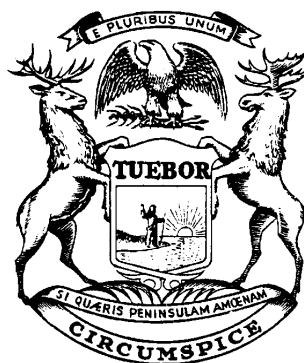

TEN YEAR HISTORY OF FALL ENROLLMENTS

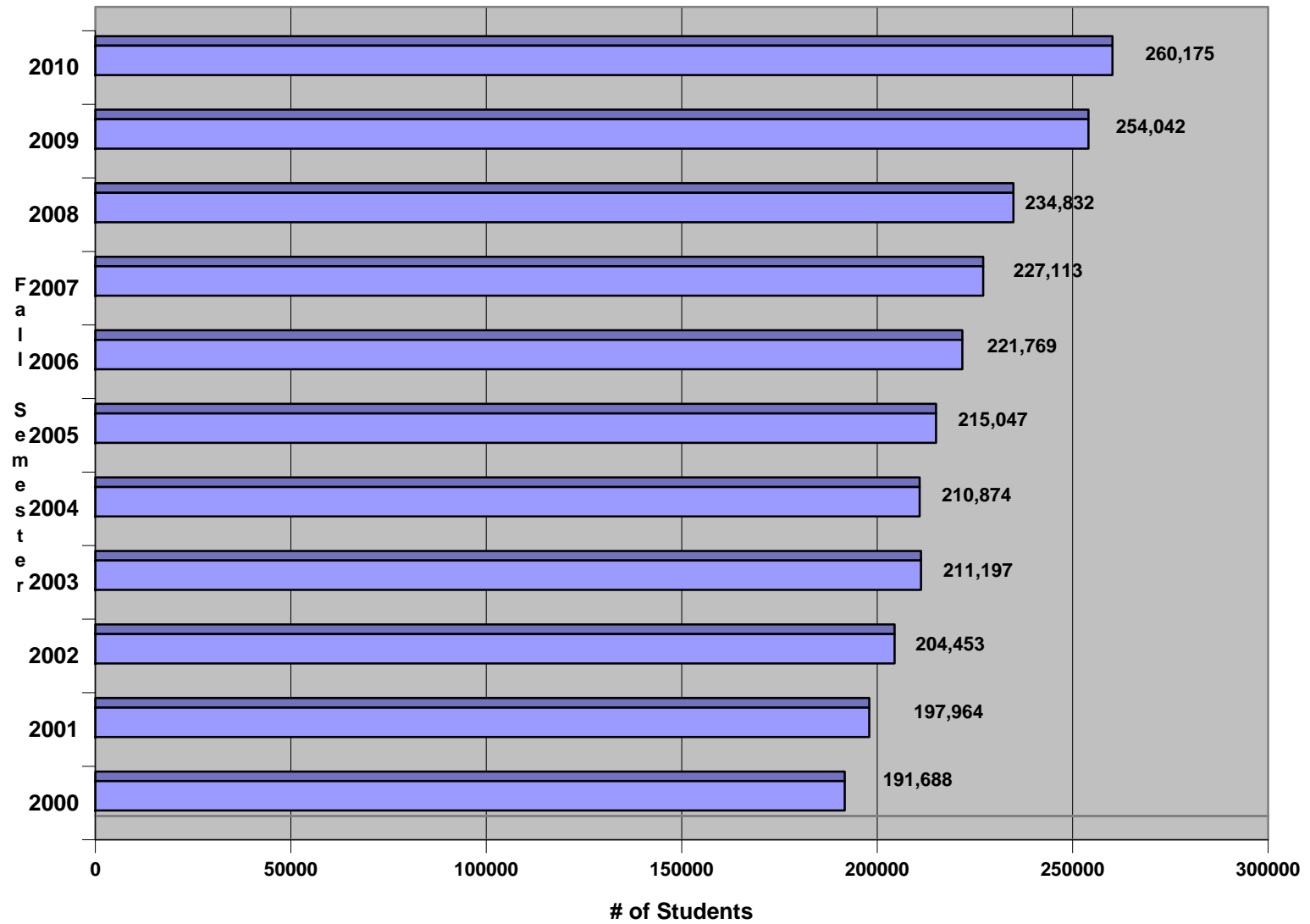

FALL 2010 ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY

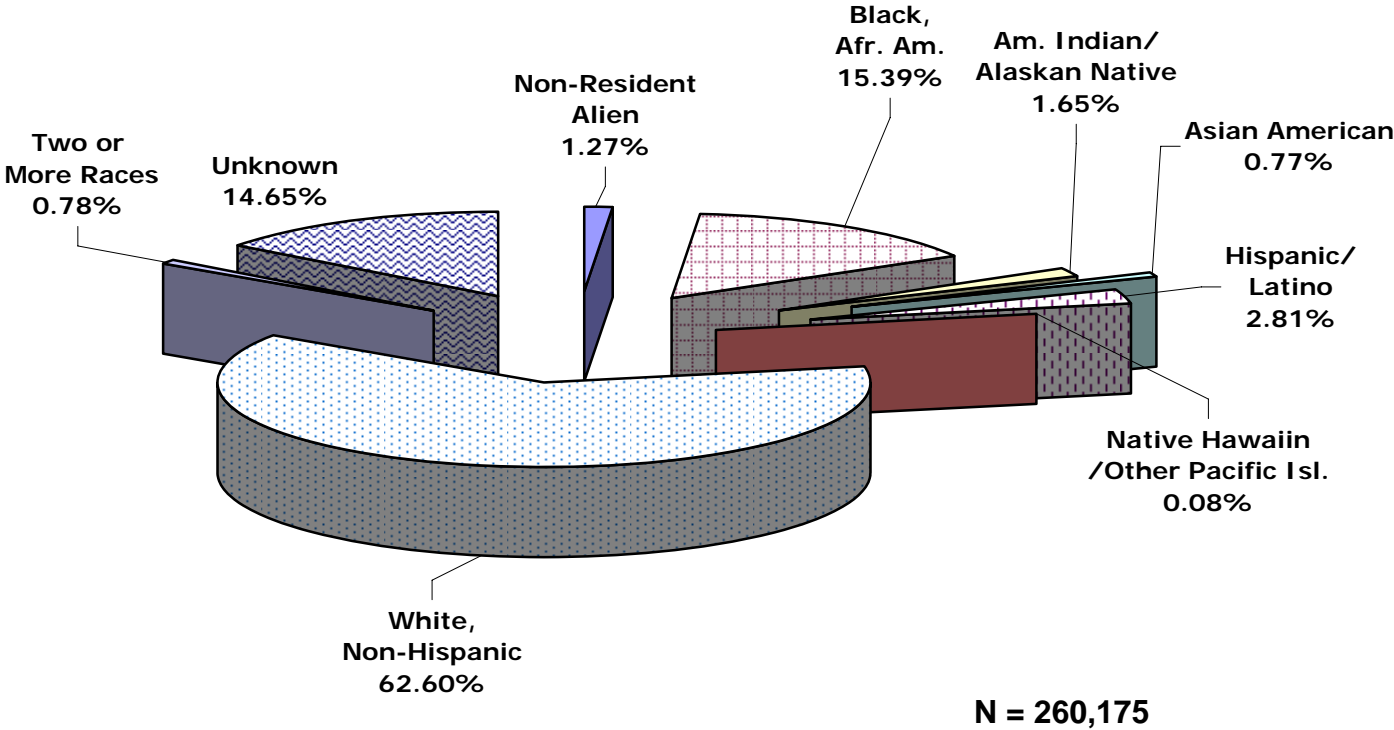

NUMBER of FITIAC's AS COMPARED TO TOTAL POPULATION

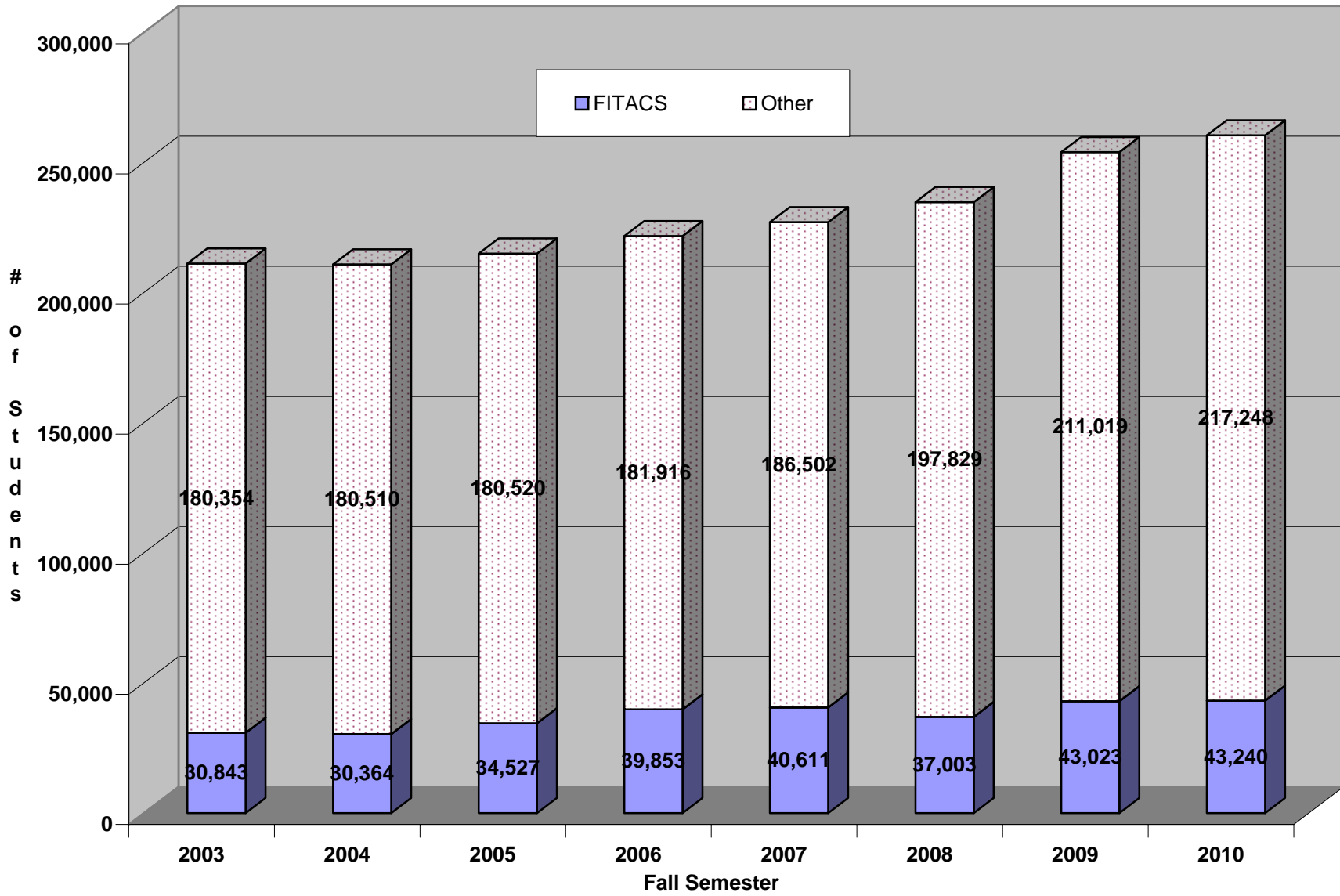

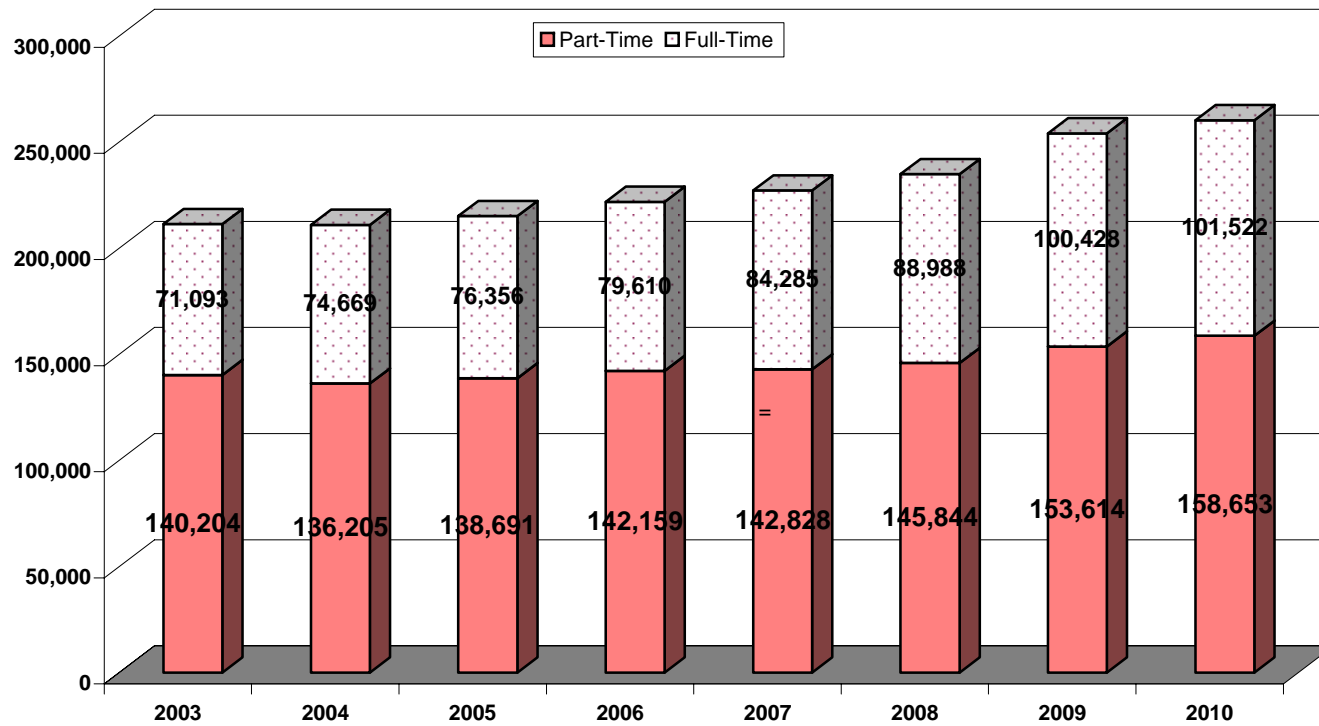

FALL 2010: ENROLLMENT BY AGE

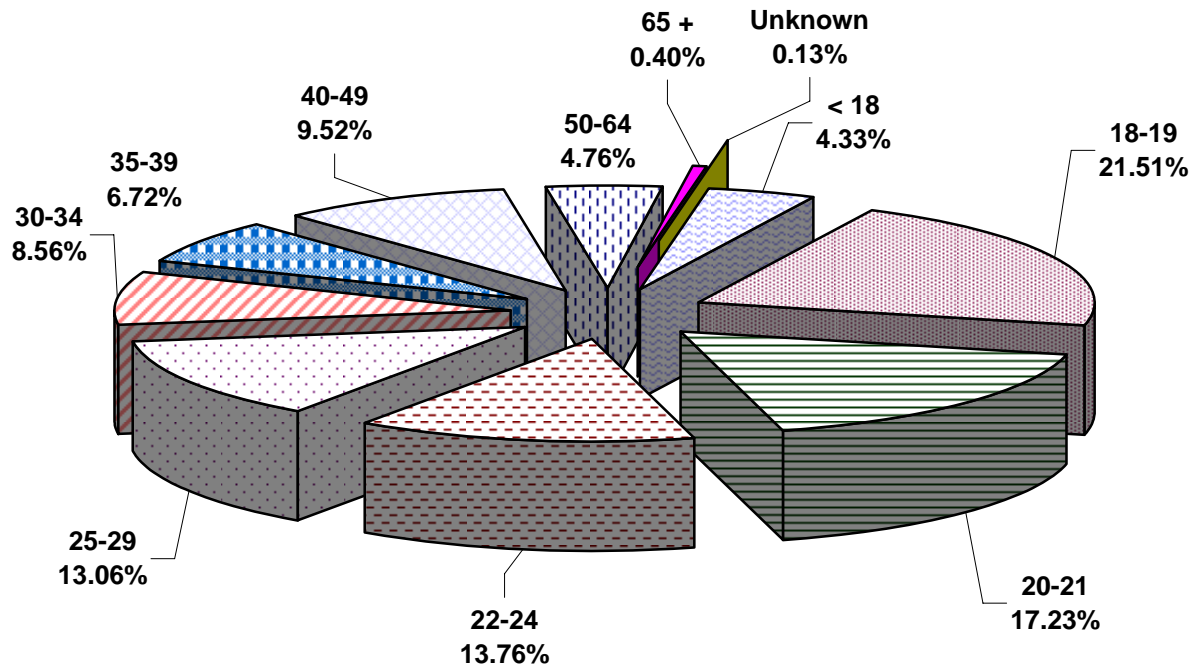

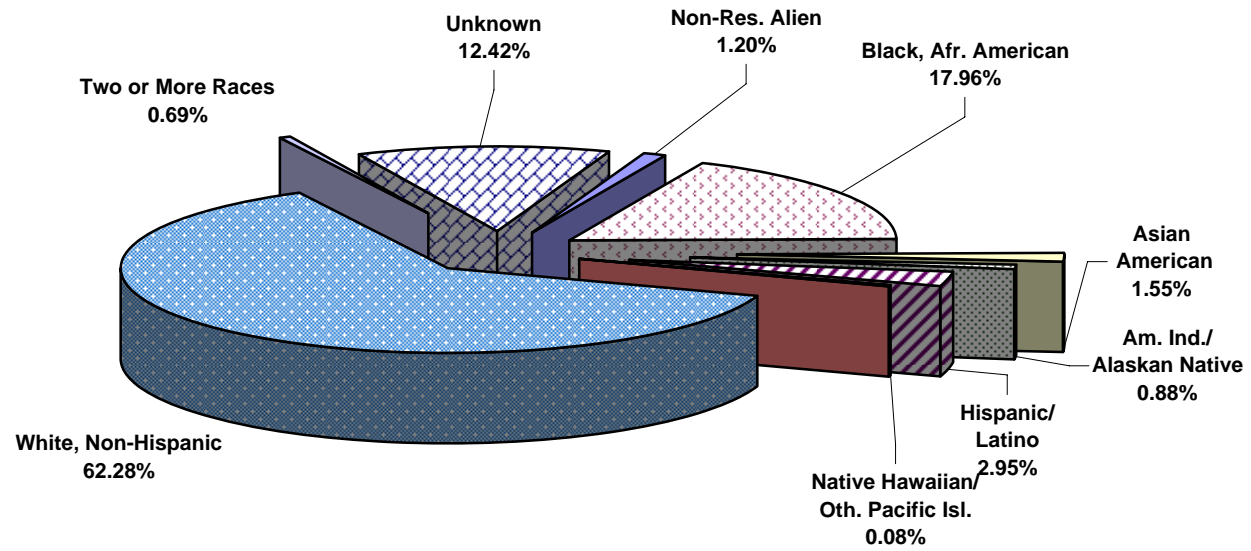

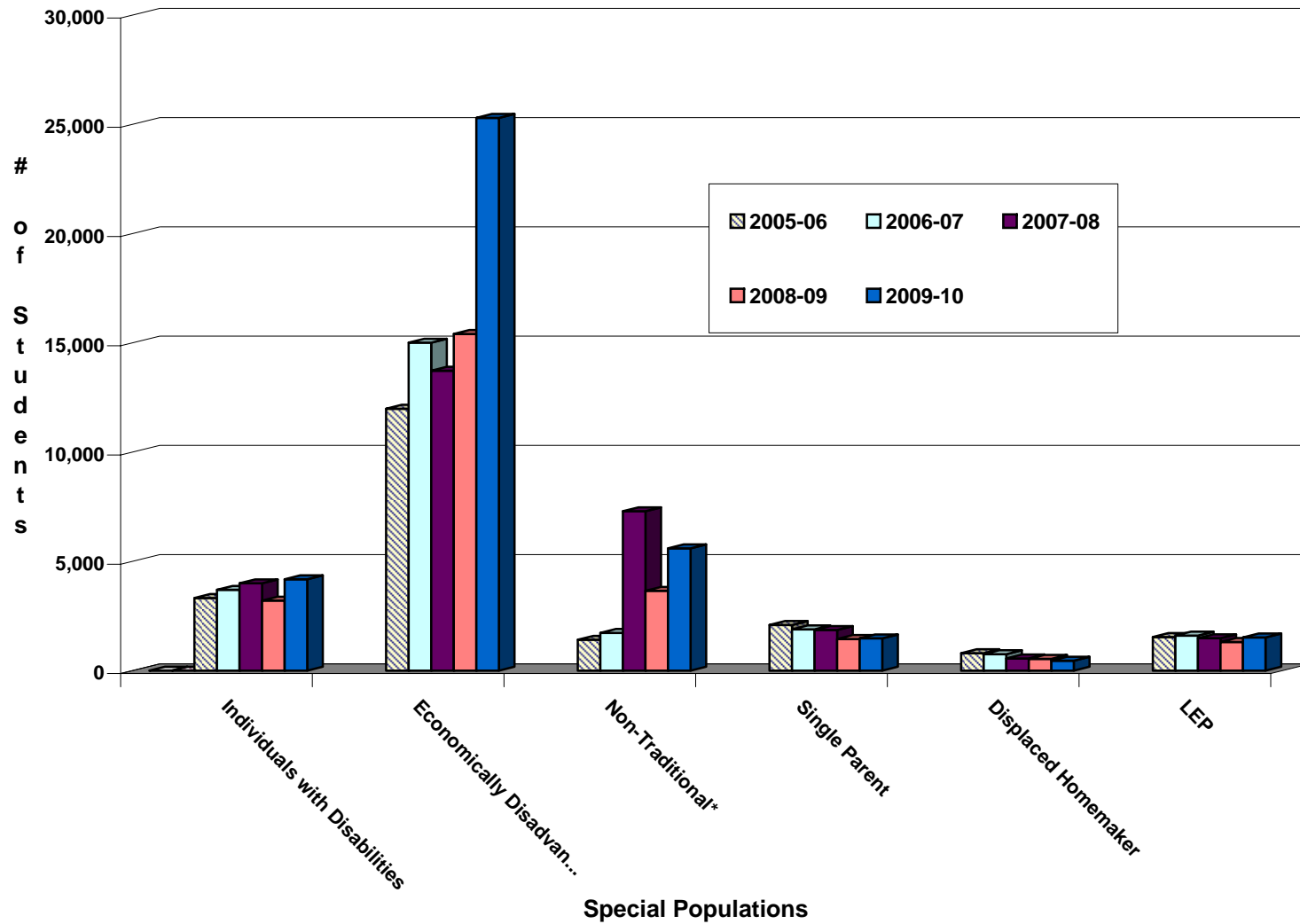

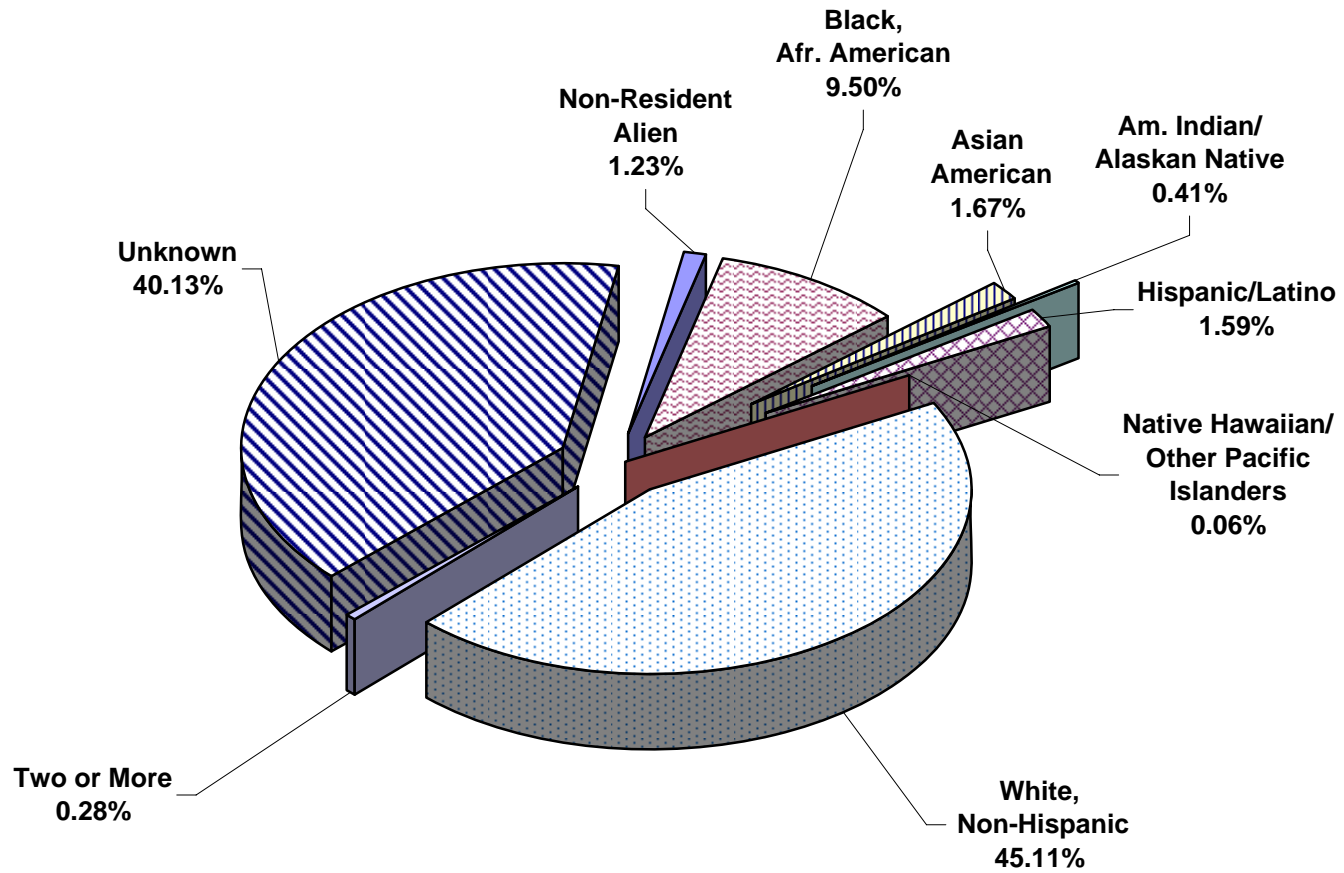

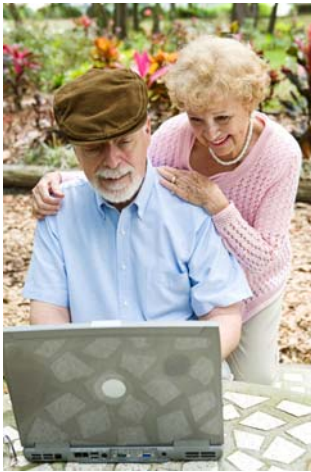

OCCUPATIONAL YEAR-END PROGRAM ENROLLMENTS BY ETHNICITY, 2009-10

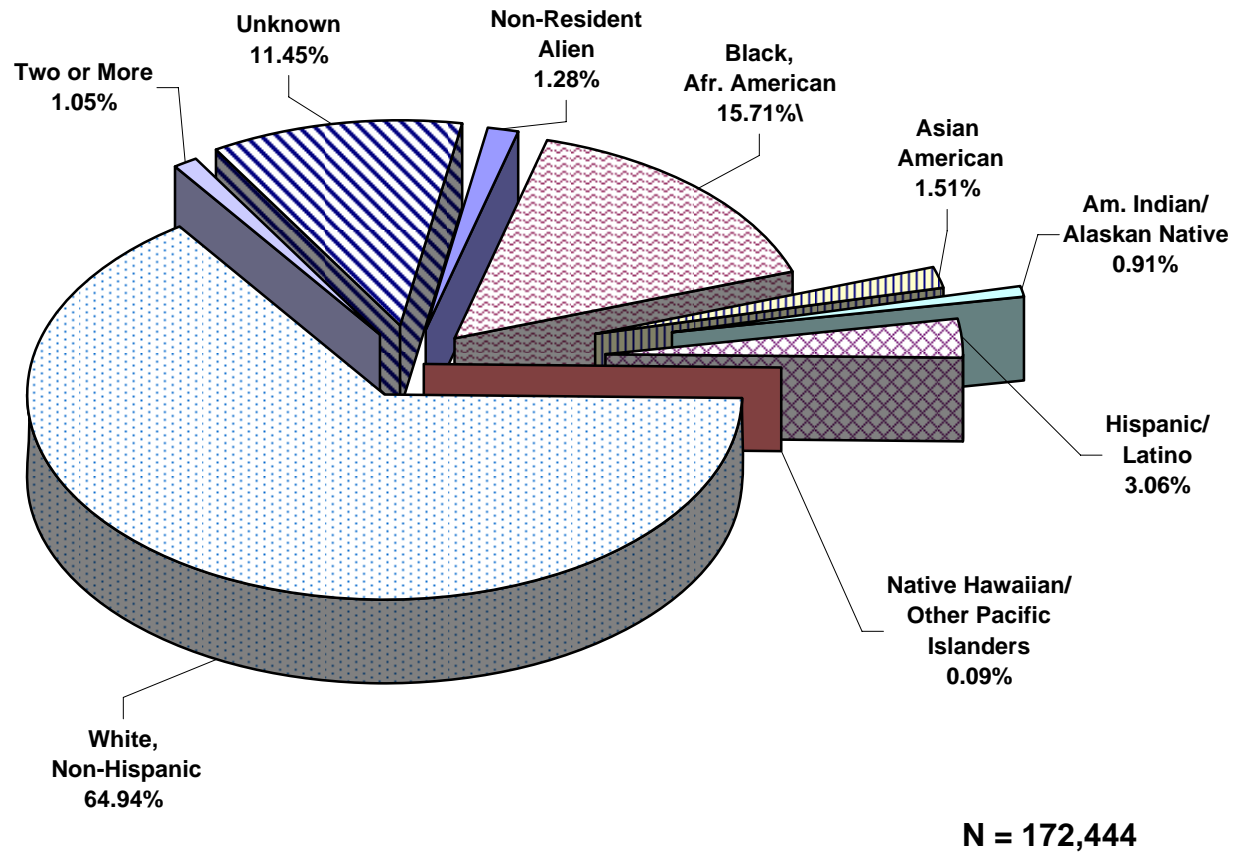

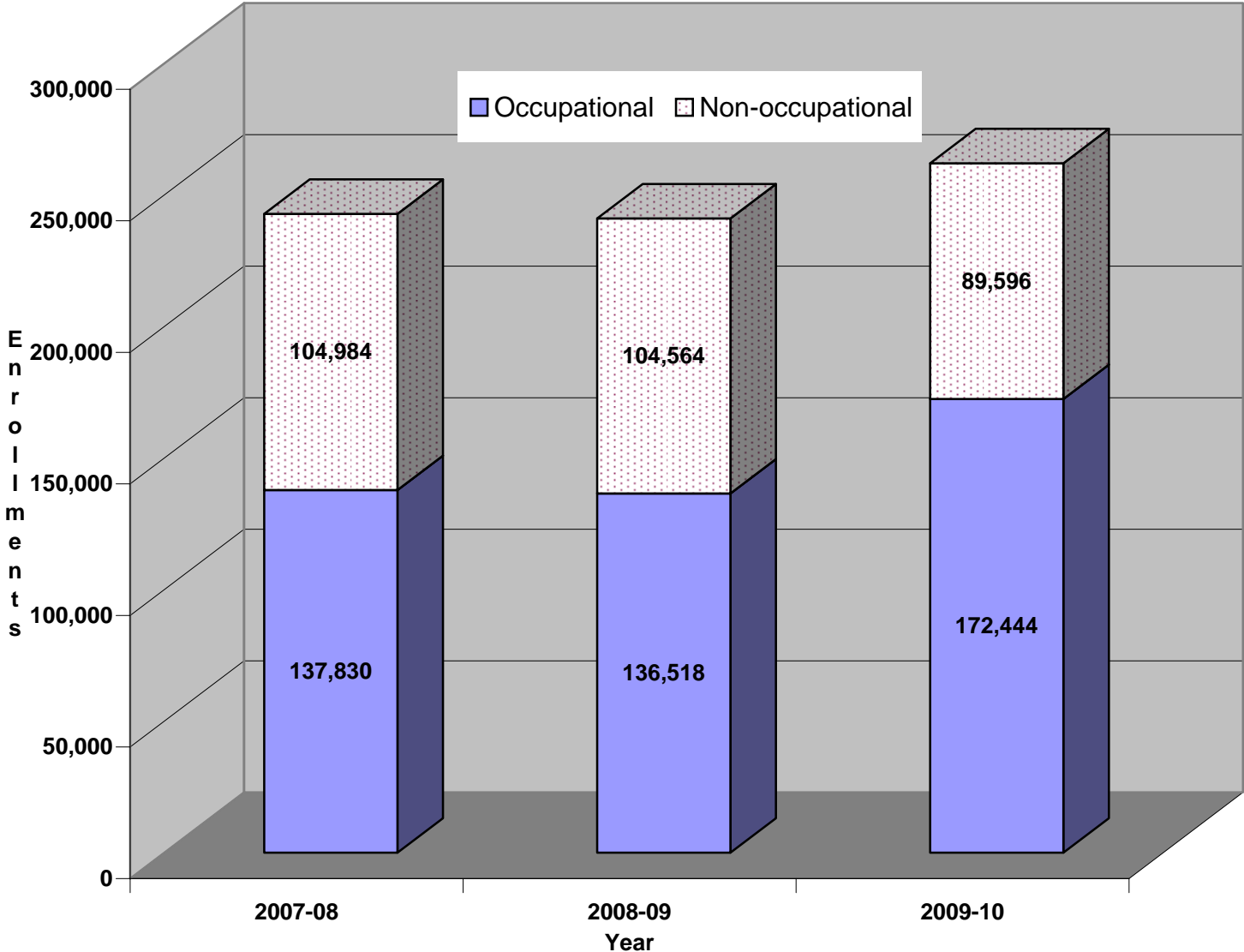

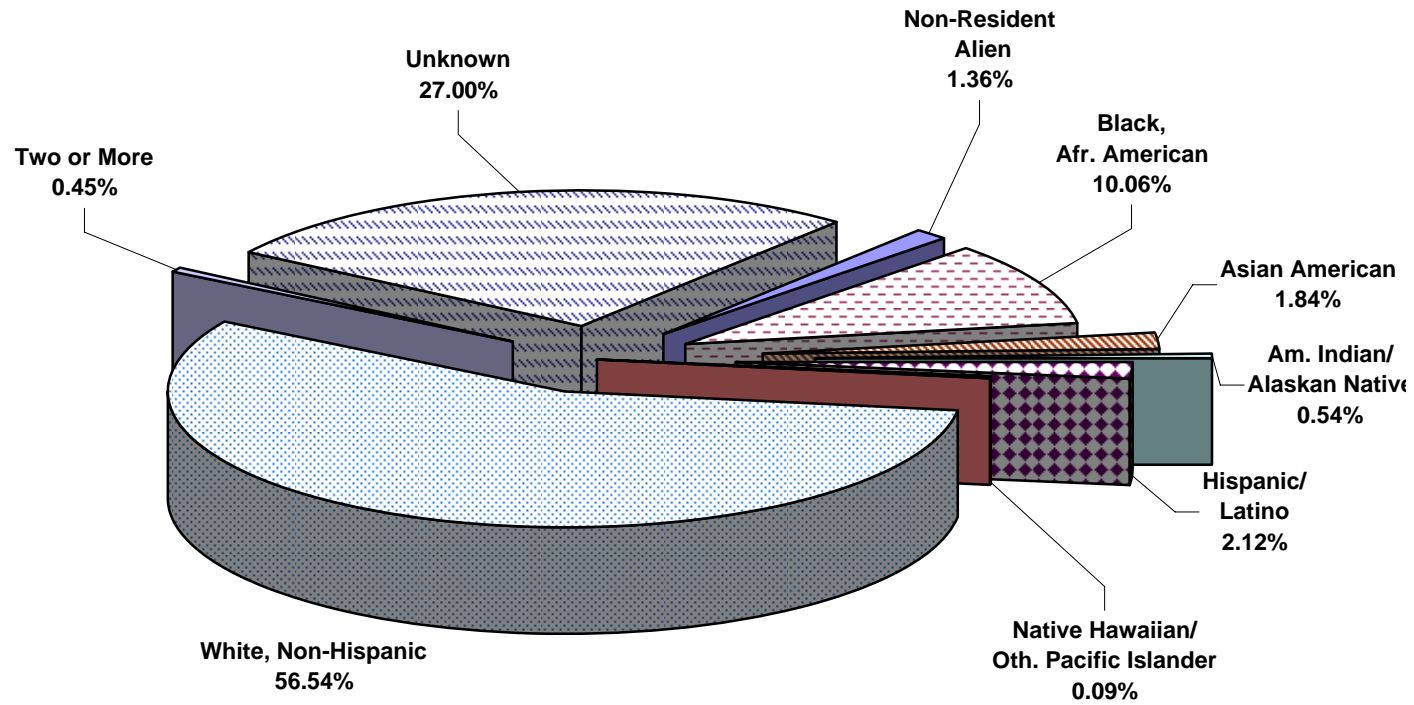

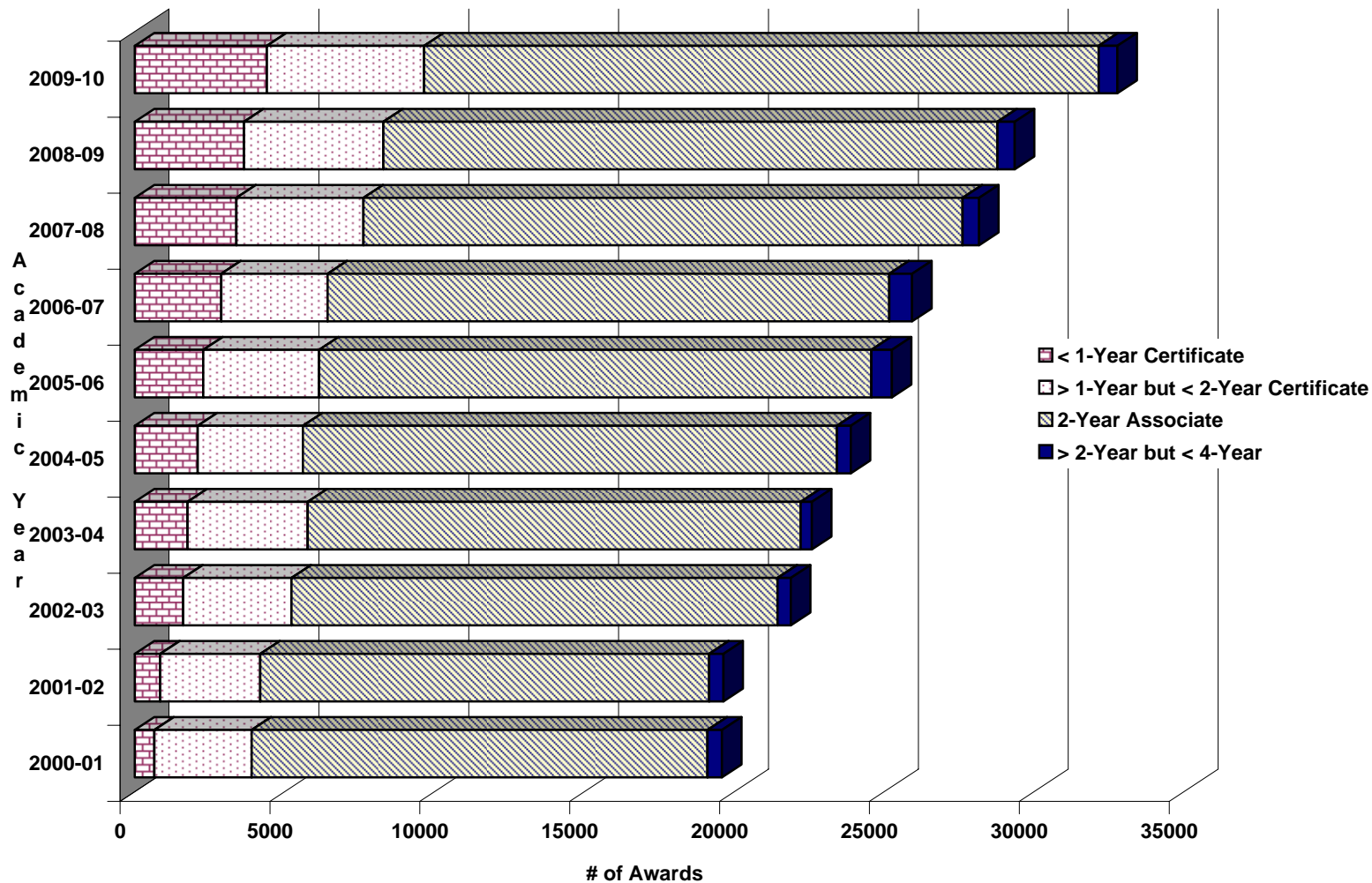

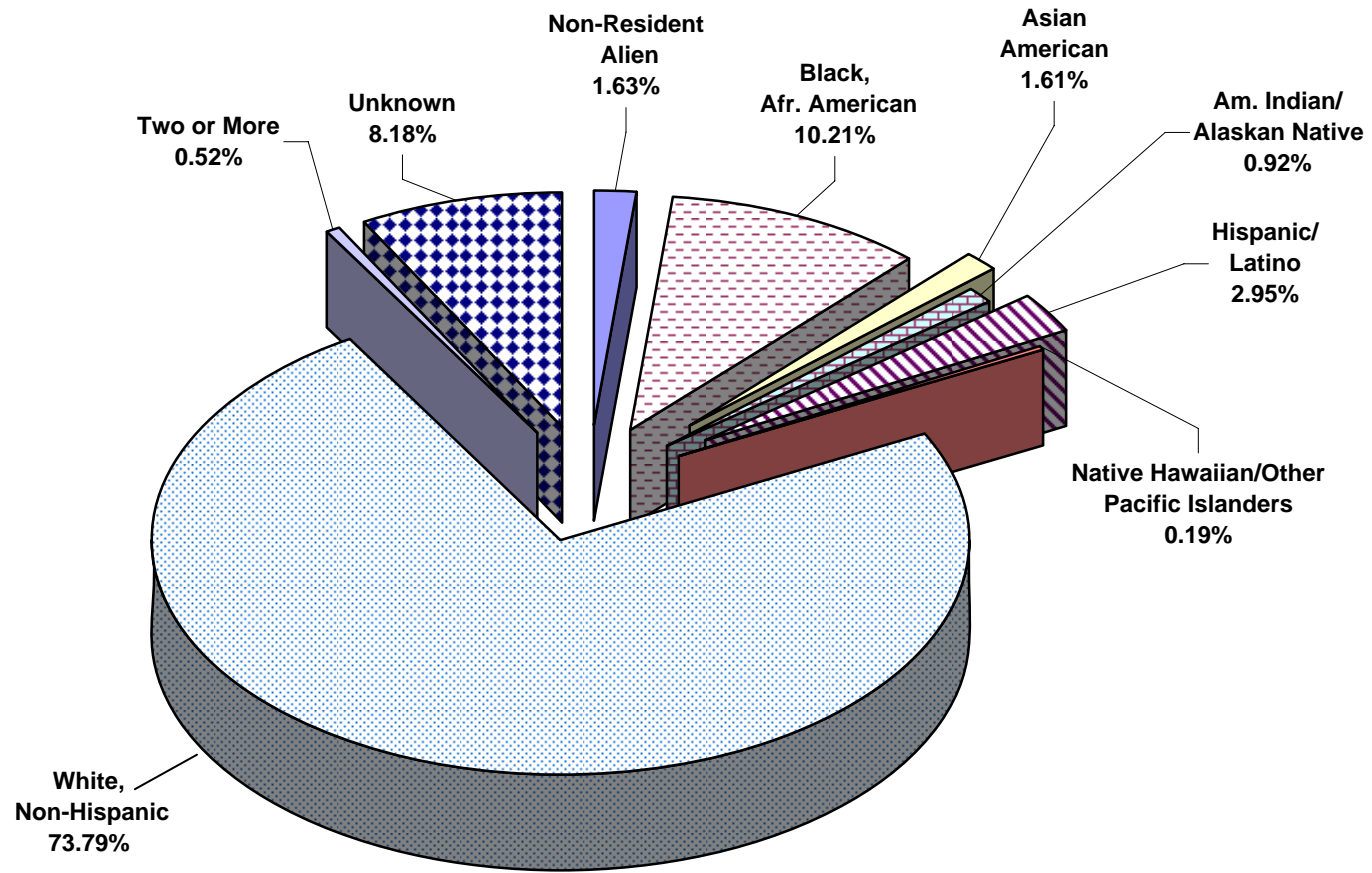

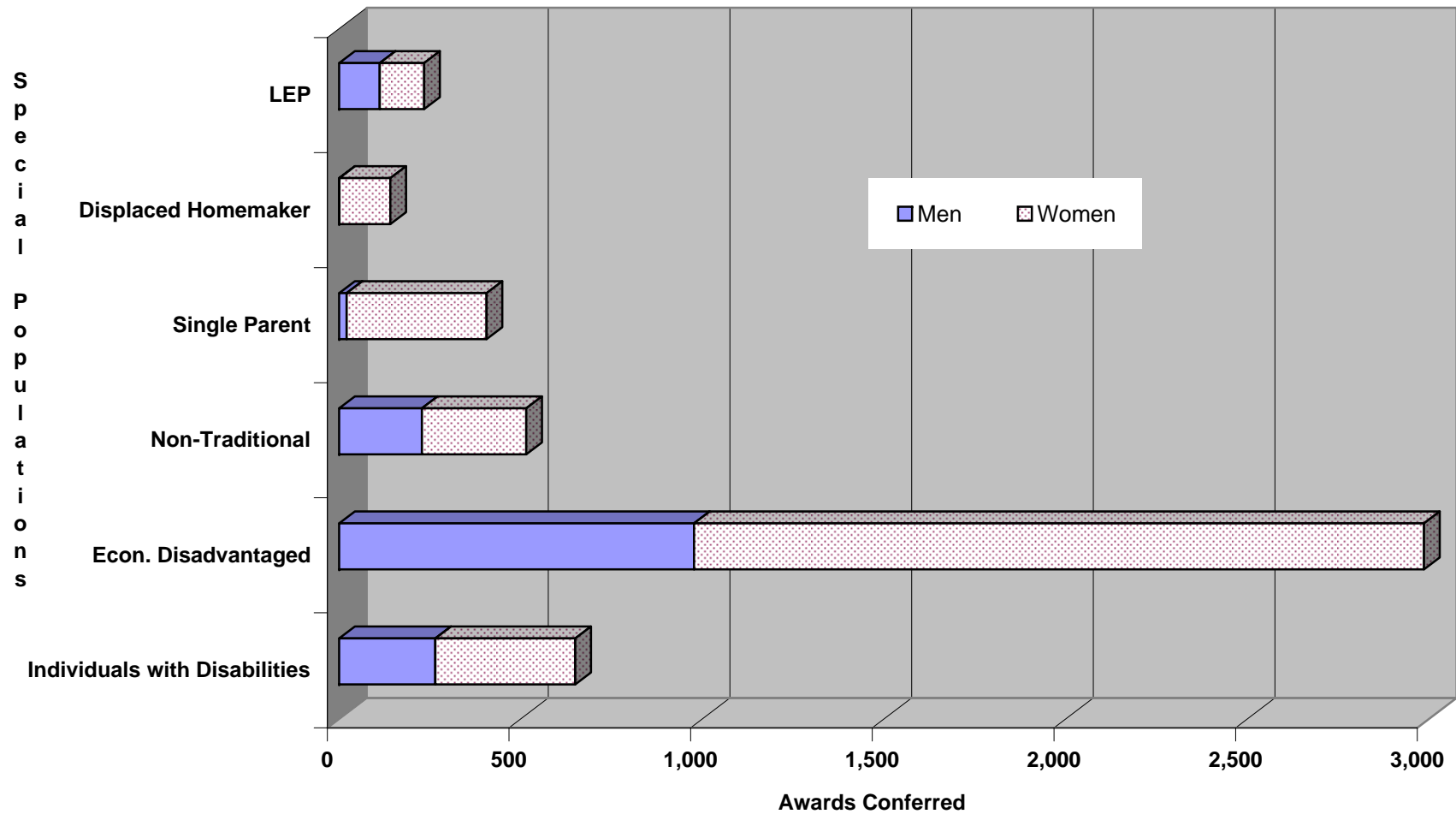

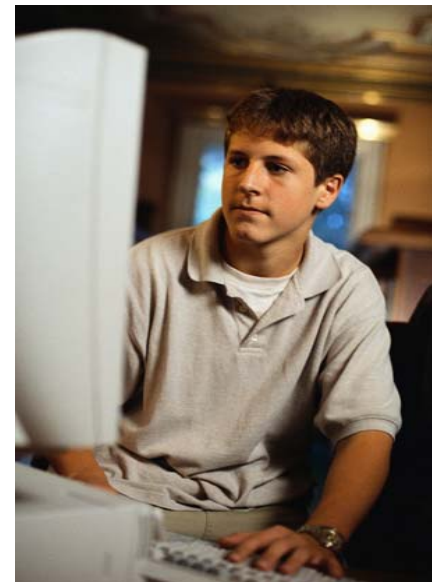
