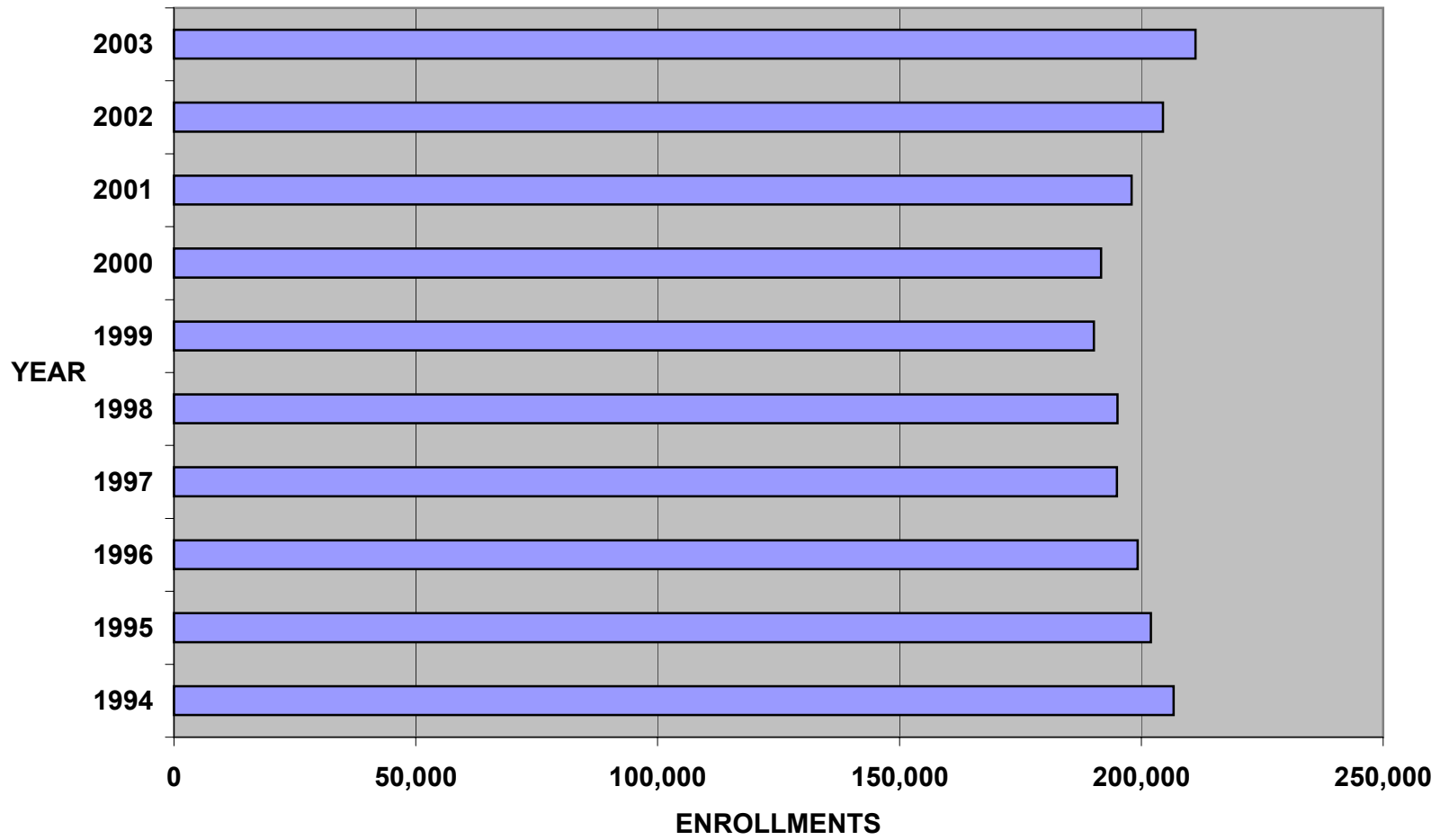

FALL 2003 ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY AND GENDER

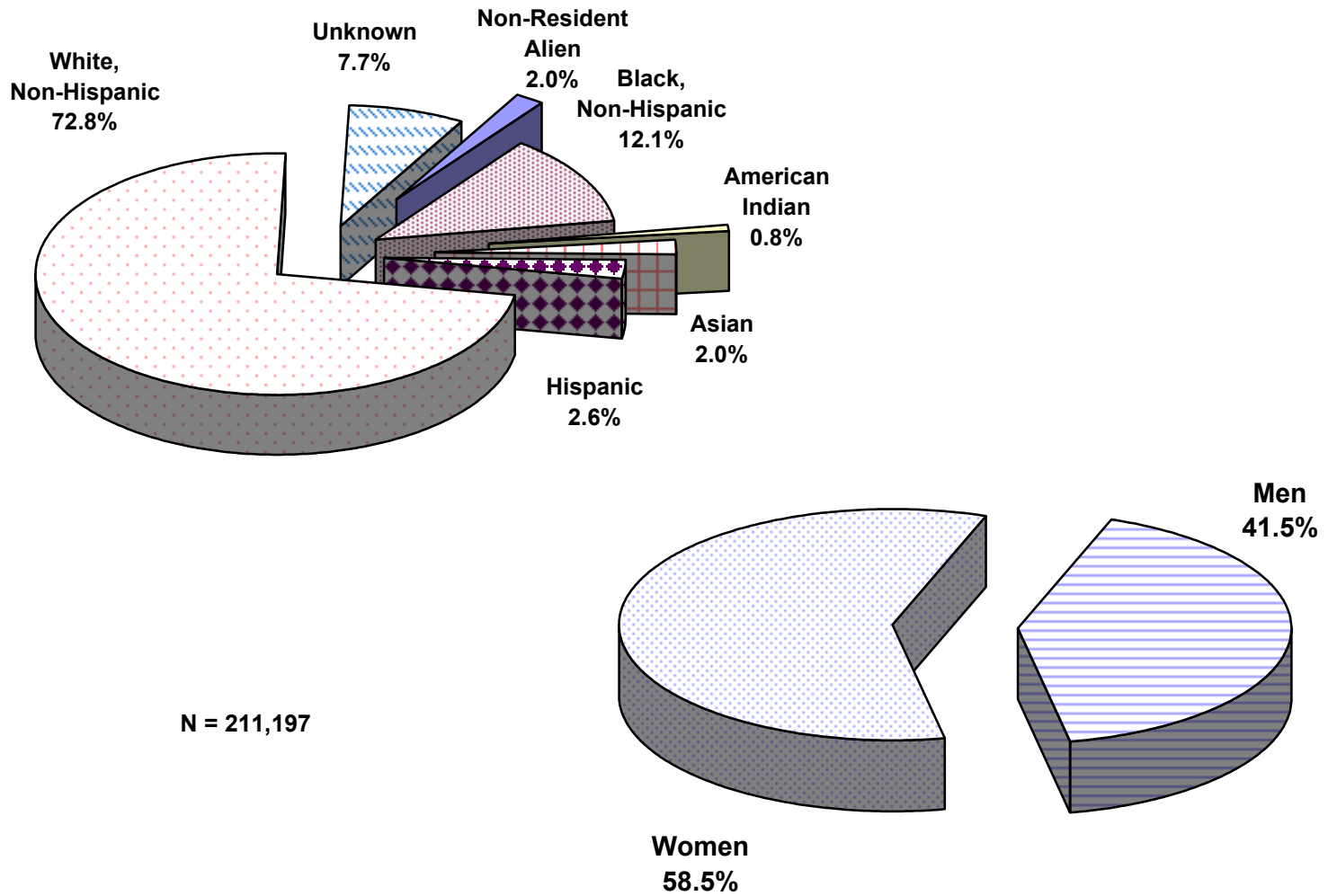

2000-2004**

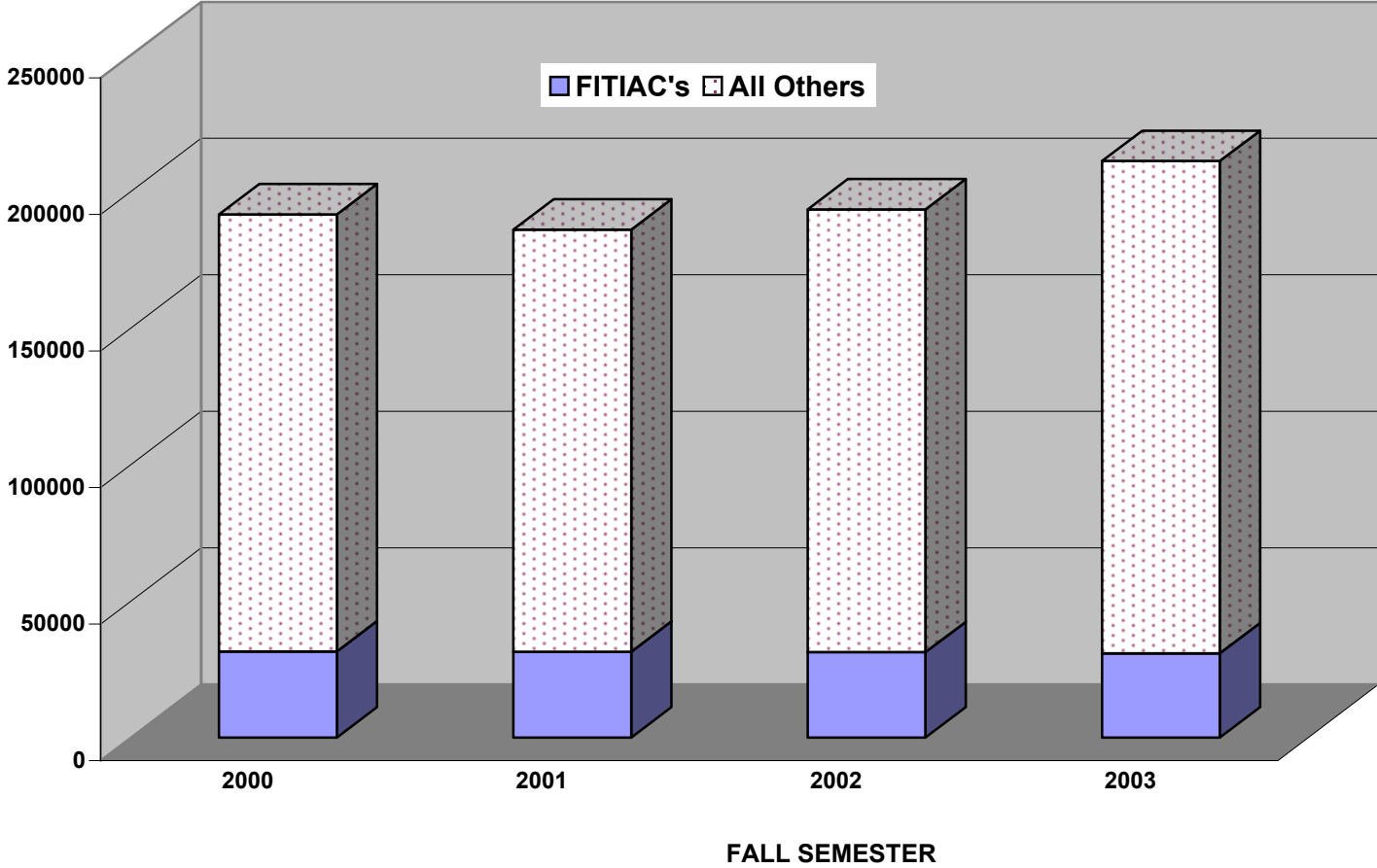

Fall 2003 ENROLLMENT BY STATUS AND GENDER AS COMPARED TO FALL 2002

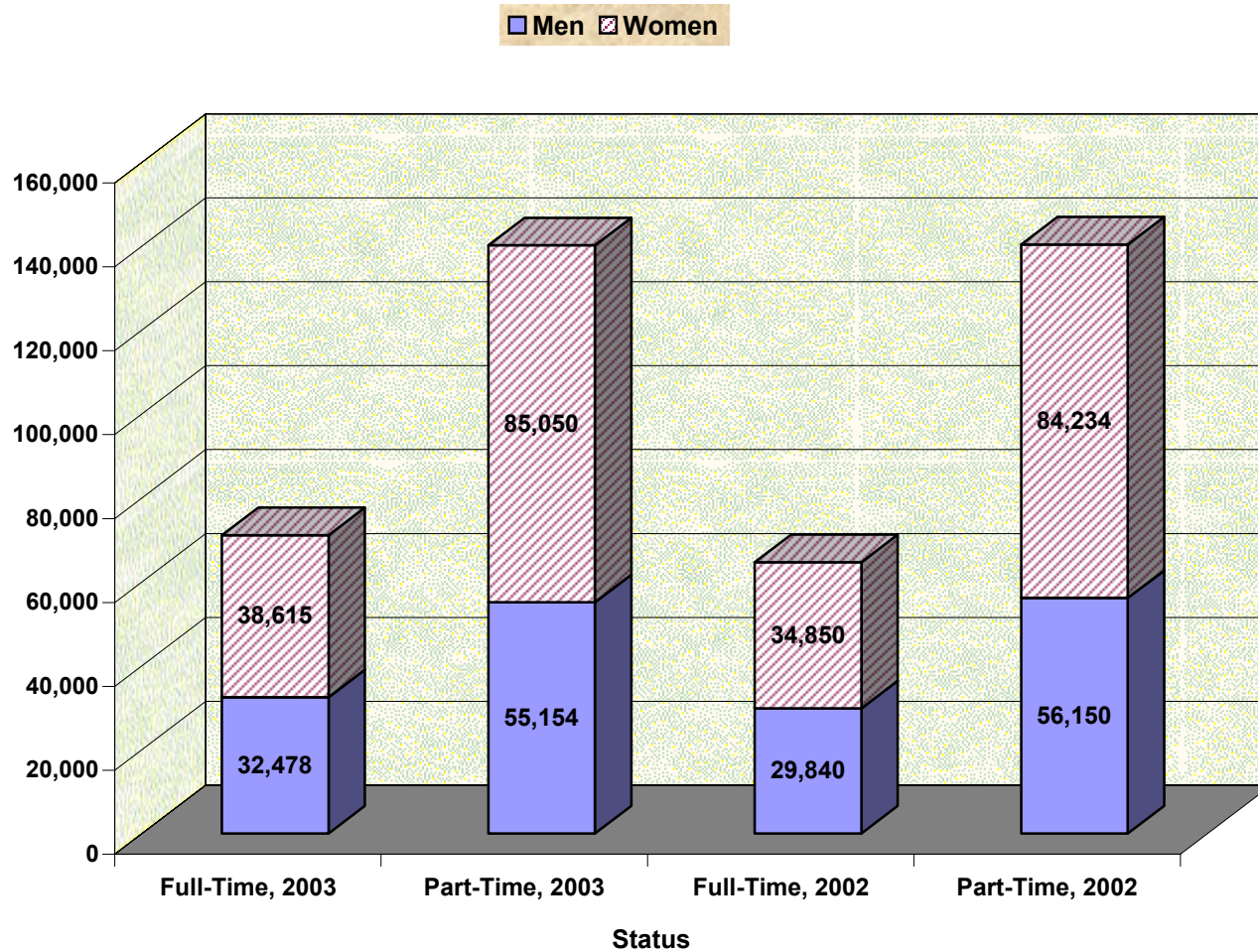

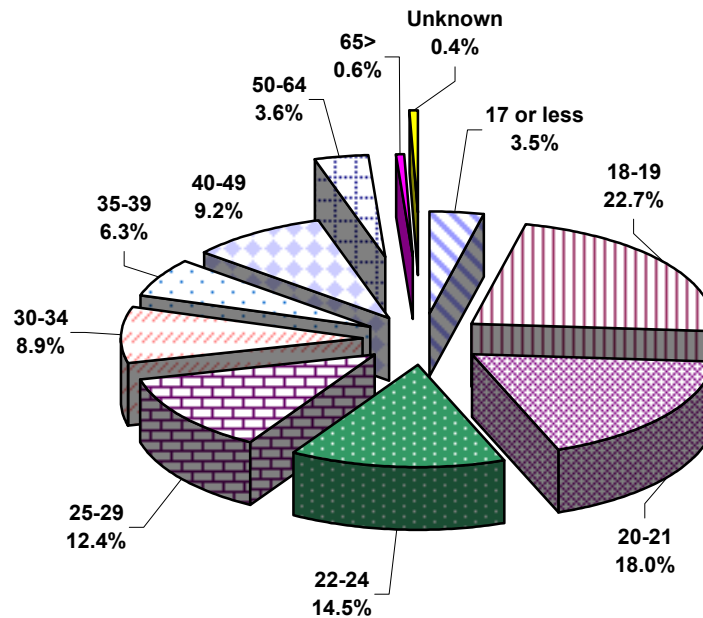
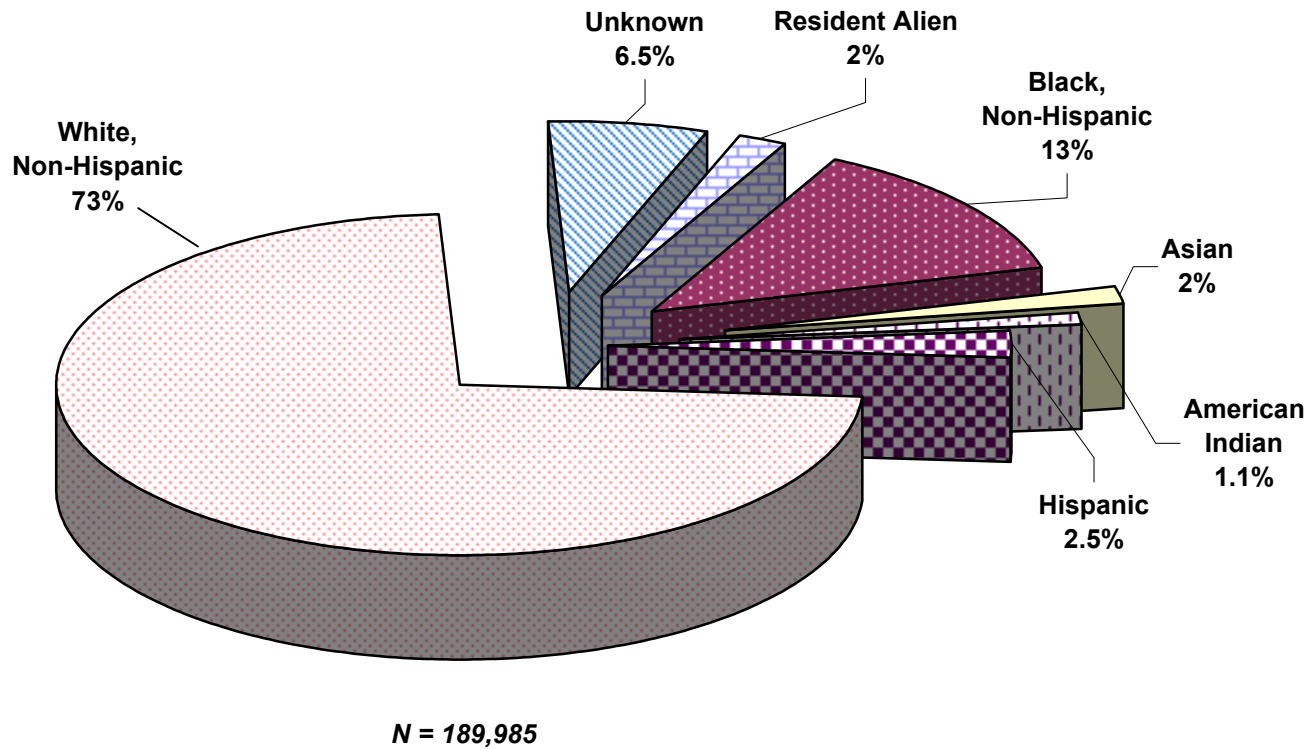

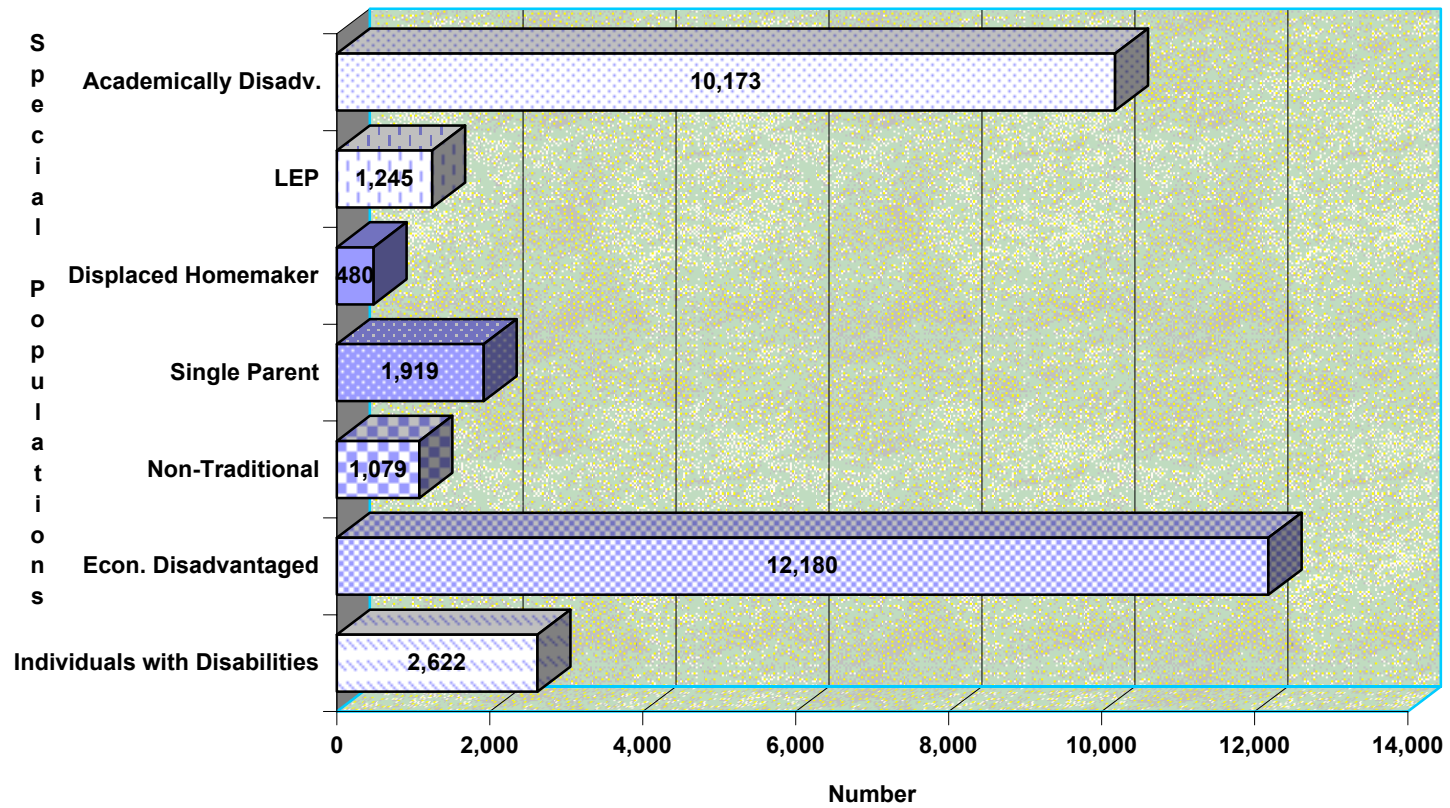

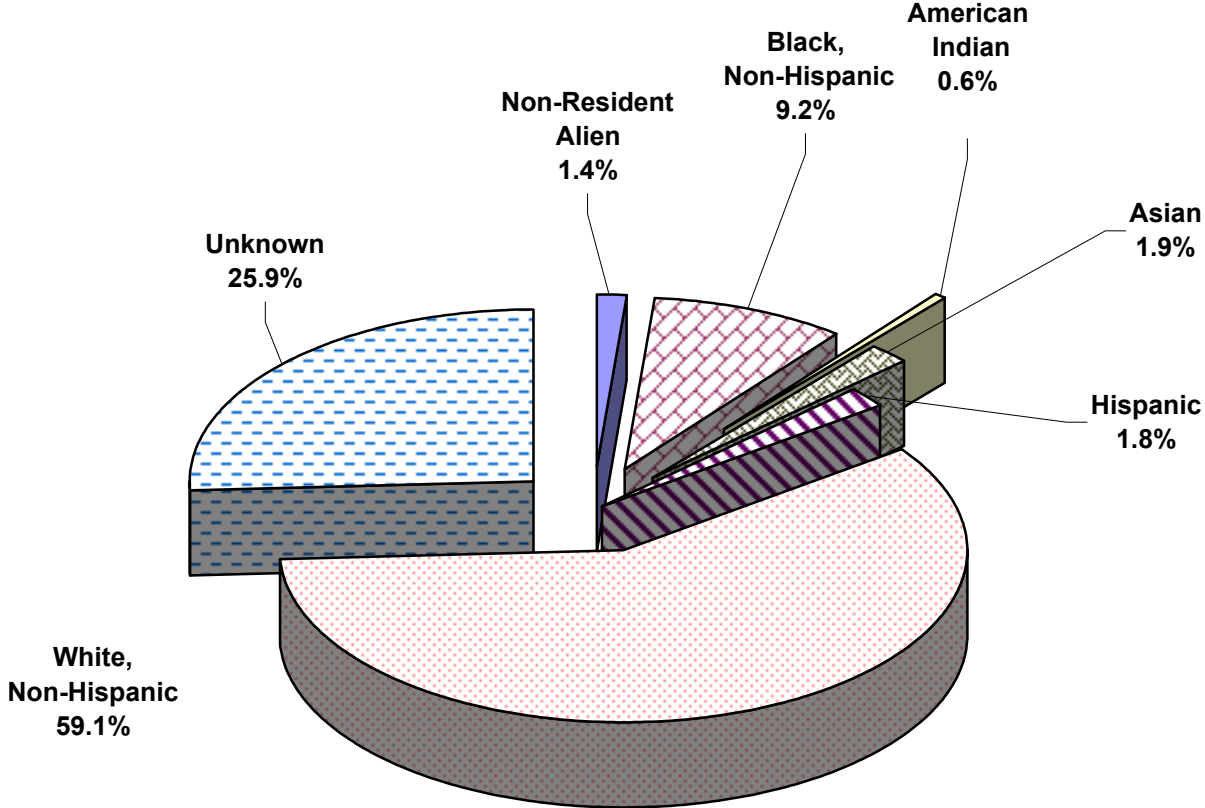

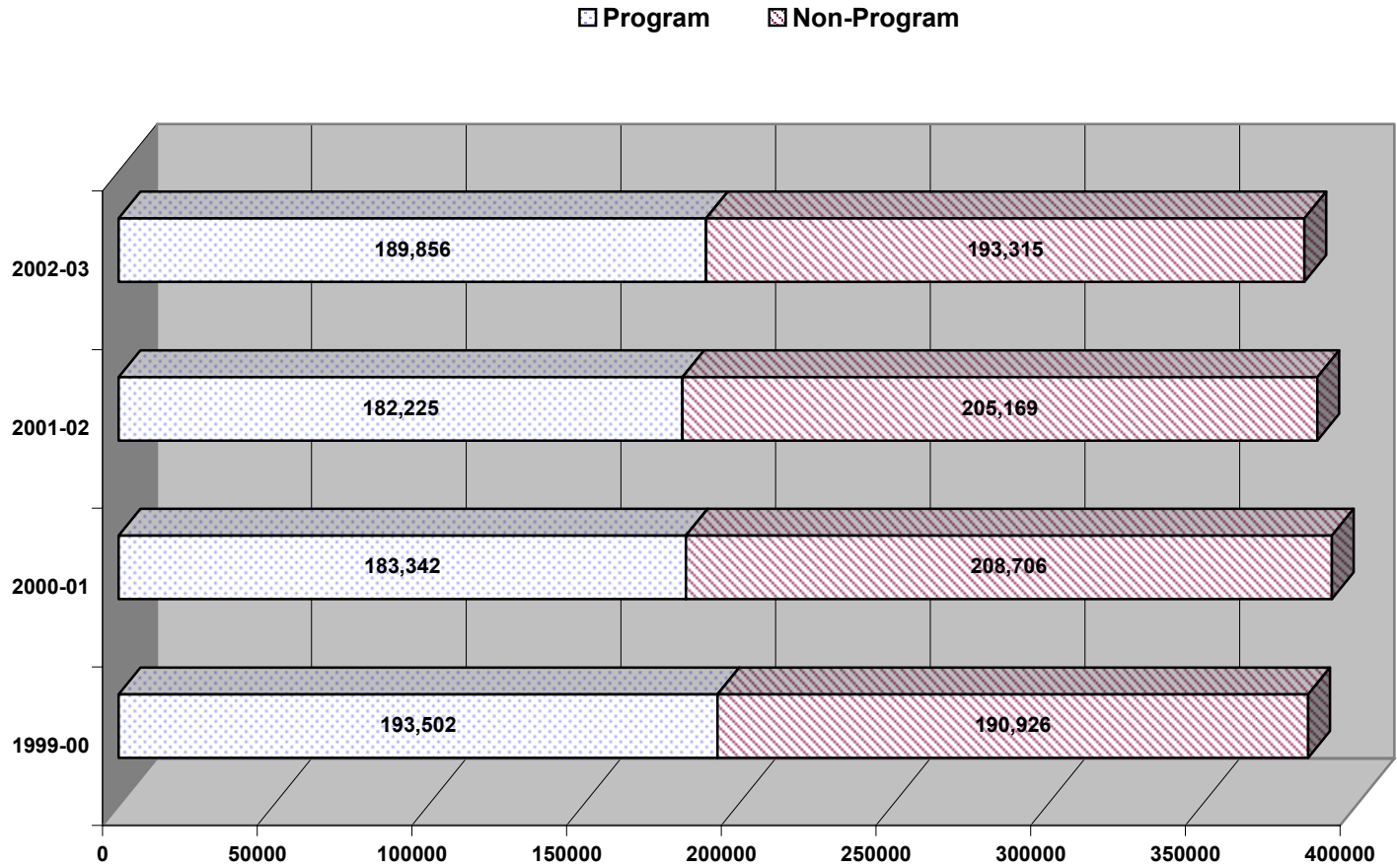

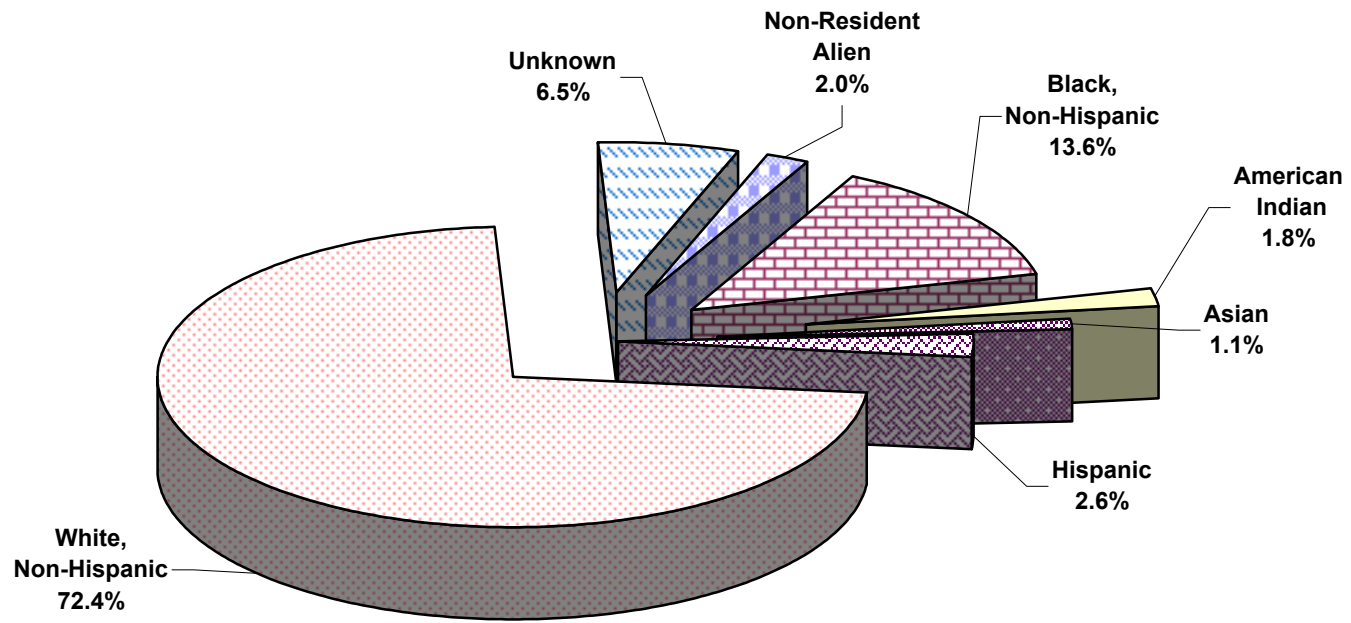

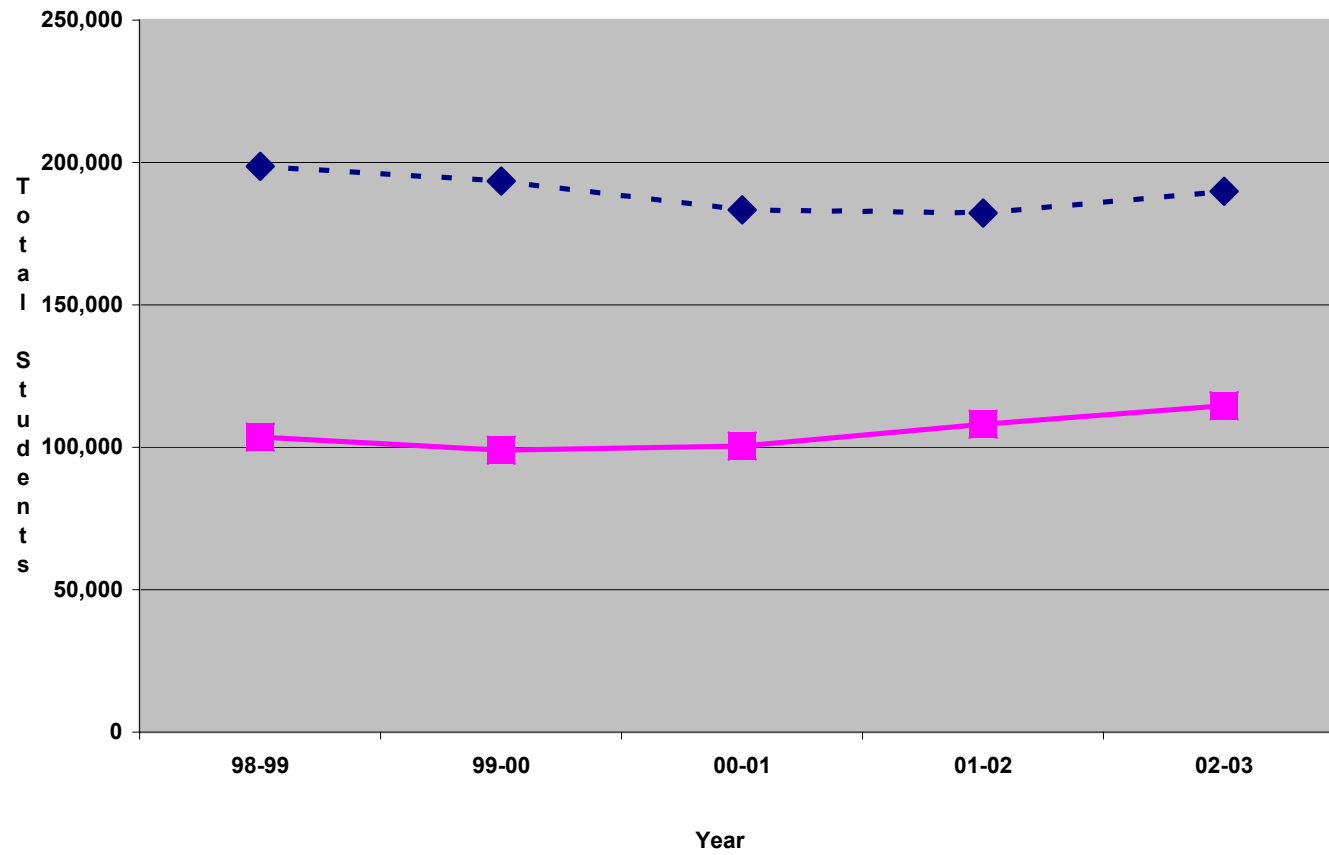

OCCUPATIONAL NON-PROGRAM ENROLLMENTS BY ETHNICITY, 2002-03

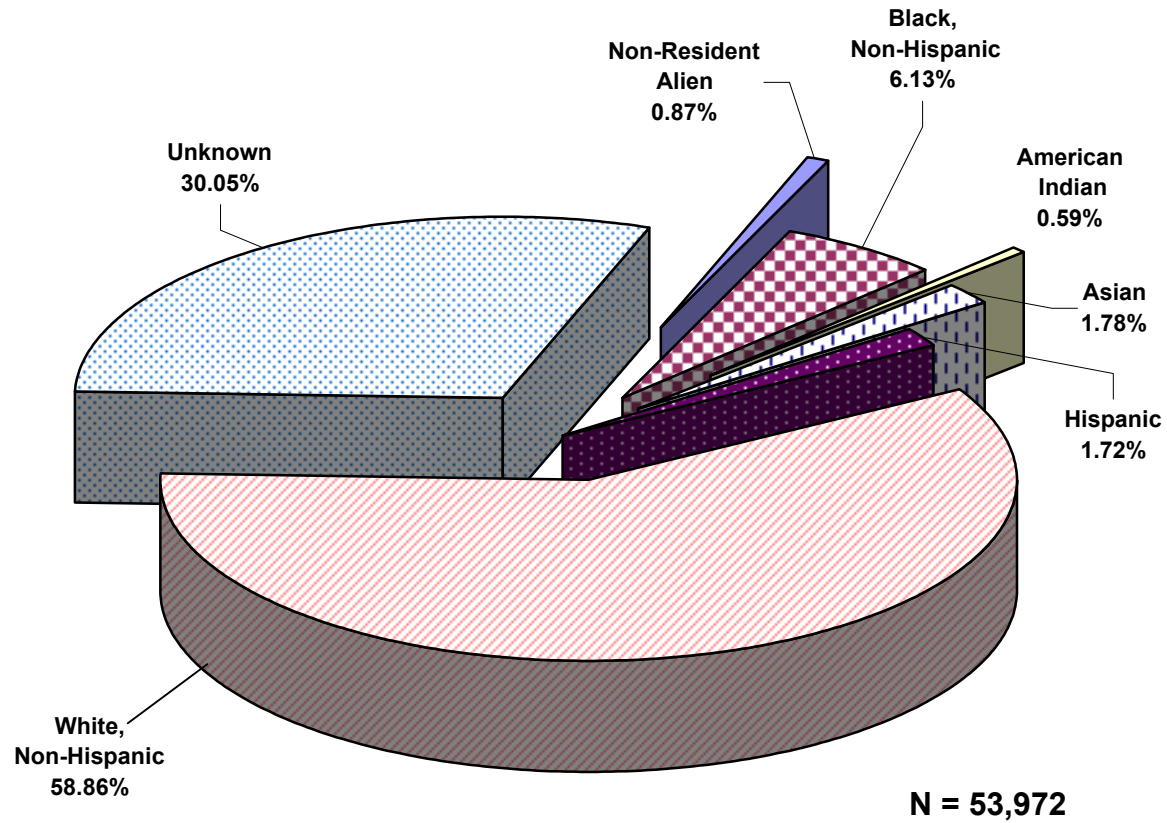

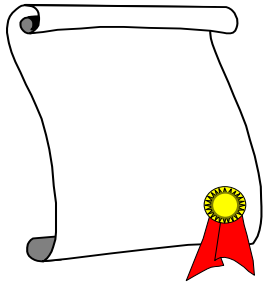

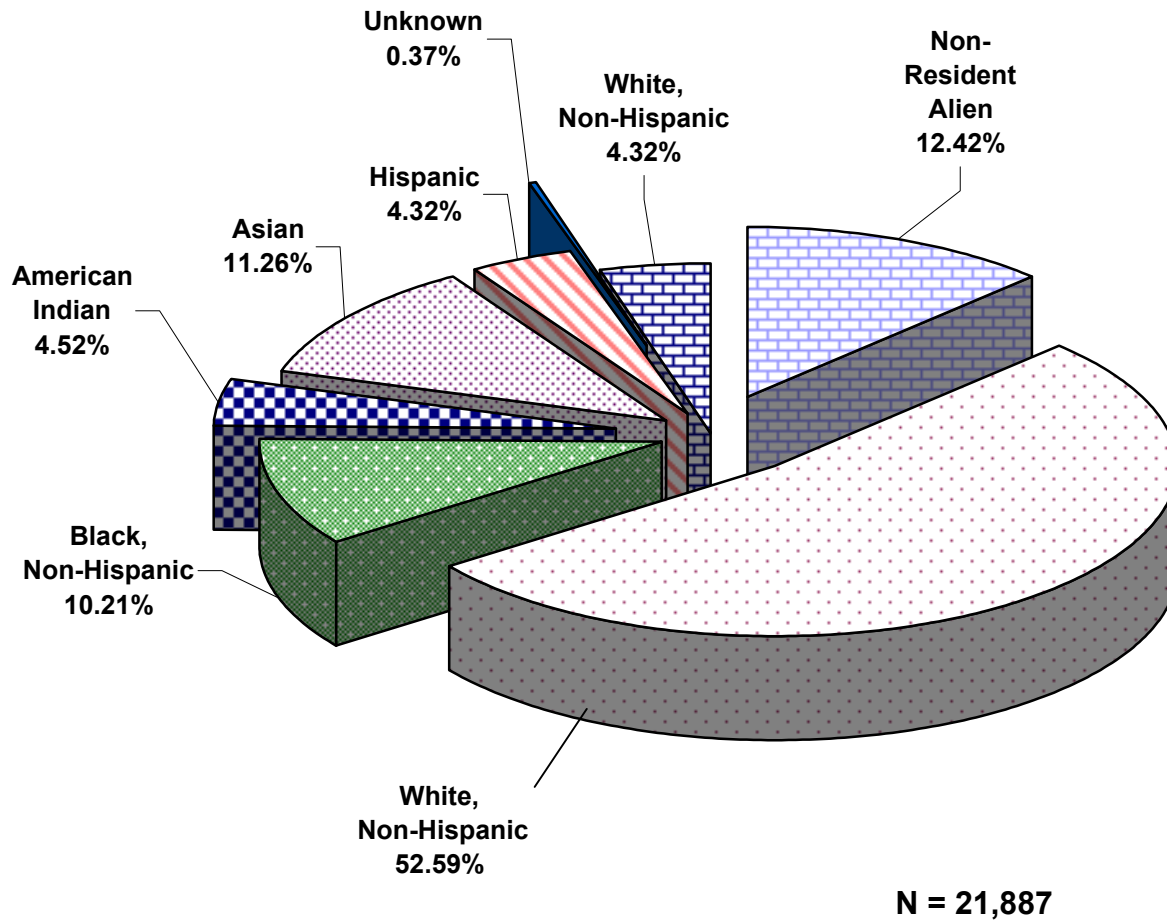

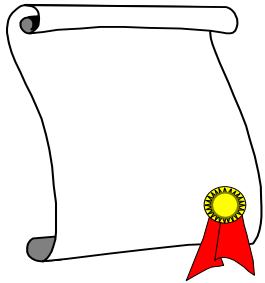

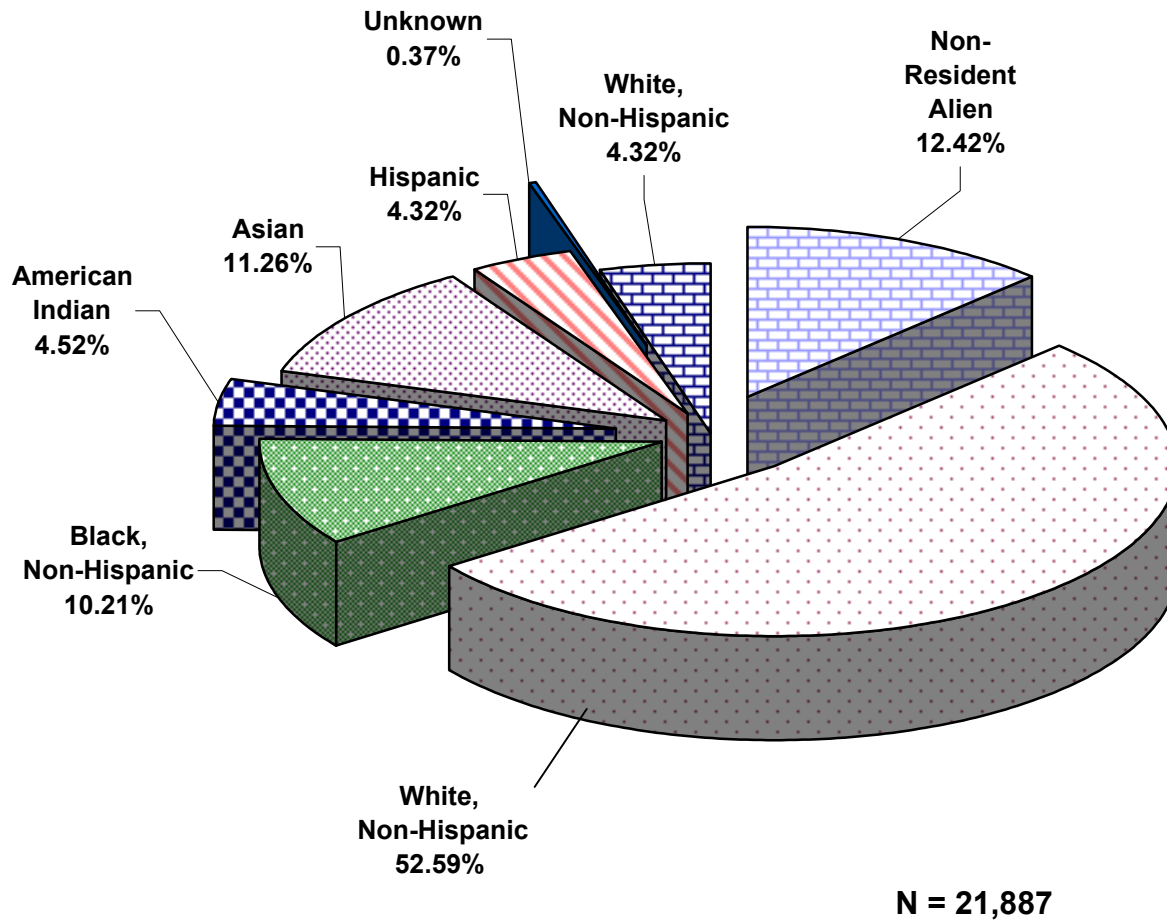

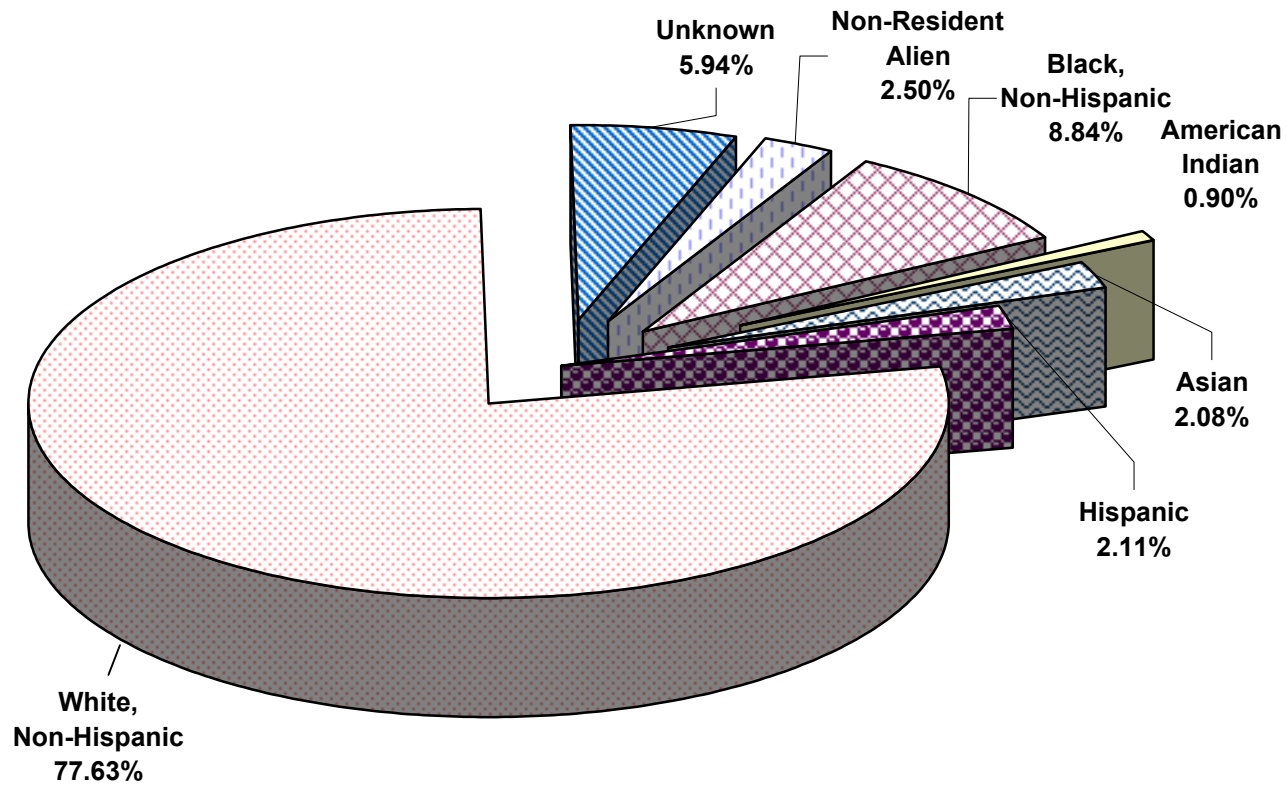
