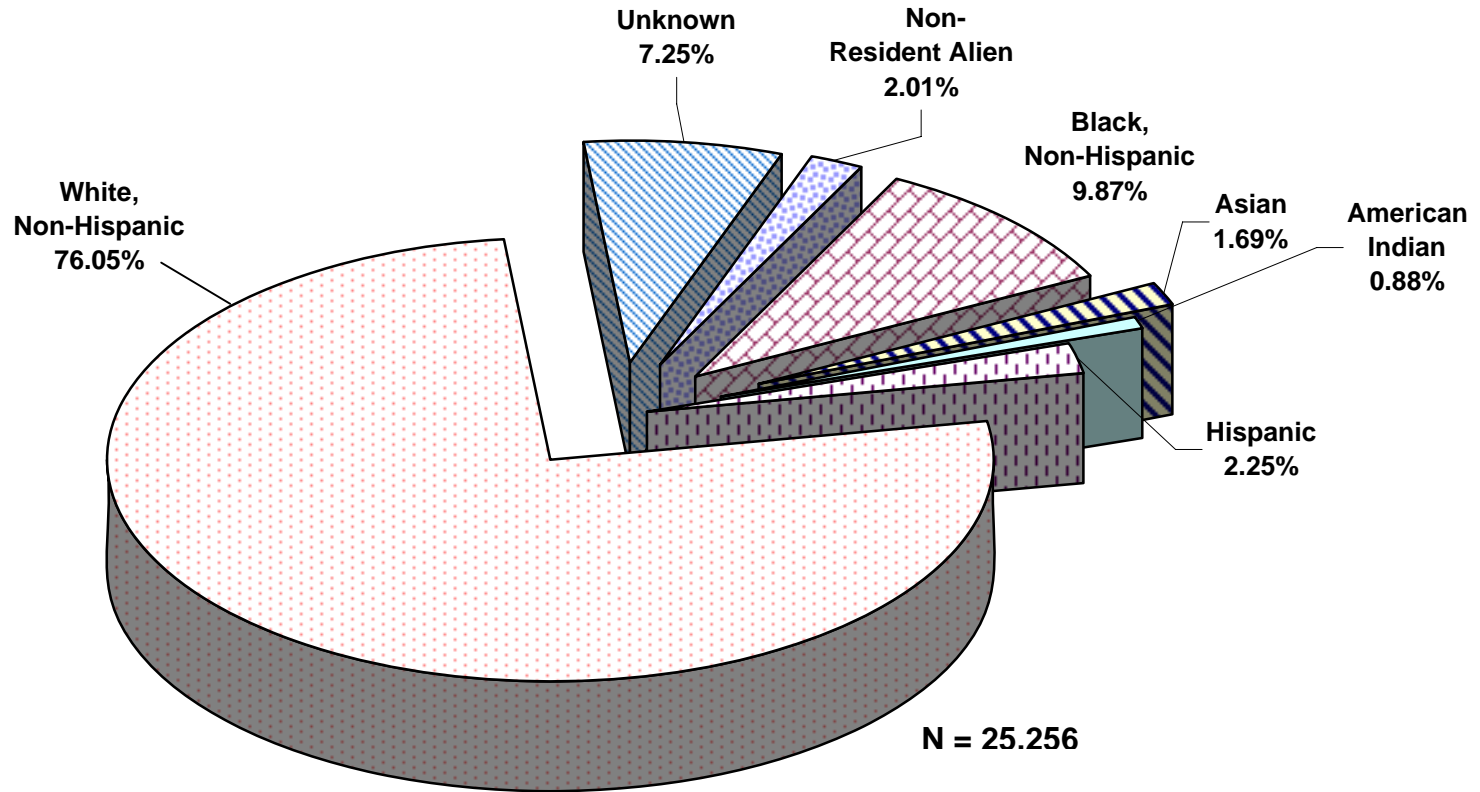
