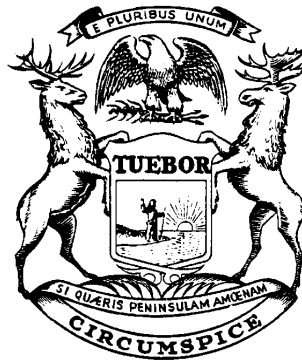

TEN YEAR HISTORY OF FALL ENROLLMENTS

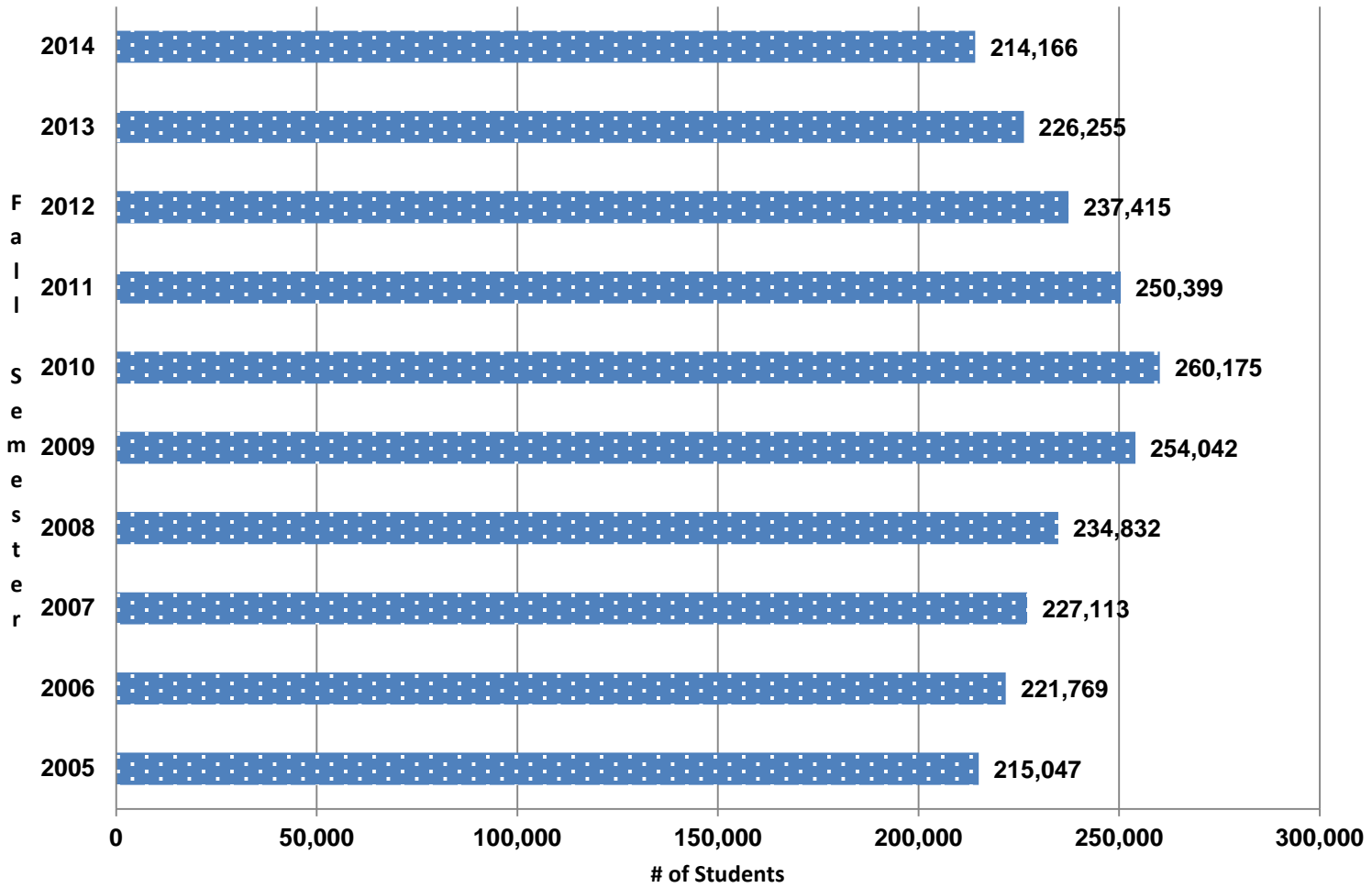
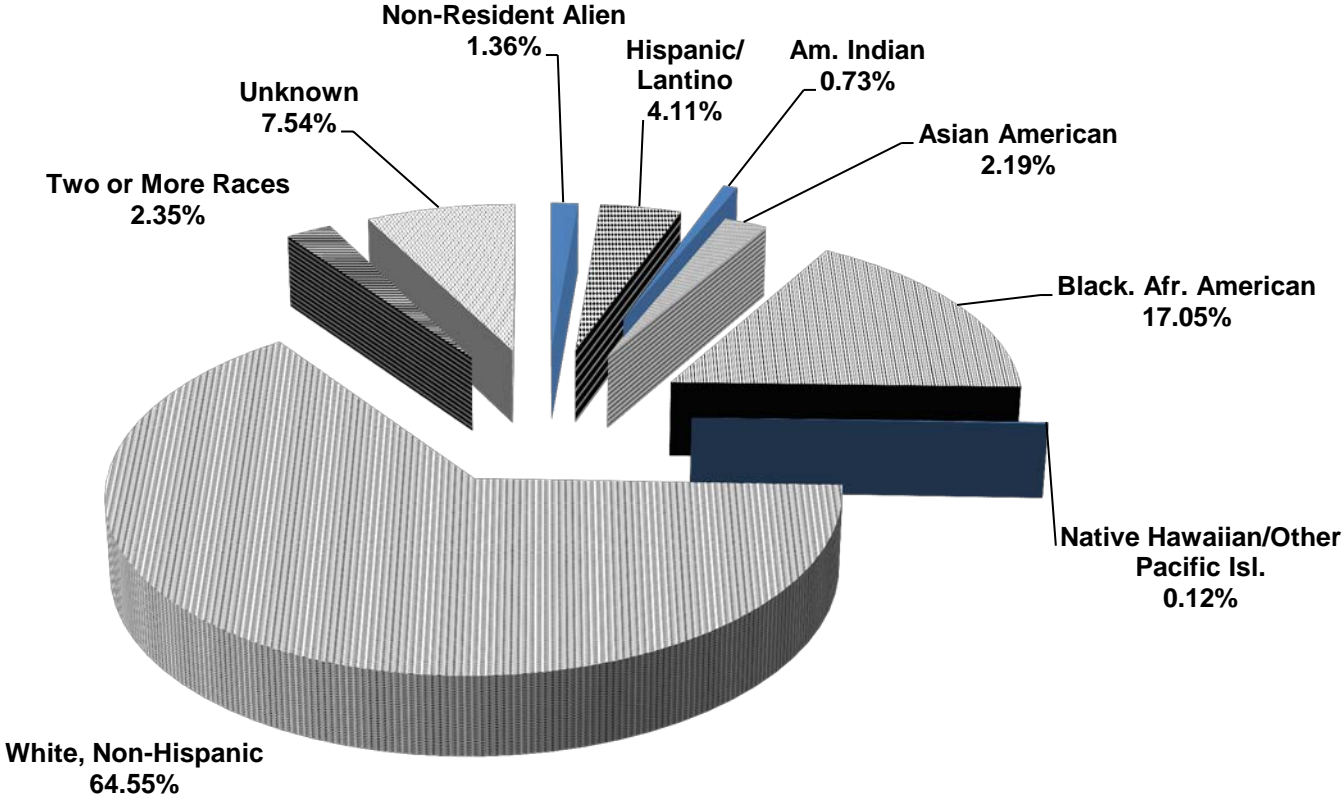

NUMBER of FITIAC's AS COMPARED TO FALL ENROLLMENT, 2004 THROUGH 2014

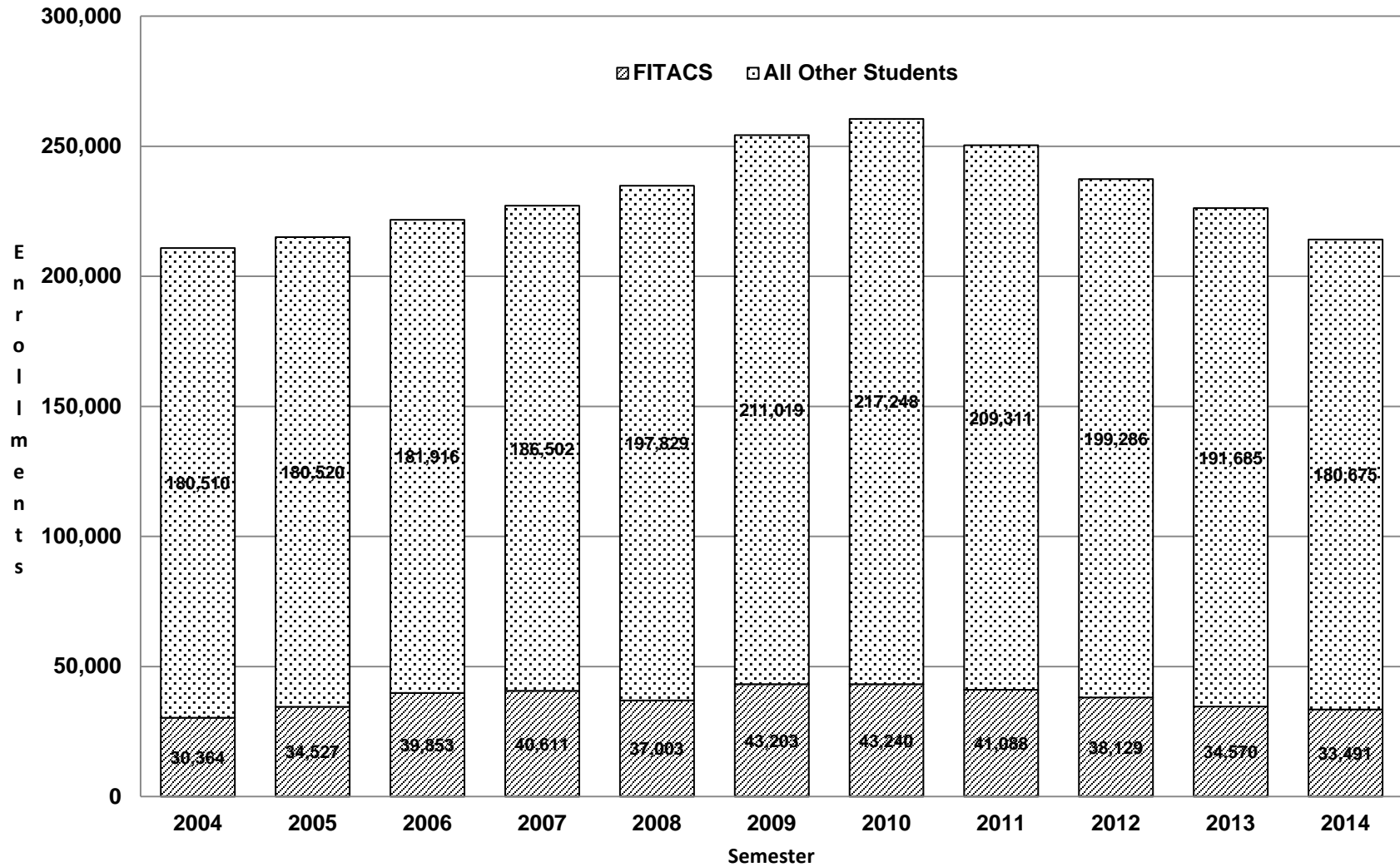

ENROLLMENT BY STATUS, FALL 2010 - FALL 2014

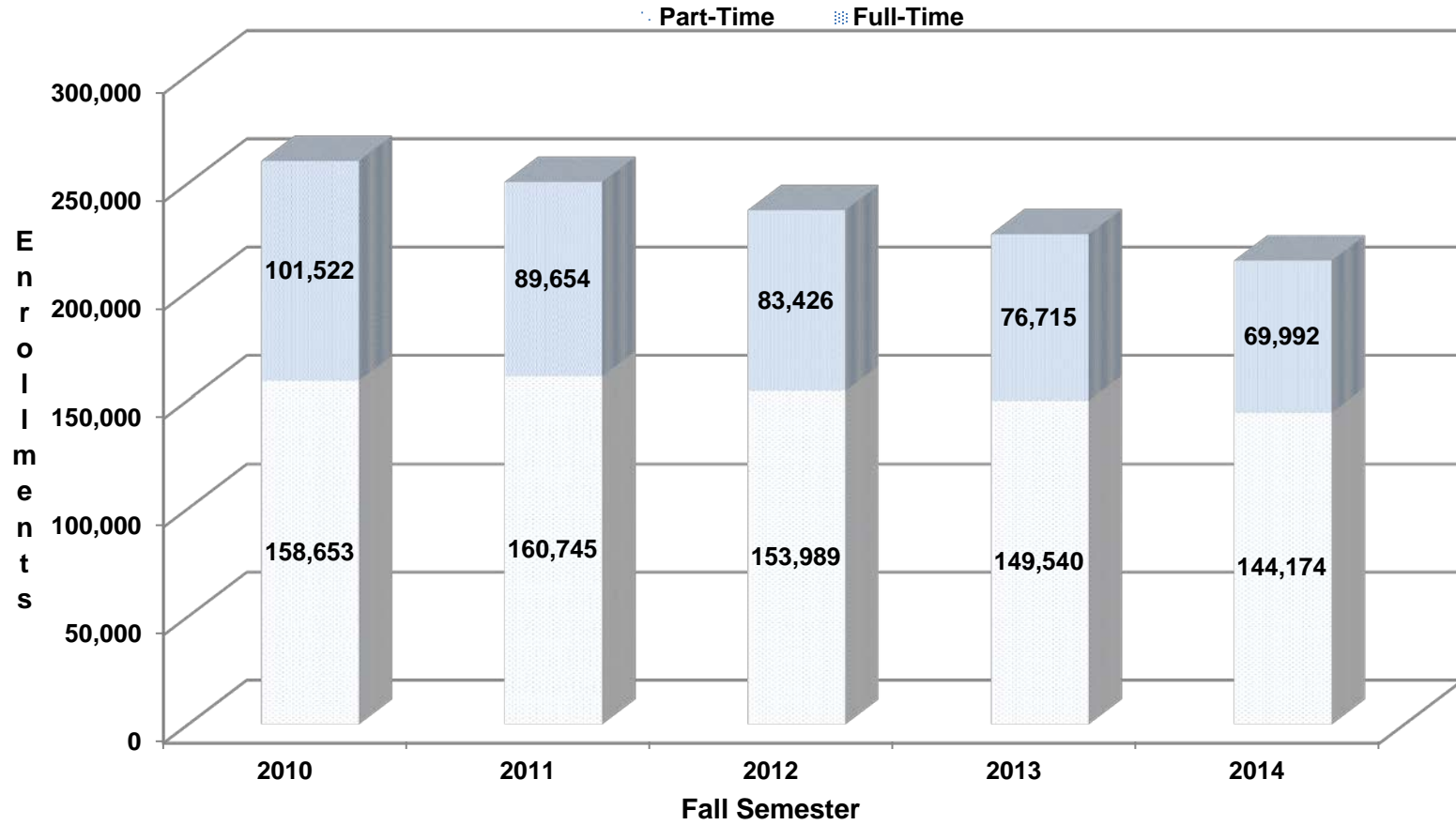

FALL 2014 ENROLLMENT BY AGE

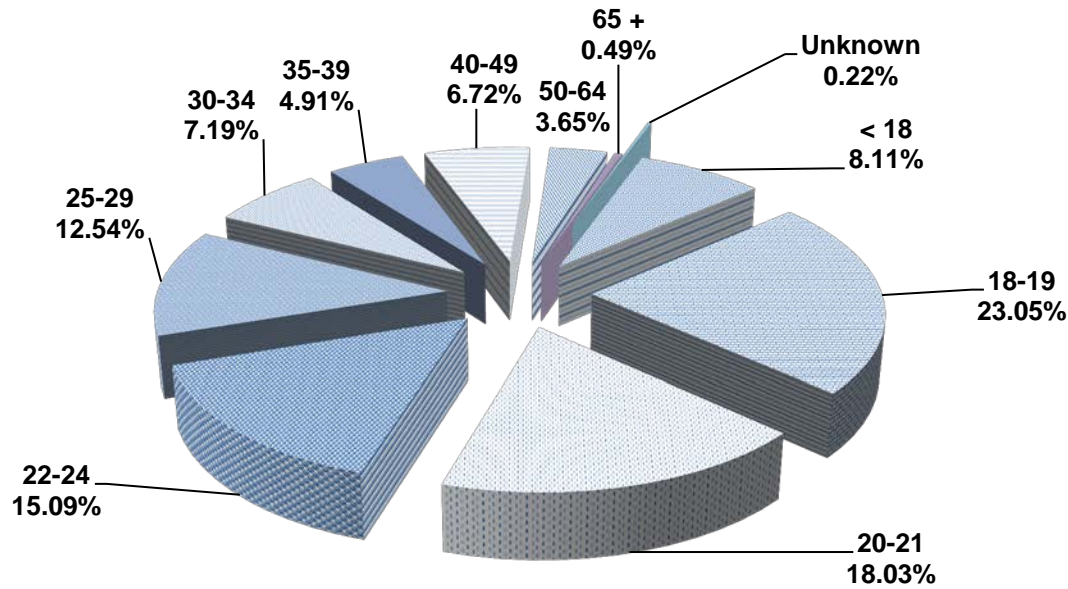

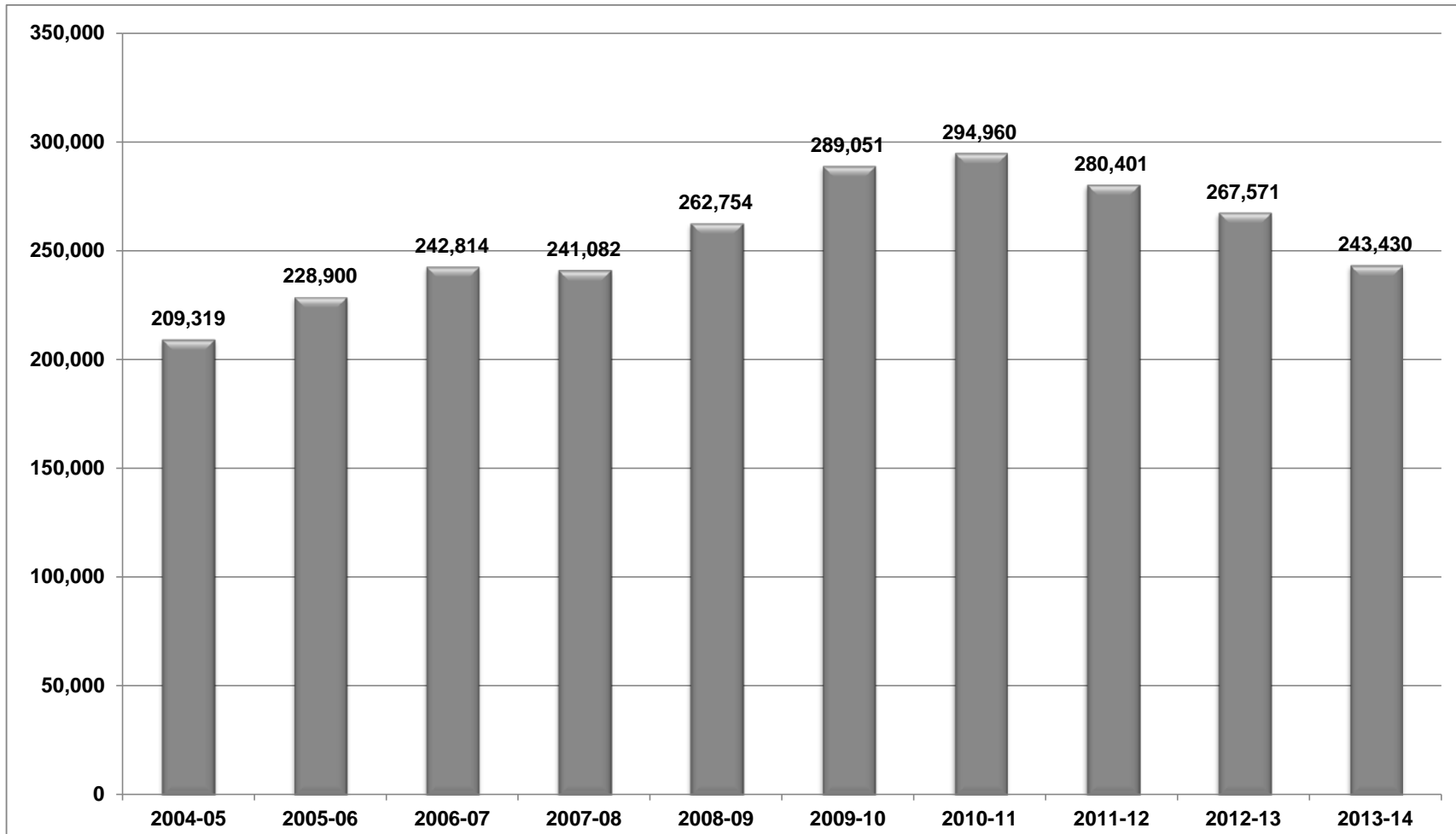

YEAR-END PROGRAM ENROLLMENT BY SPECIAL POPULATIONS, 2009-10 Through 2013-14

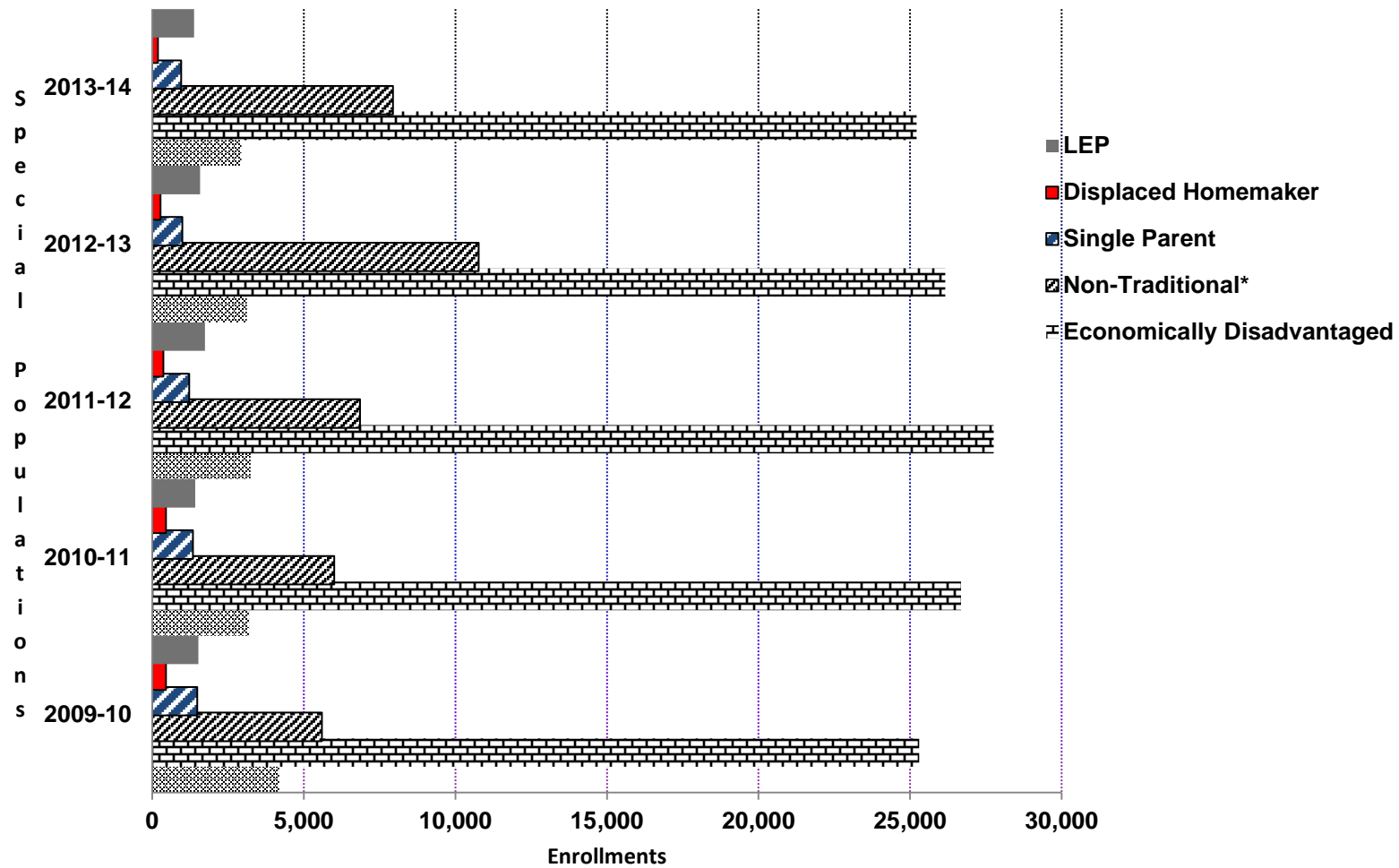

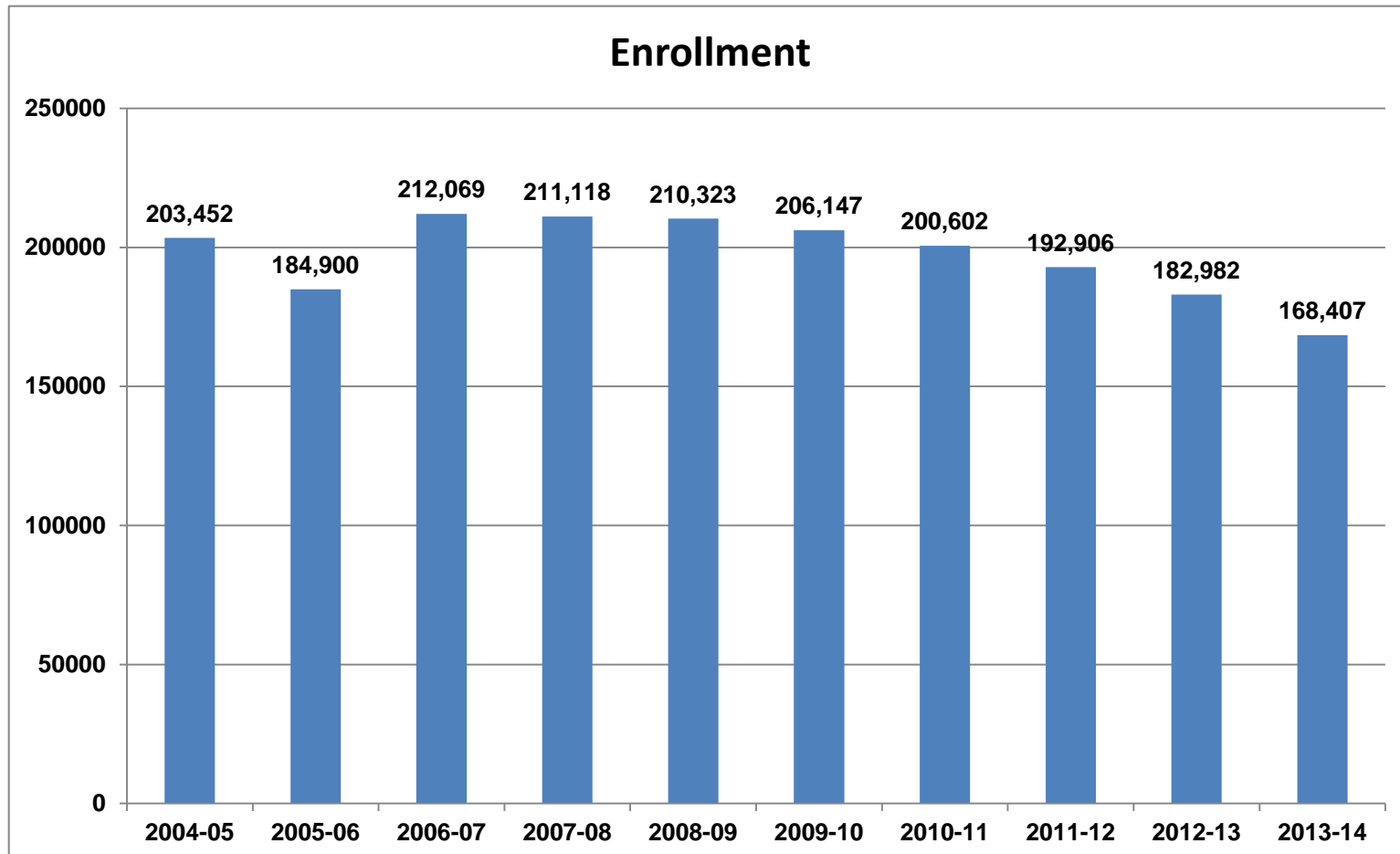

2005-06 THROUGH 2013-14**

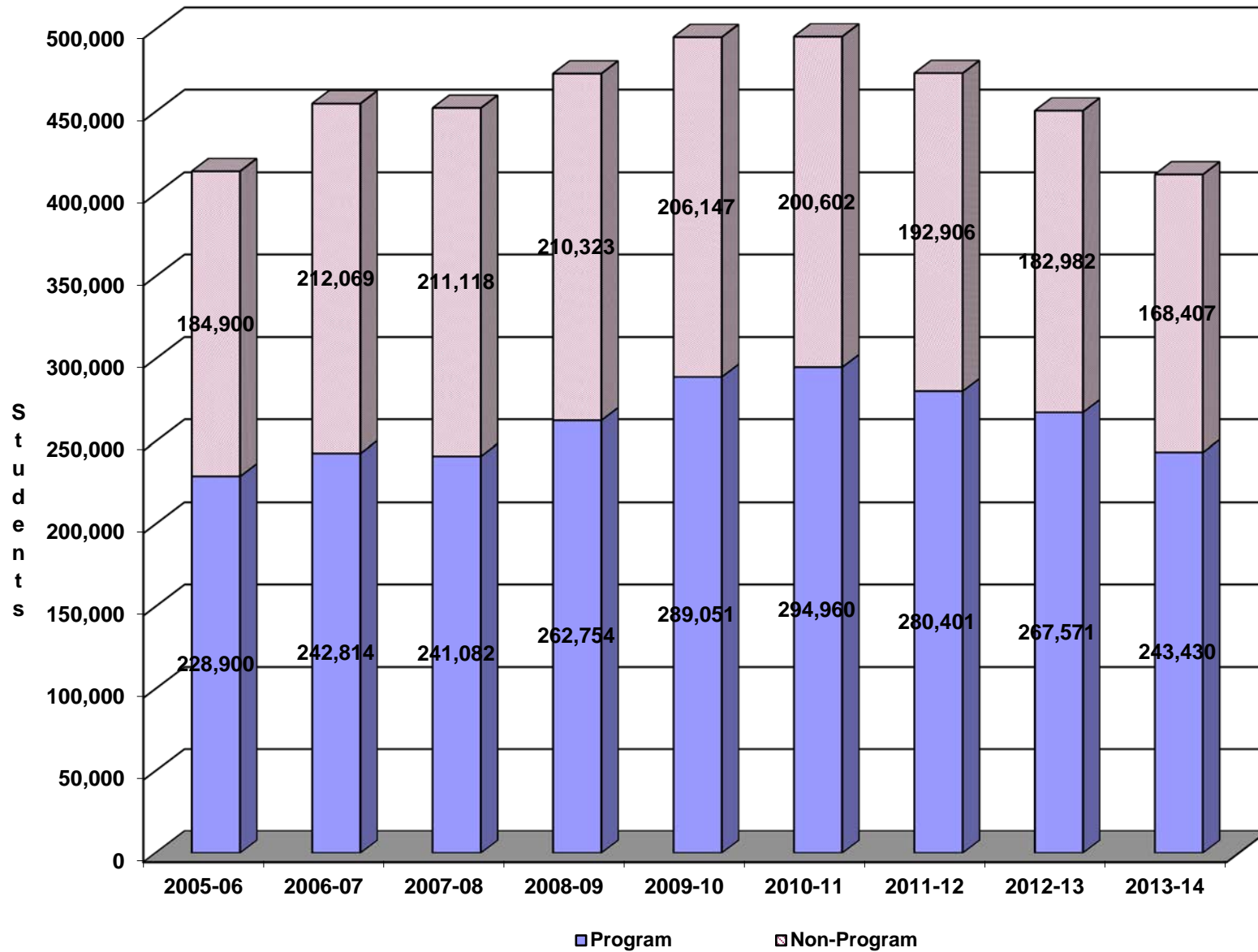

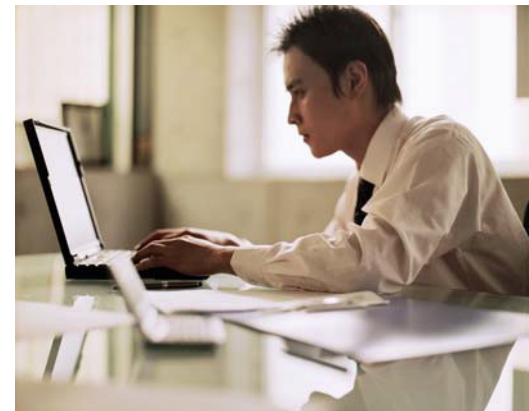

OCCUPATIONAL YEAR-END PROGRAM ENROLLMENTS, 2003-04 THROUGH 2013-14

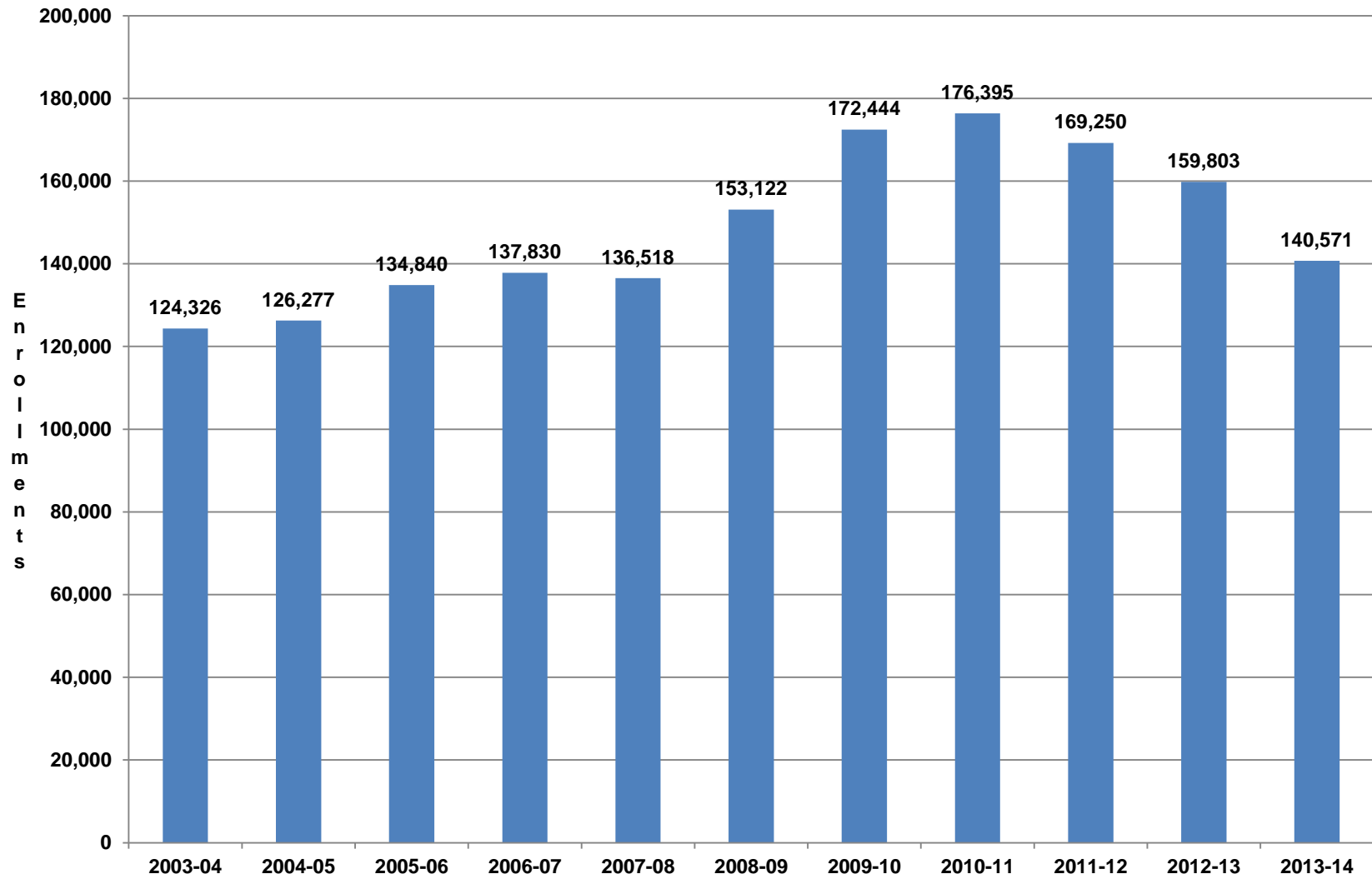

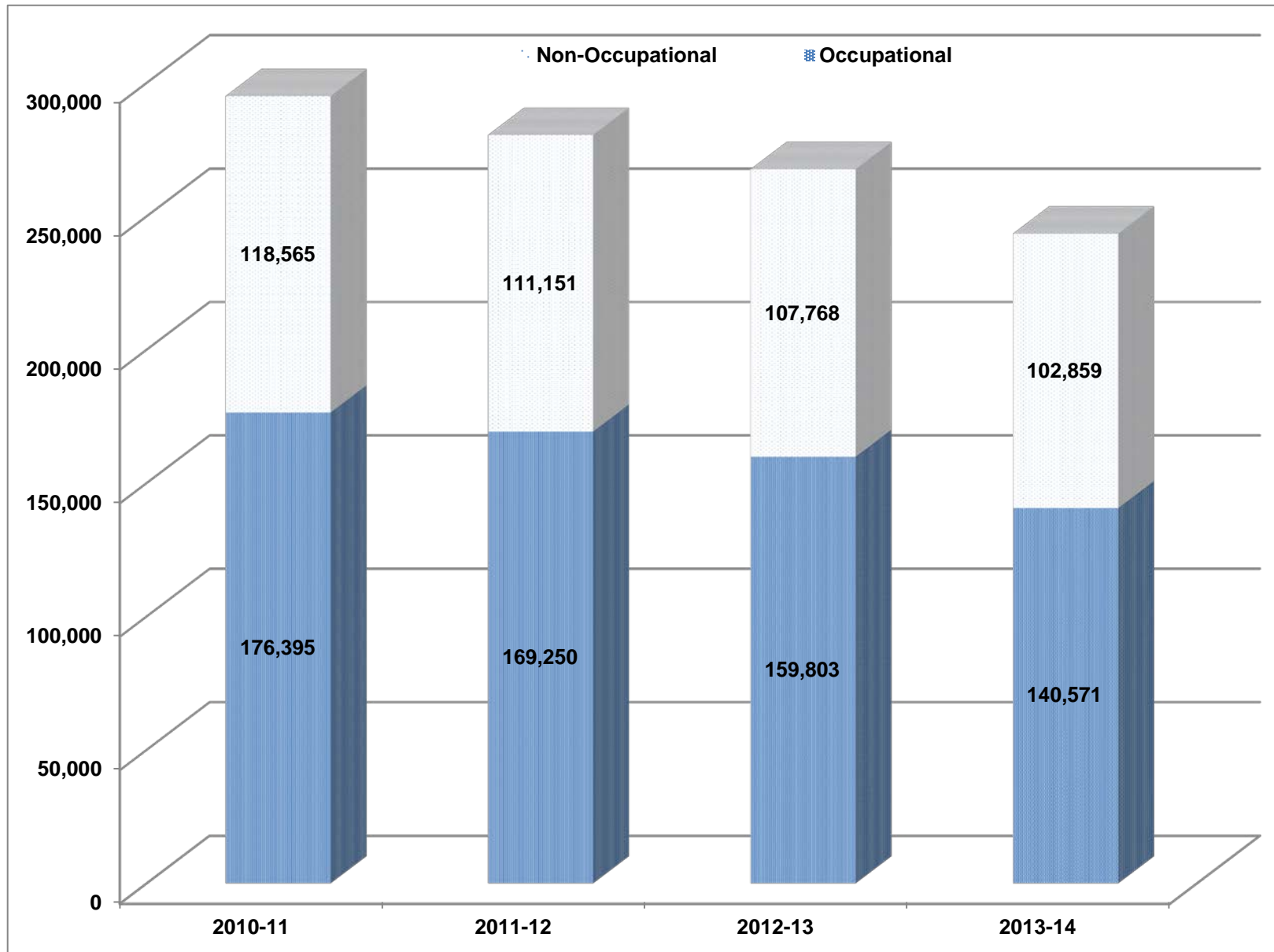

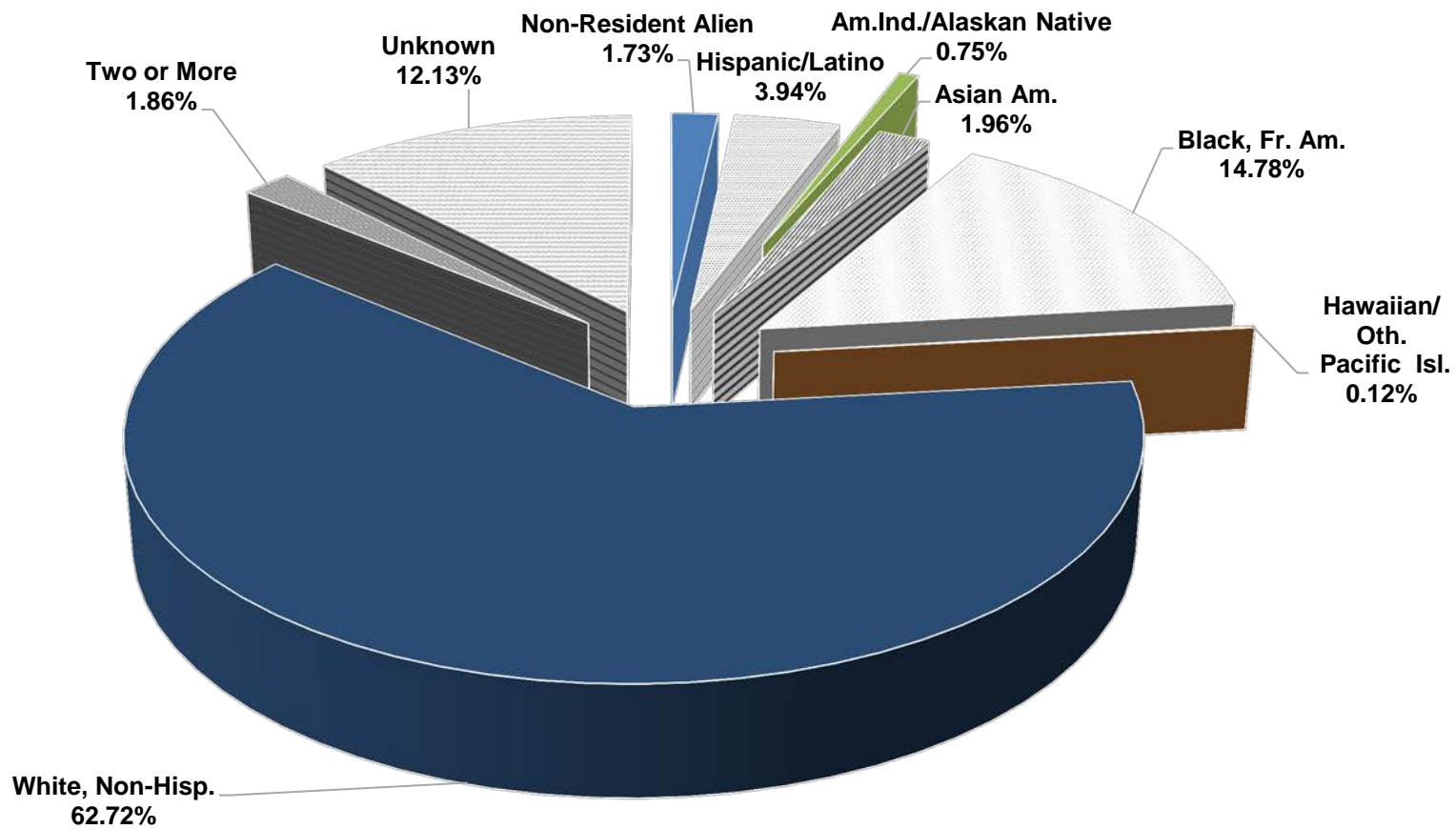

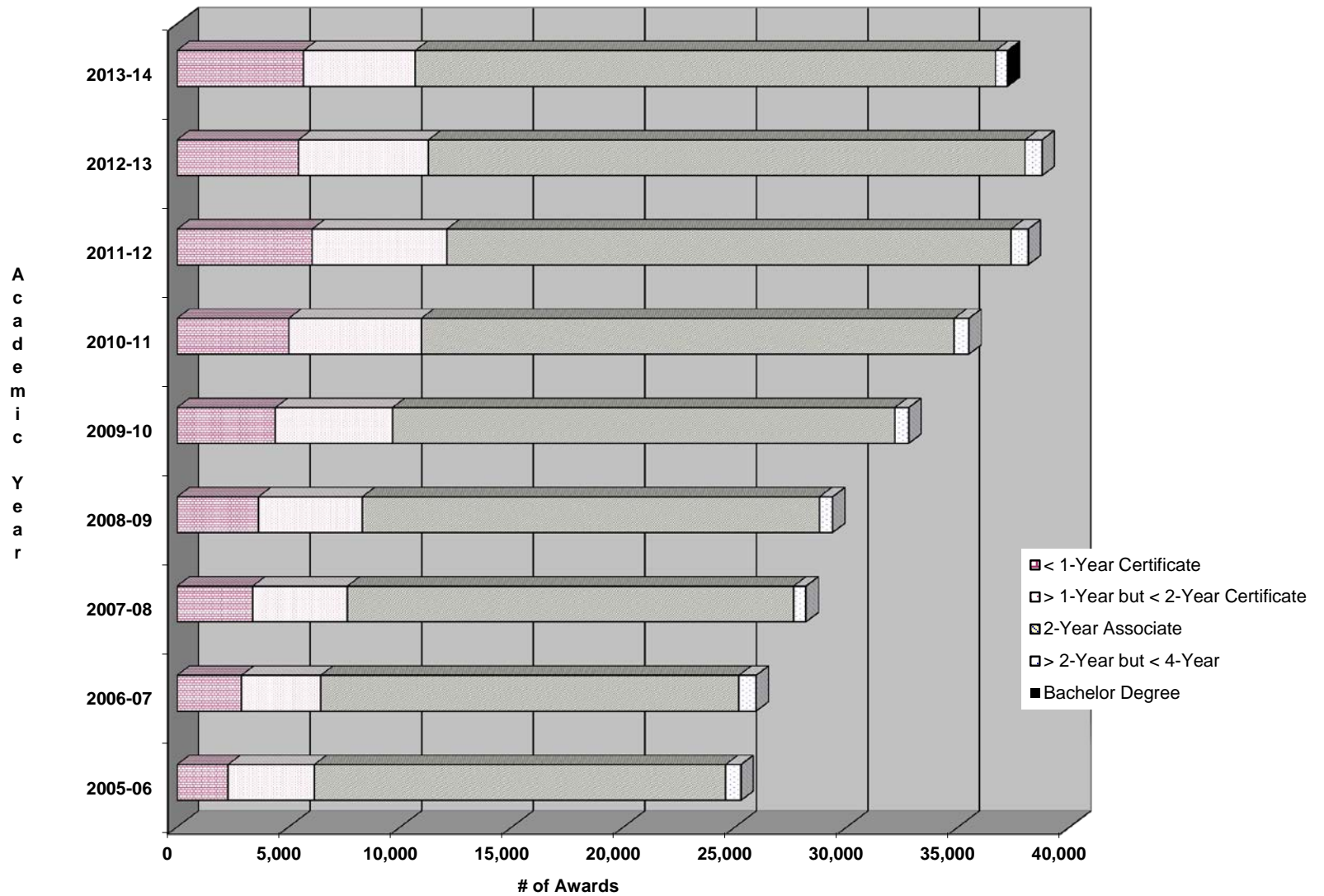

AWARDS CONFERRED BY LEVEL, 2005-06 THROUGH 2013-14

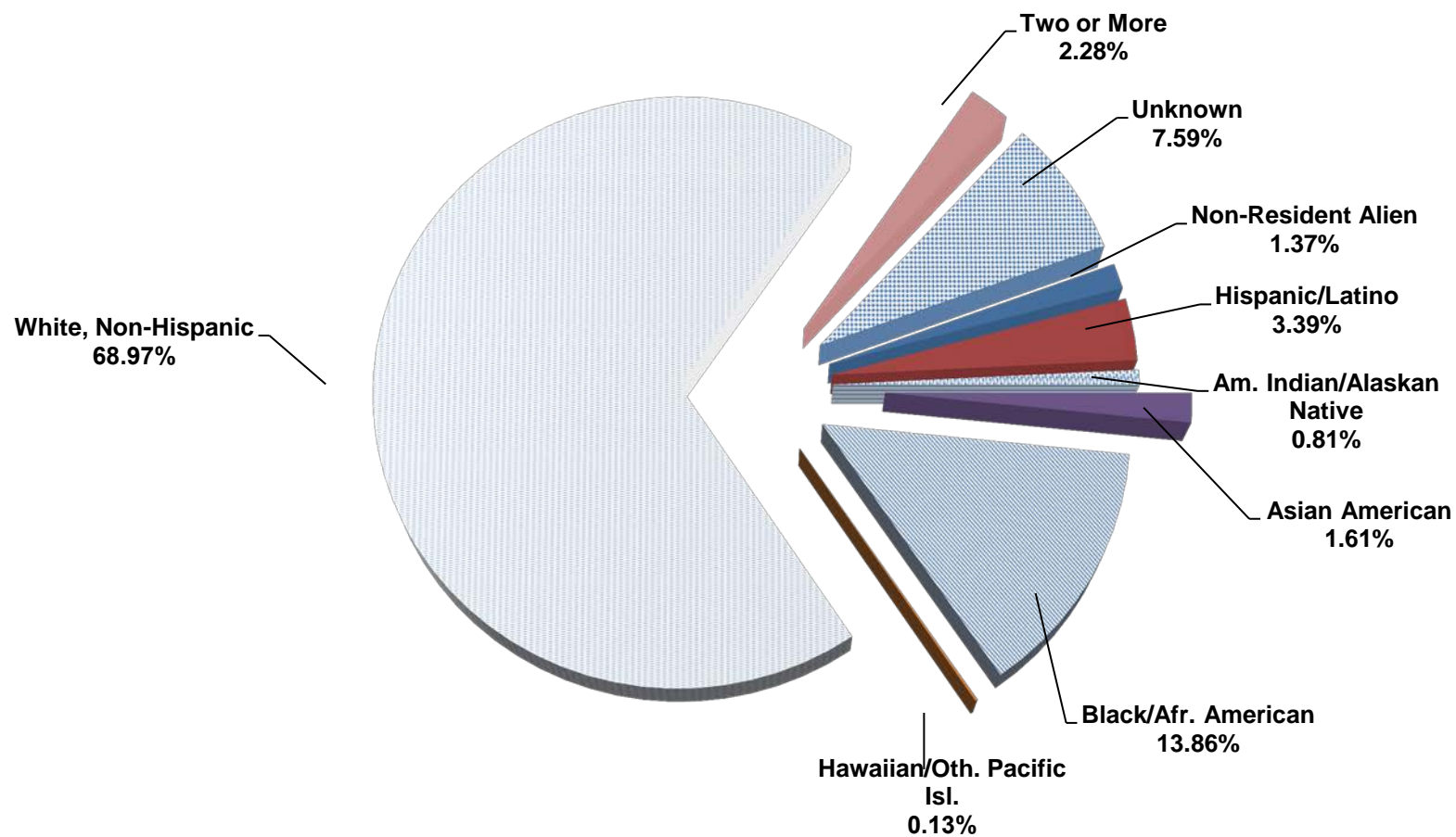

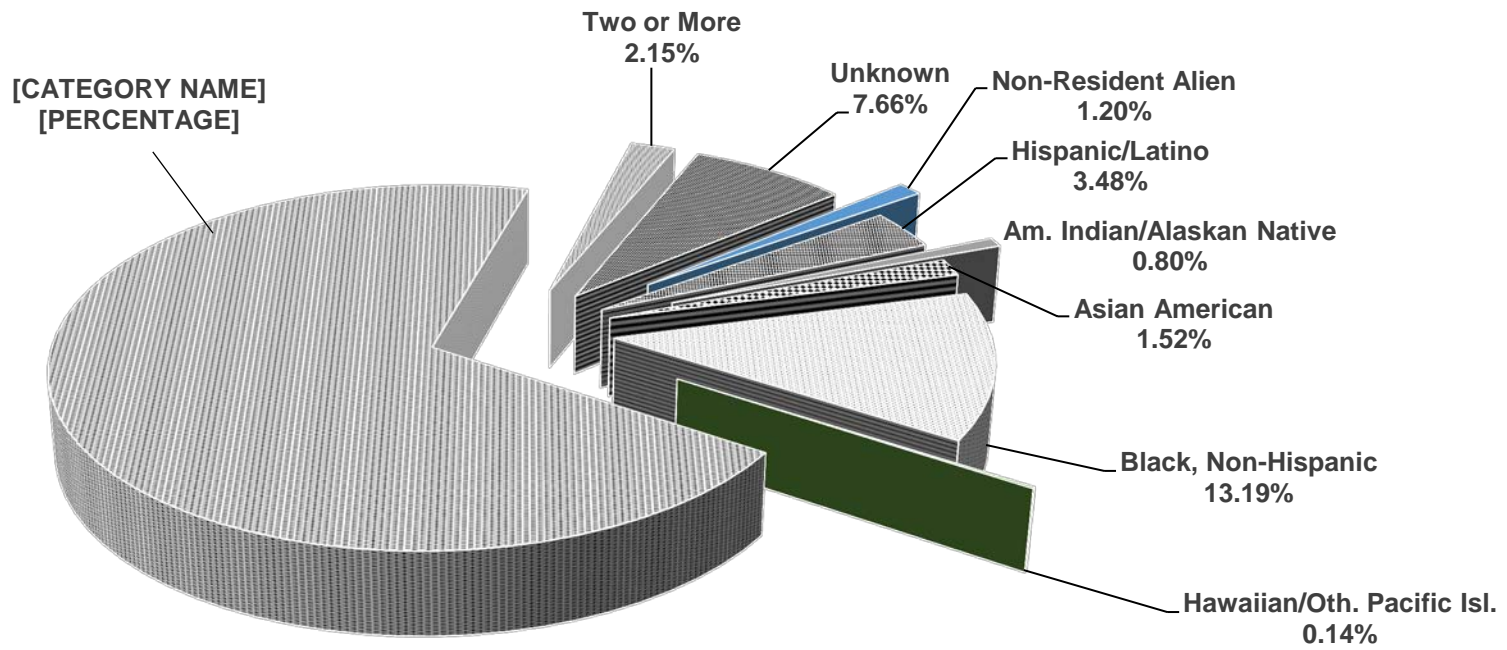
