TEN YEAR HISTORY OF FALL ENROLLMENTS

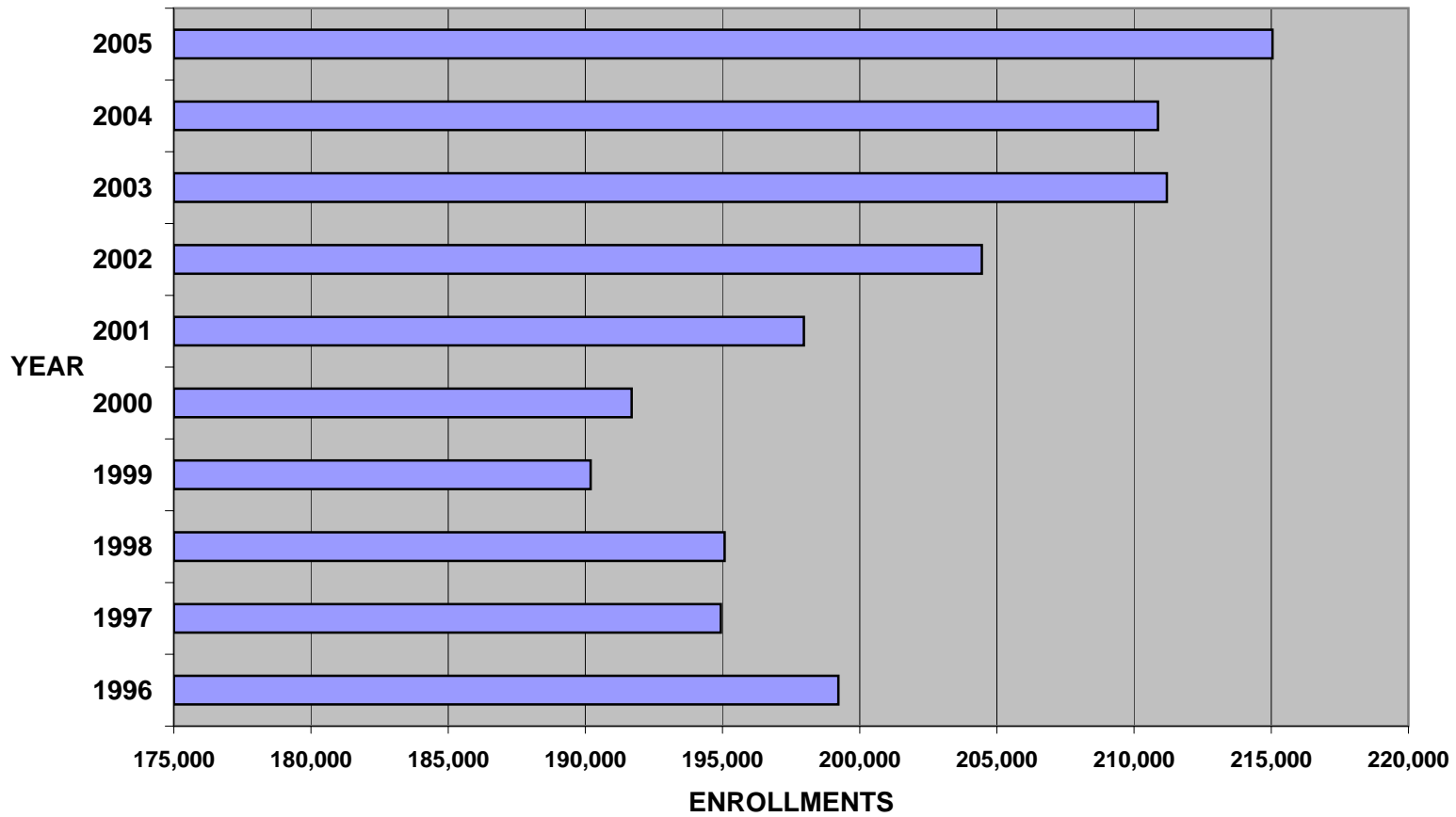

Fall 2005 ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY

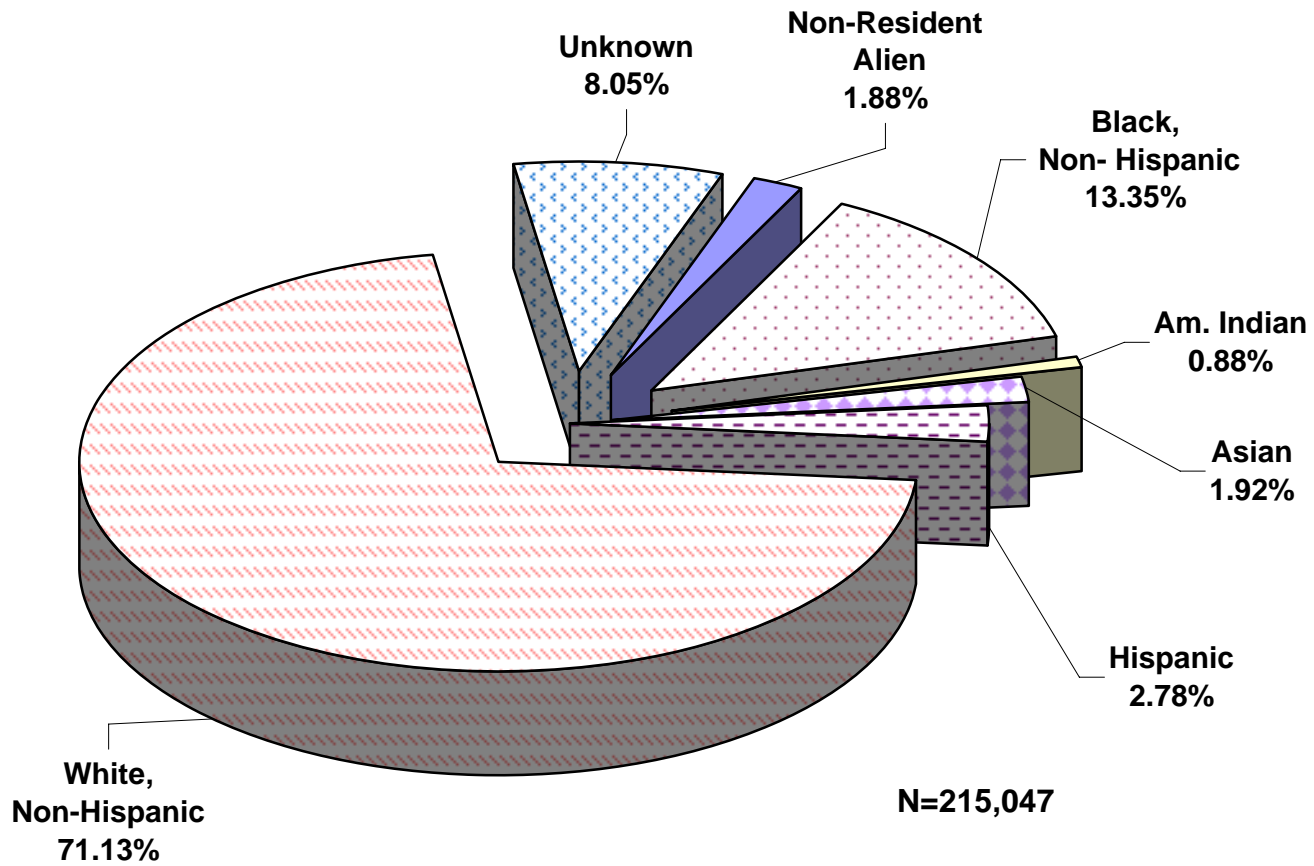

FITIAC'S AS A PERCENT OF FALL ENROLLMENT

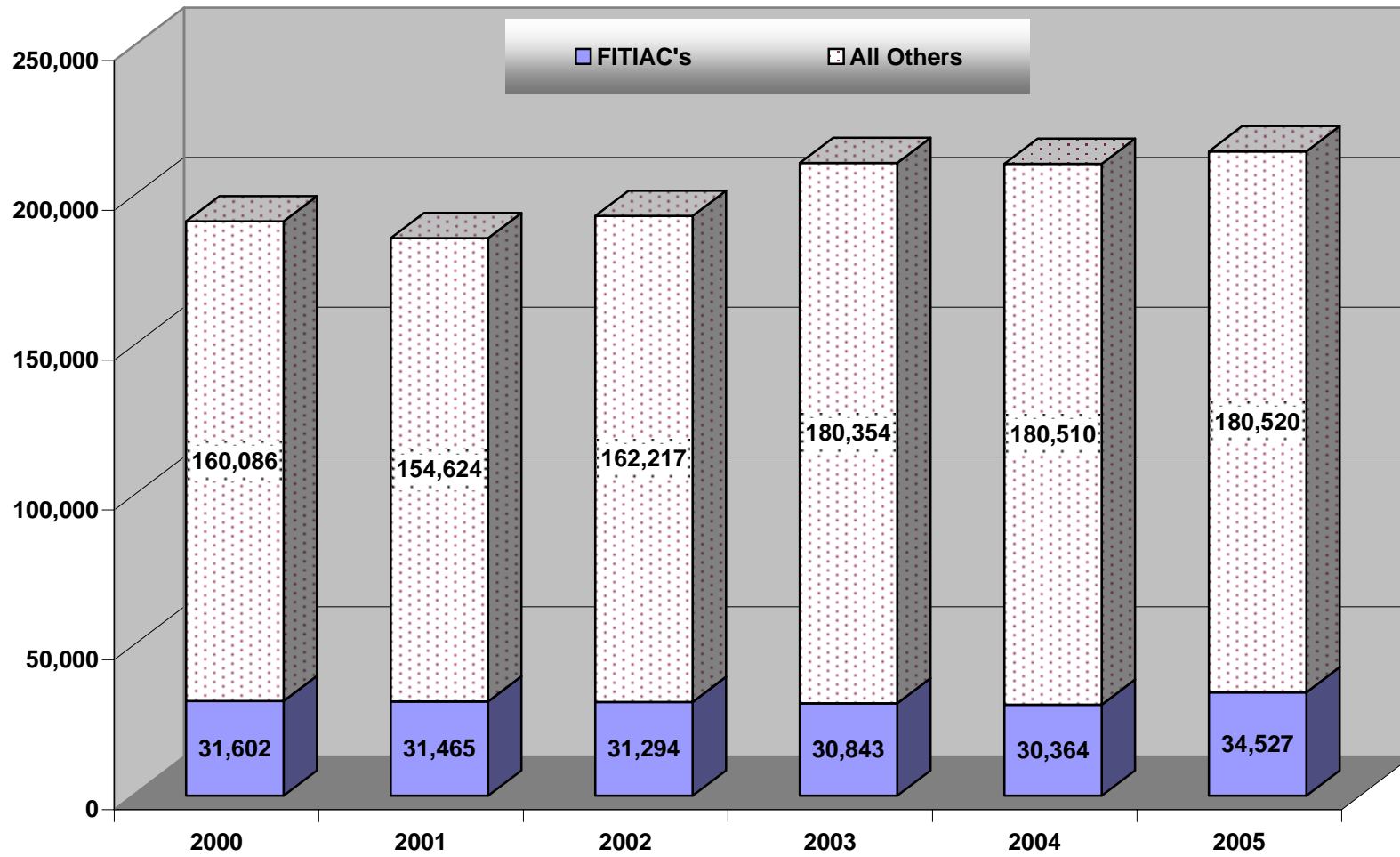

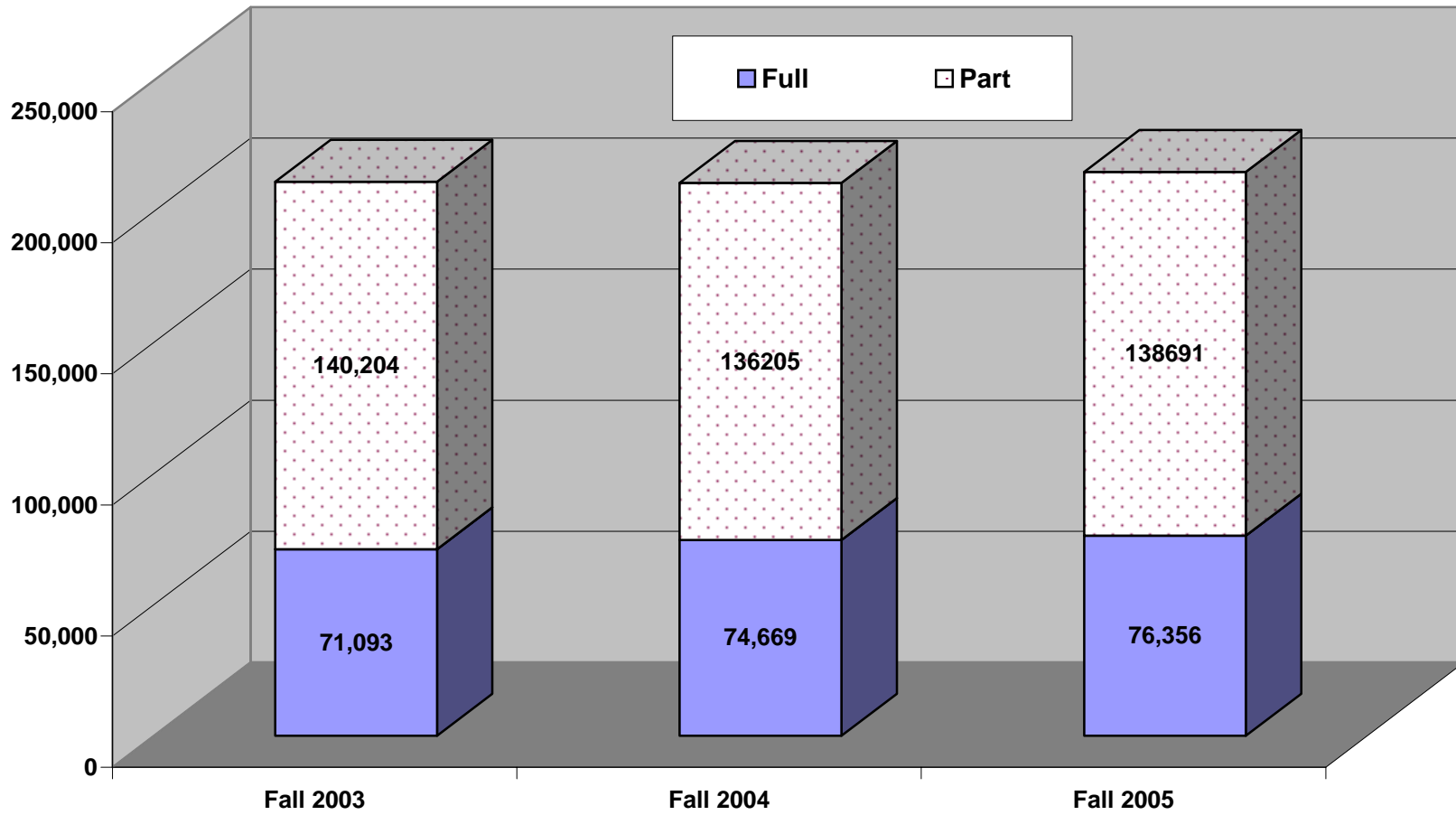

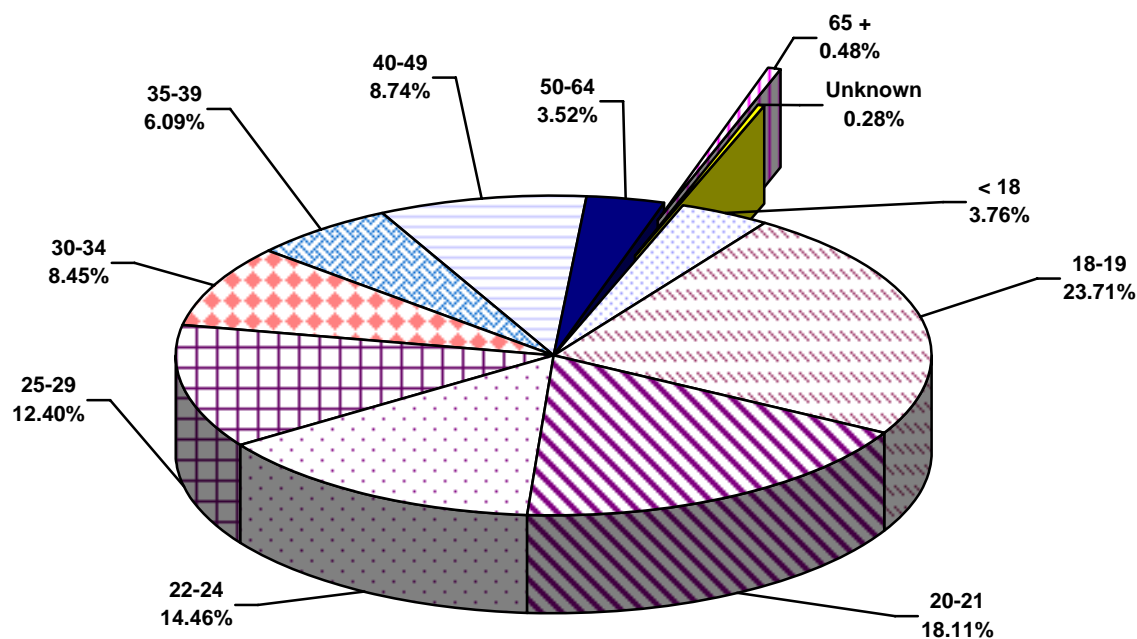

YEAR-END PROGRAM ENROLLMENTS BY ETHNICITY, 2004-05

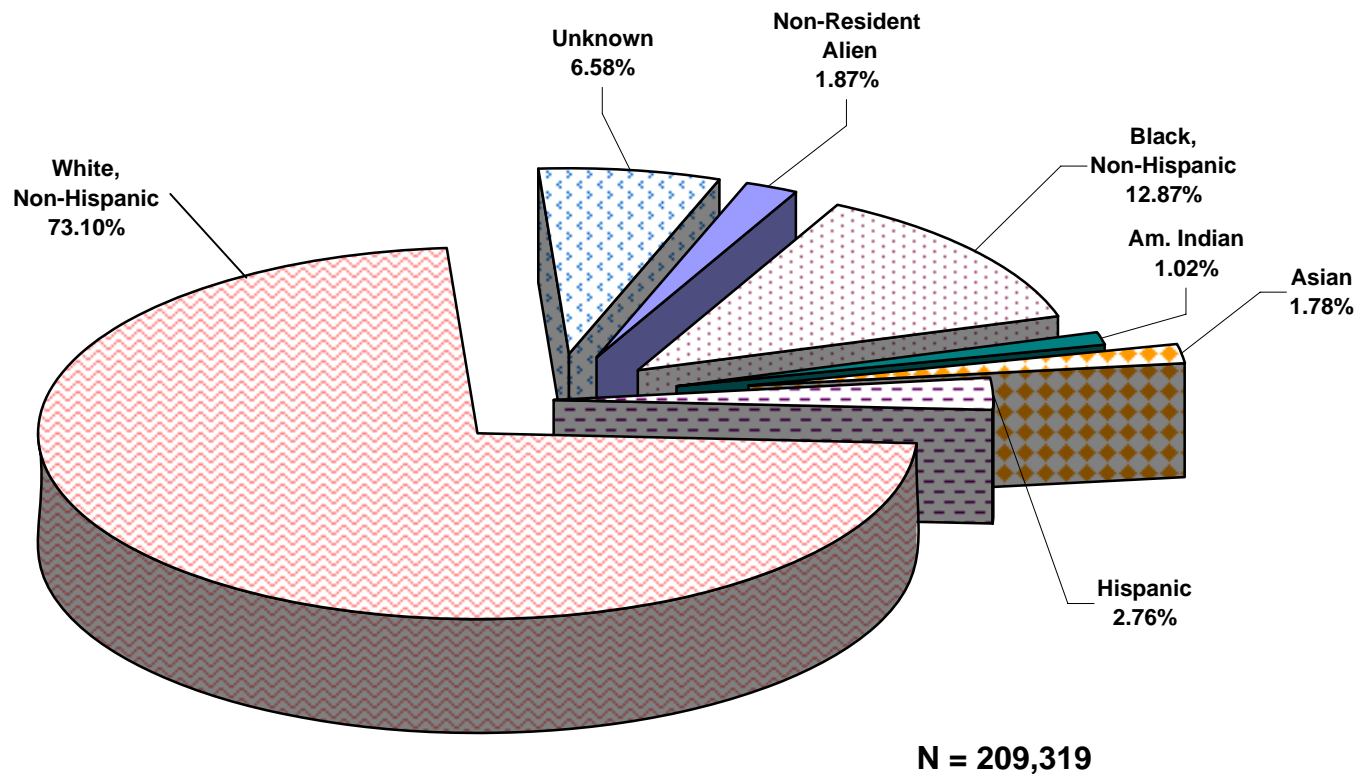

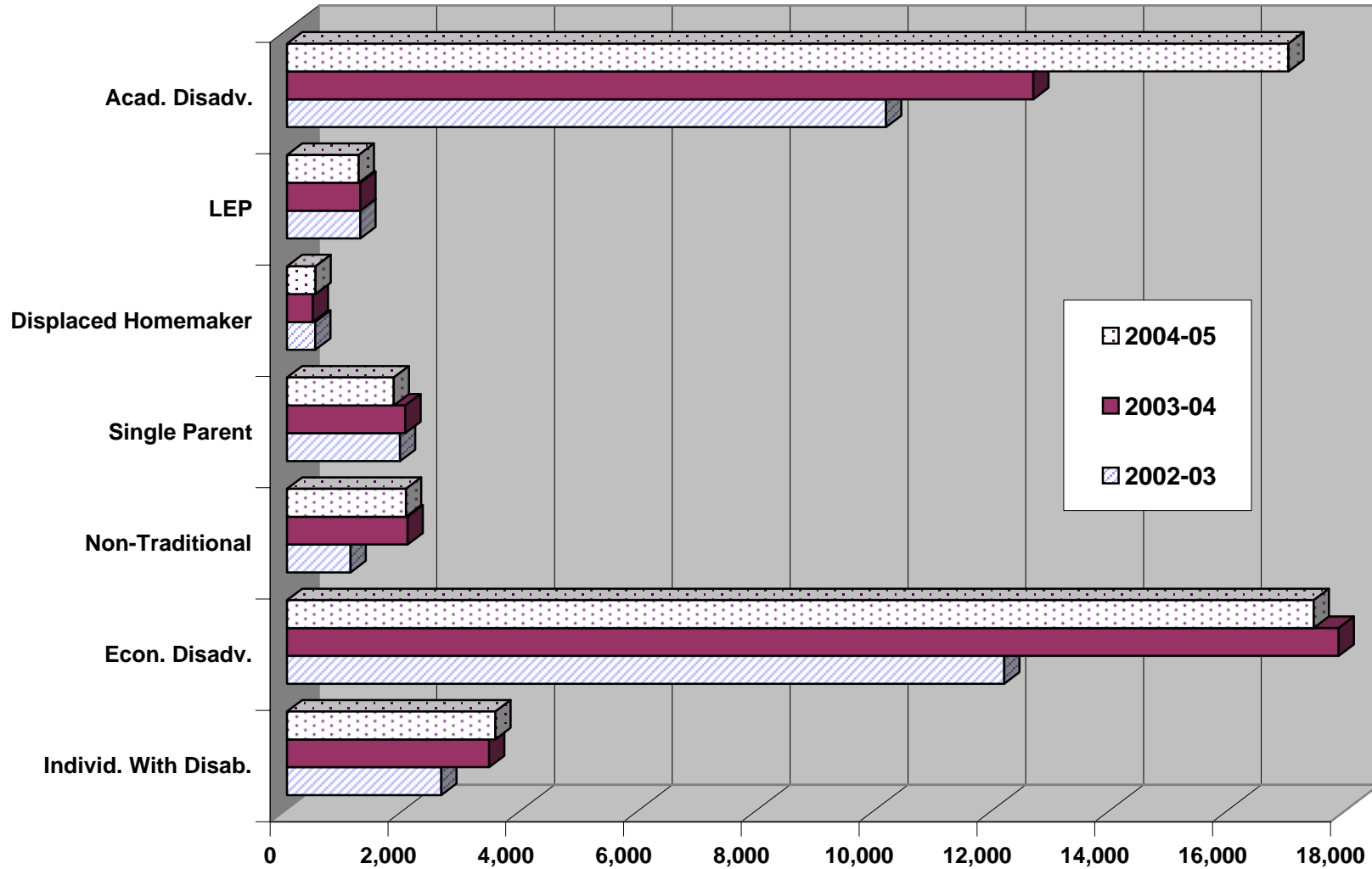

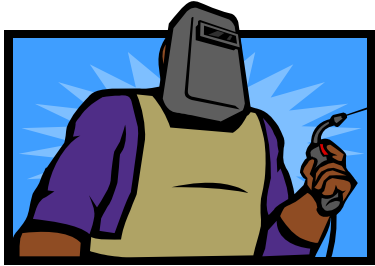

TOTAL NON-PROGRAM ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY, 2004-05

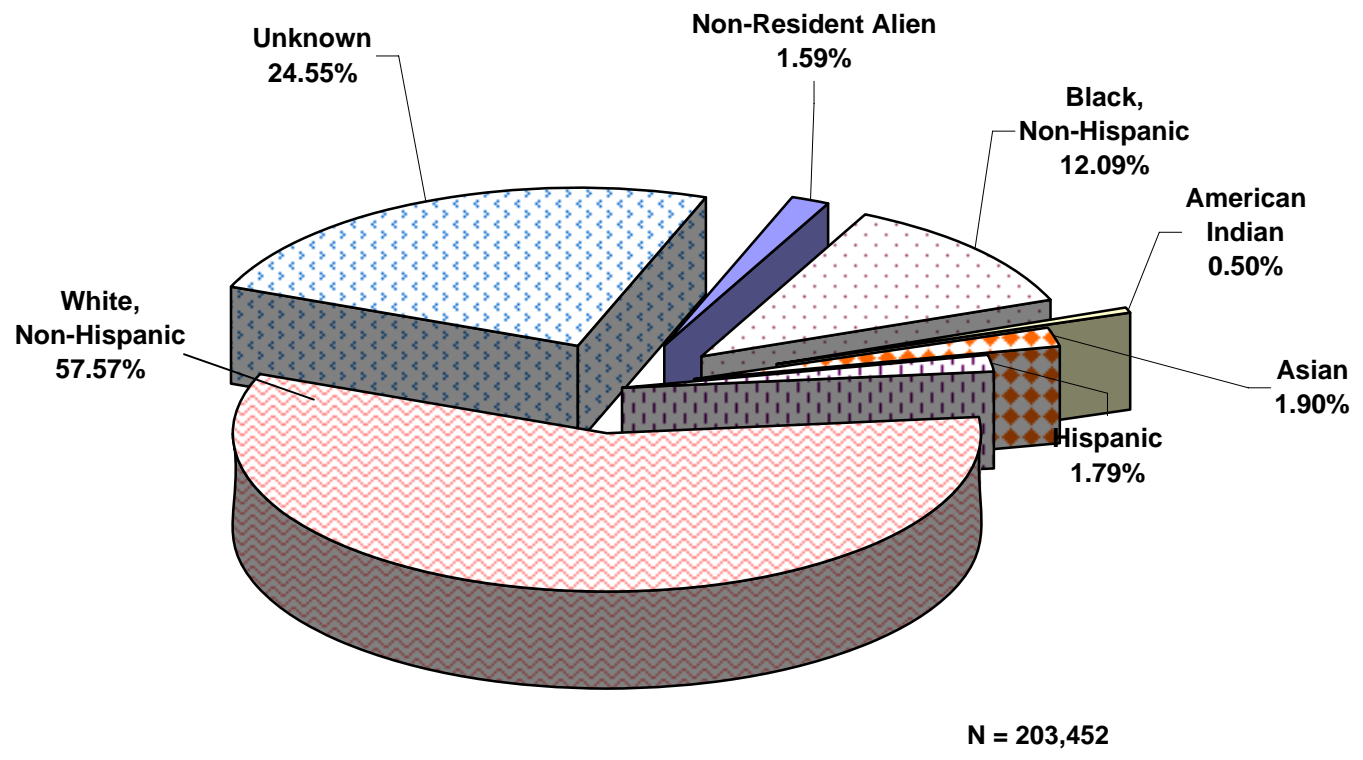

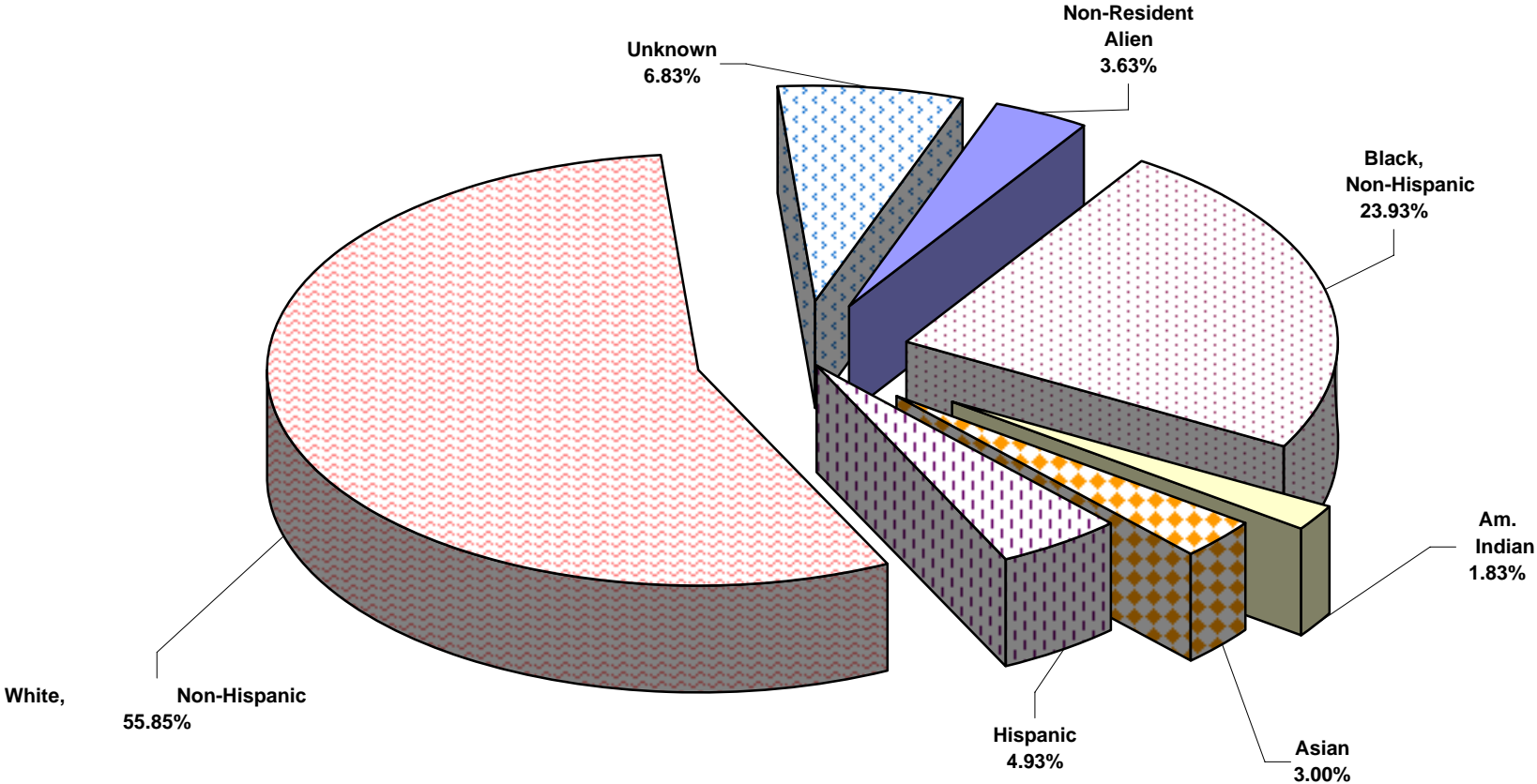

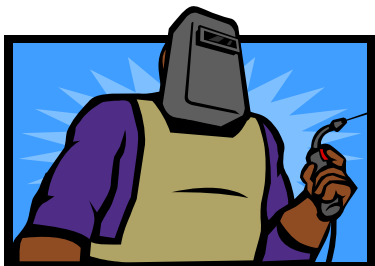

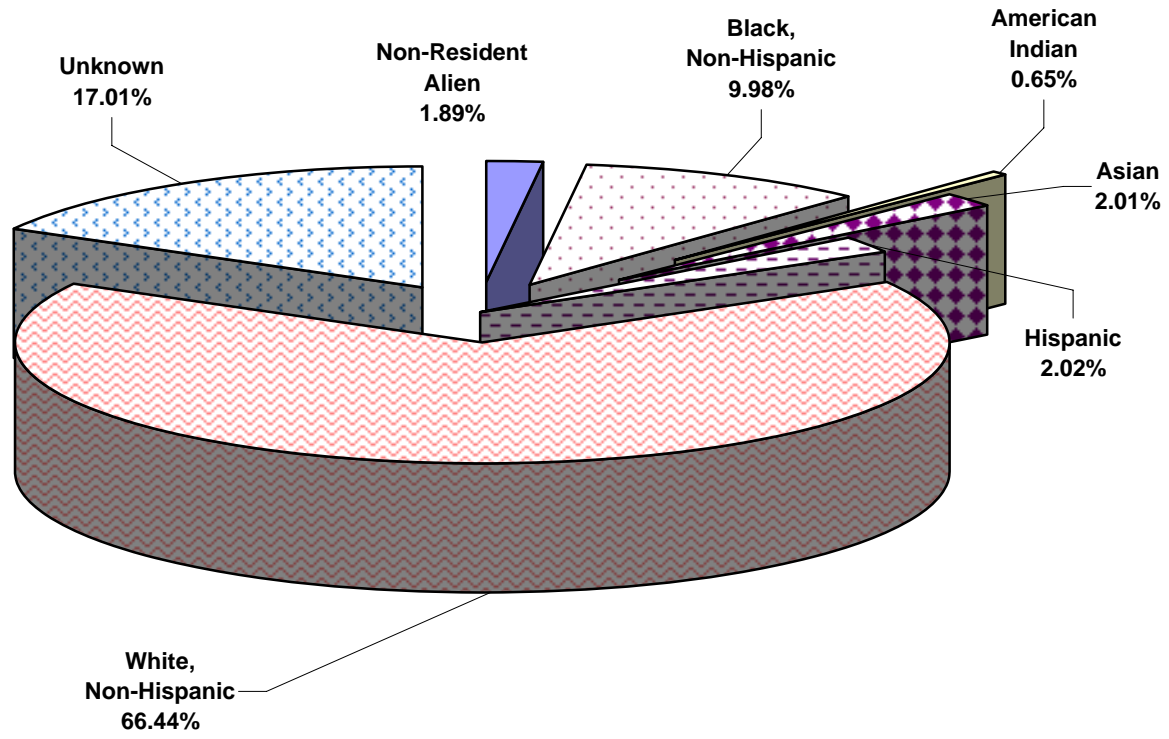

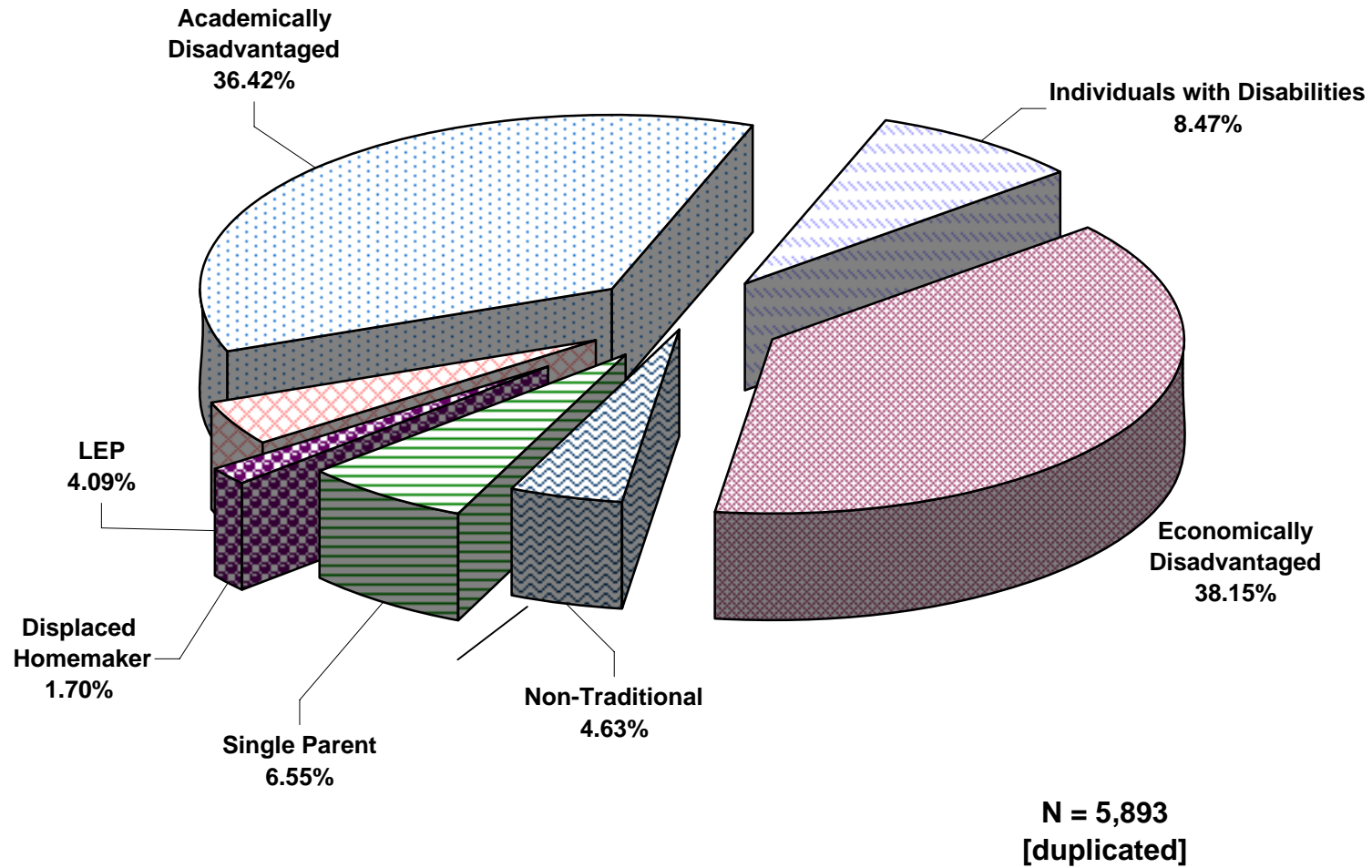

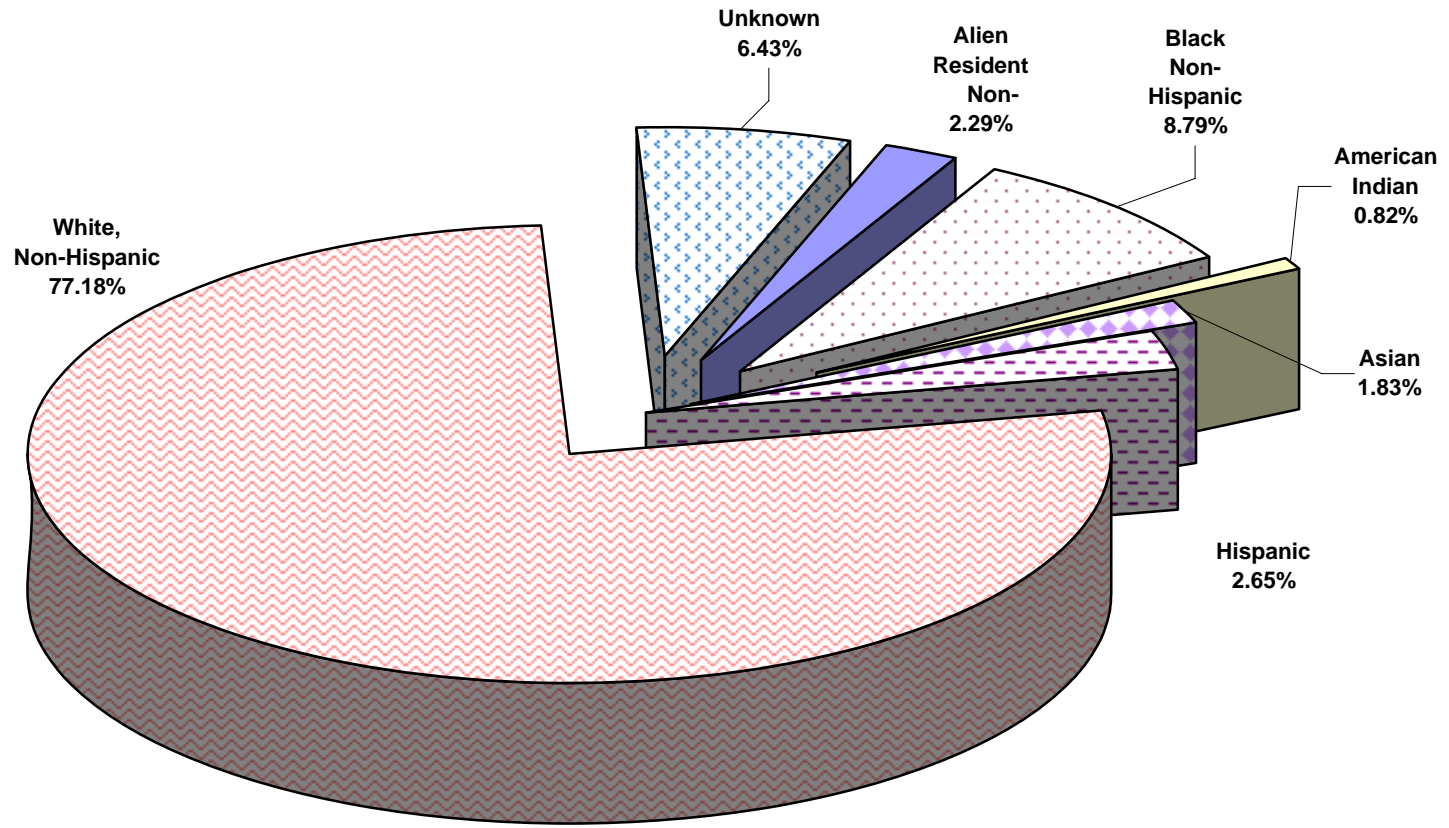
