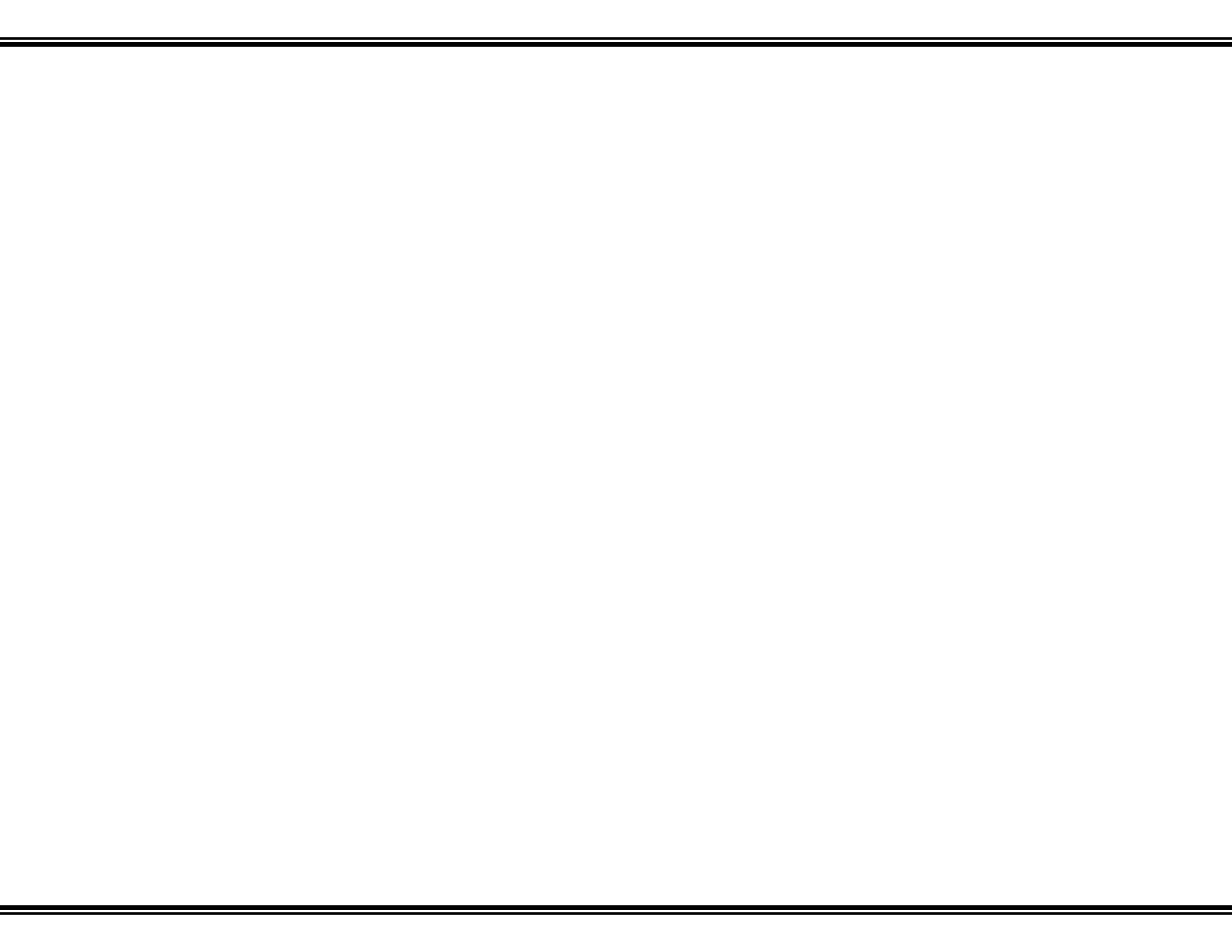

TEN YEAR HISTORY OF FALL ENROLLMENTS

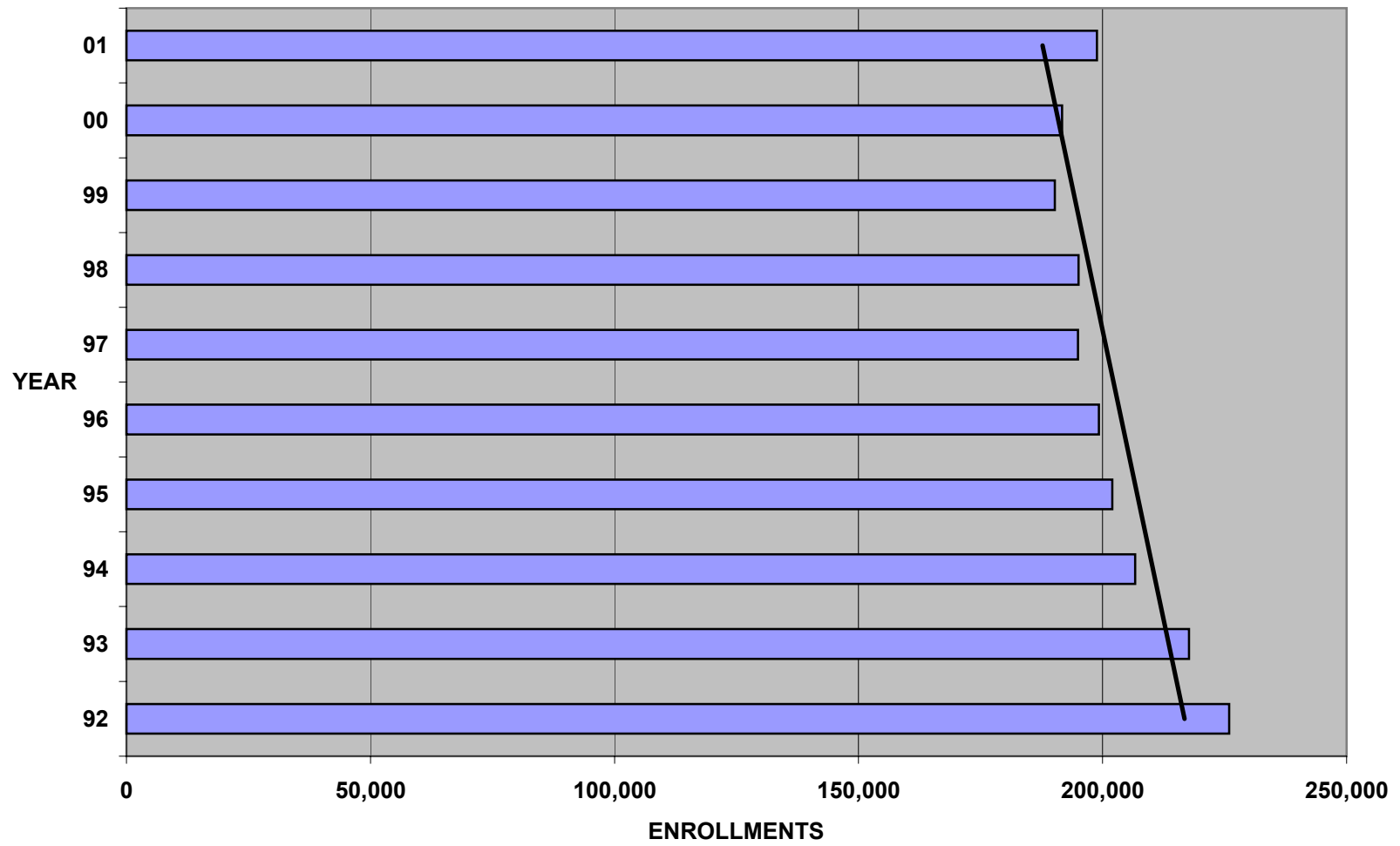
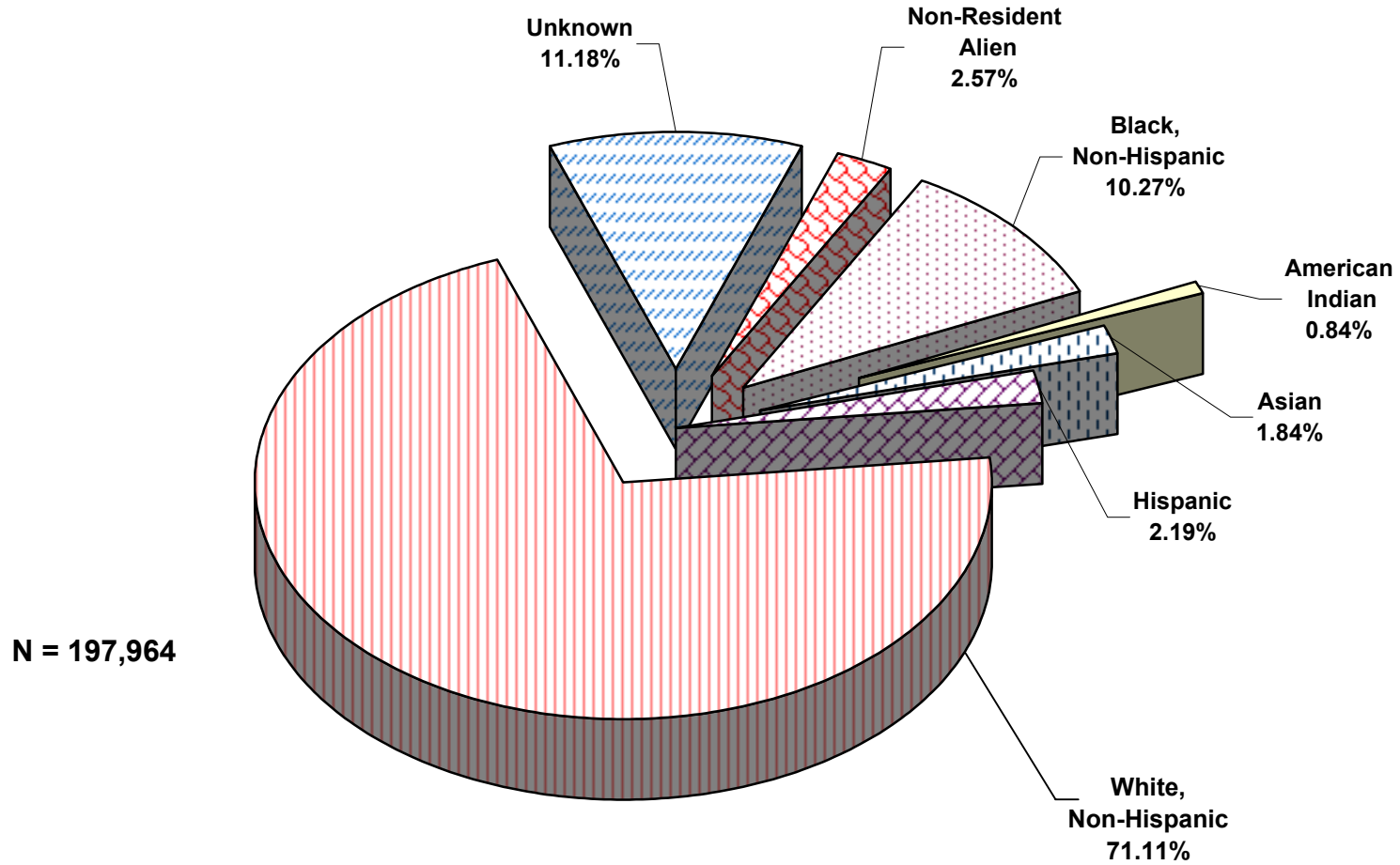

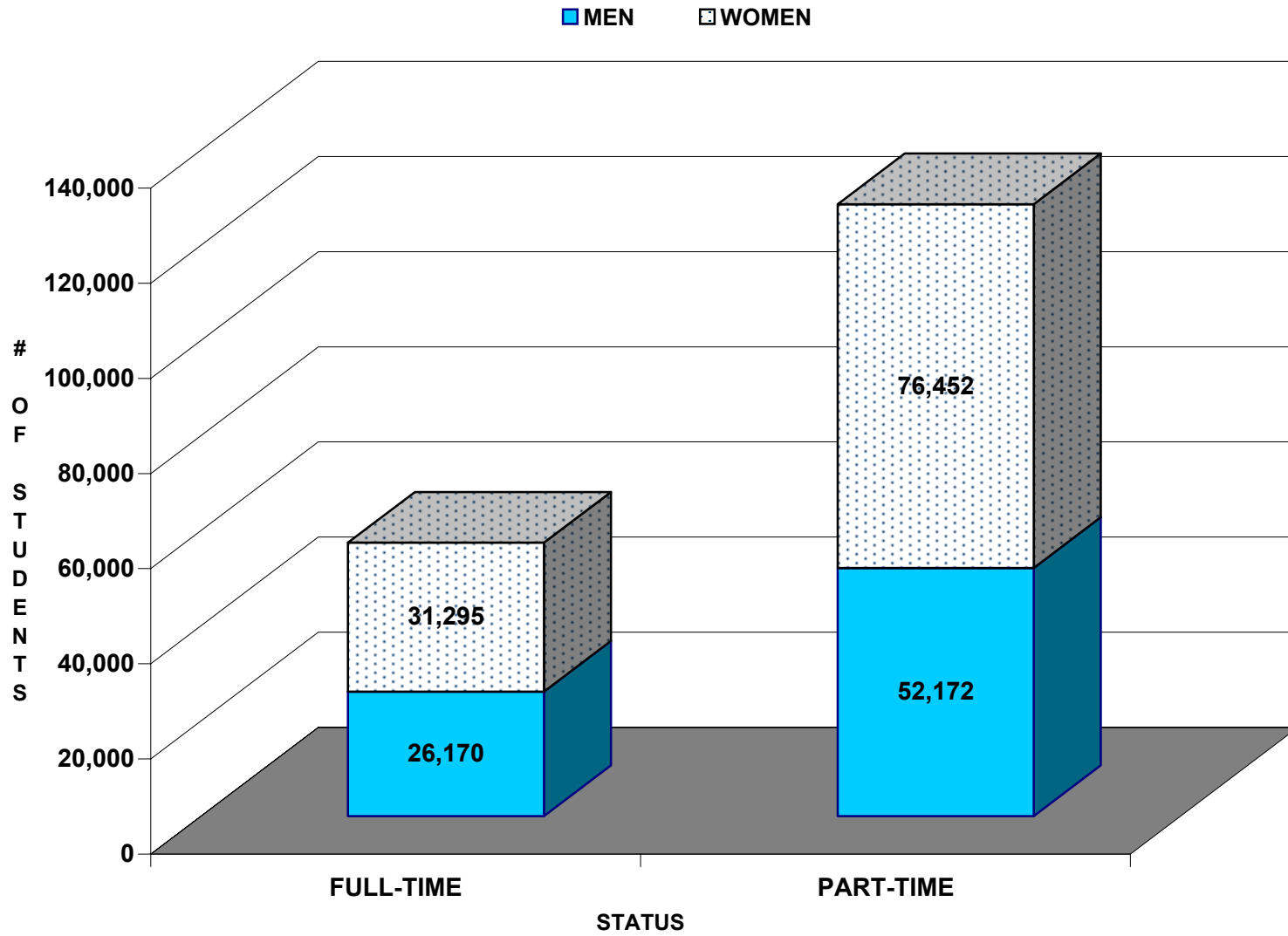

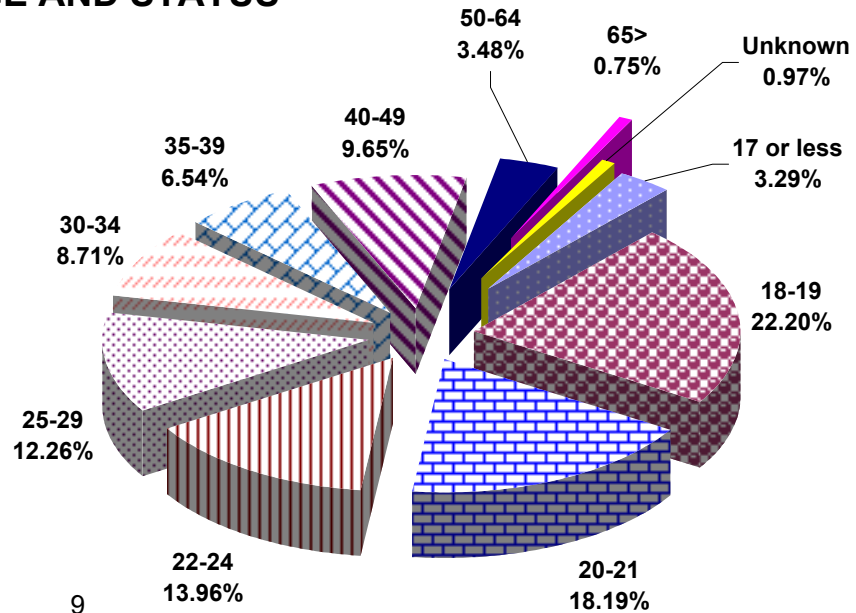

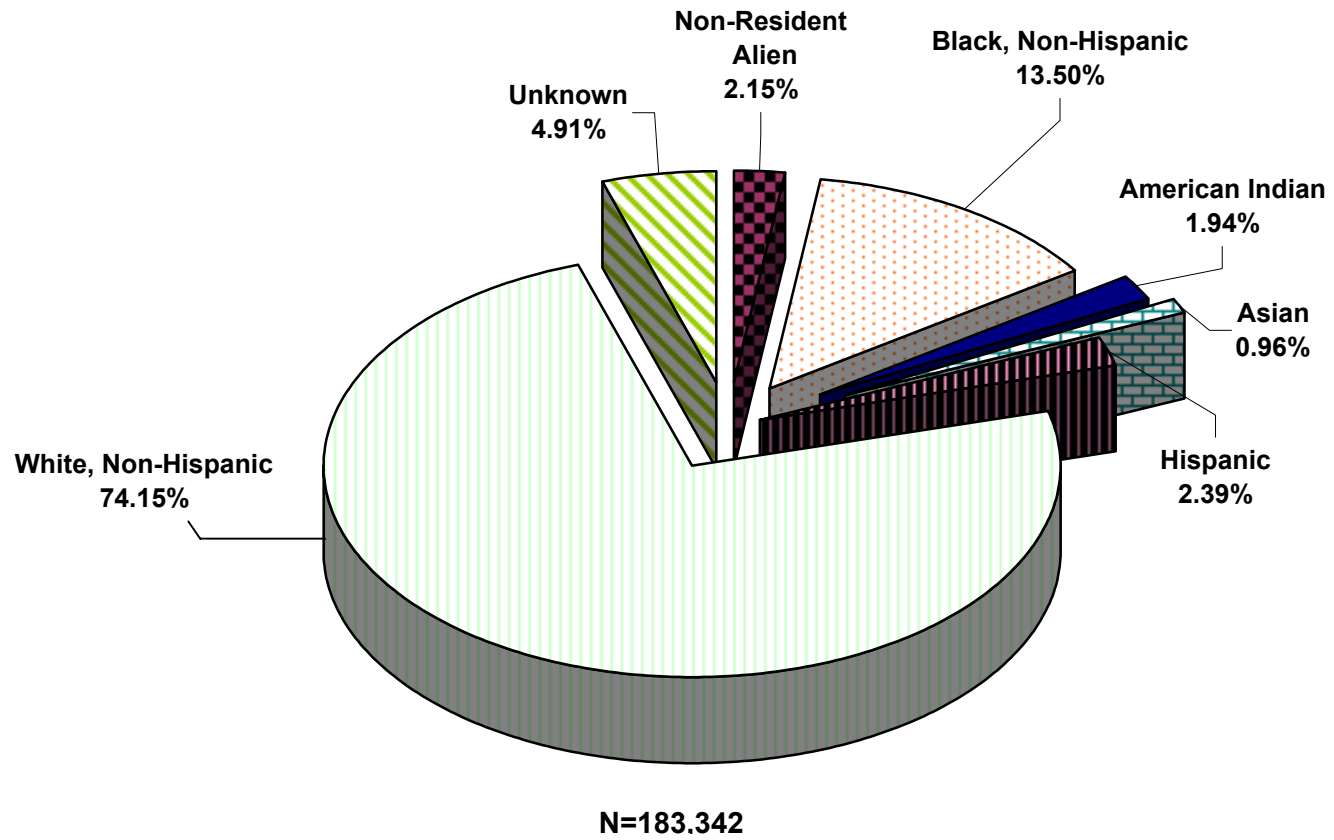

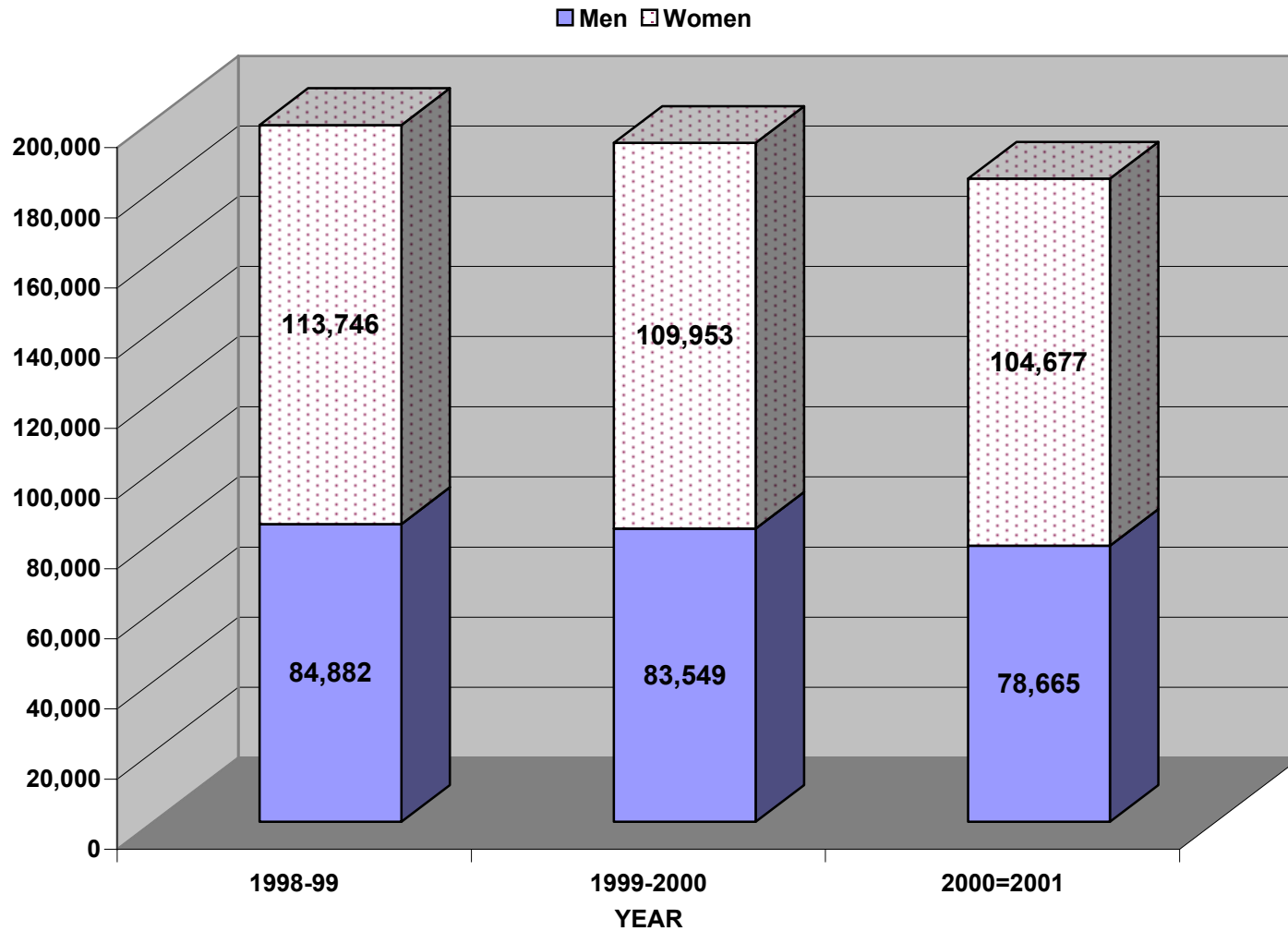

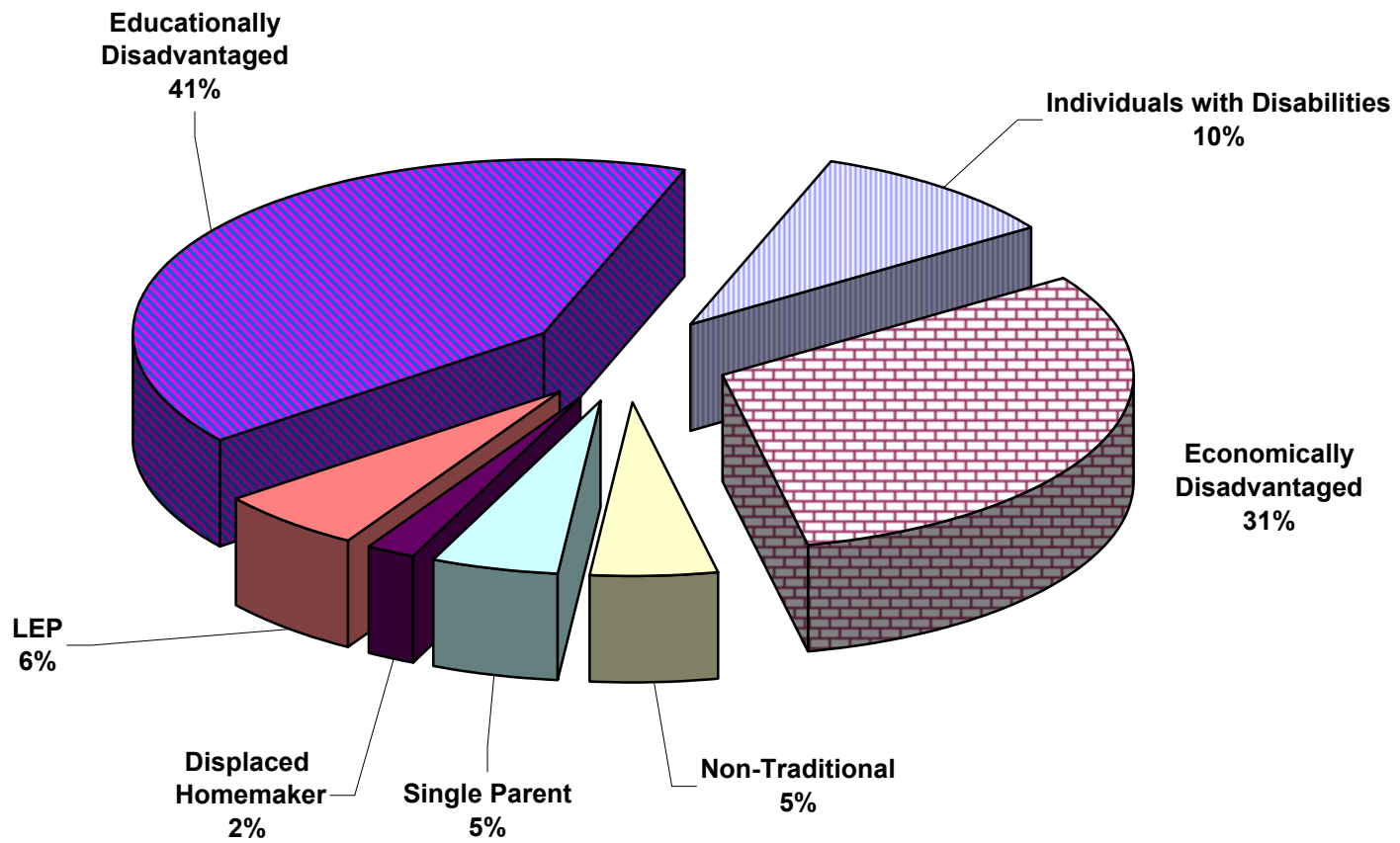

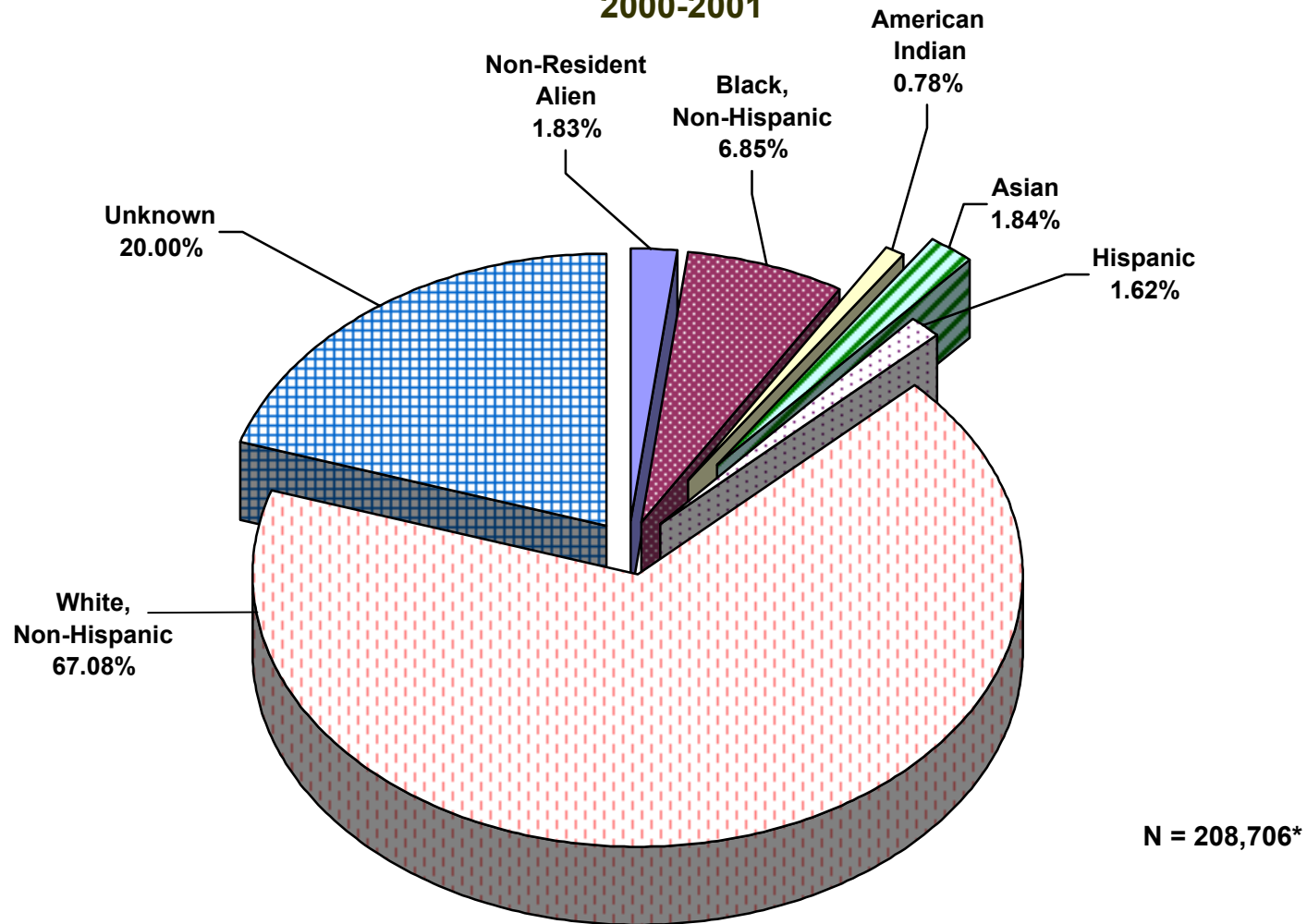

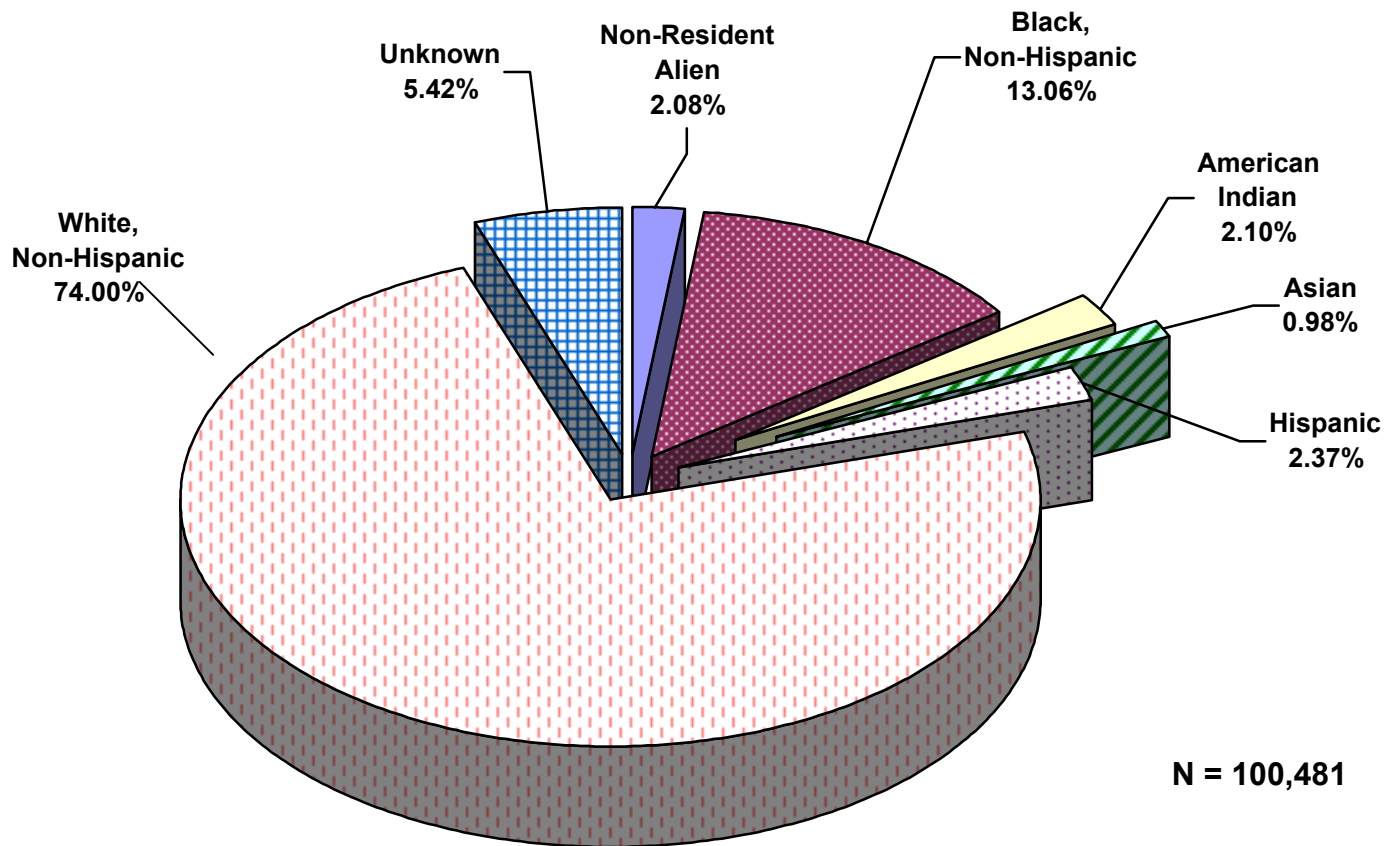

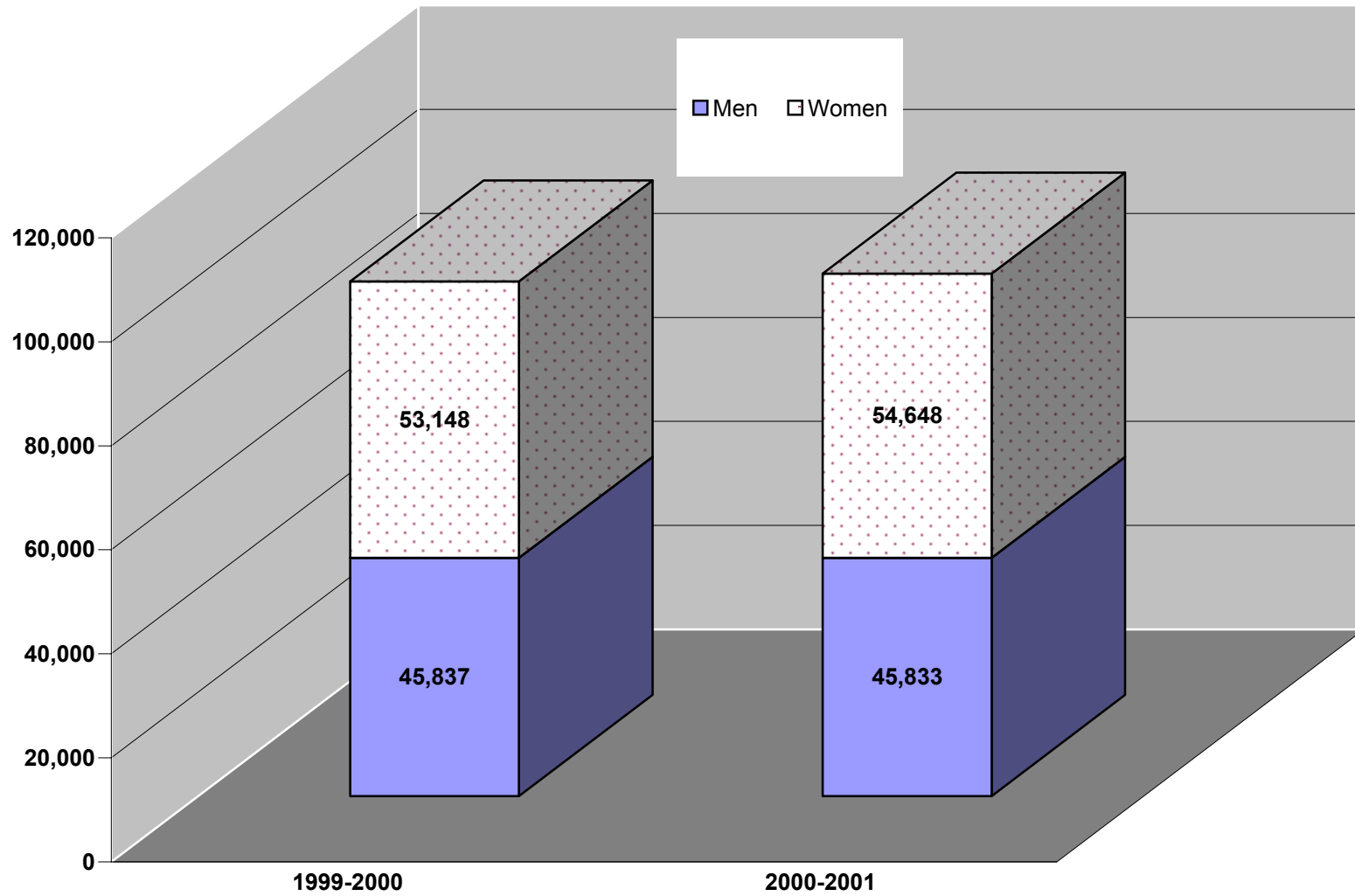
OCCUPATIONAL YEAR-END ENROLLMENTS 2000-2001

DISTRIBUTION OF OCCUPATIONAL AND NON-OCCUPATIONAL PROGRAM ENROLLMENTS

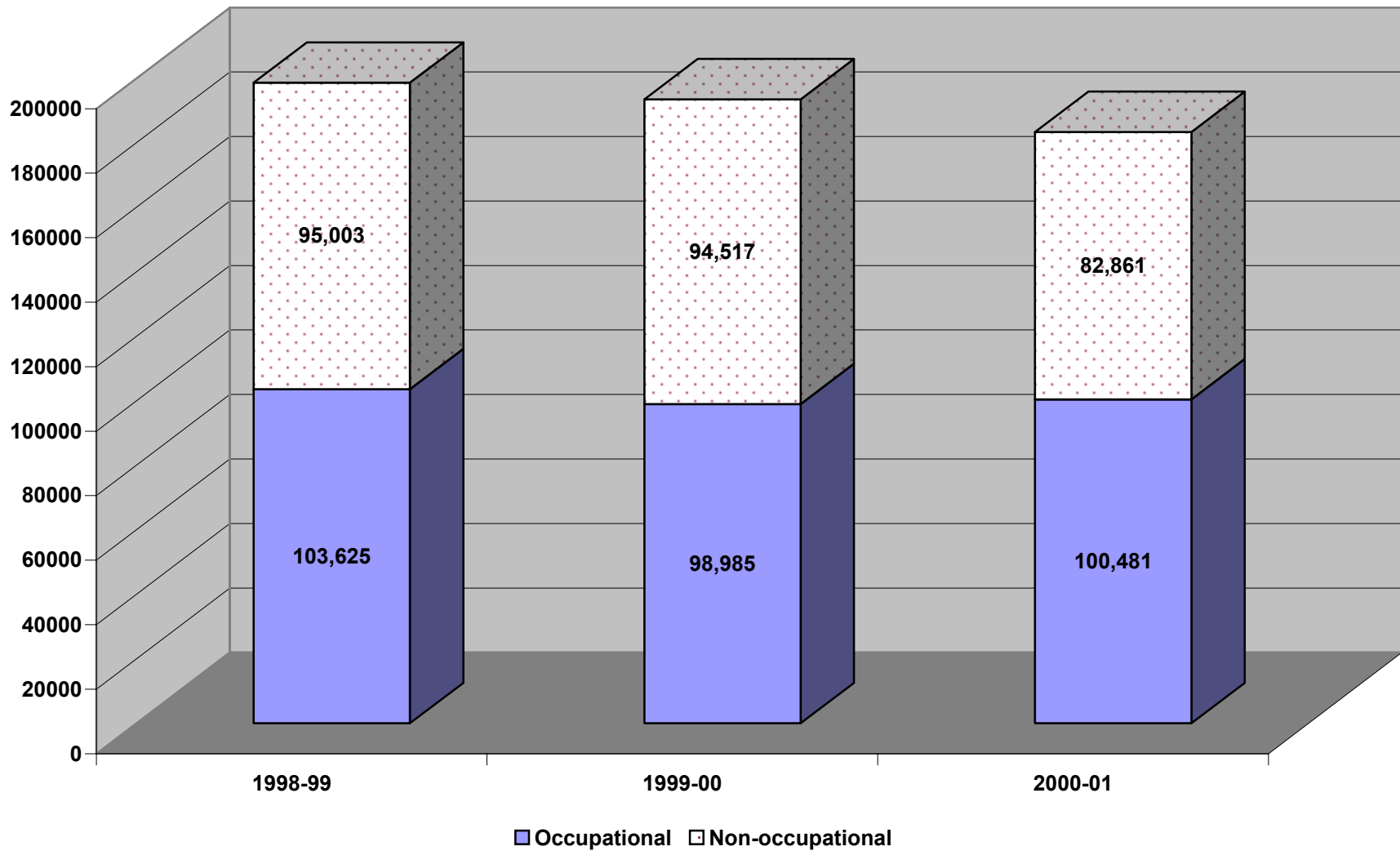
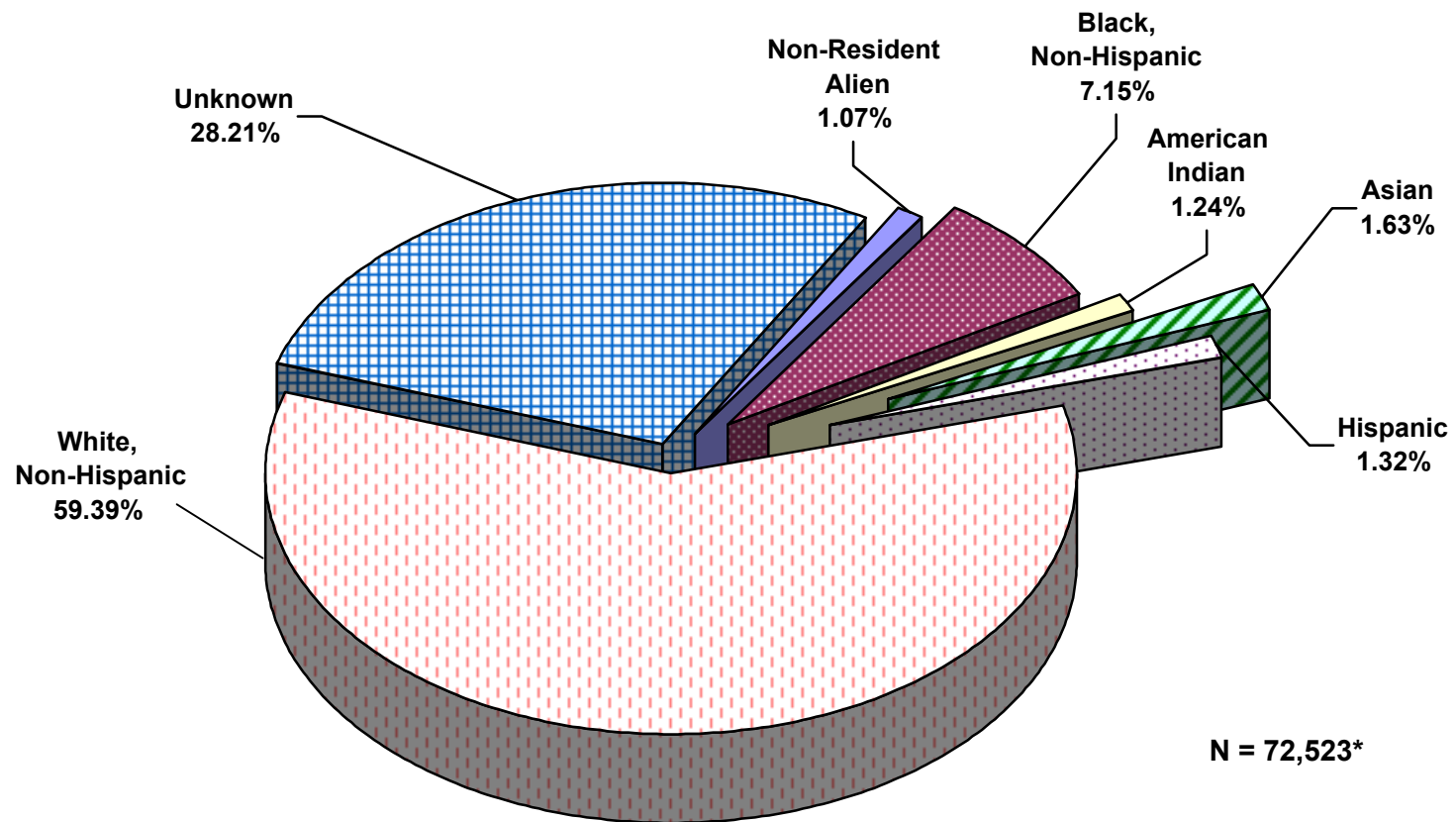

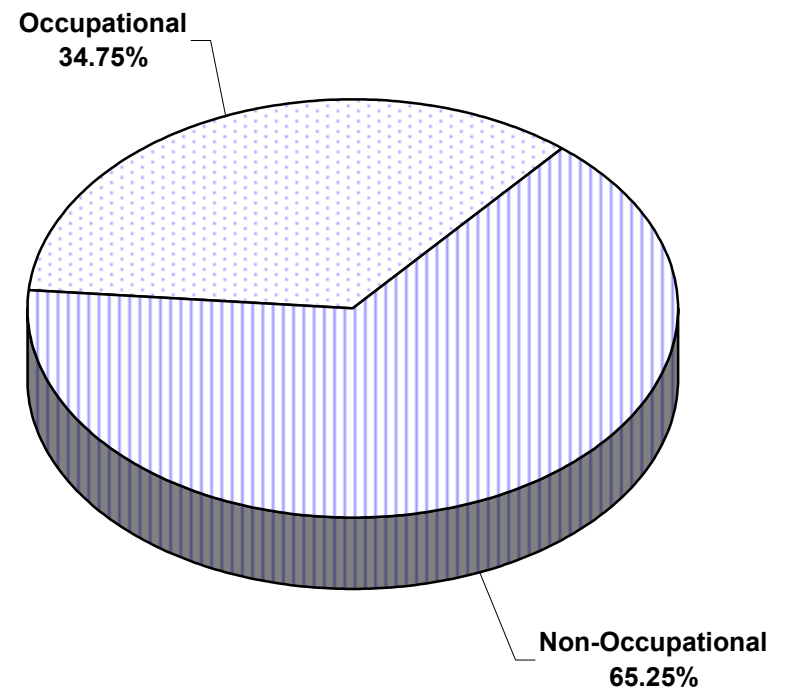

TOTAL FULL-TIME FACULTY BY ETHNICITY, 2001

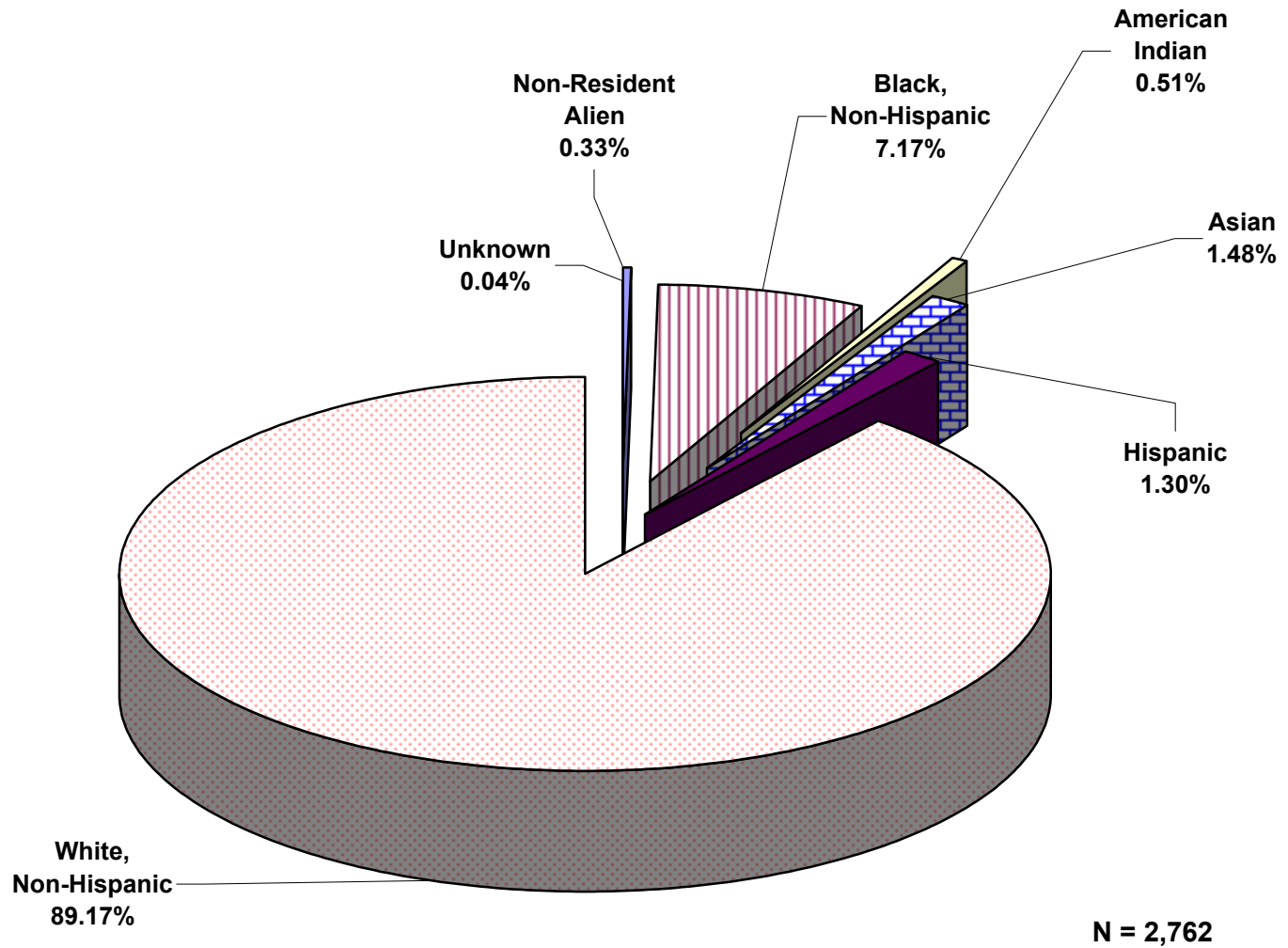

PART-TIME FACULTY BY ETHNICITY, 2001

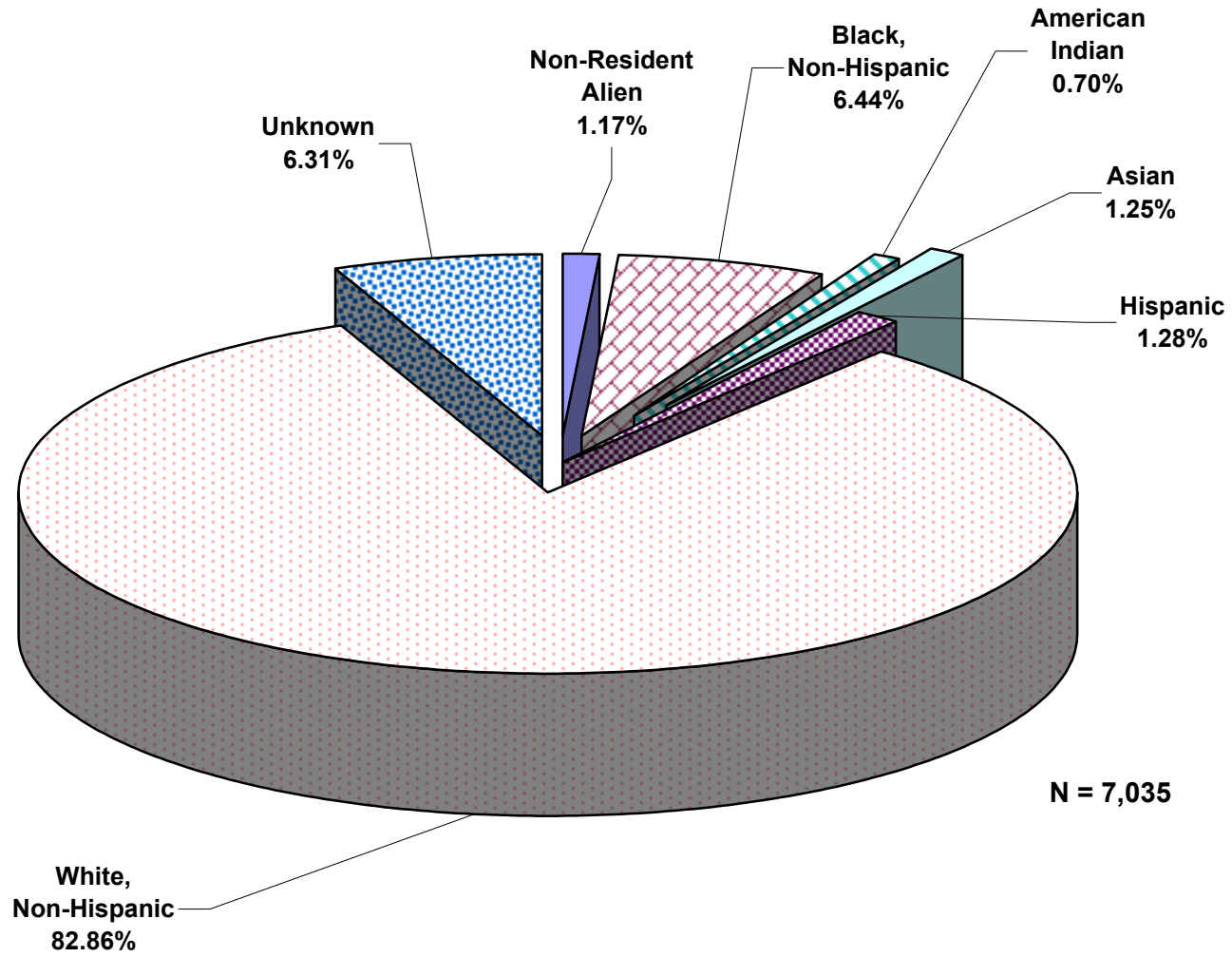

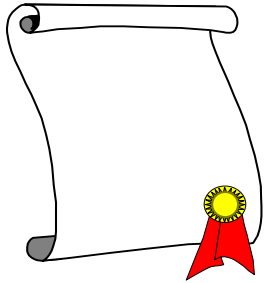

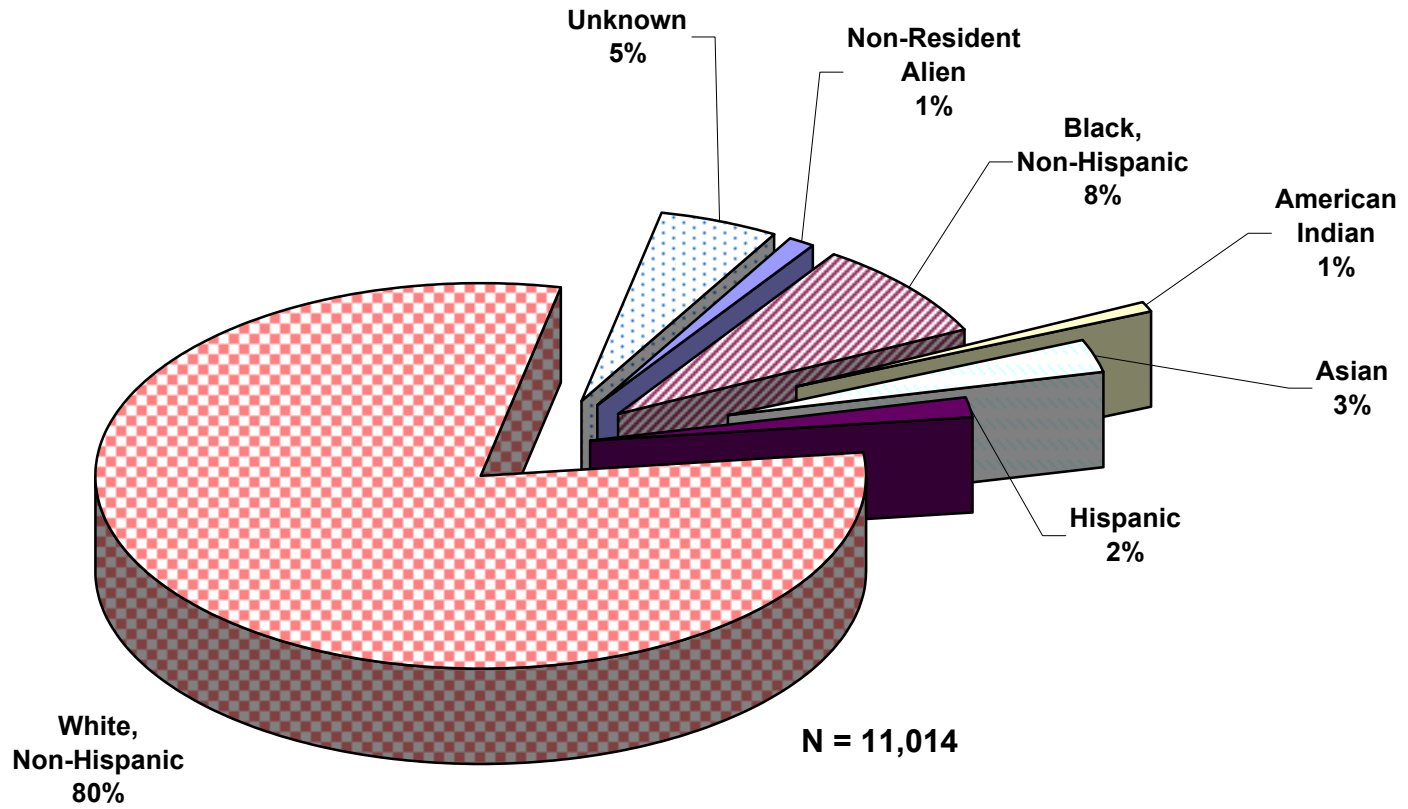
