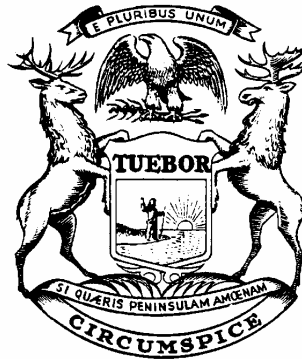

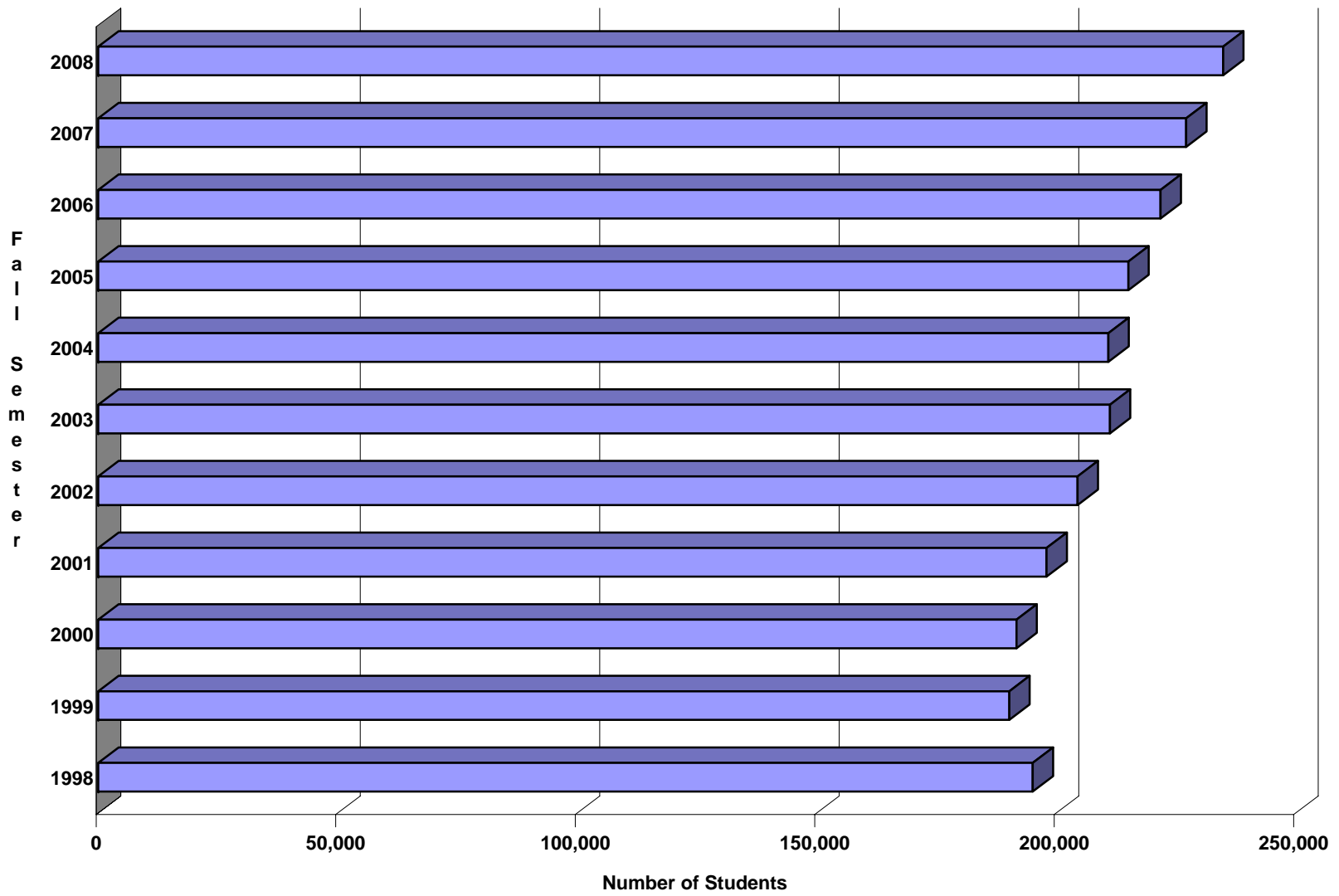

# TEN YEAR HISTORY OF FALL ENROLLMENTS



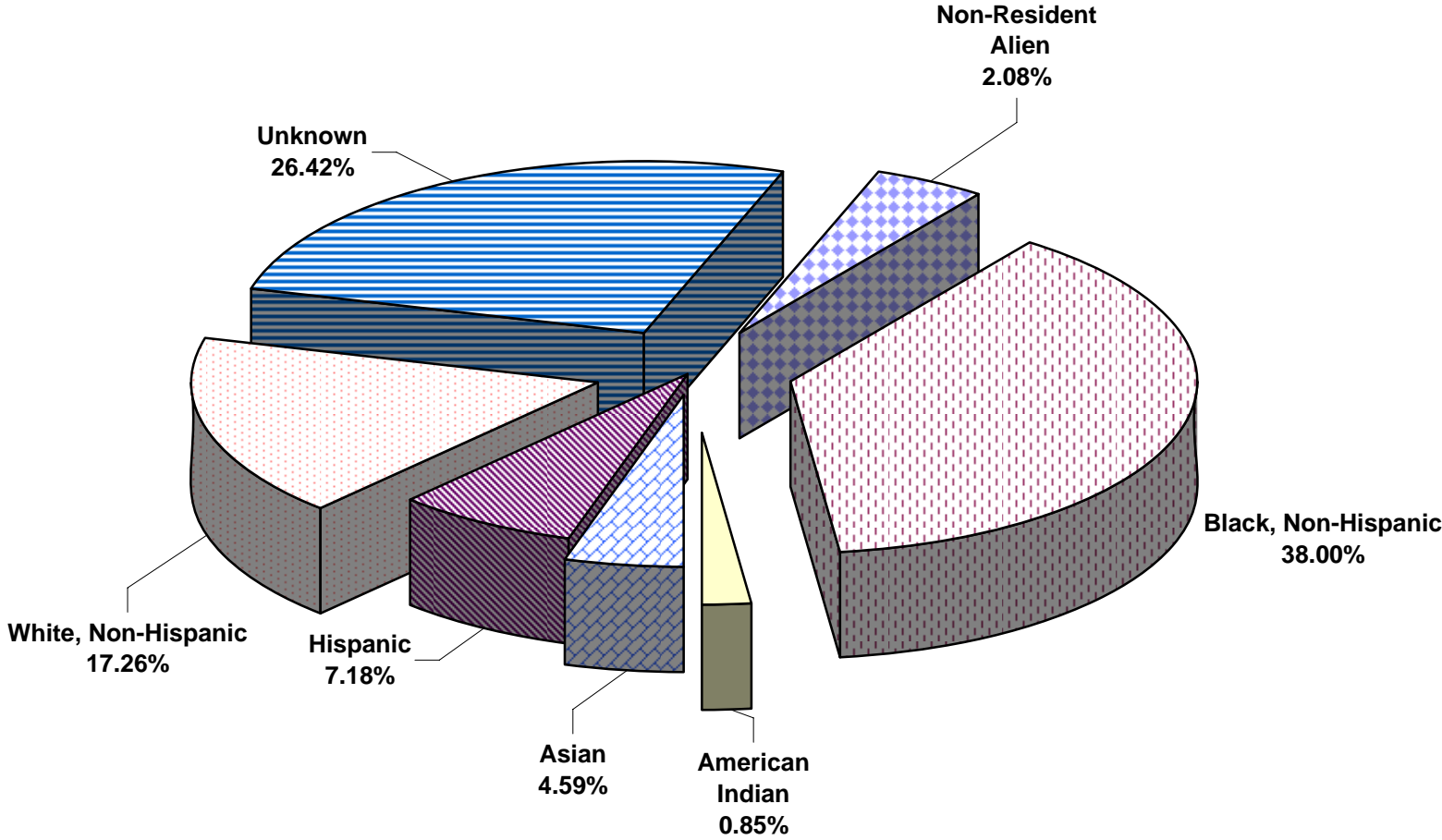

# FALL 2008 ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY

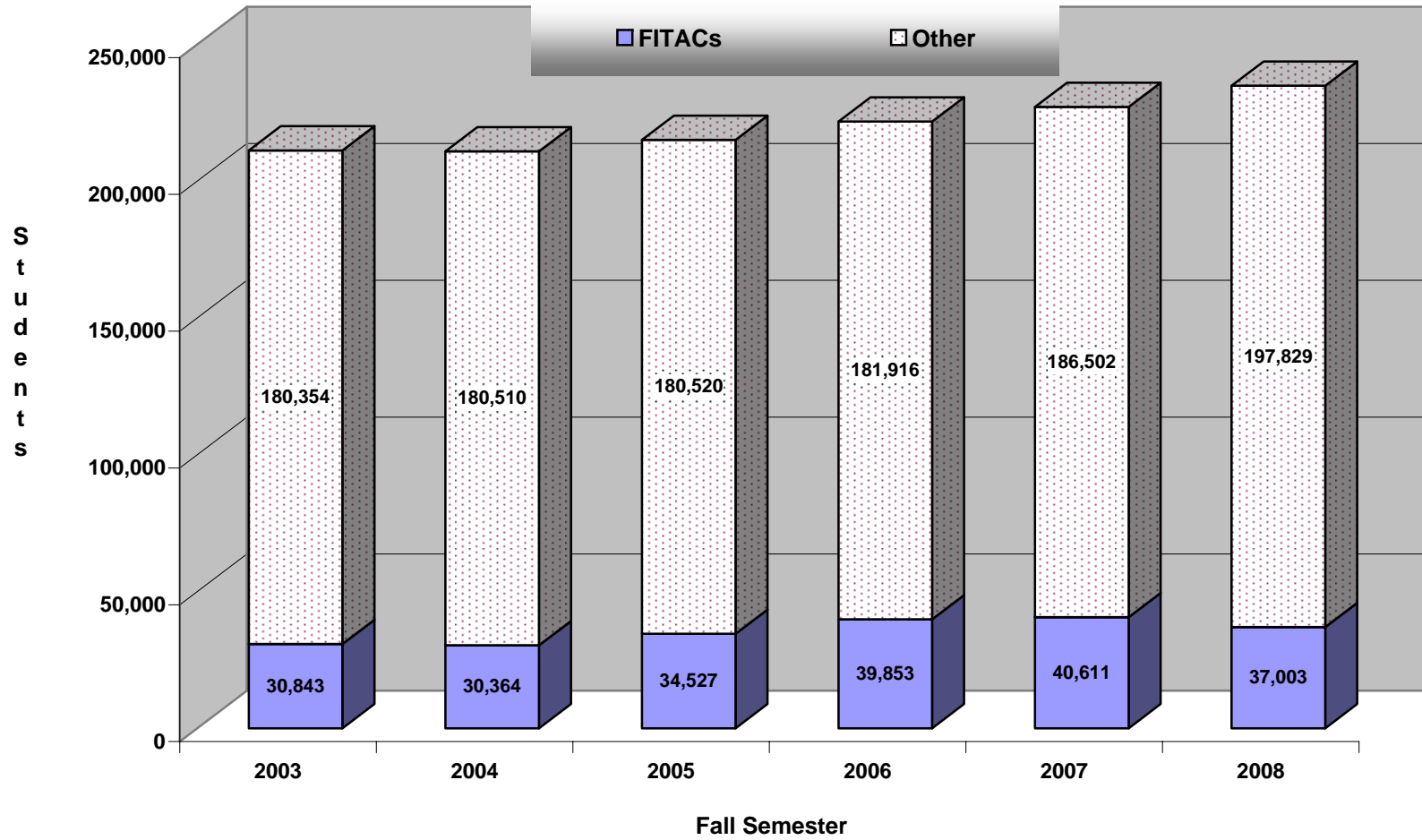

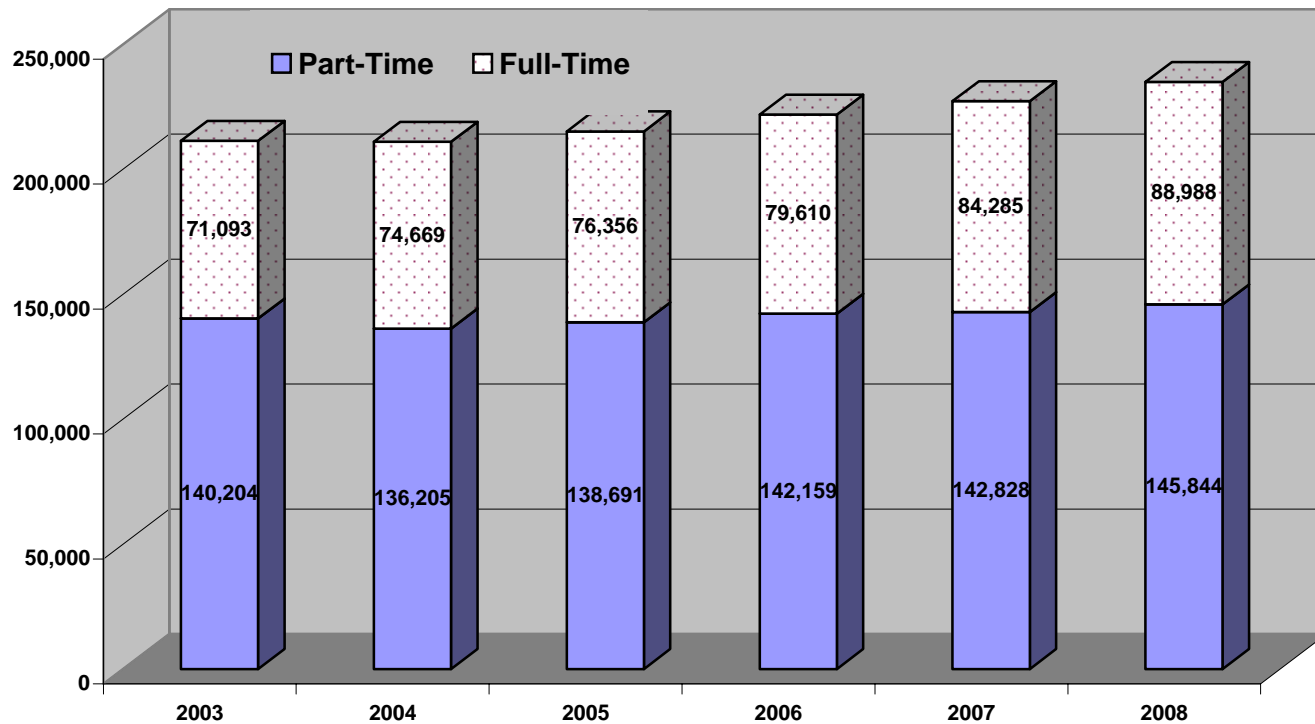

## ENROLLMENT BY STATUS, FALL 2003 - FALL 2008



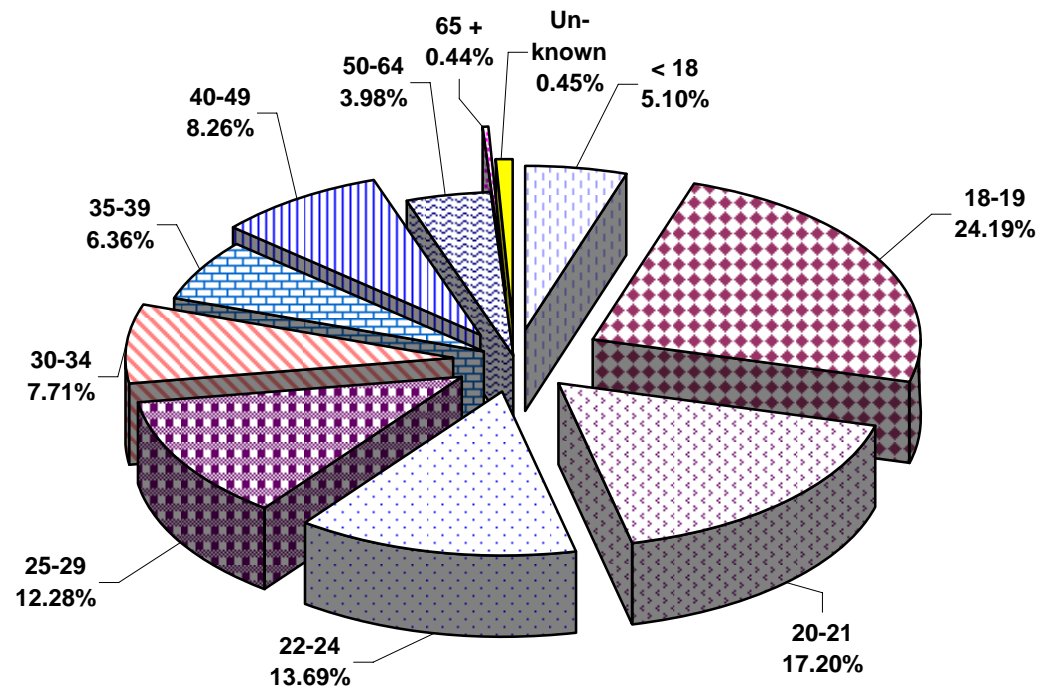
*Full-Time enrollment has continuously increased since Fall 2003, exhibiting an overall increase of 25.2% since Fall 2003 and a 5.6% increase from Fall 2007 to Fall 2008. Part-Time enrollment has also increased, however, not as dramatically as full-time enrollment. Part-Time enrollment has increased 4.2% since 2003 and increased 2.1% from 2006 to 2007.*

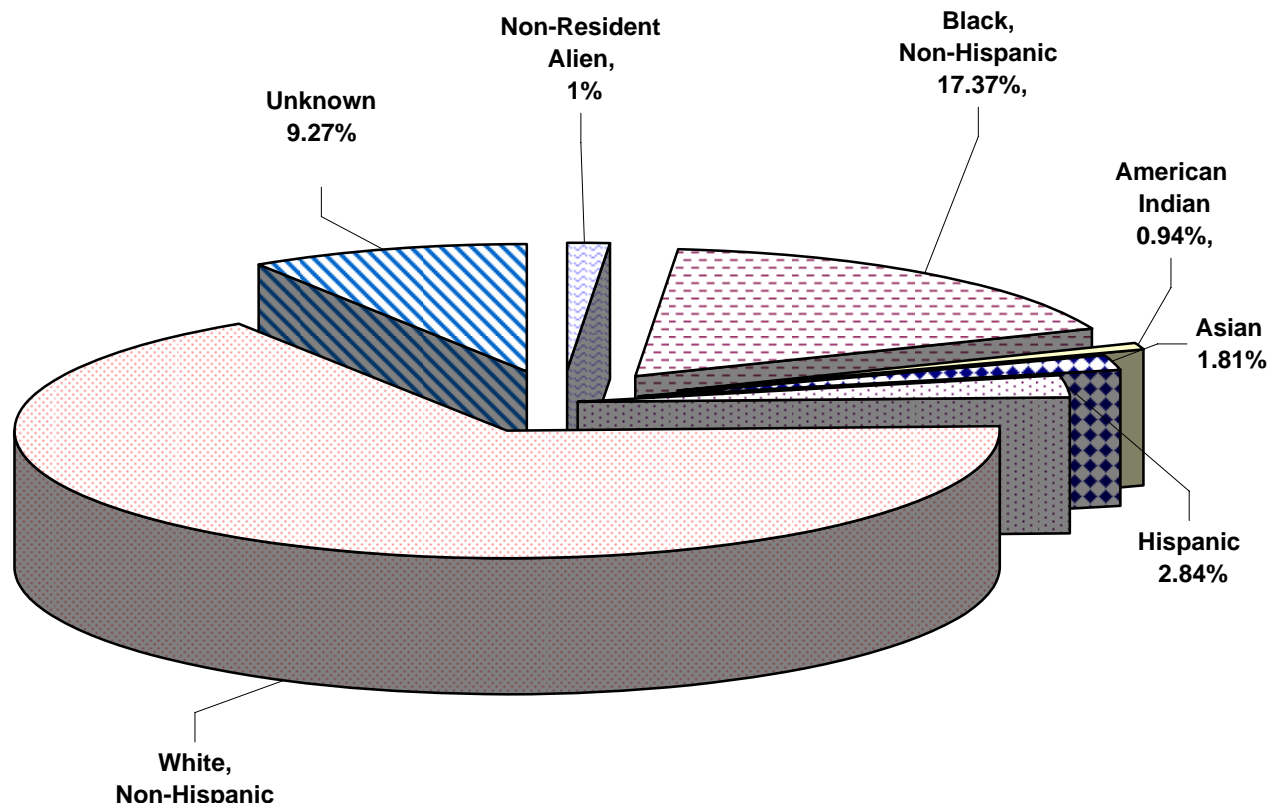

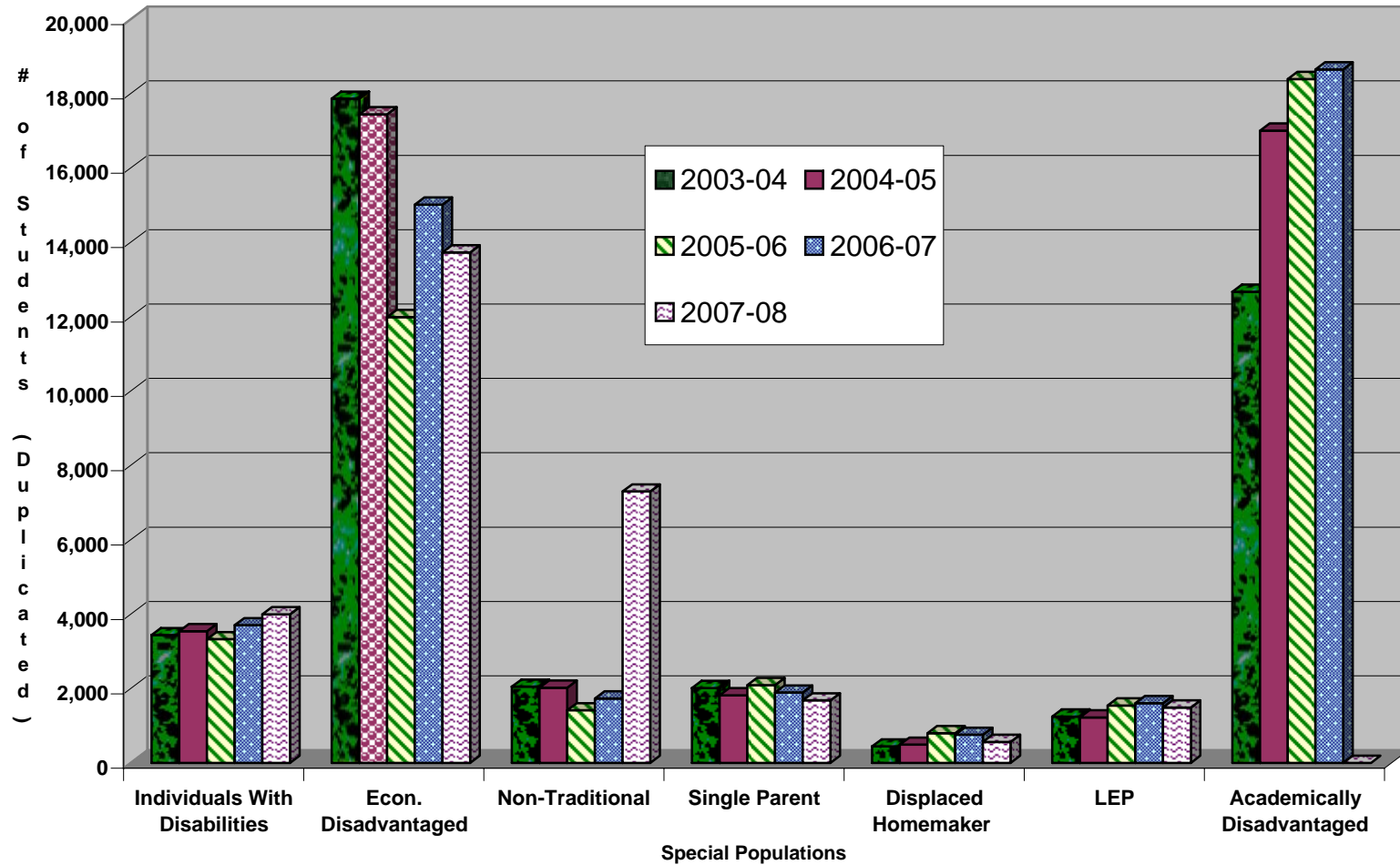

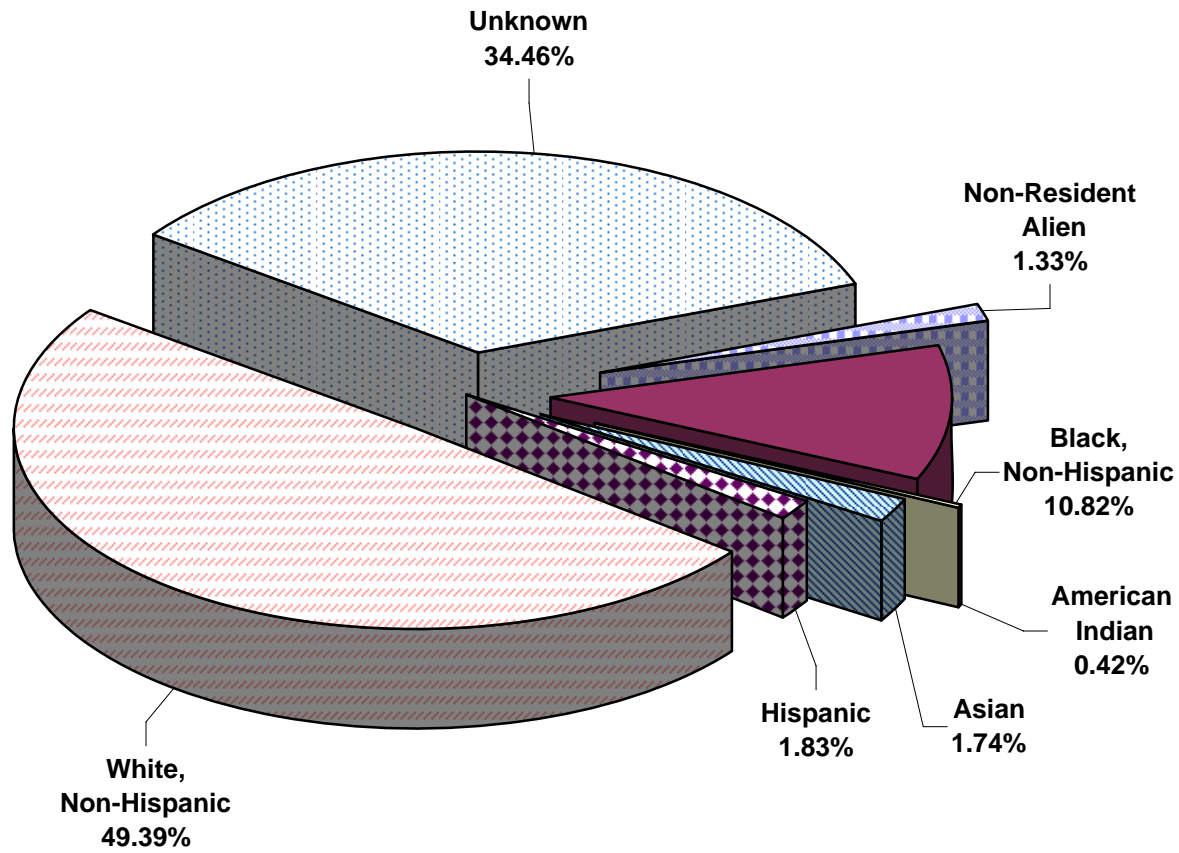

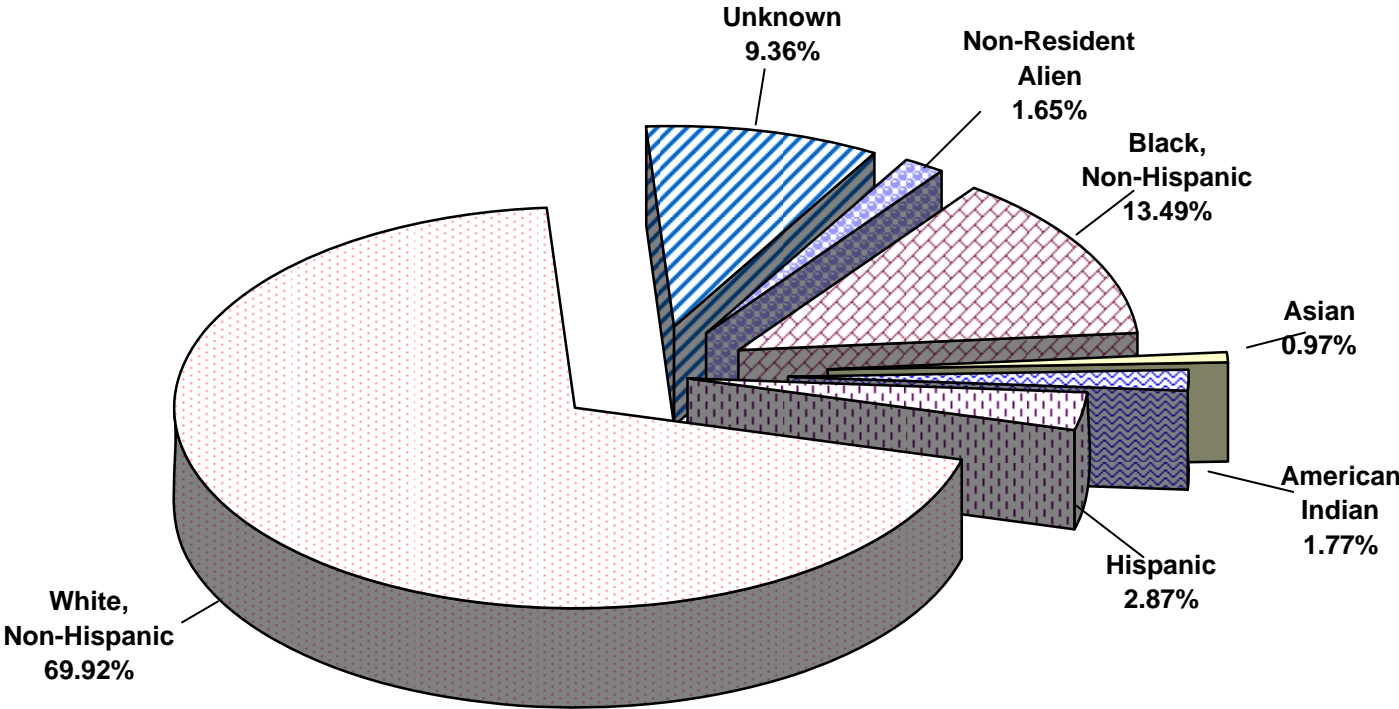

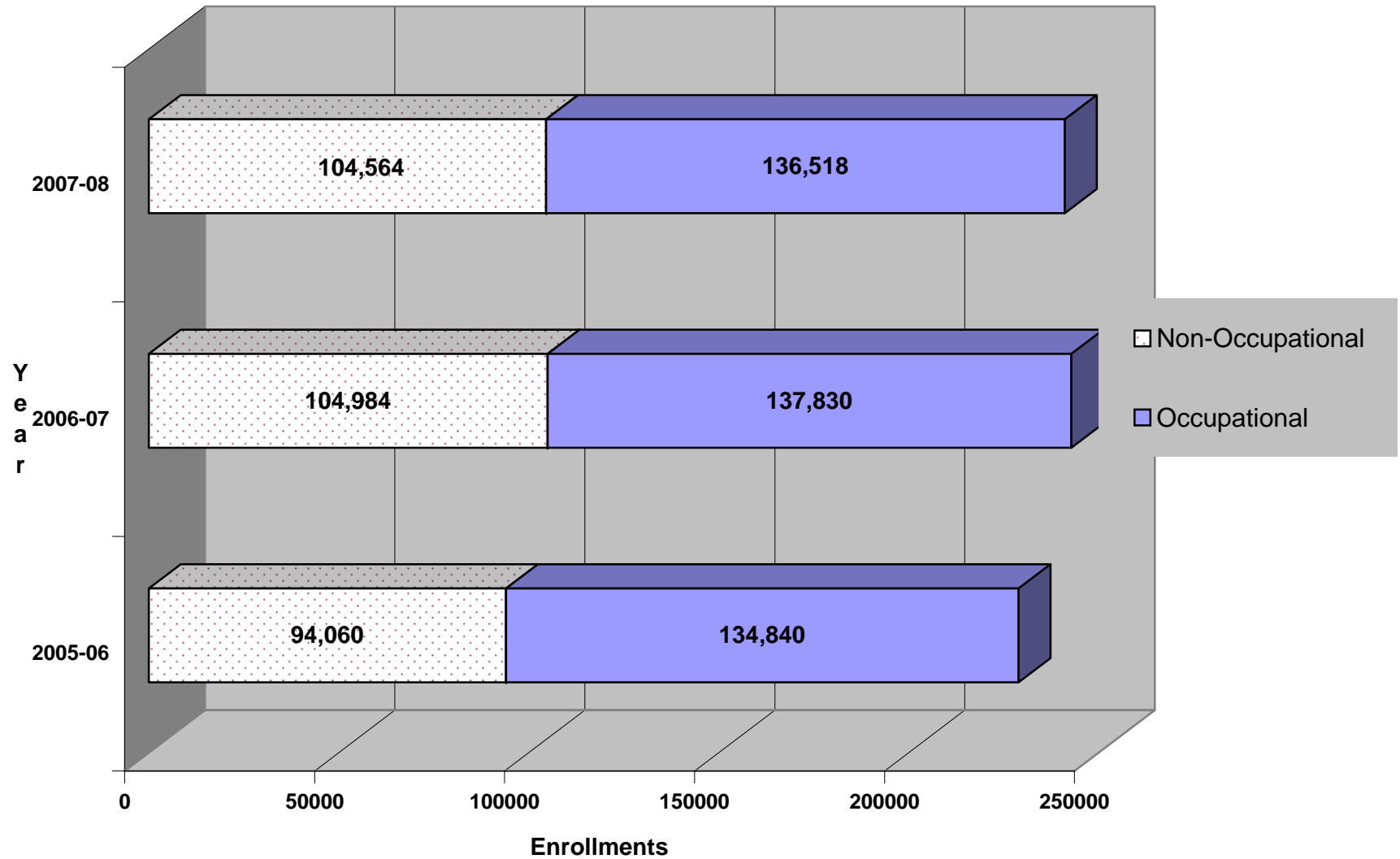

2005-06 THROUGH 2007-08**



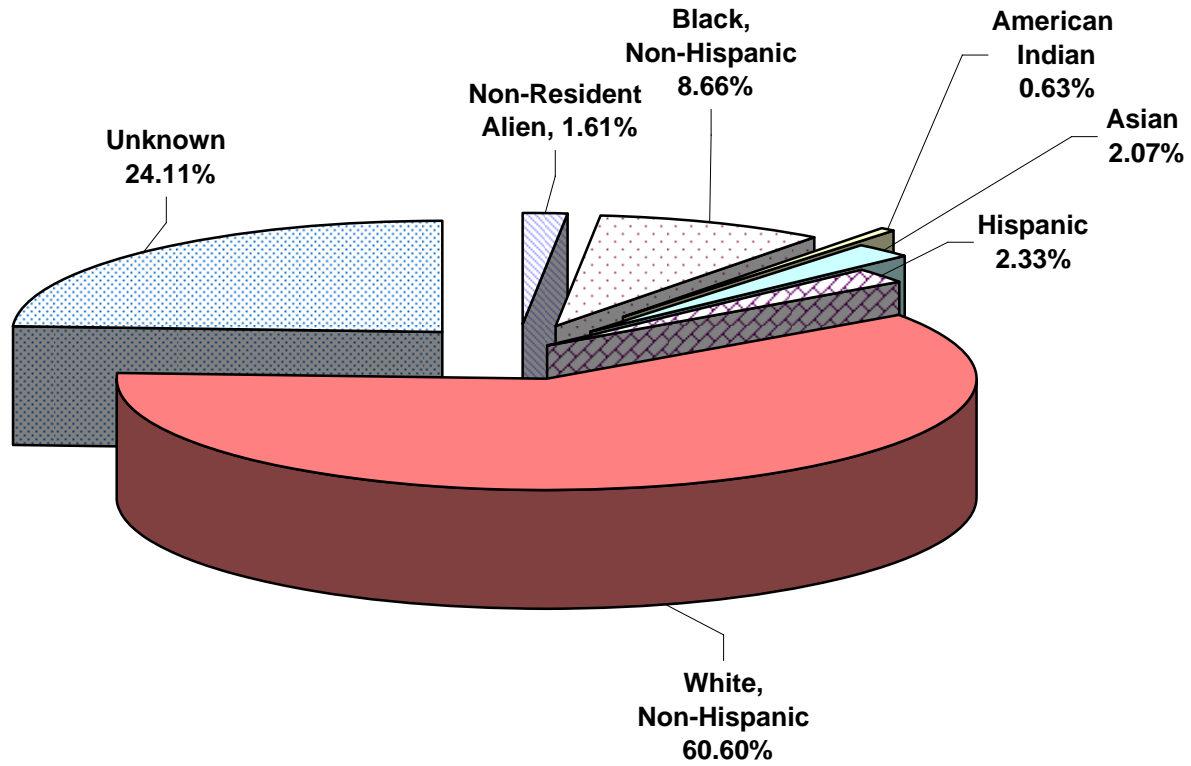

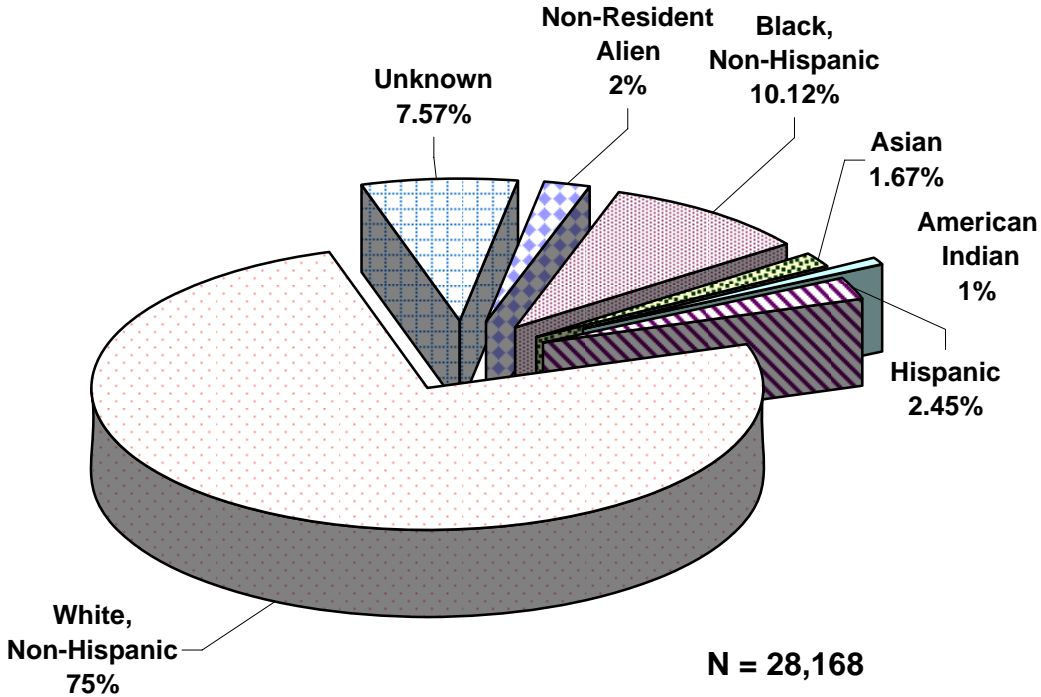
