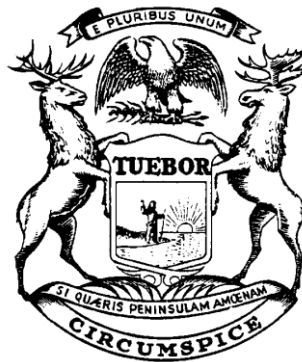

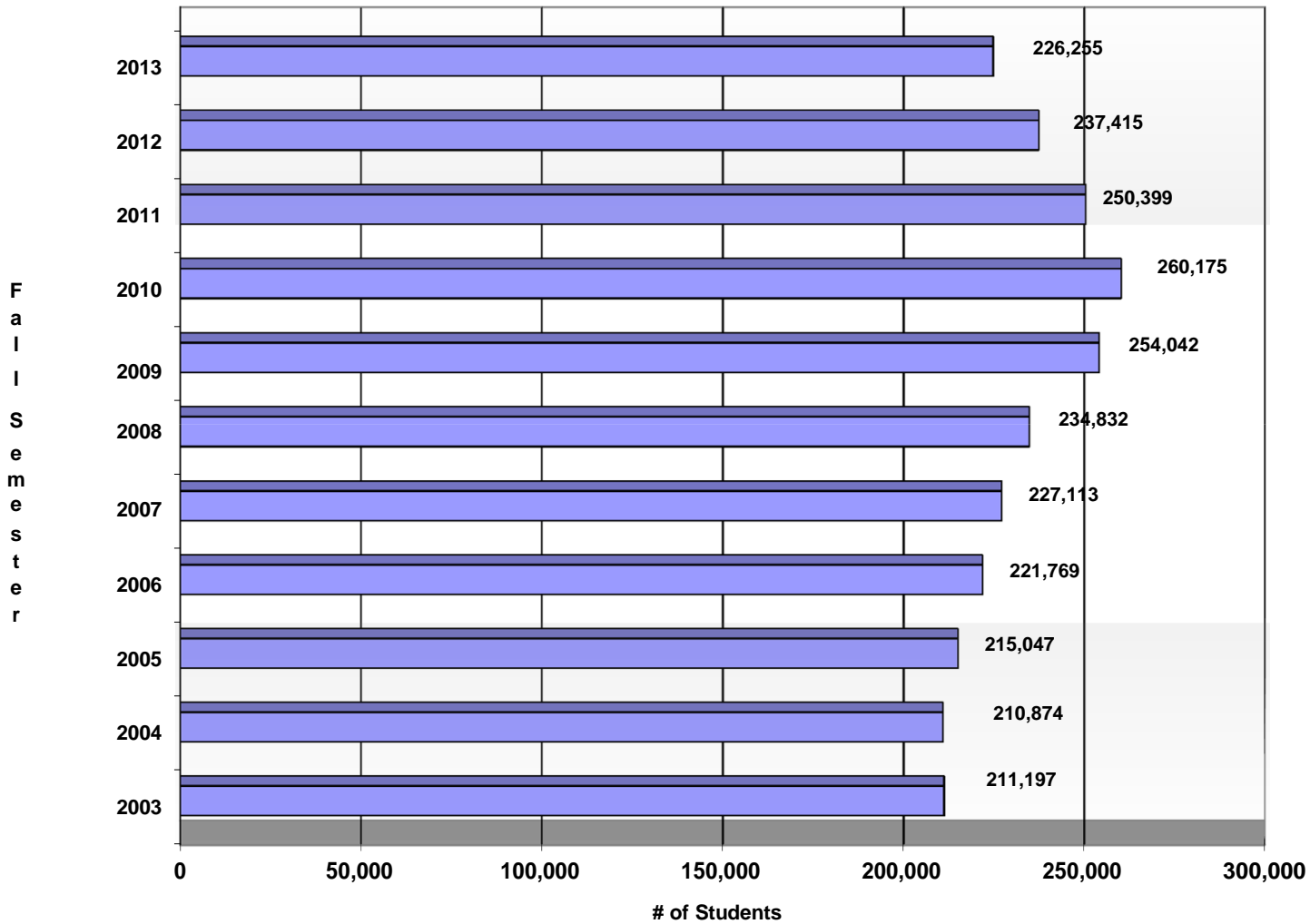
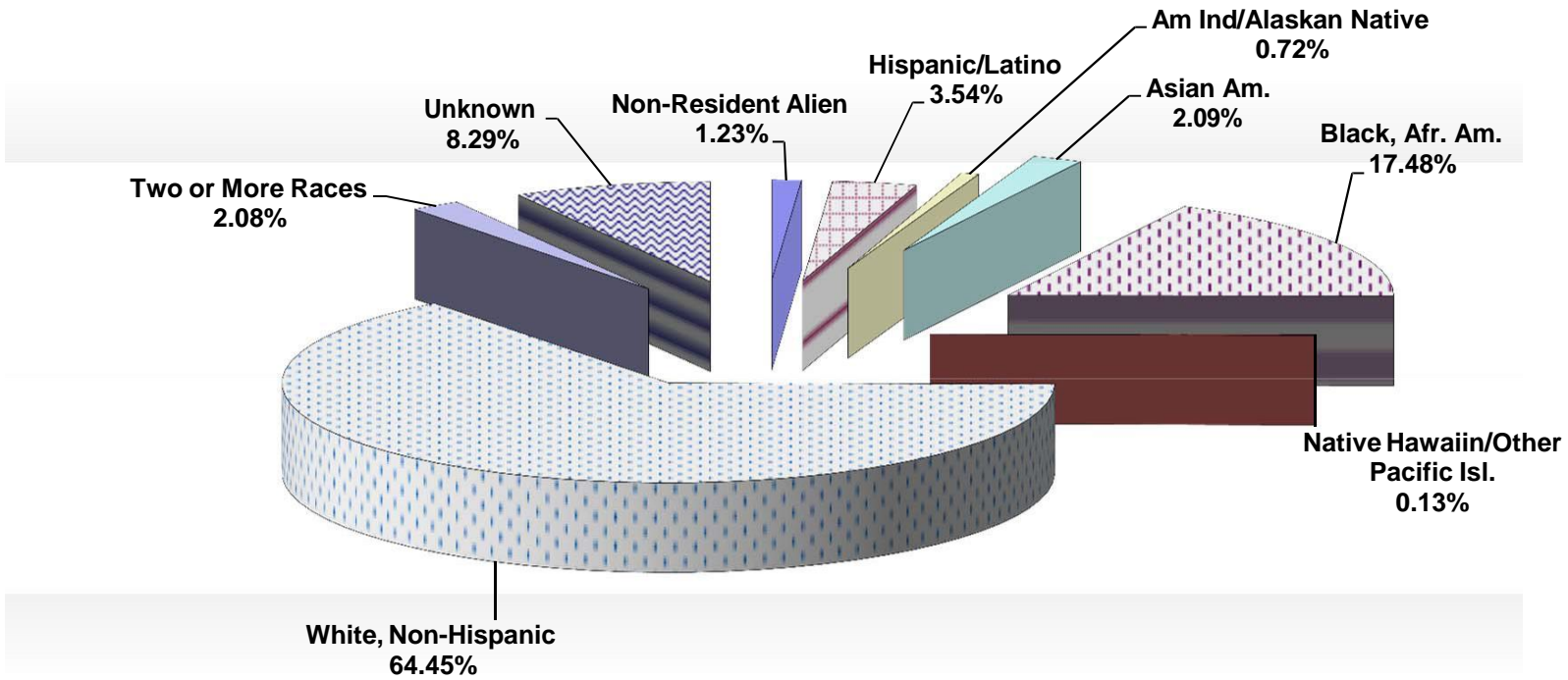

NUMBER of FITIAC's AS COMPARED TO FALL ENROLLMENT, 2004 THROUGH 2013

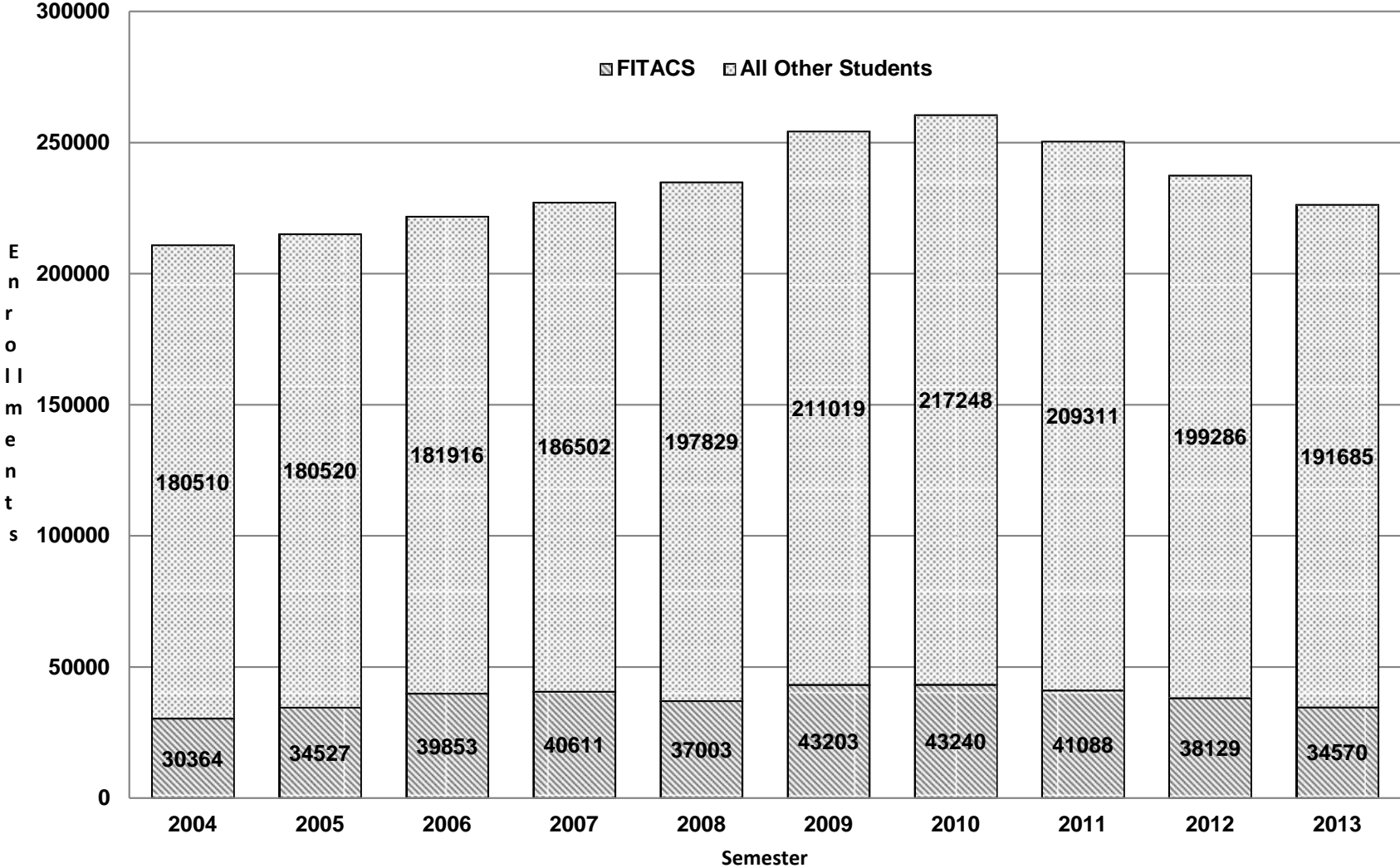

ENROLLMENT BY STATUS, FALL 2005 - FALL 2013

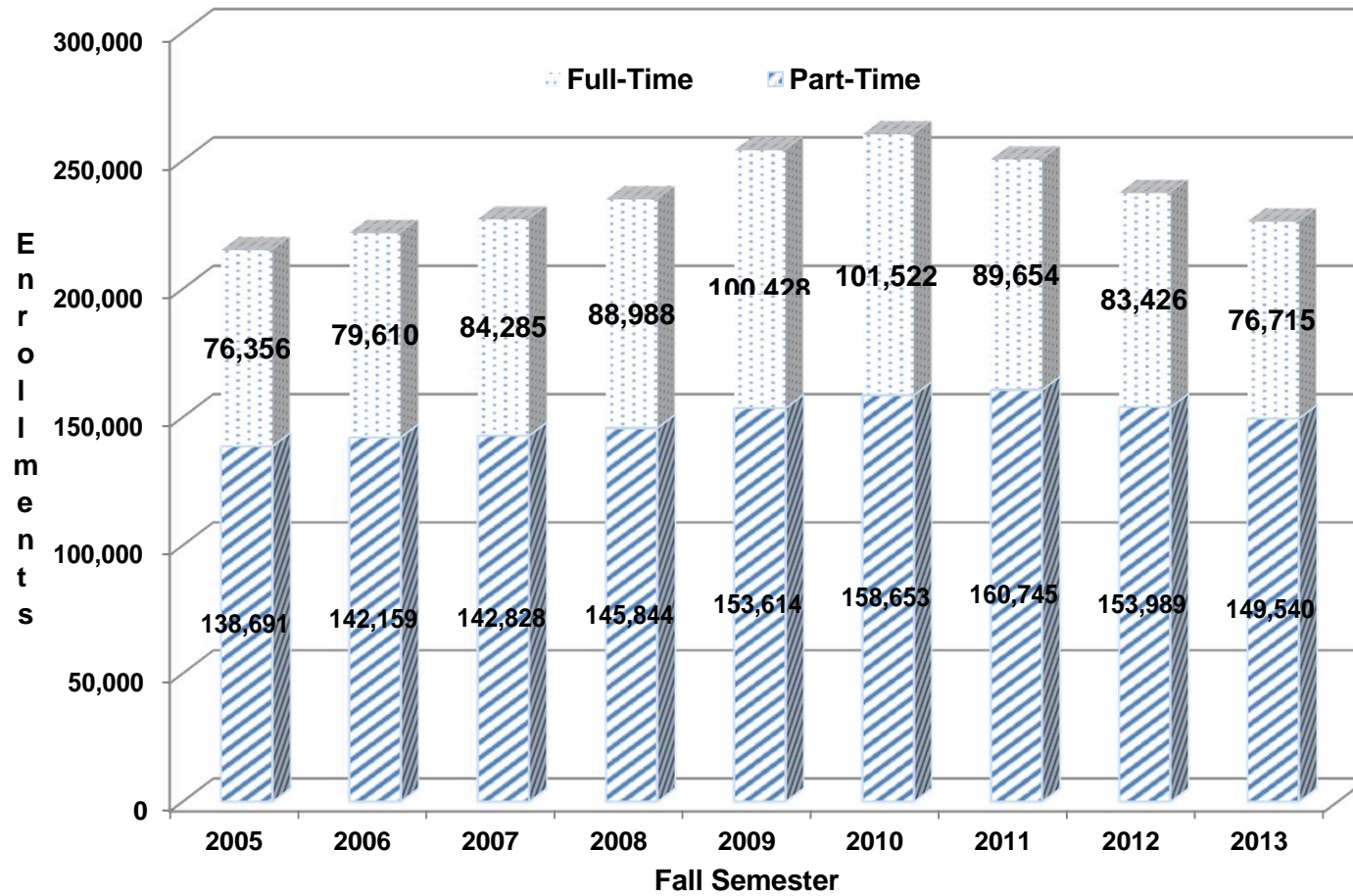

FALL 2013 ENROLLMENT BY AGE

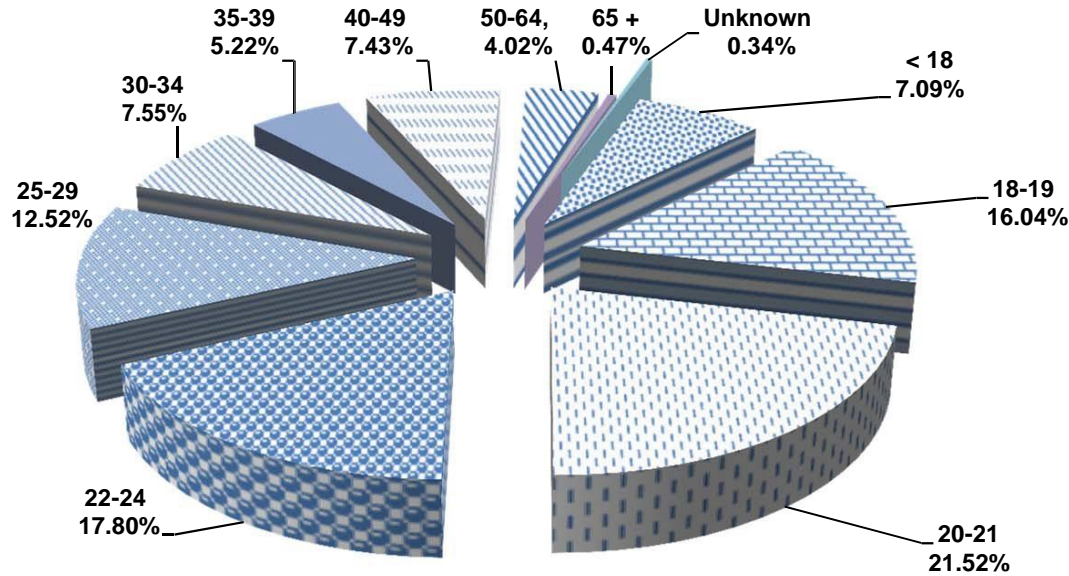

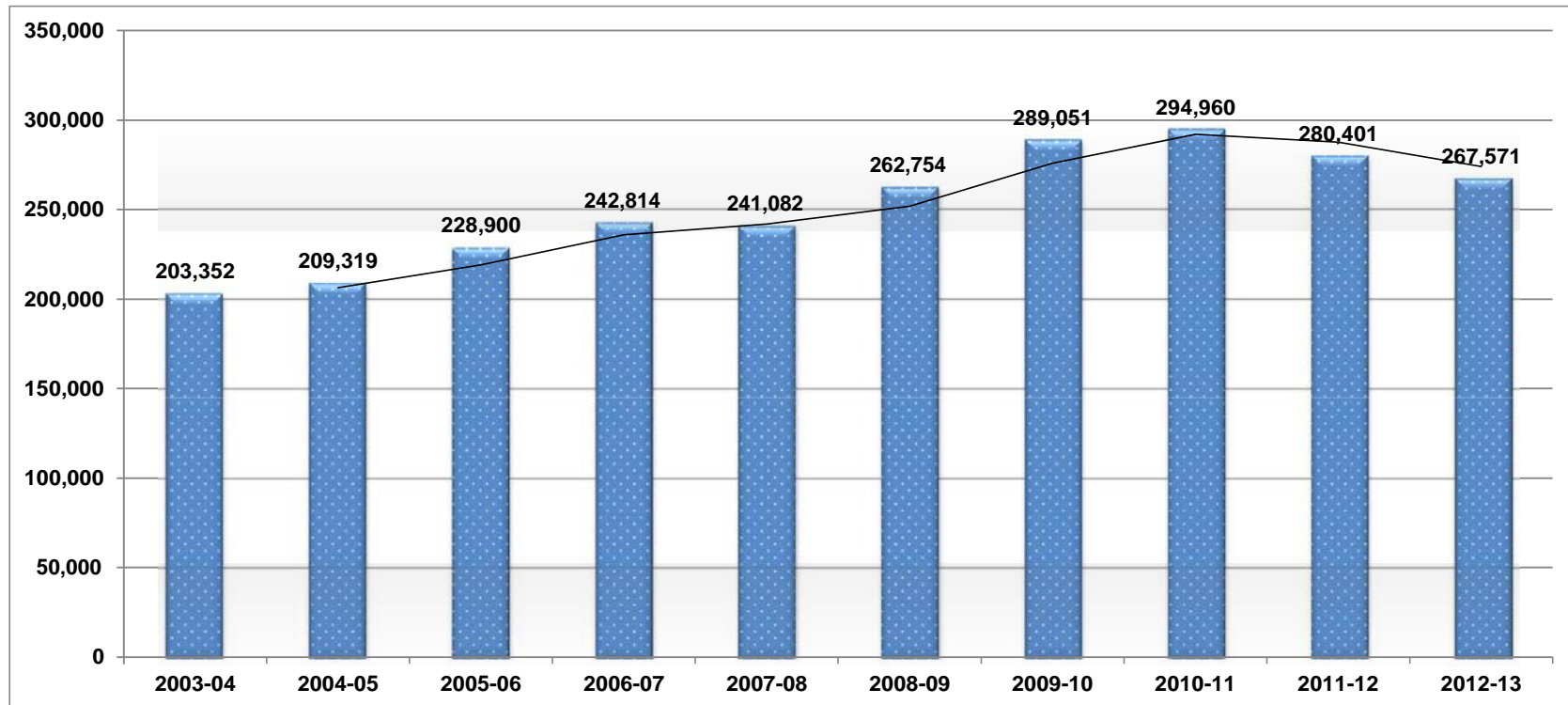

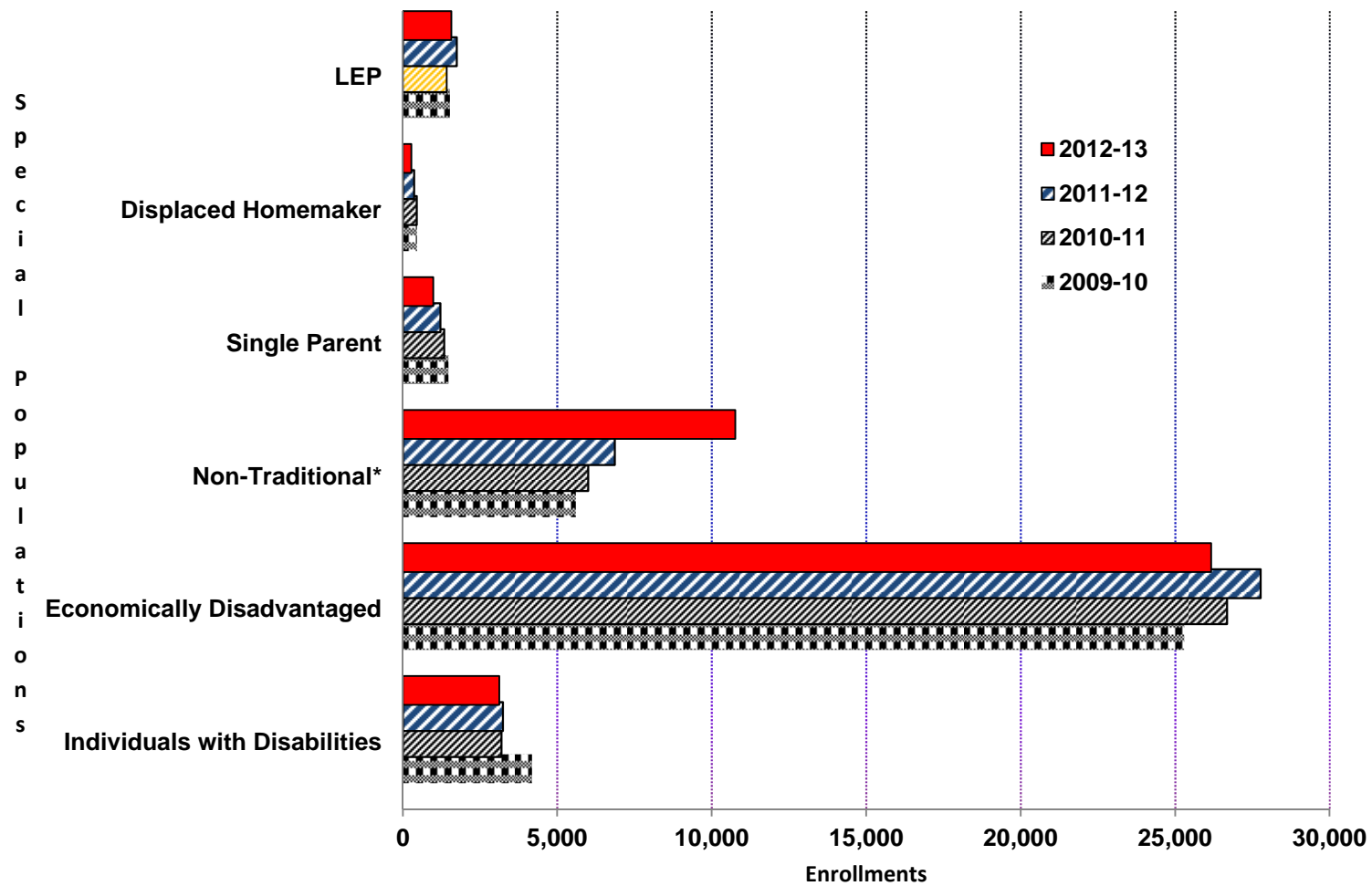

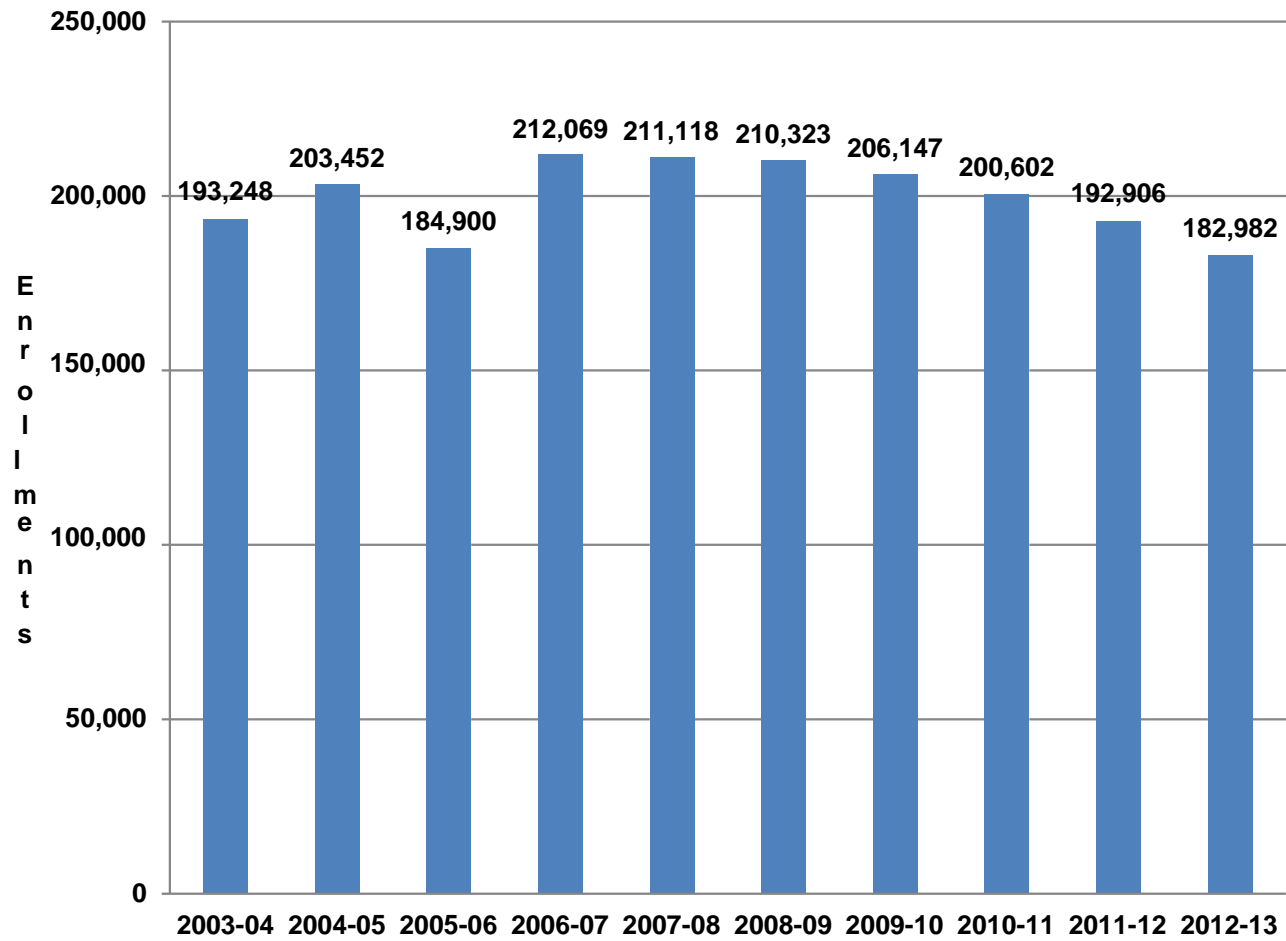

2005-06 THROUGH 2012-13**

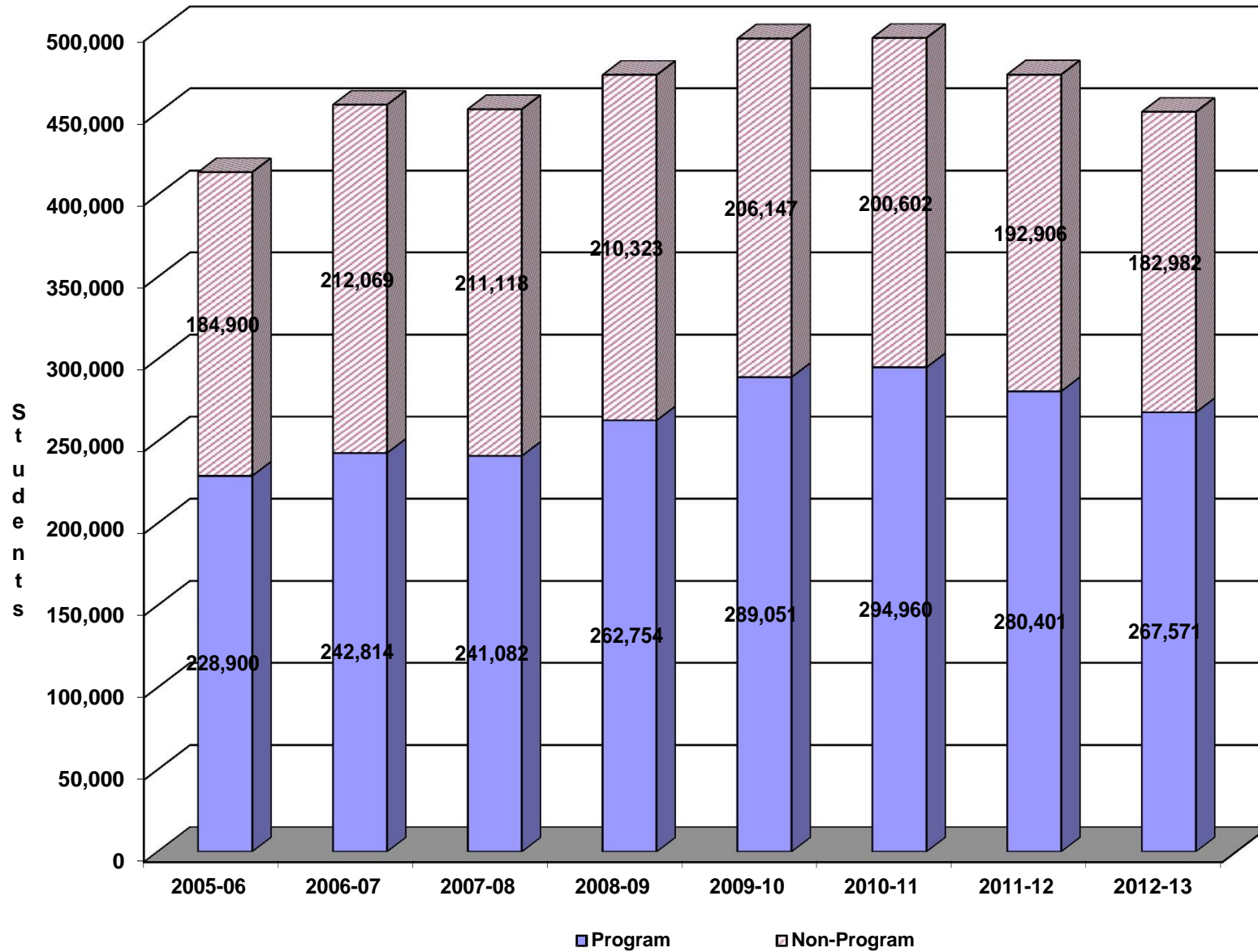

OCCUPATIONAL YEAR-END PROGRAM ENROLLMENTS, 2003-04 THROUGH 2012-13

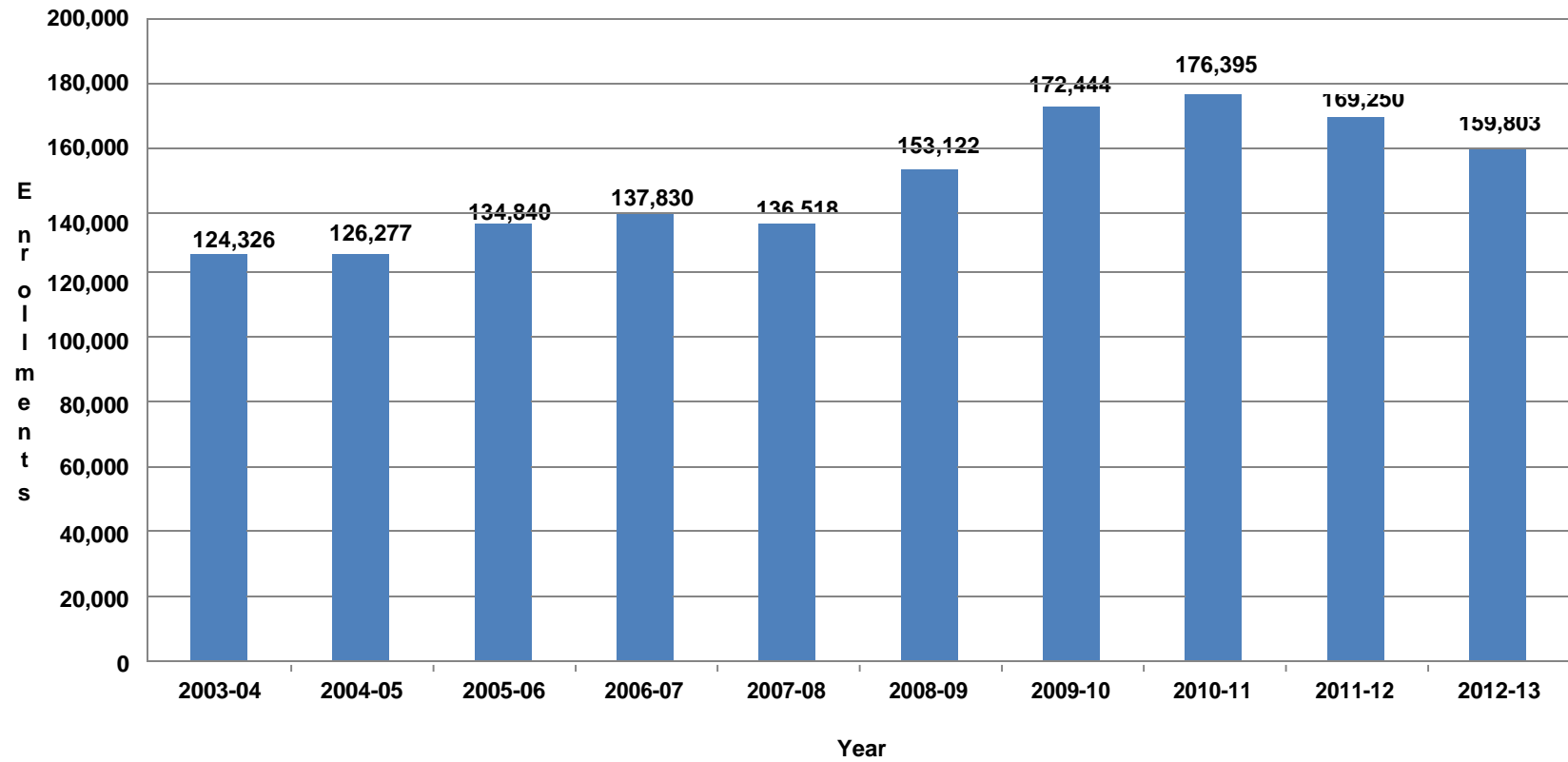

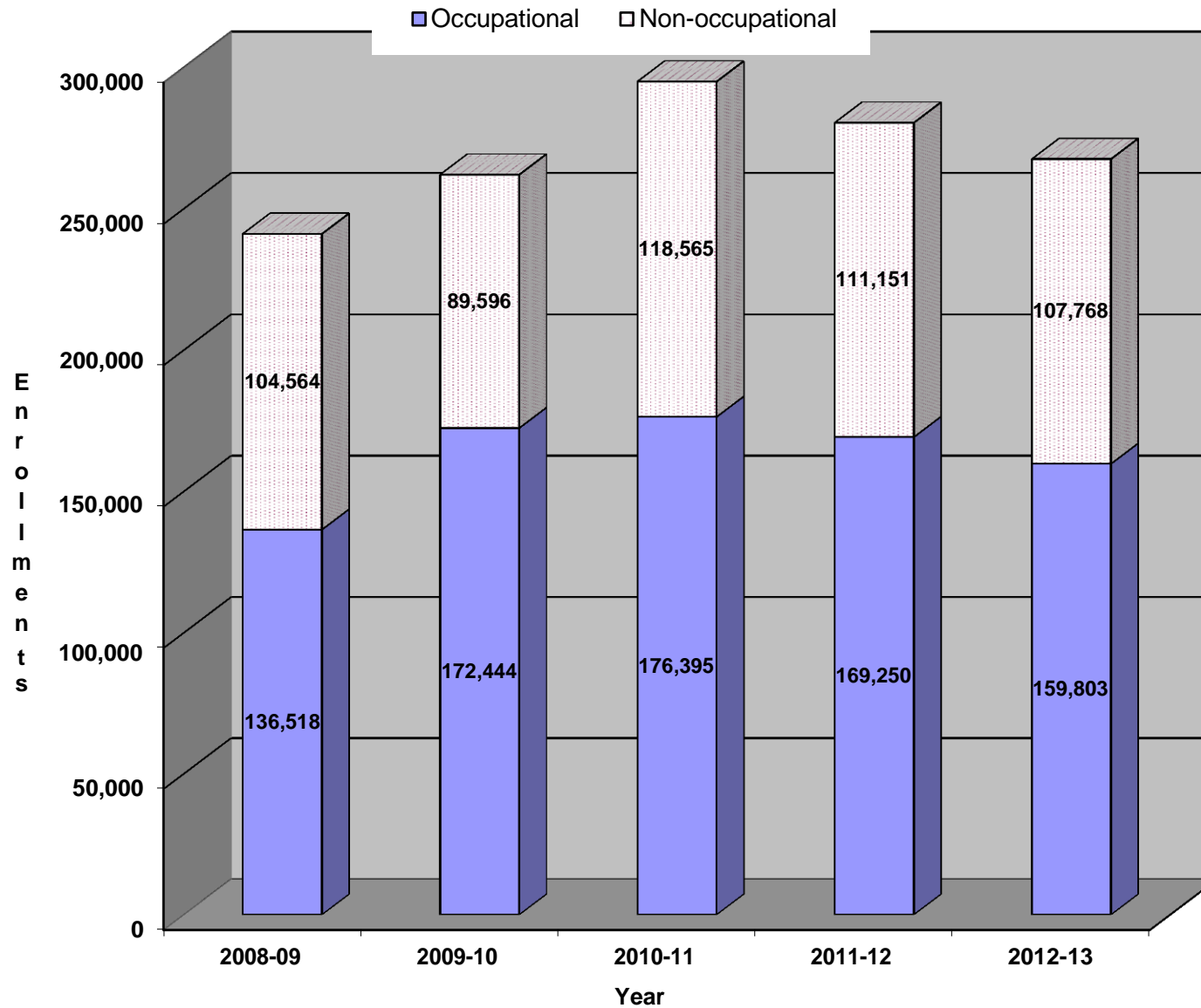

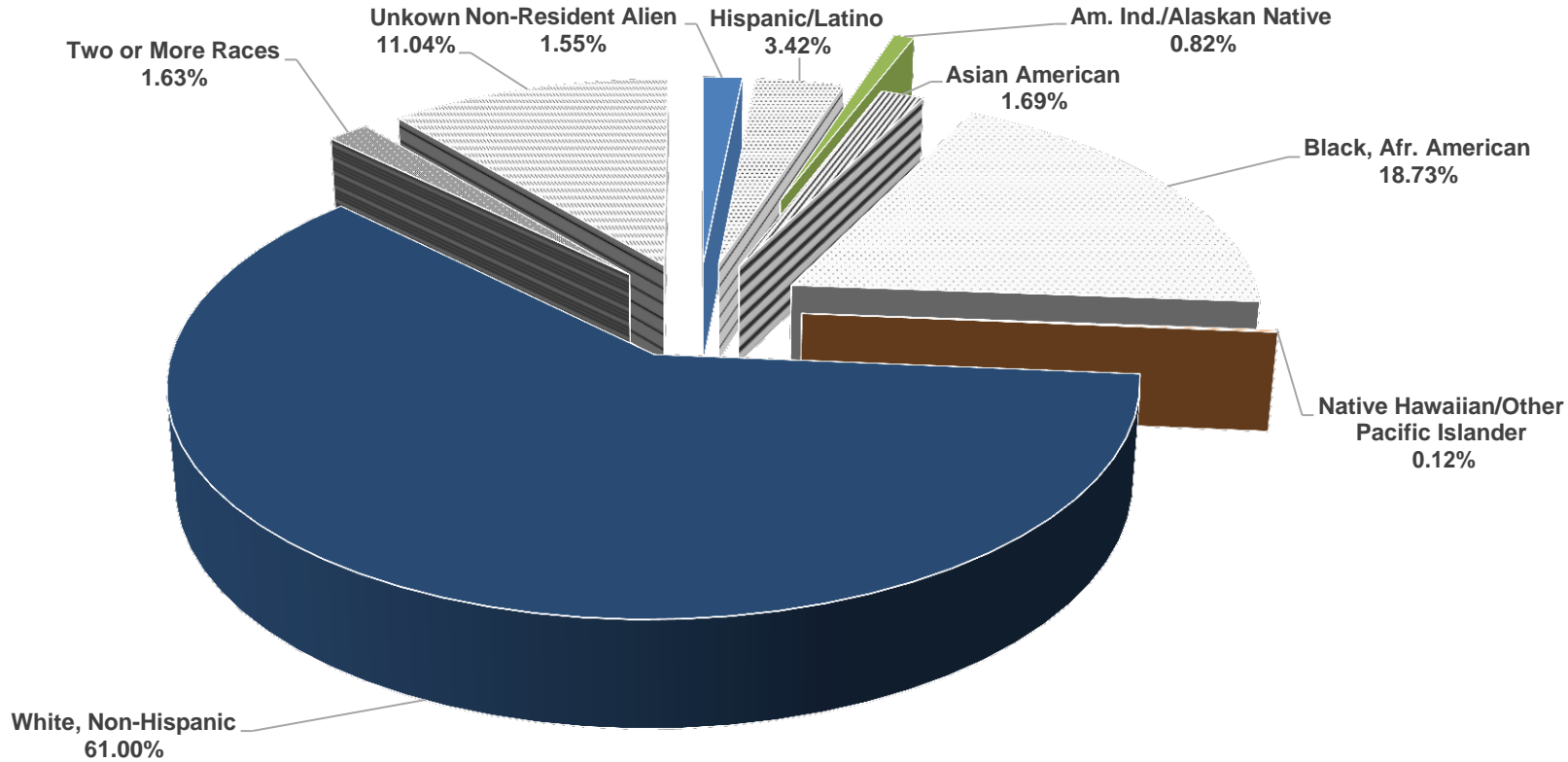

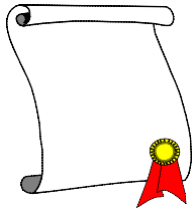

AWARDS CONFERRED BY LEVEL, 2003-04 THROUGH 2012-13

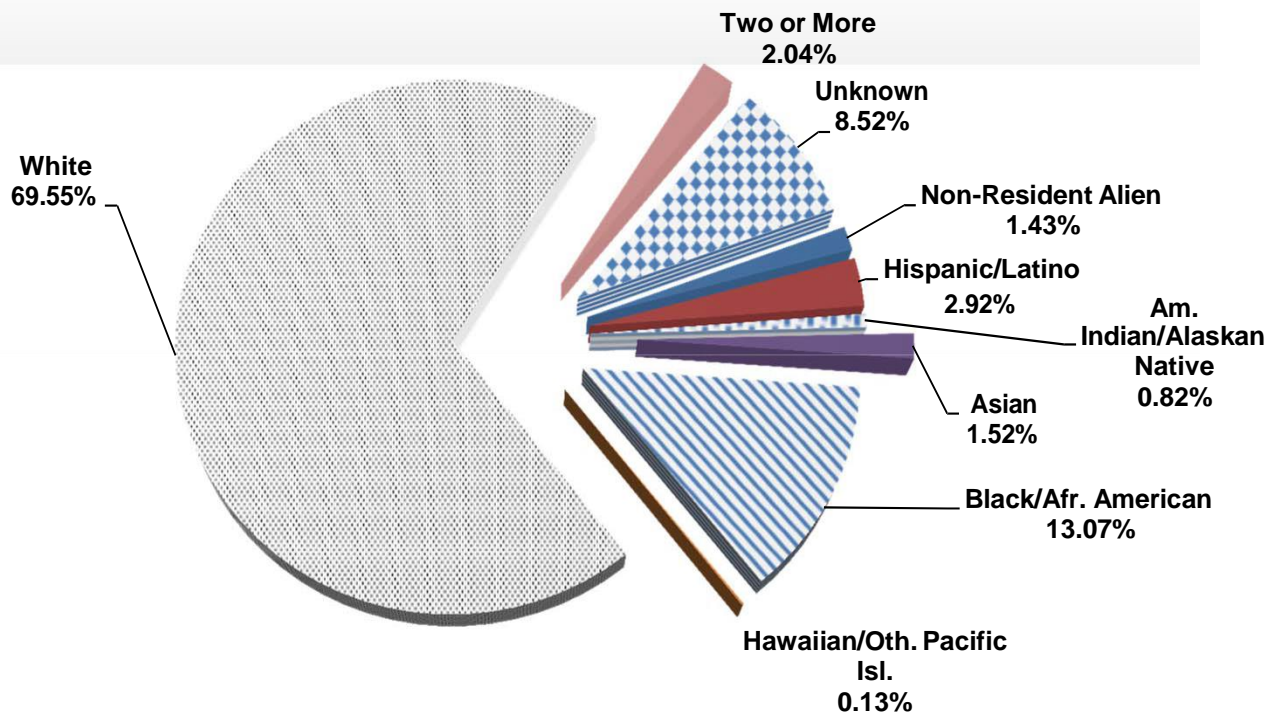

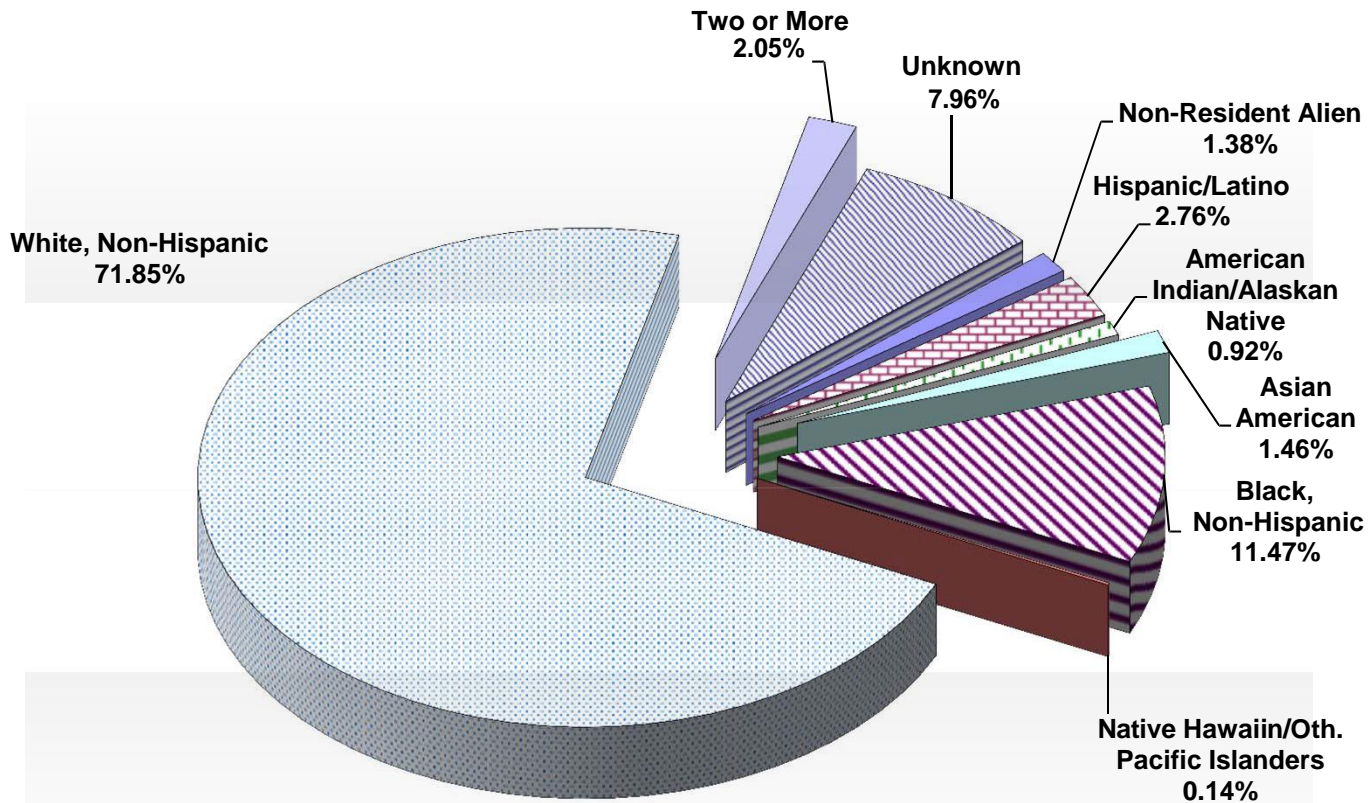
