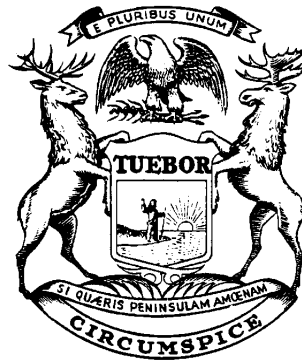

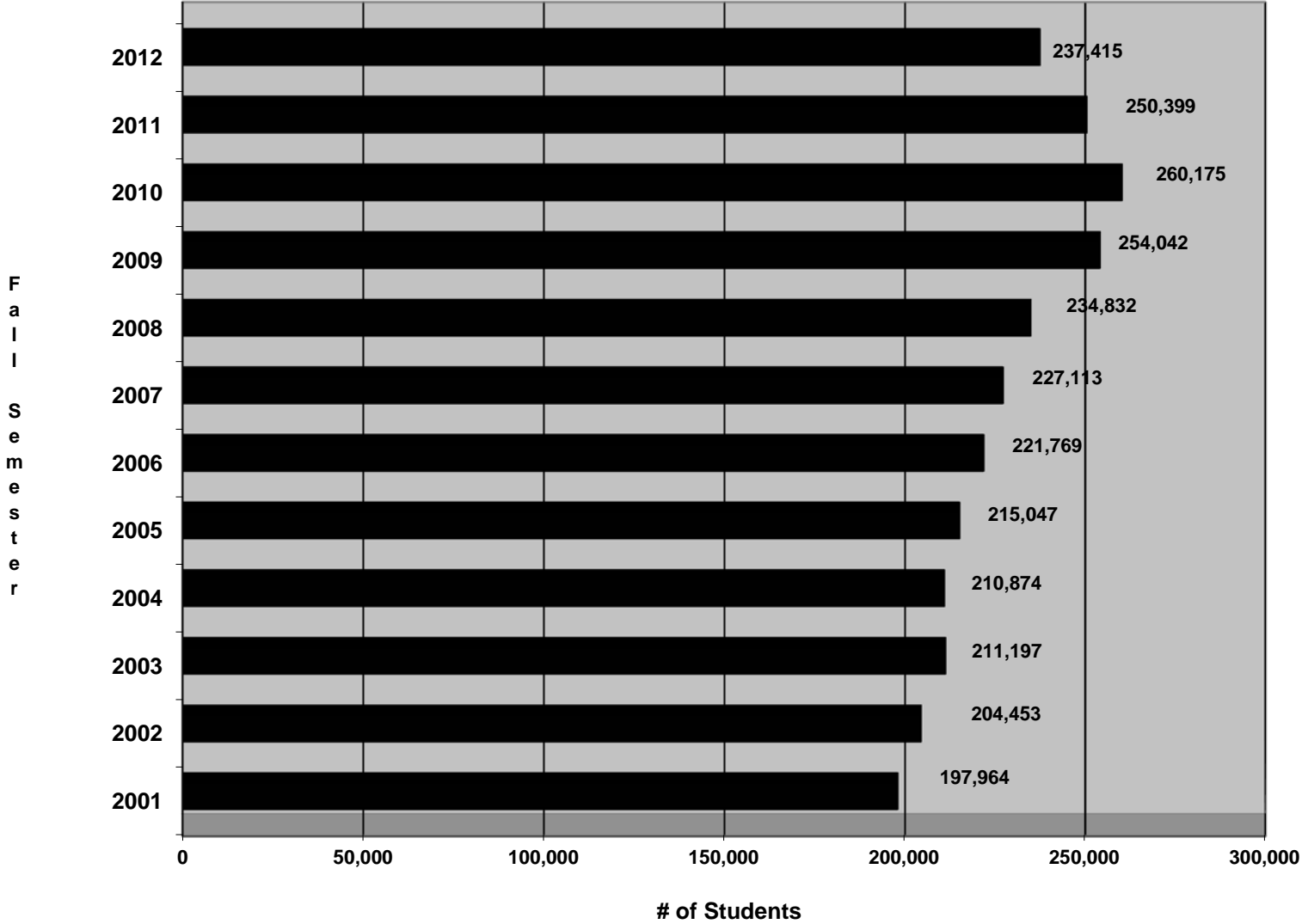
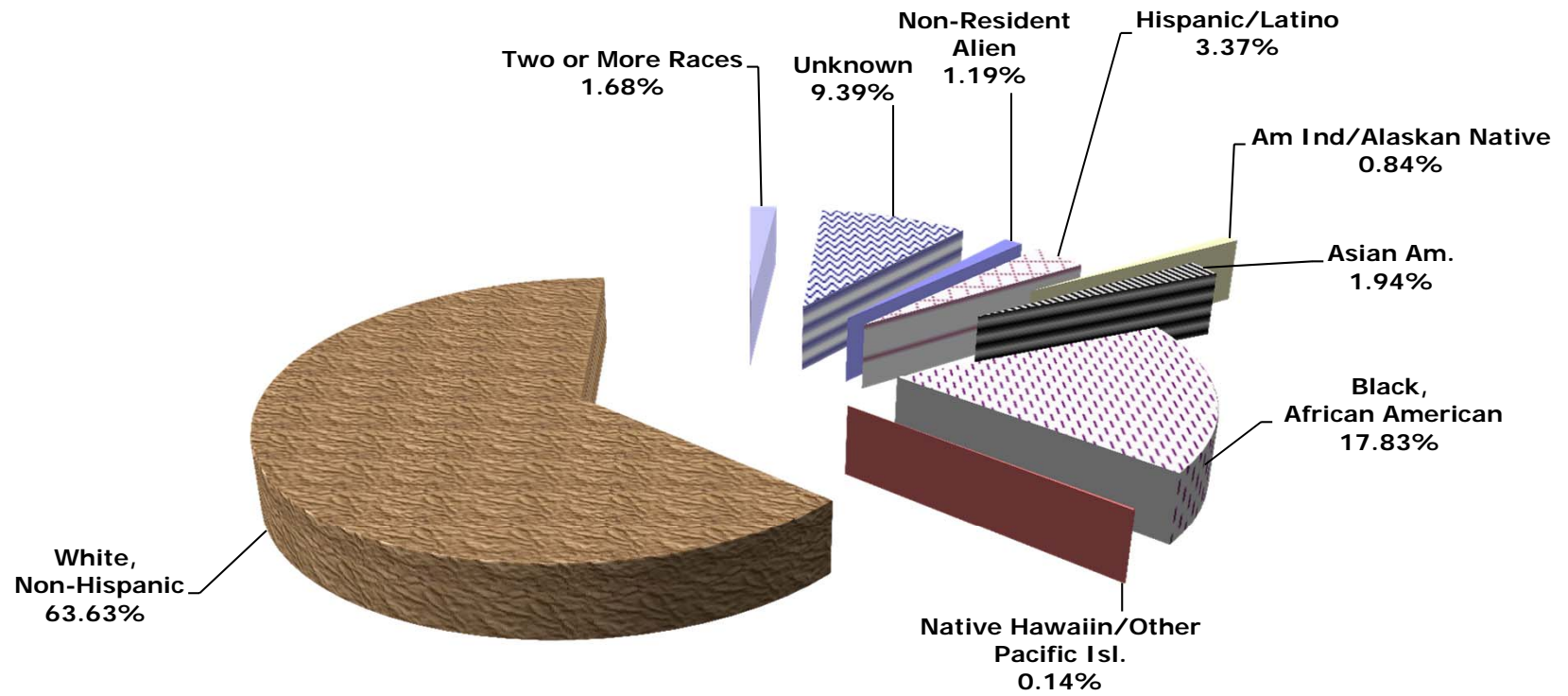

NUMBER of FITIAC's AS COMPARED TO FALL ENROLLMENT, 2003 THROUGH 2012

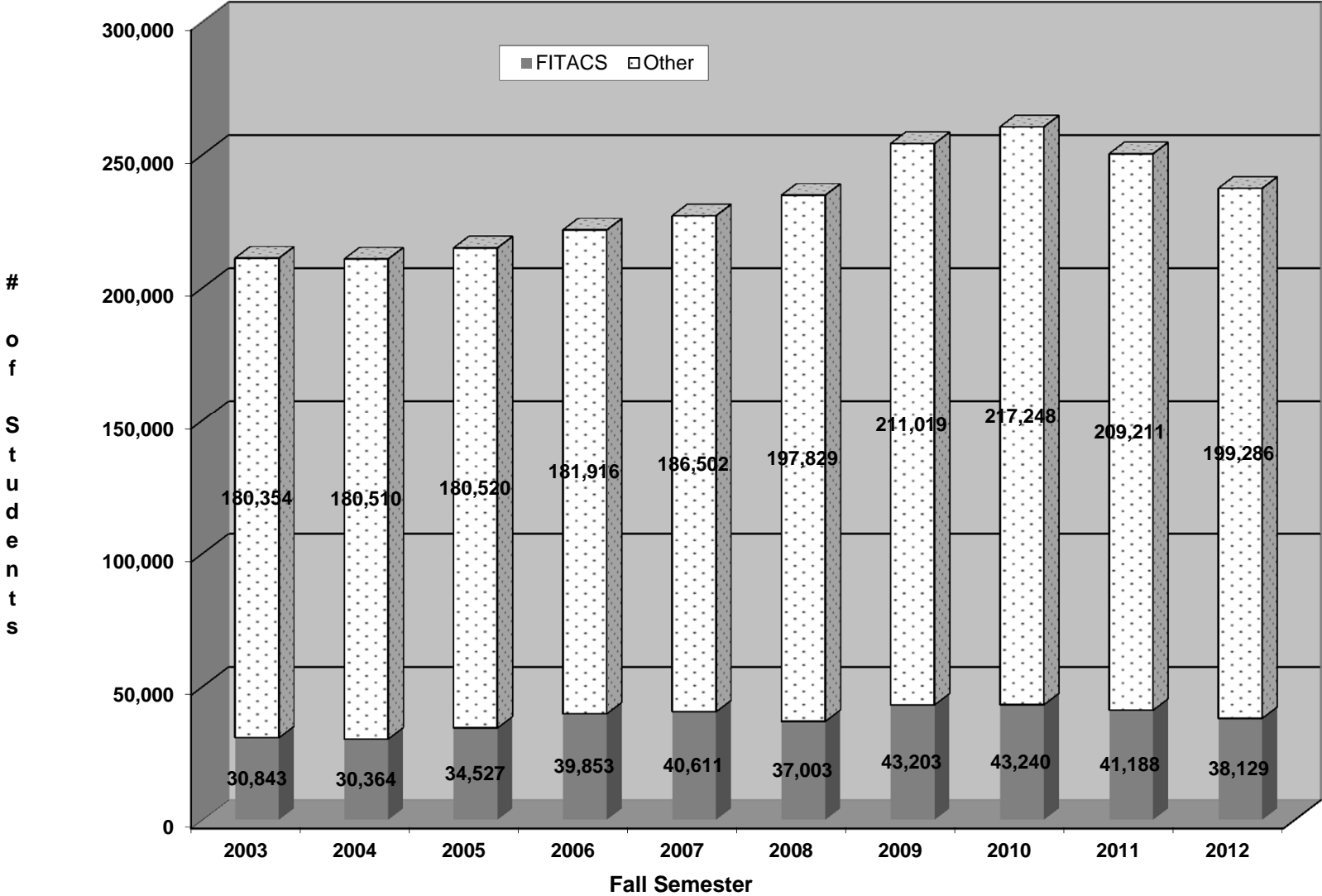

ENROLLMENT BY STATUS, FALL 2004 - FALL 2012

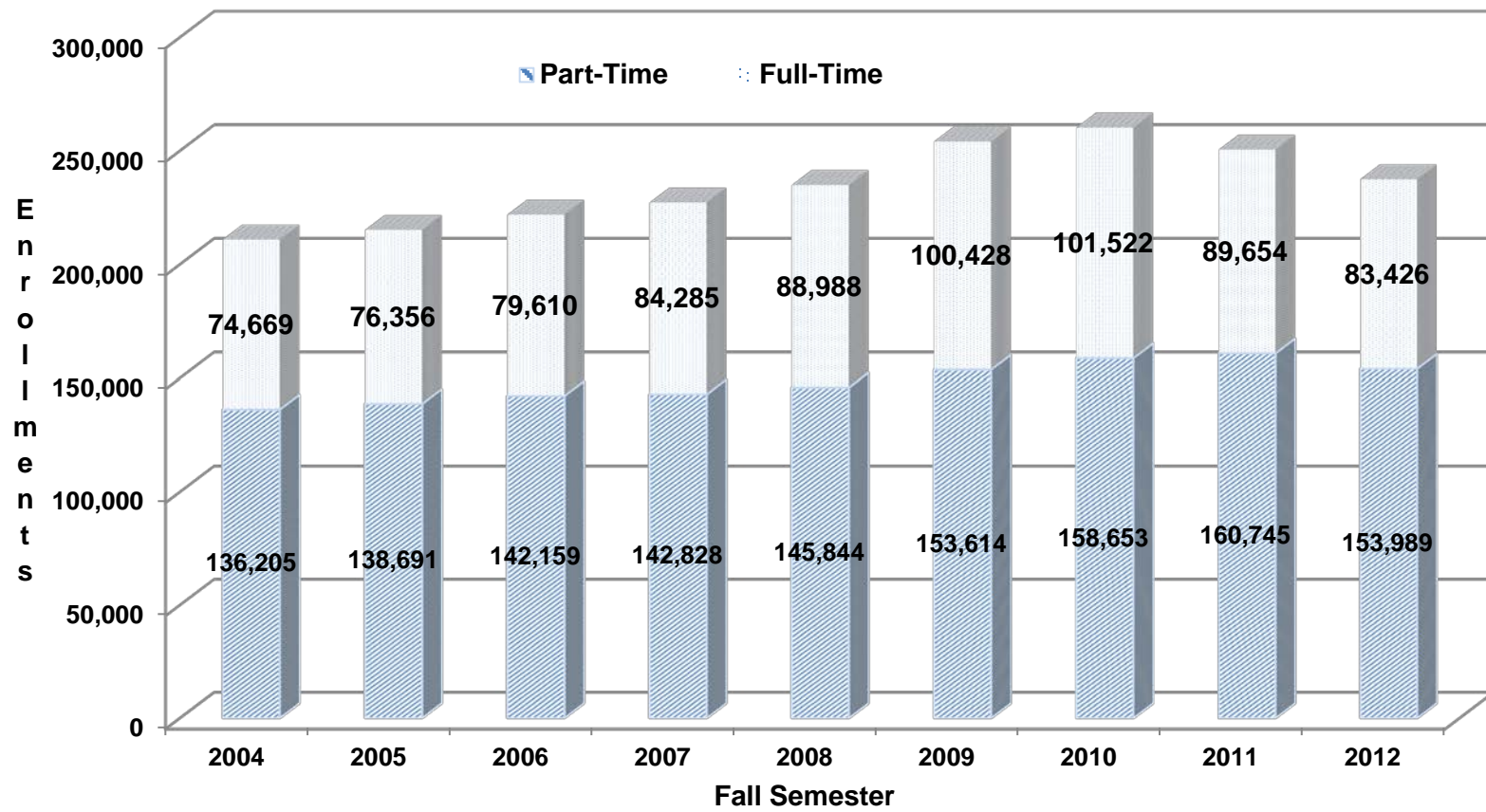

FALL 2012 ENROLLMENT BY AGE

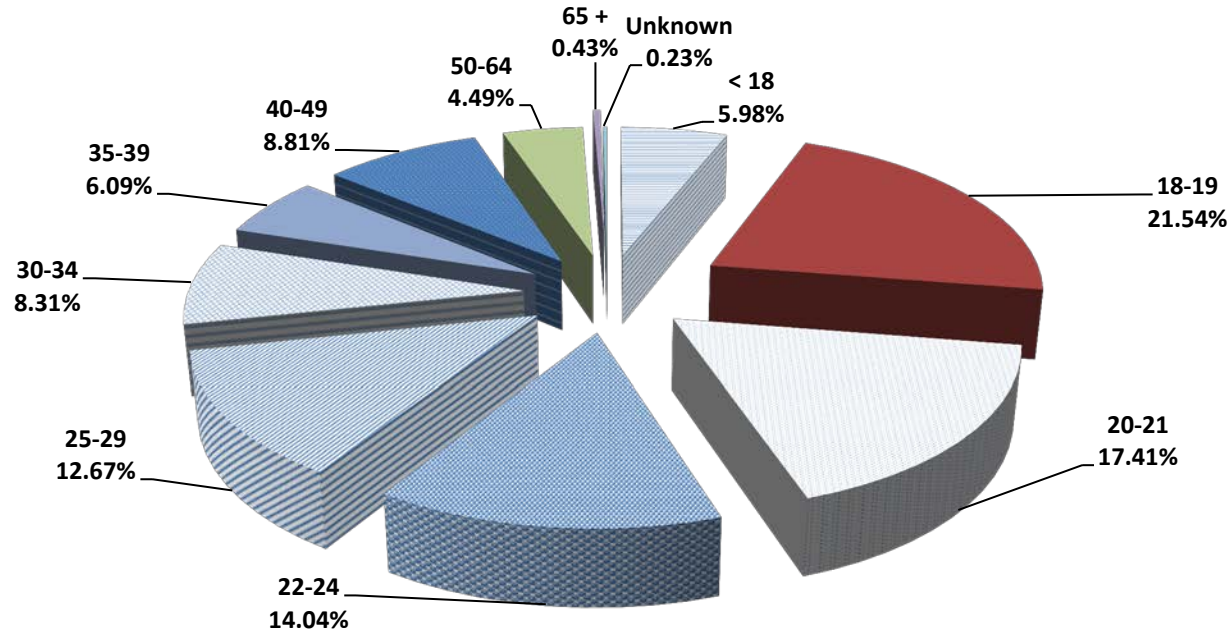

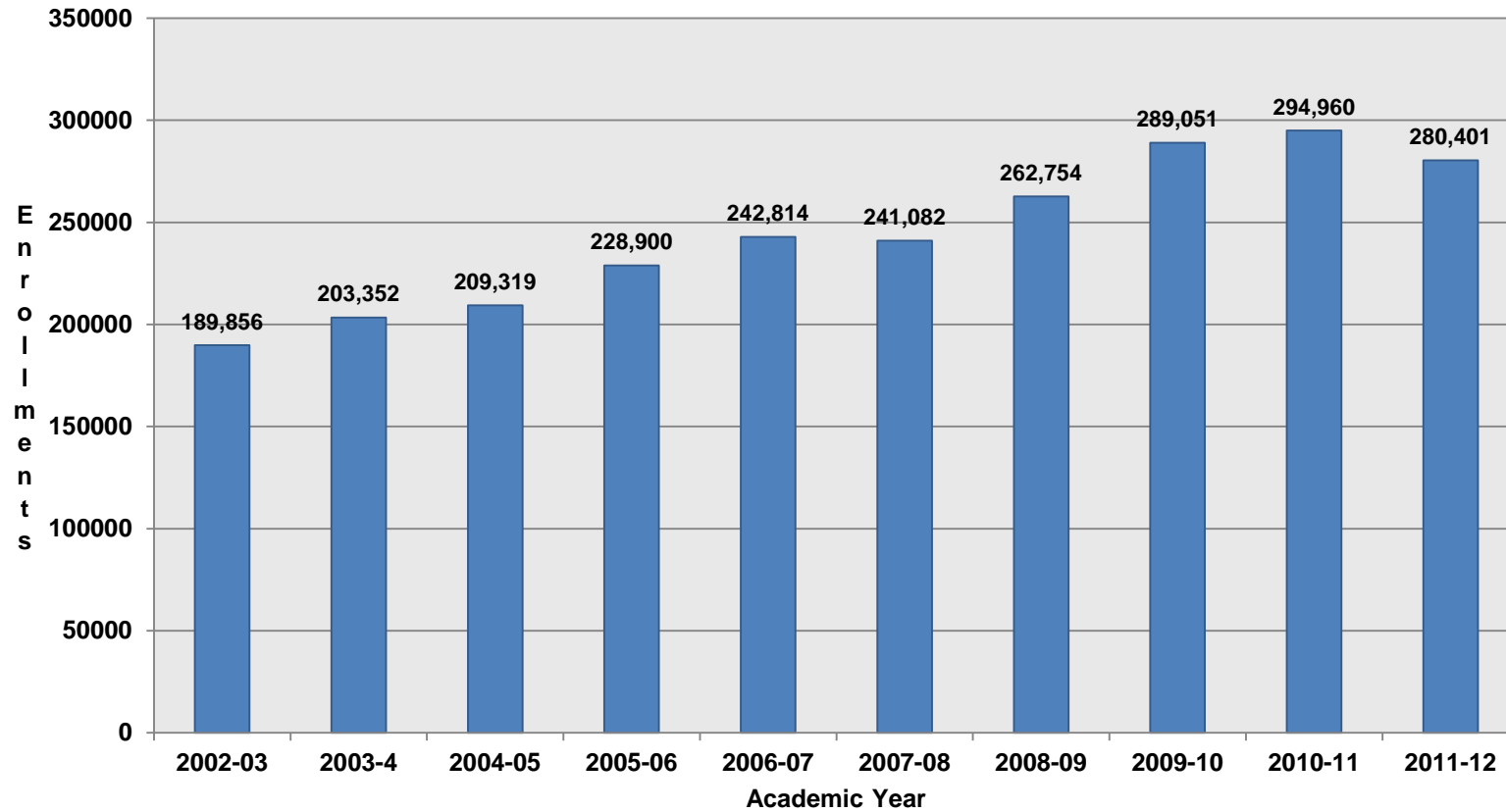

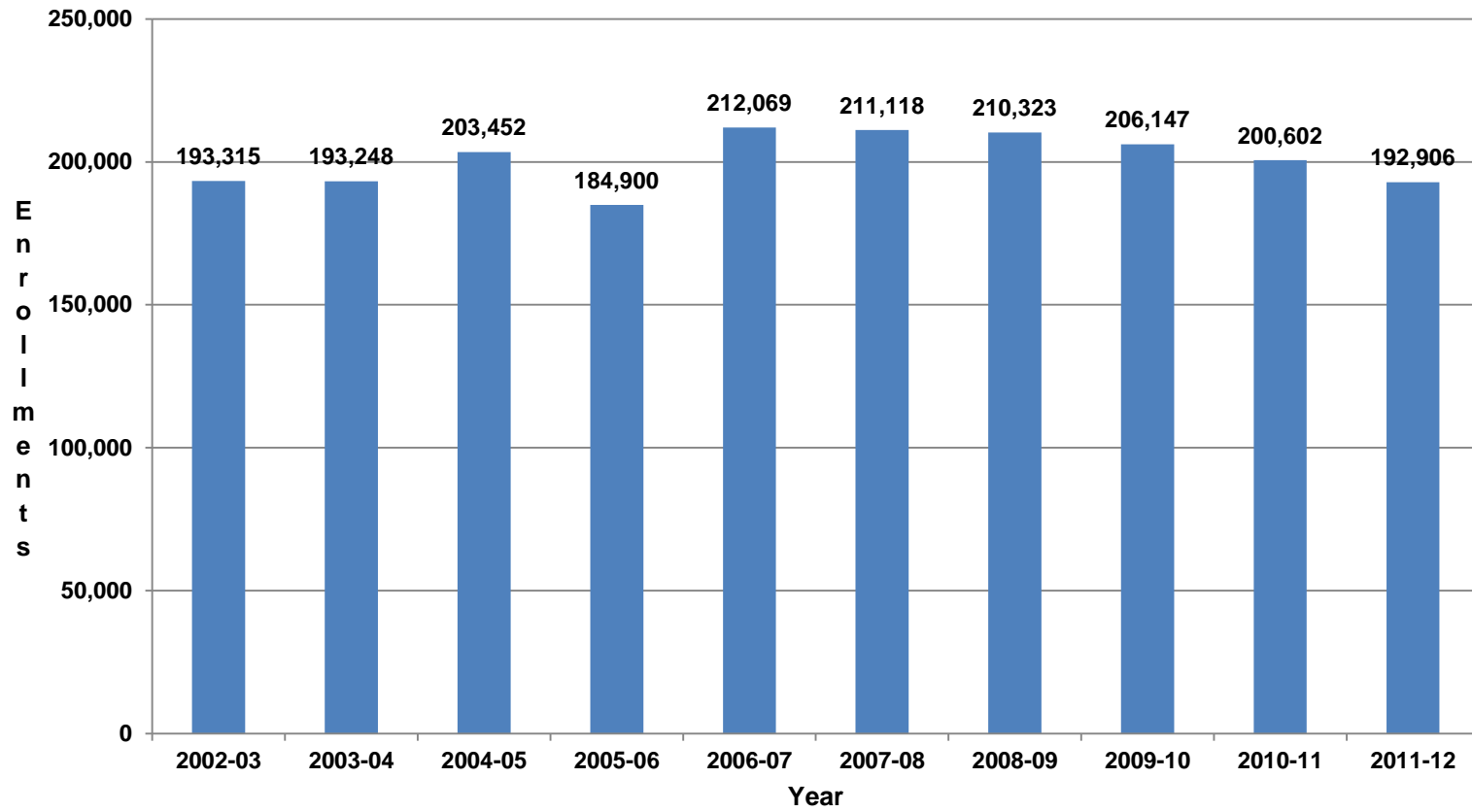

OCCUPATIONAL YEAR-END PROGRAM ENROLLMENTS BY ETHNICITY, 2011-12

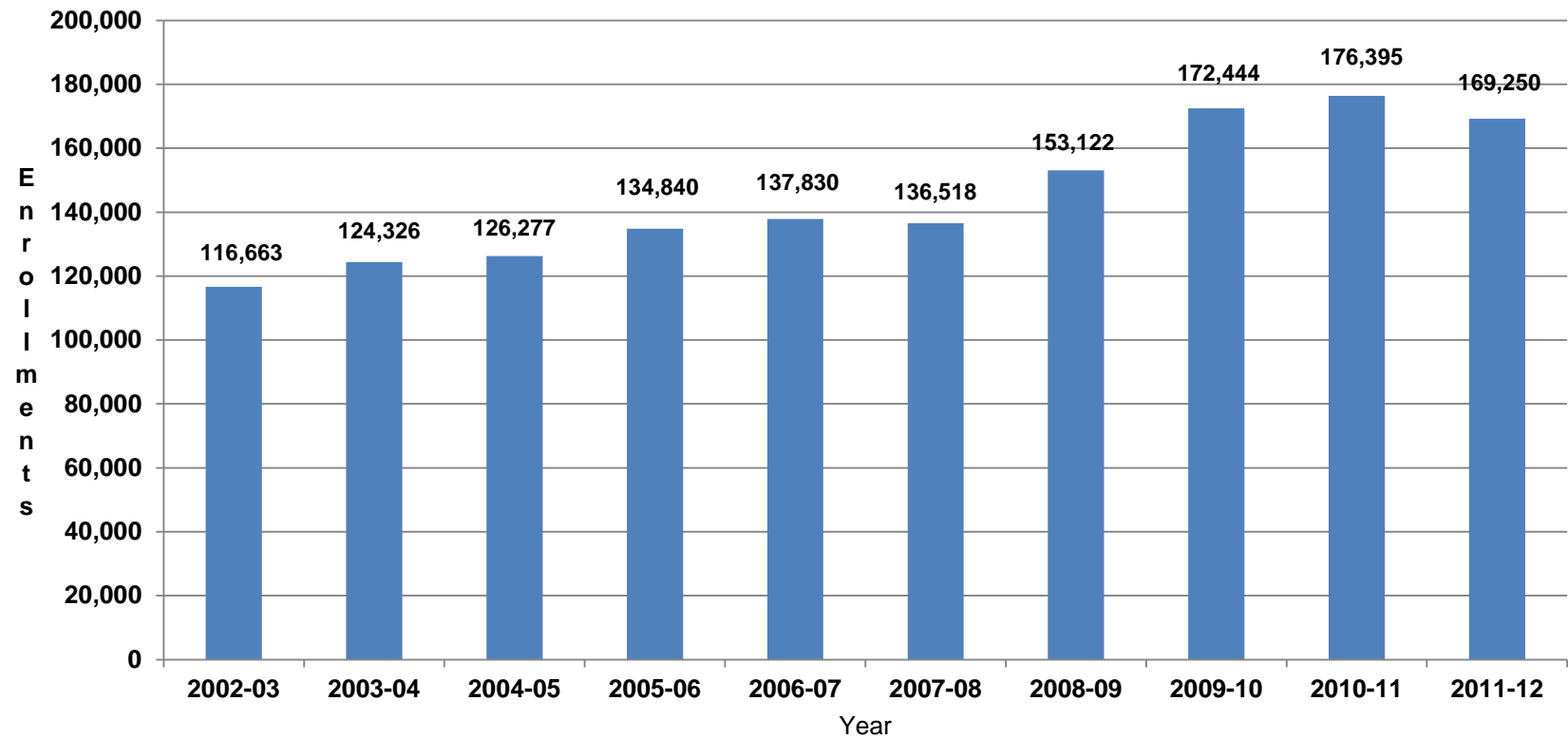

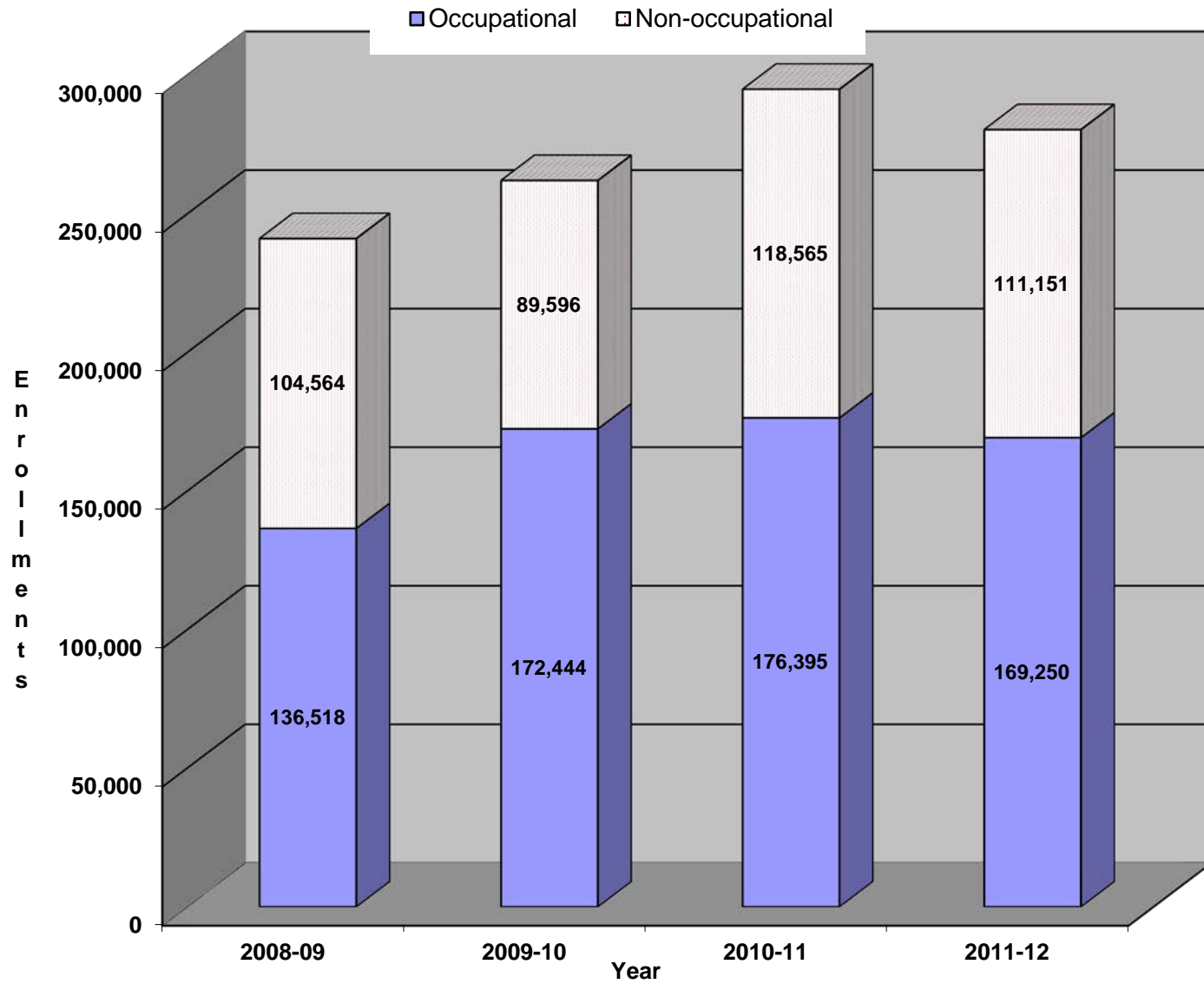

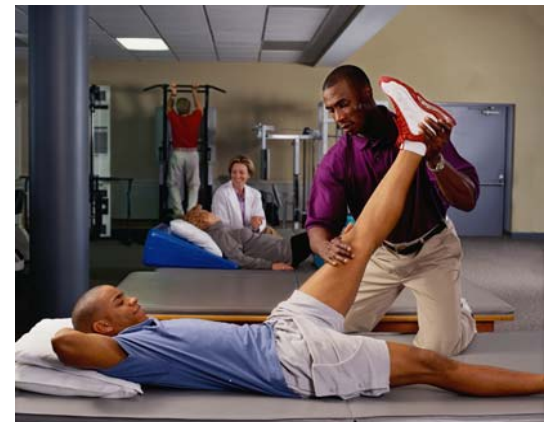

TOTAL OCCUPATIONAL ENROLLMENT (PROGRAM + NON-PROGRAM) BY ETHNICITY, 2011-12

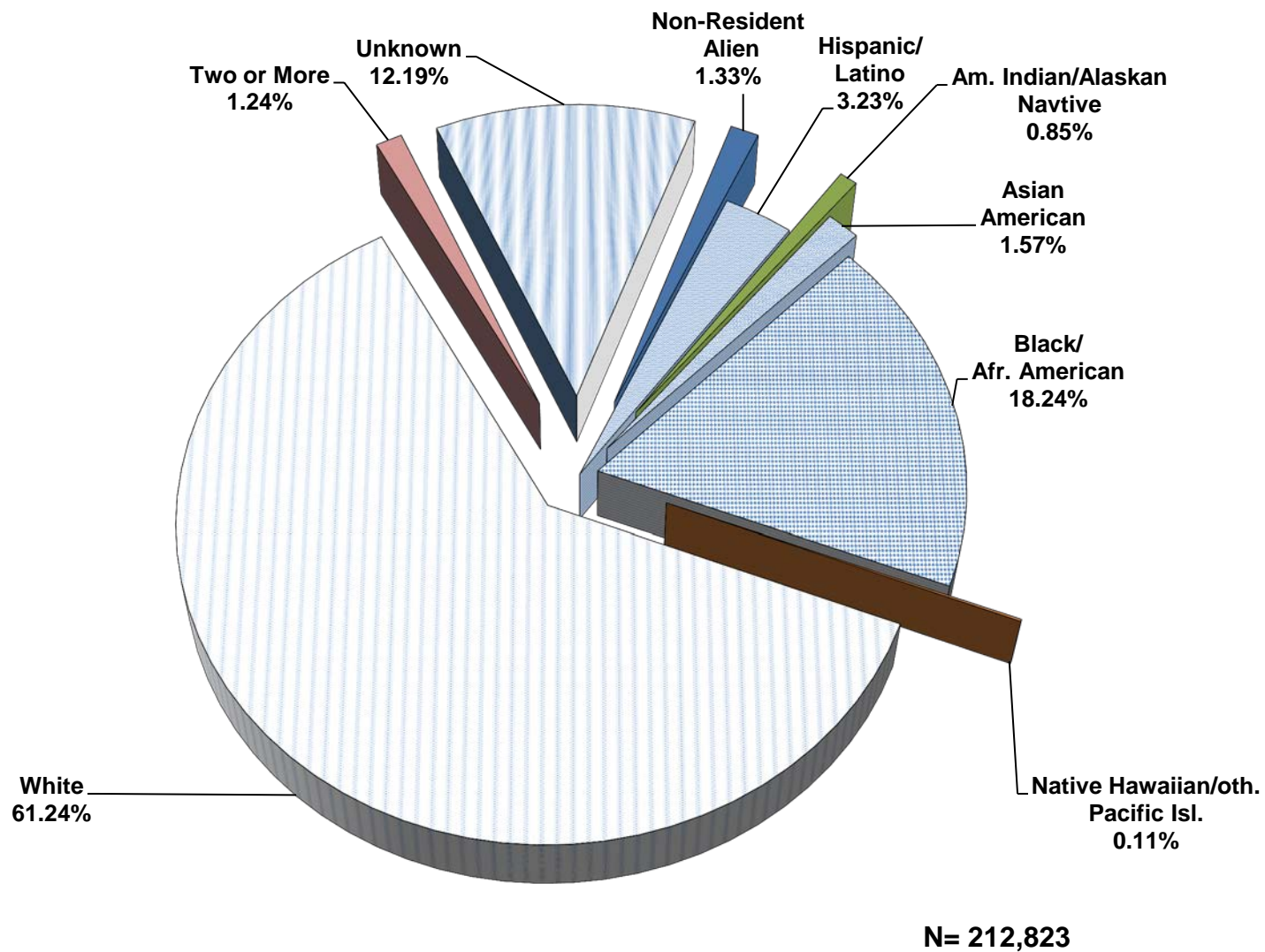

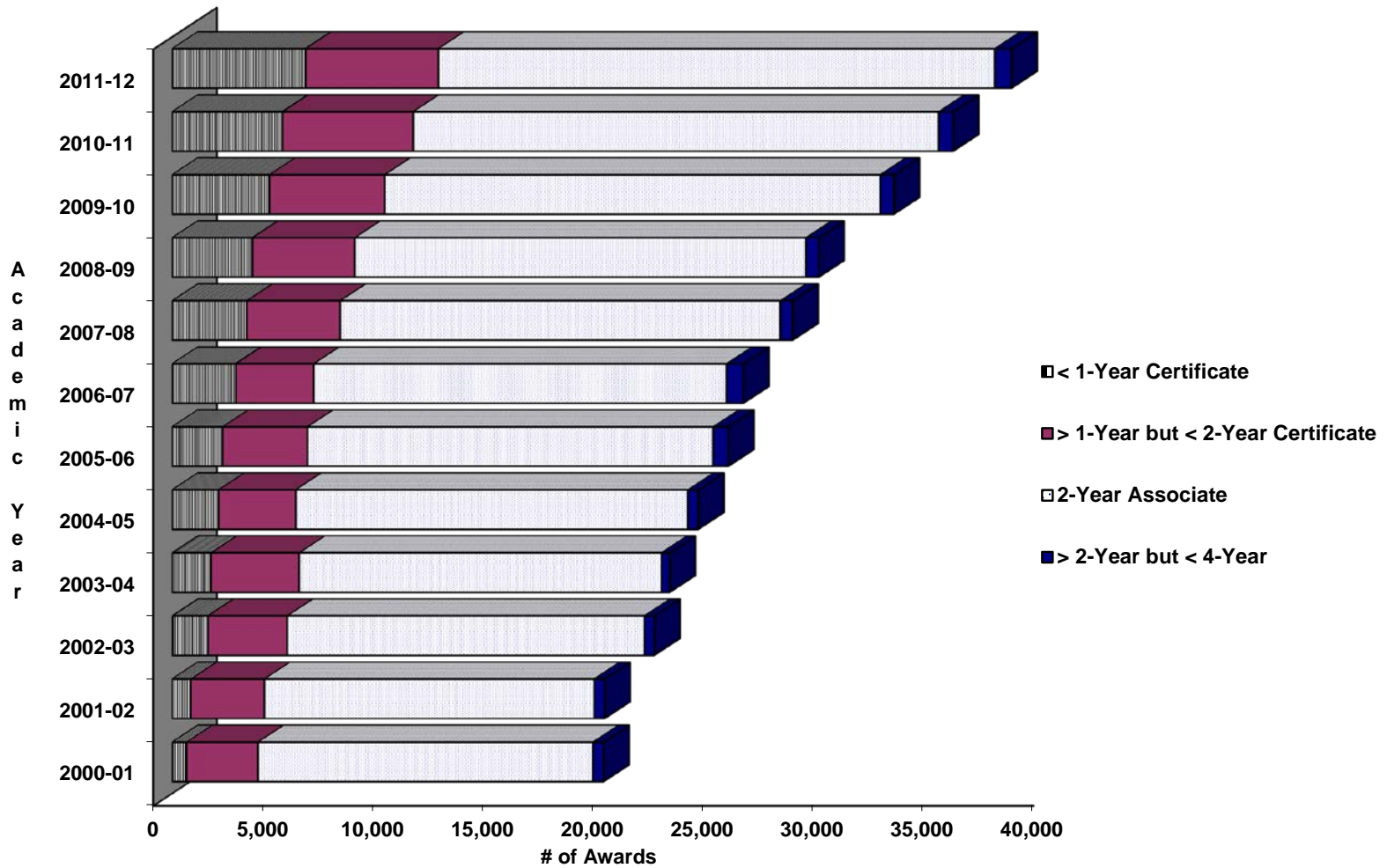

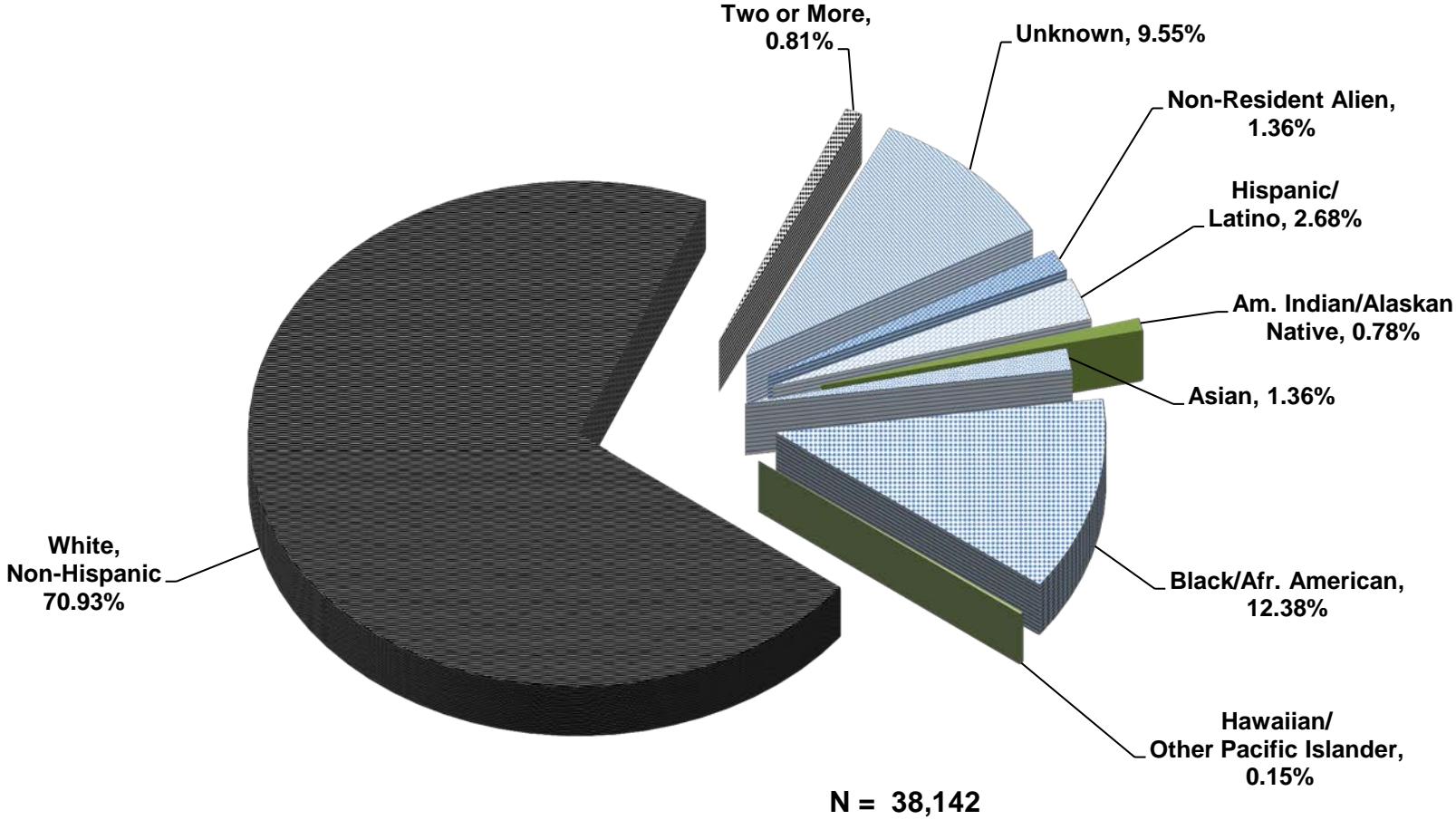

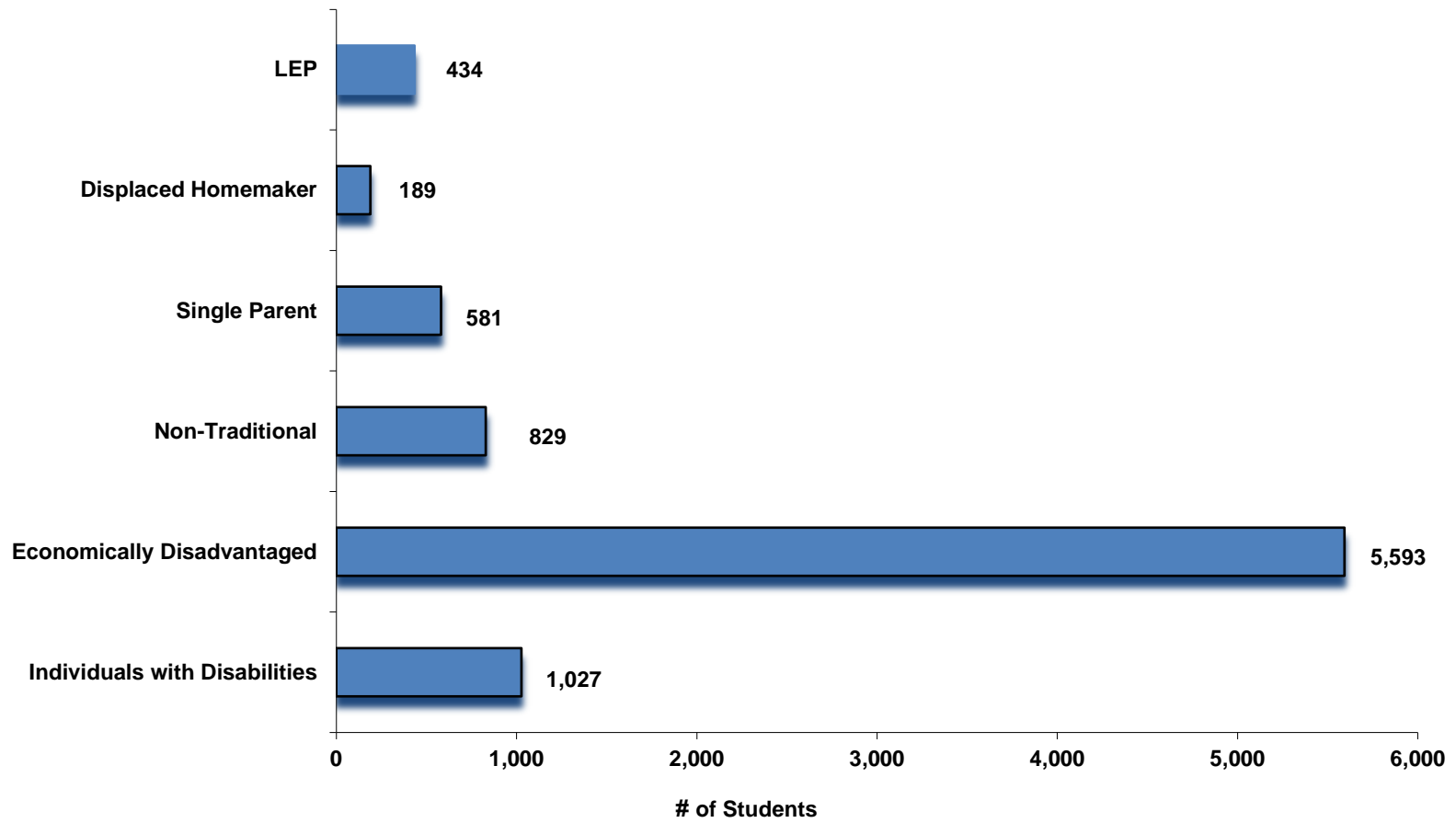

OCCUPATIONAL AWARDS CONFERRED BY ETHNICITY, 2011-12

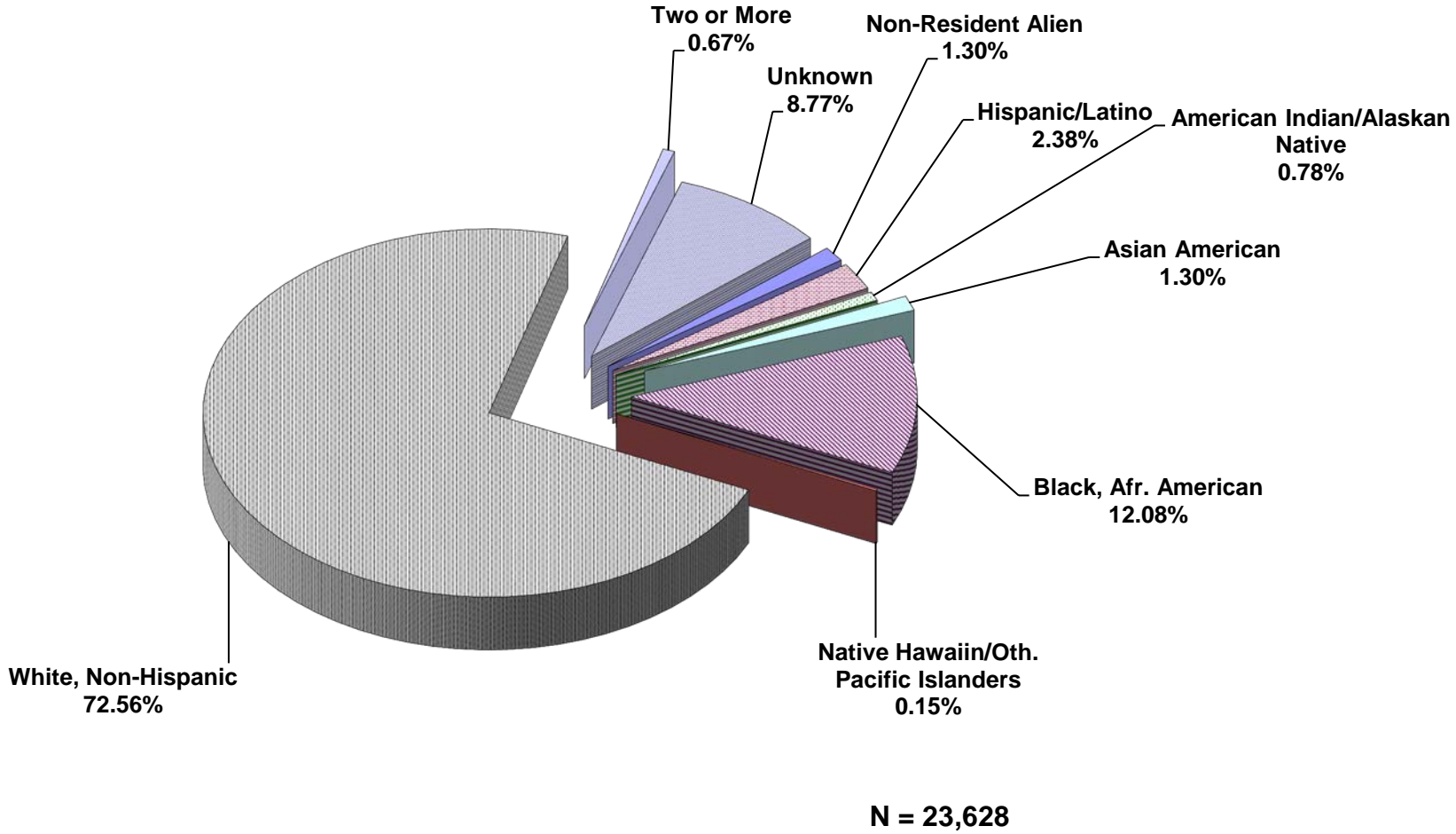
